Fits and starts and Zoom

Despite opening in the most challenging of circumstances, the Sarah Vande Berg Tennis & Wellness Center has weathered the early storm and is zooming ahead

The buzz around the new Zephyrhills tennis facility, named after one of the town's dearly-departed tennis stars, was reaching a fever pitch, early in 2020. The City of Zephyrhills invested in it, there was private investment coming in, future CEO Pascal Collard put

close to seven figures of his own money into it. Then the COVID-19 Pandemic hit. The United States and the world, for that matter, hadn't seen a global pandemic like it in over a century. States locked down, people lost their jobs, businesses shuttered and yet, the Sarah Vande Berg Tennis & Wellness Center, known locally, regionally and nationally now, as "SVB" was set to open, more or less at the height of the pan-

"There's no doubt it was a stressful time for us," Collard said. "It was a scary time for sure, we weren't sure how long it was going to last."

By late spring, the state was in lockdown. Schools went online and the screws on businesses turned tighter. Construction at SVB was forging ahead. They were on the clock, anticipating an early fall opening. The

A Look Back ... JULY 15, 1971

New series harkens back to days gone by. Let's look at the above date

The year 1971 is the subject of our 10th Look Back. Massive headlines abounded with two moon landings by U.S. Apollo space crews, Walt Disney World opening in Orlando, the Ed Sullivan Show airing its final episode and major earthquakes in Los Angeles, Italy and Turkey.

In sports, the Baltimore Colts beat the Dallas Cowboys in Super Bowl V, the Milwaukee Bucks, who currently are in the National Basketball Association Finals against the Phoenix Suns, defeated the Washington Bullets for their only title and the Pittsburgh Pirates beat the Baltimore Orioles in the World Series.

Locally, the front page of The Zephyrhills News, billed back than as the Voice of the Pure Water City, no less than 14 stories or announcements. On the order of city council a warrant was issued to a local businessman for alleged junk law violations, council appealed FDOT plans for an overpass on U.S. 301 and a public hearing was held on road closings.

Council members also approved of providing materials to repair the Girl Scout Hut at Shepard Park, heard complaints from a representative of Forest Heights over air pollution from Kash N' Karry's trash incinerator and honored a request by Pasco County Cablevision to cancel an agreement for service in Zephyrhills.

In other political news, the Pasco County Commission tentatively approved a \$7.6 million budget with a millage rate of 9.65, an increase of 3.25 over the previous year, and encouraged hospital privileges for osteopathic physicians. Zephyrhills School Board Member Pat Murphy showed his objection over bids on furniture for a new library at Gulf High by breaking a leg off a chair.

Zephyrhills softball team places third in the state tournament

Minor softball all-stars split four games in the Little League's state series at Rockledge

A long road trip for a Zephyrhills Little League All-Star team resulted in a four-game split. That 2-2 mark by the minor softball squad earned Zephyrhills a third-place finish in the state tournament at Rockledge.

Made up of the best players from two minor softball teams, Zephyrhills played four games in three days, sandwiching two convincing victories around a pair of losses.

Afterward, coach Haven Mills, who came up through the Zephyrhills Little League and later starred at Zephyrhills High, was content with her team's showing in the series on Florida's east

"We definitely could've won the whole thing if it wasn't for the delays and a couple of bad calls, but that's softball," said Mills, who previously was an assistant for a Zephyrhills all-star softball

Zephyrhills opened the tourney with a 20-7 loss to Countryside, a game played over two days and at two locations — from Rockledge to nearby Cocoa — due to rainouts and curfews. The team trailed by a slim 5-4 margin before Countryside





Also on the front, two Zephyrhills juveniles in a theft and damage at the Zephyrhills Skating Rink, twin colts were born but only one survived and 15 major baseball players made the

Zephyrhills Little League All-Star team.

Aside from the skating rink break-in, there were crime briefs scattered throughout the newspaper. When pulling over a car for reckless driving at 2:30 a.m. a Zephyrhills Police Officer found two of three occupants naked. A Crystal Springs man was arrested for an armed robbery of the Zephyrhills Speed-ee Shop. Two 13-year-old Zephyrhills girls, reported as runaways, found in a Florida Plaza Motel room of two Dade City men.

