# Primary Election coming up Aug. 23

A primary election with other non-partisan offices and referendums is right around the corner

The political landscape in the United States is tumultuous to say the least. The Jan. 6 Hearings are forging ahead, a landmark Supreme Court decision overturned Roe versus Wade, gas prices are skyrocketing, let's not even get into the issues at the state and local level. Regardless of where you stand on these

issues, your chance to have your voice heard and to utilize your constitutionally-given right to vote for your representatives, judges and referendums is

coming up - fast.

August 23 marks the date of the regular primary election, ahead of this November's general election. Whether you're Republican, Democrat, Independent or third party, this August's primary election is one that you'll both want to research and show up for.

Here's why

Outside of the partisan primaries, there are a number of items on the August ballot that you'll want to consider before bubbling in that oval. Perhaps the biggest one is the Penny for Pasco referendum.

Penny for Pasco was originally approved by county voters back in 2004. It passed again in 2012 with 70 percent approval. Between 2005 and the end of 2014, Penny for Pasco generated \$320,000,000 in funds that were divided between public schools, the Pasco County Commission and infrastructure for cities within Pasco County.

If approved by voters in the upcoming primary election, the surtax will stay in place until 2039. While the final numbers have not been tabulated, it is estimated that Penny for Pasco will generate \$700,000,000 between 2014 and 2024.

The way a surtax works is that it is an additional

# Basketball director relocates youth program to Zephyrhills

Chapel Rip City called a handful of places home until a warehouse and gym were built off Chancey Road

A youth basketball program founded in 2013 at Sports & Field in Wesley Chapel has been on the move since that building shut down and has since been transformed into a brewery. A new basketball program has emerged and it has a new home in Zephyrhills.

Colin Bolinger, who ran the organization when it was at Sports & Field, kept it going by relocating to the new Cypress Creek High School five years ago.

"I still had a bunch of players who had nowhere to go, so I started my own program," he said. "It really started to take off. Facilities (such as the school's new gym) sell the program."

Shut down briefly in 2020 due to restrictions stemming from the coronavirus pandemic, the renamed Chapel Rip City program underwent a resurgence. Four all-boys teams, ages 4-12, practiced at the Land O' Lakes Recreation Complex and later at a warehouse in Tampa, the latter of which shut down late last year.

At that point, Bolinger took matters into his own hands and utilizing his own funds had a warehouse built at 40417 Chancey Rd. in Zephyrhills. Boys teams in four age groups now call that gym home and in the spring the non-profit program expanded by adding a girls team with players ranging from sixth-through ninth-graders.





percentage of state sales tax that comes back to the respective county. The Florida state sales tax is six percent. In Pasco County, the sales tax is seven percent. That one-percent difference is where the funding from Penny for Pasco comes from. It is not a property tax, it is not an income tax, it is an additional sales tax that has been in place since 2004.

Some other non-partisan decisions are for your Pasco County School Board members. Districts 1, 3 and 5 are all up for grabs. District 1 is a sprawling district that covers the whole east side of the county, including Zephyrhills and Dade City. Incumbent Allen Altman is not seeking re-elec-

The District 1 race will be between Al Hernandez, Stephen A. Meisman and James Washington. Each has their own website. Each is also profiled with links to said websites on pascovotes.gov. District 3 and District 5 are on the west side of the county but these are still board members that will shape decisions affecting Pasco County students, parents and teachers.

It's very easy to look past the judges. Two Circuit and one County office are up for election. Nicholas "Nick" Cvnthia Fiorentino and Newton face off in the 6th Judicial Circuit Group 22. Scott Finelli and Keith Meyer run

off for the 6th Judicial Circuit Group 27 and for County Judge Group 4 - Clementine "CC" Conde and Patrick Moore face off. Again, each of these candidates have their own websites. Judicial candidates are limited in what they can say, politically but their experience and track record are available. There are also profiles on the

candidates on floridabar.org.

