Look back to 1992

The Zephyrhills News continues a summer series of looking back to days gone by. This week we venture back 20 years ago to the summer of 1992

Perhaps a few people in the city and outlying areas of east Pasco County who were around back then could recall a few significant stories in the summer of 1992. Specifically, the July 16 issue of *The Zephyrhills News*.

That's when five significant stories adorned the front page of the hometown community newspaper that dates back to 1911 and remains one of the last major weekly publications in the Sunshine State.

In the top story above the fold and on display in the numerous racks around town, the Geiger family, longtime residents, was featured. It told of Elizabeth Geiger replacing her husband on the city council with former mayor James Bailey administering the oath of office. John Geiger had resigned to run for the newly created District 61 seat in the Florida House of Representatives.

Elizabeth Geiger, who previously had lobbied in Tallahassee for education issues, praised the city's efforts concerning the local airport, Zephyr Haven Nursing Home and addressing traffic concerns on U.S. 301. She vowed to continue helping those and other local efforts.

In health matters, Peggy Snow moved back to Florida from Illinois to become the administrator of Zephyr Haven Nursing Home, replacing Patti Whitfield who held that job for 20 years. Also, a Houston firm purchased Humana Hospital-Pasco in Dade City.

Hercules, flooding issues - hot topics at meeting

Monday's city council meeting greenlit Wharton-Smith to manage Hercules Park construction

The headlining item that started off Monday's meeting was approved 4-0 with council VP Lance Smith presiding over the meeting in the absence of council president Jodi Wilkeson.

Item 1.1 gave the nod to Wharton-Smith, Inc. for the construction management contract to design and build Hercules Park. The Evaluation Committee which consisted of Gail Hamilton, John Bostic, Shane LeBlanc, and Rodney Corriveau recommended Wharton-Smith, who will be working closely with Kimley-Horn & Associates on the design. Hard numbers like the cost and timeline are not yet available.

The item approved the contract between the city and Wharton-Smith but it should be noted that funding for Hercules Park is budgeted in the current FY 2022/2023 Annual Budget.

"This is one of the best things to happen in this city in a long time," councilman Alan Knight said.

Item 1.2 approved a Letter of Agreement with

Over 116,000 **Vote-By-Mail Ballot requests** fulfilled for the **Primary Election**

Brian E. Corley, Supervisor of Elections, announces that on July 14, over 116,000 vote-by-mail ballots for the Aug. 23, 2022 Primary Election will be mailed to voters with requests already on file. Ballots to uni-

formed and overseas citizens were mailed July 8. Voted ballots must be returned to the elections' office by 7 p.m. Election Day, Aug. 23. Please allow sufficient time for first-class delivery by the US Postal Service, or hand deliver ballots to any of the three Supervisor of Elections' Offices in Pasco County. Voted ballots are also accepted at early voting sites, but may not be turned in at the polls on Election Day. Information on office locations and early voting sites is available at PascoVotes.gov.

For eligible voters who did not previously request a ballot, they are still available by calling the elections' office, by submitting the request in writing, or by using the on-line request form on PascoVotes.gov. Requests must include the voter's FL Driver's License number, FL ID number, or last four of SSN, date of birth, and Pasco County residence address. Written requests must also include the voter's signature. Vote-by-mail ballots cannot be forwarded but can be mailed to a temporary mailing address if outside of Pasco County. Voters are encouraged to confirm their mailing address when ordering a vote-by-mail ballot. Requests are fulfilled immediately, with ballots being mailed daily. The deadline to request a ballot to be mailed is 5 p.m. on August 13.

Written or telephonic requests for vote-by-mail ballots must come from the voter, an immediate family member, or legal guardian on behalf of a voter. Voters may pick up ballots for themselves at any of the three elections' offices beginning, July 11, but not for someone else until nine days before the election, or Aug. 14. Those picking up ballots on behalf of someone will need a written request from the voter, designating them as the person authorized to carry out the ballot. The designee will be asked to provide a photo ID and to complete an affidavit before releasing the ballot to



Pasco Schools to reboot popular Citizens' Academy

Pasco County Schools is accepting applications for the third year of its Citizens' Academy to give members of the public an in-depth, insiders' look at

every aspect of the school district.