There were a few accidents as well. A Georgia man lost control of a semi-truck tractor unit during a heavy rainstorm and skidded into a big sign in front of Ken Russell's Standard Oil Service Station, and a Zephyrhills boy was treated for drinking

Two Zephyrhills firms wrote county school policies, Zephyrhills senior watch repairman Fred Bromley, 70, retired, a proposal to split Pasco into two counties would give the west side the bulk of the tax base and four brothers and a sister who had not met in 62 years reunited in a Zephyrhills home.


12-volt car battery at Western Auto could be had for \$17.95.


FREEDOM NOW AND FOREVER **OUR HOPE IS PERFECT BLOOD**

Wealth of Health

Healthy activities for kids of all ages


Children have a seemingly endless supply of energy. Channeling that energy into something positive can benefit kids' minds and bod-

The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends various amounts of daily physical activity for children depending on their ages and abilities. Adhering to these recommendations is especially important in the wake of what many

public health officials fear has become an epidemic of childhood obesity in many nations. For example, the United States-based Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reports that roughly 13.7 million children between the ages of two and 19 are presently obese. In Canada, the Childhood Obesity Foundation reports that childhood obesity rates have hovered around 12 percent for years.







Routine physical activity can help children maintain healthy weights, and it also pays dividends for youngsters' mental health. According to the American Psychological Association, children between the ages of six and 18 who exercise regularly tend to have lower levels of depression, stress and psychological distress. Those findings, part of a 2019 study published in the journal Sports Medicine, reflect the ways exercise affects the mind. And the mental benefits don't stop there, as the study also found that youngsters who are physically active also have higher levels of positive self-image, life satisfaction and psychological well-being.

The amount of physical activity children need each month depends on their age, and the AAP recommends the following age-based

• Infants: The AAP recommends infants get at least 30 minutes of tummy time and other interactive play throughout the day.

• Toddlers: Toddlers can be tough to keep up with, and parents can channel that energy into something positive by ensuring their kids get at least three hours of physical activity every day. Free play outside and daily neighborhood walks are some examples of appropriate physical activities for children in this age group.

 Preschoolers: Three-plus hours of physical activity, including one hour of moderate to vigorous exercise, is recommended for preschool-aged youngsters. Tumbling, throwing and catching are some of the activities recommended by the AAP.

 Elementary school students: School-aged children need at least 60 minutes of physical activity on most days of the week. The AAP recommends giving children in this age group ample opportunities for free play but also notes that organized sports focused on fun can be great outlets for kids in elementary school. Parents can speak with their children's pediatricians about appropriate muscle/bone strengthening activities, which the AAP recommends three days a

• Middle school students: Students in this age group need the same amount and types of exercise that elementary school students need. But the AAP advises parents to guide children

week for kids in this age group.

toward physical activities that encourage socialization and to avoid having kids this age specialize in a single sport.

Teenagers: Teenagers need an hour or more of physical activity most days of the week. Muscle/bone strengthening activities should be included three days per week. Activities that encourage socialization and competition are beneficial to teenagers' development.

Physical activity can benefit kids in myriad ways and should be a vital component of their daily lives.



City council releases city manager evaluation, sets millage rate

After an invocation from Pastor Nick DeFord, the July 12 city council meeting got underway with Zephyrhills Mayor Gene Whitfield announcing the results of the annual City Manager's Evaluation Summary. Each city council member evaluated city manager William Poe's performance from July 2020 to July 2021. Each council member filled out an evaluation form based on different elements of the city manager's duties. Each item was ranked from one to five, with five being the highest mark or "exceeds above expectations." Whitfield announced that Poe's composite rating was 4.20117.

Next up was the Consent Agenda. Three items were contained therein and they were bundled together and passed 5-0 with the initial motion filed by councilman Charlie Proctor. Item 2.1 approved the minutes for the June 28 meeting.

Item 2.2 approved a contract with BRW Contracting to construct a reclaimed water line extension. On Feb. 7, 2021, the city distributed Bid 11-21-03 for the construction of the Reclaimed Water Line Extension in the area of 12th Street and CR 54; North at Dairy Road; East on Daughtery Road and west side of Wire Road to the Otis Allen intersection where the connection will be made. Additionally, a connection at Dairy Road to serve the hospital will be connected. Future users of the line can be anyone along the route including the potential of going to the Scotland Yard's golf course. The \$959,145 estimate, which is budgeted in the FY 2021 Budget, is an estimate. Storms in Texas and the CO-VID-19 Pandemic have made supplies more expensive and even difficult to attain. Once the materials order is complete, a finalized budget will be released.