On to the partisan offices. Pasco County is an ever-changing landscape. That much is true geographically and geopolitically, too. According to the Supervisor of Elections website and as of July 11, 2022 - there are 403,216 active and registered voters in Pasco County; of which, 163,231 are registered Republican, 113,819 are registered Democrat, 118,044 are no-party affiliated and 8,122 are registered in a third party. Florida is a closed-primary state, where voters can only vote in a party preference primary if they are registered to that party. FYI, the book closing date to register with a political party ahead of the primary is July 25.

Republicans will not have incumbent Scott Franklin to represent them in US Congressional District 15, as Franklin is not seeking re-election to that post. Demetrius Grimes, Laurel Lee, Kevin McGovern, Kelli Stargel and Jackie Toledo will vie for the nomination in a conservativeleaning House district. Democrats will field: Gavin Brown, Alan M. Cohn, Eddie Geller, Cesar Ramirez and William VanHorn in an effort to determine who will challenge the Republican

Both Republicans and Democrats have primaries to select their nominee for Agriculture Commissioner. Current Agriculture Commissioner Nikki Fried is now a Democratic candidate for governor. Republicans have to choose from former Senate President Wilton Simpson and James W. Shaw. Democrats will select from: Naomi Esther Blemur, J.R. Gaillot and Ryan Morales to run for Agriculture Commissioner.

Republicans get to choose their candidates for two County Commission seats. Pasco County District 2 - which contains the southwest corner of the County, will field Republican candidates: Troy F. Stevenson, Seth Weightman and Christie Zimmer. District 4 - which contains the south-central part of the county, will field: Gary Bradford, Christina "Fitzy" Fitzpatrick and Shannon J. Wittwer.

Democrats have some big choices to make, too. Democrats, not just in the county but state-wide, will select their nominee to run for U.S. Senate in November against incumbent Marco Rubio. Ricardo De La Fuente, Val Demings, Brian Rush and William Sanchez will all vie for the chance to run against Rubio in November.


In this upcoming primary, Democrats will select a nominee to take on current governor Ron DeSantis, even as speculation on DeSantis's 2024 presidential run circulates. Democrats will select from: Charlie Crist, Cadance Daniel, Nicole "Nikki" Fried and Robert L. Willis to nominate their candidate for governor. Democrats will also select an opponent to run against incumbent Ashley Moody for Attorney General from: Aramis Ayala, Jim Lewis, Daniel Uhlfelder.

Each of the candidates mentioned maintains a website of their own. Pascovotes.gov is a great resource to learn more about the candidates. Another great non-partisan resource for information about candidates

and offices is ballotpedia.org. Lastly, keep an eye out for debates and / or town halls that will give you an in-person look and listen for the candidates you'll be voting for.

Don't take this right you've been given lightly. Millions of people around the world and even in the history of this country don't or do not have that right. Surely, that's enough cause to both show up at your polling place and also not to show up blind with regard to your choices.



# The History Channel

- On July 21, 1899, Ernest Miller Hemingway, author of such novels as "For Whom the Bell Tolls" and "The Old Man and the Sea," is born in Oak Park, Illinois. The influential American literary icon became known for his straightforward prose and use of understatement.
- On July 22, 2005, "March of the Penguins," a French-made documentary about emperor penguins in Antarctica, opens in theaters across the U.S. The film went on to win numerous awards, including an Oscar, and became one of the highest-grossing documentaries in movie history.
- On July 23, 1918, Della Sorenson kills the first of her seven victims in Nebraska. Over the next seven years, friends, relatives and acquaintances of Sorenson died under mysterious circumstances. In 1925, Sorenson was arrested when she made an unsuccessful attempt at killing two children with poisoned cookies.
- On July 24, 1567, during her imprisonment at Lochleven Castle in Scotland, Mary Queen of Scots is forced to abdicate in favor of her 1-year-old son, later crowned King James VI of Scotland. In 1542, while just 6 days old, Mary had ascended to the Scottish throne upon the death of her father, King James V.
- On July 25, 1832, the first recorded railroad accident in U.S. history occurs when four people are thrown off a vacant car near Quincy, Massachusetts. The victims had been invited to view the process of transporting loads of stone when a cable on a vacant car snapped, throwing them off the train and over a 34-foot cliff.
- On July 26, 1931, a swarm of grasshoppers descends on crops throughout Iowa, Nebraska and South Dakota, devastating millions of acres. The swarm was said to be so thick that it blocked out the sun and one could shovel the grasshoppers with a scoop. Cornstalks were eaten to the ground and fields left completely bare.
- On July 27, 1981, Adam John Walsh, age 6, is abducted from a mall in Hollywood, Florida, and later found murdered. Adam's father, John Walsh, became a leading victims rights activist and host of the long-running television show "America's Most Wanted."