The Pasco Schools Citizens' Academy will consist of eight monthly meetings beginning in August 2022. Five meetings will be held during the day and three meetings will take place in the evening. Sessions will be a combination of informational lessons, tours, and classroom presentations. Participants will visit several of Pasco County's diverse schools; meet with district leaders, school personnel, and principals; and learn about special programs, curriculum, athletics, budget, student nutrition, school safety initiatives, and more.

"I am really happy that I was part of the initial co-hort that took this class. It has been an eye-opening experience for me to understand how the school district machinery works and how much thought and planning goes behind every aspect of running the schools that most of us take for granted," said one participant from the inaugural class.

The Citizens' Academy class will consist of 30 to 50 members from the community. The first class will be held on Aug. 18. The final meeting and graduation is set for April 27, 2023.

Northstar Place Branding & Marketing. The city entertained 10 different solicitations for a re-branding. At the June 13 meeting, council approved the committee's rankings. The firm's proposed project timeline is 34 weeks, encompassing market research, brand strategy, creative development, and action & implementation. The city plans to obtain deliverables from the service including: brochures, signage, a new city logo and tagline among

down into three phases: Phase I: Research, Insights & Strategy (\$30,000) Phase II & Phase III: Creative, Action plus Implementation (\$34,000) Travel (\$4,000).

There was some concern expressed by Knight regarding additional expenses that may emerge outside the scope of the contract, Knight highlighting that the rate of \$185/hour is one that the city would like to avoid. The item passed 4-0.

Straight to Citizen Comments. The first resident up was Kim Earle, who lives off of Phelps Road, which is technically in Pasco County not Zephyrhills, but her complaint was of the Trotter's Crossing development in Zephyrhills. Earle brought in both video and photographic evidence of a major water sheeting flood that occurred on her property after a July 1 rainstorm dumped

inches of water at the top of the hill in the development. Her issue was that the developers graded the hill and caused an inordinate amount of runoff onto her property. The evidence was abundantly clear. She reported damage to the inside of her home and to her fence, even to Phelps Road itself. Earle did mention that the contractor returned to the site days later and fixed her fence.

City staff was made aware the incident and contacted both the contractor and the SouthWest Florida Management District. Neither entity was present Monday and Smith asked city cttorney Matthew Maggard if a stop order would be appropriate. Maggard said that in light of the circumstances it would and a stop order was motioned and approved 4-0 for the project.


In other Citizen Comments, Historic Preservation Board appointee Elieen Westermann brought up the fact that the clock in Clock Plaza was not working. She made some inquiries about costs of renovating the clock tower and fixing the clock and even identified some sources for possible

funding of the project.

Last up was Faith Wilson of Main Street Zephyrhills. Wilson gave a report of Main Street, the projects it's taken on and the impact it's had on the community. She mentioned how social media traffic has increased and how Main Street hosts an event every month of the year. Wilson also used the platform to announce her stepping down from her post, stating how grateful she was to

serve Zephyrhills. The announcement garnered a round of applause from council chambers and Knight instigated a standing ovation for the out-going director.

The History Channel

- On July 14, 1789, Parisian revolutionaries and mutinous troops storm and dismantle the Bastille, a royal fortress built in 1370 that had come to symbolize the tyranny of the Bourbon monarchs. This dramatic action signaled the beginning of the French Revolution.
- On July 15, 1606, the great Dutch master Rembrandt van Rijn is born in Leiden. Rembrandt completed more than 600 paintings, many of them portraits or self-portraits. By the age of 22, he was accomplished enough to take on his own students.
- On July 16, 1935, the world's first parking meter, known as Park-O-Meter No. 1, is installed in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Indignant opponents of the meters considered paying for parking un-American, as it forced drivers to pay what amounted to a tax on their cars without due process of law.

- On July 19, 1956, Secretary of State John Foster Dulles announces that the United States is withdrawing its offer of financial aid to Egypt to help with the construction of the Aswan Dam on the Nile River. The Soviets rushed to Egypt's aid, and the Aswan Dam was officially
- On July 20, 1969, American astronaut Neil Armstrong, 240,000 miles from Earth, speaks these words to more than a billion people listening at home: "That is one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind." Stepping off the lunar landing module Eagle, Armstrong became the first human to walk on the surface of the moon.