Item 2.3 was a resolution allowing city council to apply for a Department of Environmental Protection State Revolving Fund Loan to pay for the reclaimed water line extension.

Business Item 3.1 was a second reading that repealed Ordinance No.: 1377-19, regarding solar energy system standards and brought the city code in line with the 2008 Florida Solar Rights Act. It passed 5-0.

The big announcement in the Finance Director's Report wasn't all that big of an announcement. The city millage rate will remain right at 6.35, where it is currently. The rate can be lowered but not raised. Finance Director Ted Beason spoke of the city's \$946 million in total assets and \$103 million in total growth.

There was no public comment and it was passed 5-0. In the City Attorney's Report, the first reading of Ordinance No.: 1419-21 would have approved a small scale future land use map amendment to the city's comprehensive plan, changing the future land use map designation from City Residential Suburban to City Residential Urban. It also would have amended the zoning City R3 (medium density residential) to R4 (multi-family residential). Senior Planner Rodney Corriveau took the podium briefly and fielded questions from the dais. He stated that planning staff were comfortable with the changes and answered councilwoman Jodi Wilkeson's question that multi-family units and rentals would be permitted in the R4 designation. Councilman Ken Burgess recused himself prior to the vote and it passed

In council comments, each council member praised the efforts and preparedness of both ZPD Chief Derek Brewer and ZPD, as well as Shane LeBlanc and the public works department with regard to the recent brush with Hurricane Elsa. 




prospects were dim.

Prior to opening, people were telling me I was crazy, why I chose to build SVB in Zephyrhills, everything was shutting

down and we had no members," Collard said.
From March 30 to Sept. 1, SVB had exactly zero memberships. By the time of their soft opening on Sept. 21, they had just

"Membership was the most scary thing," Collard said. "Our business model was based on 400 members and we had 15.

Collard brought in a business partner, Andy Sorrentino, who moved to Florida from Philadelphia that June. SVB went ahead with the grand opening on Oct. 11 but they would have to come up with something besides memberships to keep the ship

"We had to reinvent ourselves, quickly," Collard said. Collard and SVB started an academy for kids. They were expecting 12, they now have 50. They had made arrangements to bring in a local coffee shop and cafe. The Wesley Chapel location went under and SVB elected to go with a more expansive menu with the option to cater big events. That led to the introduction of Vesh, who Collard touts as the, "best caterer from Tampa." Now Sunday brunches are always packed.

Massage therapy at SVB had a sluggish start. It had no customers for the first several weeks. Now it's fully-booked and SVB has since hired a second massage therapist.

Collard and SVB had to make some tough decisions. They struck out, expanded when a more conservative voice might say to hunker down. Collard is not one to hunker down.

The facility already had hard and clay tennis courts and had the footprint in place for grass tennis courts, meant to emulate the Wilmbelton playing surface; much like the hard and clay courts were designed to mimic the US Open and French Open surfaces, respectively. Instead, Collard and SVB called an audible and put in a beach where the grass was set to go. This opened up both beach volleyball and beach tennis.

Beach volleyball is a popular sport in the South and 53 colleges play it. There are no public courts in the area and usually one has to hit up the beach to find a net and enough sand to play on. Not only does SVB now offer it, they are opening it up in classic Collard fashion -big. A grand open tournament is already

scheduled for this coming August.
So after a few fits and starts, SVB is roaring, zooming ahead. A \$4.6 million state appropriation is coming in to buttress a \$15 million investment in a 26,000-square-foot indoor facility, on a 10-acre parcel on Simons Road, across from SVB. Collard expects this facility to support volleyball, basketball but also double as

indoor event space and even a concert venue. Cryotherapy and the salt room were part of the initial plan but now SVB is adding Neurofeedback and Biofeedback, an interactive computer system that helps athletes and non-athletes achieve peak performance training and overall mental wellness. Just last week, they added on-site IV service, where people can get the nutrients and hydration they need intravenously.