# How to overcome a fitness plateau

Each individual has his or her own fitness goals when beginning an exercise regimen. Perhaps the plan is to lose a set amount of weight or lift a certain amount of weight? Goals help people assess their workouts whether or not they are achieving the desired results.

Some call this General Adaption Syndrome. Even though hitting a plateau may seem frustrating, it is a good sign that an individual is making progress in a fitness program.

# How to overcome a plateau? The American Heart

Association says one way to overcome a plateau is to follow the F.I.T.T principle of exercise. This stands for Frequency, Intensity, Time, and Type. Once a plateau has been reached, a person will have to change one or more components of F.I.T.T. to once again get desired results. That may mean increasing frequency and/or intensity,

spending more time in an exercise session, or changing the type of workout. If the plateau involves a lack of weight loss, then tracking food for a week or two can show just how many calories are going in versus how many

are expended. Often, hitting a plateau can be traced to dietary changes.

### **Banish boredom**

Another factor in hitting fitness plateaus that people may not realize is mental motivation. An individual who is becoming bored in a workout may not put forth the same level of effort, and that can manifest itself in a lack of results. Modifying the

workout or attending a new program can be a small trigger to reach a new fitness level. A fitness plateau is something active





The early voting period, at 12 locations countywide, will begin Aug. 13 and ends Aug.





# **Pasco Sheriff's Office prepares** for back to school

HOLLYWOOD -- I was 11, and Carol Burnett was 26 when we first met. I haunted a candy store next to the off-Broadway Phoenix Theater, where Carol was starring in "Once Upon a Mattress." When she became a regular on "The Garry Moore Show," I was her guest at tapings each week. Had it not been for Carol, you might not be reading this. "The Carol Burnett Show" became a classic CBS variety series, and she became a legend.

At 89, Carol's in her third marriage to Hollywood Bowl Orchestra drummer Brian Miller, and they're celebrating 21 years together come November. The "Carol Burnett Show" and "Mama's Family" have been huge successes in syndication for years. She could easily rest on her laurels, but happily, she's signed to be a regular in the 10-part Apple TV+ series "Mrs. American Pie," produced by and starring Oscar-winner Laura Dern, who's assembled a great cast: Kristen Wiig, Allison Janney, Ricky Martin and Josh Lucas. It's about a woman trying to break into Palm Beach Society. Thanks, Carol, for pointing me in the right direction.

Obviously taking a cue from Lin-Manuel Miranda's mega successful "Hamilton," which depicted all of our forefathers diversely (the only non-person-of-color being King George III), a revival of the classic musical "1776" is now headed to Broadway, getting booked for the Ahmanson Theater in Los Angeles from April 5 to May 7, 2023. This production will feature a cast of female, trans and nonbinary performers. Since the show originally consisted of mostly 23 men and only 2 women -- being about the Continental Congress' creation of the Declaration of Independence -- the question is, Are they rewriting history, or are they just taking many liberties?