For a second straight year, a local coach helps newcomers and other ballplayers hone their skills

As a longtime Zephyrhills Little League coach, Heath Horsely knows a thing or two about developing young ballplayers as well as helping the more experienced ones hone their skills on the diamond. That is why he organized a summer baseball camp for a second straight year.

The sessions, however, have been relocated. They are at the Samuel W. Pasco Recreation Complex, home to the Zephyrhills Little League. Last summer Horsely conducted his six-week camp at Charles B. Krusen Memorial Field, which formerly was the home to the Zephyrhills chapter of the Dixie Softball League. That league no longer exists in Zephyrhills.

'I think that probably helps," Horsely said of changing venues. "Krusen Field was alright. I'd just rather have the kids come out to the Zephyrhills Little League fields.

Horsely, who grew up playing baseball in the Zephyrhills Little League, knows firsthand how valuable some extra lessons on batting, catching, throwing and running the bases can be. In addition to coaching a junior baseball team in the league he also has coached the local all-star team at that level for the past six seasons

More than 30 young ballplayers signed up for the camp, which began in late June and runs through early August. Two-hour practice and

instructional sessions take place at one of the major baseball fields on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 6-8 p.m.

"They love it," Horsesaid. "It gives them something to do. We're all having fun out there.'

Lending a hand is Miguel Catalan, who coaches the Outlaws, a 10-and-under travel baseball team out of Spring Hill

in Hernando County. Two of Catalan's players outfielders Hunter Catalan, the coach's son, and Brantley Carlson — previously played in Zephyrhills. They showed up at a recent practice to train and encourage other youngsters.

"We've got some kids we brought from this (Zephyrhills) league and we're pushing them further in baseball," coach Catalan said.

"We work on fielding, batting, pitching. I want to get better," Hunter Catalan said. Carlson said he came to the camp to work

on his "pitching, speed and agility." Also helping out the younger kids were Jason Chase, a Zephyrhills Little League coach

who brought his stepson Baron Von Kripe, and Bailey Carter, an all-star on Horsely's junior team. "It'll help him out," Chase said of his stepson, who at the age of 9 this past season played in the minors. "It's a good learning experience

for the kids. I had a lot of kids (this past season) who didn't play before. This will give them a little jump; give them a little bit of knowledge on the fundamentals of baseball. By doing this it gives them a head start."

Added Carter, "It's kind of cool to teach them how to catch because they twist their

Among those taking part in the camp was 9-year-old Dylan Tedesco, who has not played in the local league yet. He said he came out to the field "so I could get better at baseball."

A recent session of the camp drew nearly 30 kids. Horsely and his assistants started them off with calisthenics to stretch and loosen up. That was followed by a series of fielding and baserunning drills.

Later, players were divided into two teams for a fun scrimmage with everyone batting from one team before the other side got to hit.

'We split them up to play a little sandlot baseball and to see what they can do," Horsely


















As was the case on occasion, a crime story was placed on the front page. That particular week a Zephyrhills man faced multiple charges following a chase through three counties. The 20-year-old faced multiple traffic offenses including grand theft auto. The chase began by a Zephyrhills patrolman on 5th Avenue at 3 a.m.

On a brighter note, Pasco County Commissioners autographed copies of The Historical Places of Pasco County and there was a photo of a cheerleading camp at the East Pasco YMCA with cheerleaders from Zephyrhills, Dade City and Wesley Chapel.

With 24 pages and two sections, there was plenty of room for local news and sports. Adorning the inside pages of section A were stories on county and city politics, road projects, obituaries and weddings, as well as police

Additionally, there were sections for opin-

ions, business and religion.

In sports, although it was summer time and high school athletes were taking a break there were plenty of athletic events to cover. As the sports editor back then I wrote about a variety of events, ranging from the professional ranks to an adult baseball league to youth baseball and softball programs.


Back then, we covered the Buccaneers in football and the Rowdies in soccer. On page 1 of sports we wrote about the Rowdies' 1-0 win over the Colorado Foxes at the University of South Florida's soccer stadium. That marked the fourth shutout of the season for goalkeeper Bill Andracki.

In American Legion baseball, a team that combined high school players from Zephyrhills and Land O' Lakes, East Central Pasco narrowly edged North Tampa 6-5. Zephyrhills ace right-hander Mark Roberts was the winning pitcher.