Five days ago, SVB completed a purchase of 30 acres of property in what they are calling Phase III. It's to-be-determined what exactly the use for the parcel, just a five-minute walk from the clubhouse, will be but Collard says, "ideas are welcome." SVB is now closing in on 200 memberships. While it's attracted athletes and non-athletes from all over the world, cultivating the local population is the next step.



Deputy-involved shooting/ barricaded subject in Dade City

Deputies were attempting to locate an individual in the State Road 52 and Smith Road area of Dade City to serve warrants for three charges, which included driving without a license, grand theft auto and fleeing to elude, at approximately 9:50 p.m. on July 12.

The individual, identified as Lewis Moores, a white male born July 8, 1971, fired shots from inside a residence toward two deputies outside following announcements made by deputies on scene. They asked him to exit the residence peacefully for approximately 10 minutes prior to the shooting.

The individual continued to fire at the deputies as they moved back for cover as one deputy returned fire. The individual refused to come out of the residence and spoke with deputies for over two hours while periodically firing additional shots.

No deputies were injured after the individual fired at them. The Florida Department of Law Enforcement was notified, per agency policy for deputy-involved shootings.





Coach Charlie Heath celebrates 700th career win with wife and team manager Lesa

When they founded a travel softball team that plays home games at the old Dixie Softball League field, which is adjacent to the Charles B. Krusen Memorial Field, in 2007 Charlie and Lesa Heath did not envision milestone victories.

The husband-and-wife duo from Zephyrhills simply sought to provide a local outlet for talented ballplayers and even help a few of those girls land college scholarships. Among them was Rachel Heath, a Wiregrass Ranch graduate who later played at Saint Leo.

In a tournament at Clermont last month, Charlie notched career win 700. He downplayed that mark, crediting the ballplayers instead. "I've been doing it a long time," Charlie said. "It doesn't mean

nothing to me. It's all them."

Added Lesa, "It's not just Charlie, it's a team thing." Lyndsey Calton, a 2016 Pasco High graduate who landed a schol-

arship to Polk State College thanks to her five seasons with the Misfits, was a player when Charlie got his 500th win. Now she helps out as an assistant coach.

"I love helping them, but I would much rather be playing," she

The Misfits, comprised of 14-18-year-olds from Zephyrhills, Dade City, Wesley Chapel and Lutz, typically play about a dozen tournaments from the end of the high school season in May through Decem-

So far, they have done extremely well. In five tourneys the Misfits have gone undefeated to win championships, one in Orlando at Disney's Wide World of Sports Complex and the other at Clermont's National Training Center, which is considered one of the premier fastpitch complexes in the southeastern U.S.

In the most recent series the Misfits finished third last weekend

in Clearwater. They have also played in tourneys at Bartow and Lakeland, two cities that traditionally have formidable high school programs, and next weekend are scheduled to compete in a Tier I Showcase at Plant City. That upcoming series often brings out college coaches and scouts.

They look pretty good," Lesa said of this year's group. "It's a pretty talented team."

Plus, they are a relatively underage team playing against older girls. On the Misfits, there are more players just coming out of middle school than those who will be high school seniors.

Among the young players who will be high school freshmen are Aliyah Zito, Shalyn Carter and Laila Woolfolk, the latter of whom recently was part of Stewart Middle's championship girls basketball

Cat Durden, a middle infielder who injured her back last March while playing for Pasco High, tried to play through the injury but now is sidelined. Still, she comes out to support her travel ball teammates.

'I like both, but I like travel because it's more competition," she said in a comparison with the Misfits and high school softball. Replacing Durden at shortstop this summer has been Olivia Chap-

man, a Zephyrhills Christian Academy player who came up through the Zephyrhills Little League and is in her first season with the Misfits. On the other end of the spectrum is Laci Carter, a pitcher-outfield-

er who played on many all-star softball teams in the Dade City Little League and has been with the Misfits for five years. Like the others she

relishes the competitiveness and camaraderie of travel ball.

"It's the atmosphere. It's like a family," she said. "The determination is different. (Travel ballplayers) want it more than Little League."

Rounding out the roster are: Haley Brengal, Christina Chiavetta,
Maggie Cumingham, Sofia Gaffigan, Samantha Layva and Alexis Tillis; along with assistant coach Byron Durden.