Movie theaters may finally be getting their audiences back. It's going to be a threeway fight between "Top Gun: Maverick," which joined the billion-dollar film club after one month in release; "Jurassic World: Dominion," which reached a billion-dollar gross in half the time; and "Elvis," which swiveled out of the gate strongly and is nipping at their heels. Moviegoers were stunned by Tom Hanks' portrayal of Col. Tom Parker, partly because they didn't know Parker was a greedy, ruthless man who purposely held Elvis Presley back to make more money. Sept. 8 will bring Hanks as "Pinocchio's" father, Geppetto, and on Dec. 25, he'll be a grumpy retiree in "A Man Called Otto." Tom Cruise turned 60 on July 3, and if "Elvis" eventually beats "Maverick" at the box office, does that mean Tom will be cruised out to pasture by an Elvis impersonator?

The Dade City museum put on a night time event this past Saturday with glimpses into Florida's rich and colorful history

With current temperatures soaring, the Pioneer Florida Museum & Village took their scorching summer season of events indoors. In June, the museum featured a Civil War Homefront event that portrayed an 1864 convalescent hospital in a small Florida town. The 1905 Enterprise Church, which has a large "window shaker" air conditioning unit, was converted to the hospital, complete with a doctor, nurses and wounded soldiers. Inside the main building, presentations on medicine in the 19th Century and civilian life during the war, even samples of blackeyed pea soup were given. About the only thing suffering outside were Civil War reenactors portraying local Home Guard

For the museum's second summer installment, they tore a page out of Hollywood cinema with their Night at the Museum

Night at the Museum featured eight different docents, dressed in period regalia, depicting either an historical figure or a generic character demonstrating a craft or skill of yesteryear. Museum curator Andy Warrener portrayed Spanish conquistador Alvar Nunez Cabeza de Vaca in the section of the museum dedicated to prehistory and the 16th Century. Adjacent to Warrener, in the covered Cracker porch were museum docents Deanne Absher and Tiffany Davis demonstrating crafts using corn husks. Already on display in the area were two brooms constructed of corn husks.

Continuing counter-clockwise around the museum was historian and author Keith Kohl portraying a soldier from the 2nd

Seminole War. Kohl was accompanied by his son Johnathan. Inside the Lockey Tool Room, resident carpenter Rob Schuler and his wife Susan demonstrated different wood-working techniques. Just outside the tool room, museum association trustee Wayne Sweat demonstrated how a linotype was used. The Model 32 Linotype that was donated to the museum by The Zephyrhills News and was the very same model that Sweat used early in his career as a journalist.

Next up was Sheyenne McAlister in the Cracker Cowboy section, discussing early cattle ranching in Florida and the role of the Cow Cavalry during the American Civil War. On into the Civil War section of the museum, history teacher and historian Caleb Greinke did a first-person portrayal of Samuel Pasco, who Pasco County is named after.

Lastly, in the World War II section of the museum's main building, Hannah Schultze depicted lady Marines, complete with uniforms, identification patches, manuals and lots of sto-

The museum dimmed the lights to give the night time feel, even though it was still broad daylight at 6 p.m. when the event

"Last year we attended a reenactment, so we bought an annual membership in the Pioneer Museum," commented Lynn Smith of Brooksville. "Now we come out to whatever sounds interesting and bring our friends."

It was a bit of a change-of-pace for the museum. Typically, historical presentations are given in the third person point of view. For the Night at the Museum event, the characters truly came to life with first person presentations.

First person portrayals are difficult because you are limited in what you can say based on the character you are portraying and what time period it is," Kohl said. "For instance, you can't talk about when your character died or about anything that happened after their death. There's also a lot of fun you can have with the public being shocked by their clothing and how each of them carries a soul-capturing device - a camera.

That type of a portrayal was a fresh approach for most of the



"We have been coming here for years," said Michelle Williams of Dade City, "But we did not expect this unique event. We learned more than usual through the people role playing characters of different eras of the central Florida area.'