In the Dixie Softball League Belles All-Star tournament, Zephyrhills lost two of three games and were eliminated in the 13-15 age bracket. The late Louise Jordan helped coach that team.

The Pasco Rockets, a Zephyrhills-based team in the Tampa Bay Men's 40-and-over Baseball League, returned to the diamond after being idle for several weeks. The roster included Craig Milburn, Zephyrhills High's athletic director at the time.

Behind sports was the ever-popular park news, TV listings, classifieds and legals. Some things, it seems, never change.



HOLLYWOOD -- Is Brad Pitt breaking it to us gently that he plans to retire soon? Pitt told GQ Magazine, "I consider myself on my last leg. This last semester, or trimester, what is this section going to be?" At 58, he's won an Oscar, appeared in 60 films and produced 43 films. The \$83 million "Bullet Train," in which he stars with Sandra Bullock, drops Aug. 5. He was a producer on "Blonde," the controversial biographical fictionalized drama with Ana de Armas about Marilyn Monroe's life (out Sept. 23), costarring Adrien Brody as Arthur Miller, Bobby Cannavale as Joe DiMaggio and Caspar Phillipson as John F. Kennedy -- as well as "Women Talking," with co-producers Jeremy Kleiner and Dede Gardner (who each won Oscars for "12 Years A Slave" and "Moonlight") and four-time Oscar-winner Frances McDormand, starring "The Crown's" Claire Foy, McDormand, Rooney Mara, Ben Whishaw and Judith Ivey. The women talking are Mennonites who were drugged and assaulted for two years by the men of their colony.

Pitt makes his return to acting Christmas Day in "Babylon," by Oscar-winning "La La Land" director Damien Chazelle, reuniting Pitt with his "Once Upon a Time in Hollywood" costar Margot Robbie, in addition to Tobey Maguire, who is also a producer. "Babylon" focuses on how movies evolved from silent films to talkies. Pitt's "Once Upon a Time in Hollywood" director Quentin Tarantino offered, "He's one of the last remaining big-screen movie stars like Paul Newman, Robert Redford and Steve McQueen were, just a different breed of man." At 58, Brad Pitt can do anything he wants, so why retire? Brad, you've still got a lot of great movie roles left in you!

Adrian Grenier, who is only 45, has already thrown in the towel. The star of such films as "The Devil Wears Prada" (2006), "Entourage" (the TV series from 2004-2011), the "Entourage" film (2015), as well as The Hallmark movie "Christmas at Graceland: Home for the Holidays" (2019), left Hollywood (actually New York) and moved to Austin, Texas, admitting: "If you work hard, you can become famous. Then you make a lot of money ... but it was lackluster at the top. The work I used to do got created over time; you make something, but you don't ever know if it'll be good." He added: "It's a mask-wearing process. You're not even you, you're just playing!" He gave up acting and bought a homestead with his acting money five years ago and moved in with his girlfriend, Jordan. Over the past five years, he received his permaculture certification, and hopes he can now turn his farm into a wildlife sanctuary. Where's his "Entourage" when he needs farmhands desperately?

"Just knowing who Jesus is and basically just to have a good time," Toscano said of the primary aims of the program, later singing, "This train is bound for glory. It's not a real train. You're the real train and you're bound for heaven."

An offering then was taken for the Pregnancy Care Center of Zephyrhills with modest goals set to help those in need. Meanwhile, parishioner David Isbell worked in the back of the room as the video technician.

Following the skit on stage performed by Toscano and her children, parents and their children ventured over to the kitchen area for snacks before breaking off into small groups and walking to different parts of the church grounds.

Adult leaders overseeing the youngsters were Travis and Shelby Cunningham, a married couple whose twin sons Luke and Liam attended the sessions, Jacob Jayne, Tammy Wentworth, Kathryn Castle and Carol Joslin.

Helping out by pointing the kids in the right direction were teenage volunteers Valerie Roberts,

"It brings back all my childhood memories," Roberts said.

"It's really nice because you get to help the kids like you

were helped and I like to help them understand," Kelly said.

Someone else who is giving back and recalled attending a vacation bible school when he was young was Travis Cunningham, who at one point worked with boys and girls in the arts and crafts room.
