Florida Medical Clinic expansion is complete

New facility off Eiland Boulevard provides more doctor's offices and exam rooms

The expansion of the Florida Medical Clinic is now complete with physician's offices, exam rooms and hospital rooms open to the public. The facility, which is adjacent to the Diagnostic Clinic, was built along Eiland Boulevard and borders Simons Road.

A new two-story building contains the following departments — primary care, nephrology, otolaryngology/ENT (ear, nose, throat), audiology, laboratory, neurology, pain management and hematology/oncology.

In essence, clinic officials describe the new facility as an expansion of a multi-specialty clinic consistent with the Florida Medical concept. Joe Delatorre, the clinic's chief executive officer overseeing the new site as well as other facilities in the company, proudly welcomed the most recent addition.

"Florida Medical Clinic has been fortunate enough to continue growing as our neighborhoods have grown around us," Delatorre said. "As a result, we are proud to announce the opening of our newest multi-disciplinary facility in Zephyrhills."

In addition to the adjacent diagnostic center, there is a Florida Medical Clinic at 38135 Market Square off U.S. 301, just north of County Road 54. That facility has been there for about 25 years.

Another Florida Medical Clinic expansion took place in 2015 in Wesley Chapel. In all, Florida Medical Clinic has combinations of doctors' offices, hospital rooms and exam rooms in three Zephyrhills

Council gives the go-ahead for new residential development

Trotters Crossing, already approved by the planning commission, would have 91 homes on 30 acres

The Zephyrhills City Council cleared the path for a new residential development on the north side of the city along the U.S. 301 corridor. Commissioners voted 3-2 Monday night in council chambers to move forward with the project.

City planner Todd Vande Berg made a presentation for the project as well as a rezoning request that was submitted by CBD Real Estate Investment and Cornelison Engineering & Design. The property was annexed into the city more than 10 years ago.

"The north corridor is transforming. It's evolving," Vande Berg said before much deliberation by council members and several citizens. "The value of undeveloped land has gone up dramatically in the past decade."

Trotters Crossing, which would be comprised of 91 single-family homes on 30.48 acres, on a parcel of land just north of Phelps Road and west of U.S. 301, has already been given the okay by Pasco County officials. The planning commission approved the project by a 4-2 margin.

In Zephyrhills, councilwoman Jodi Wilkerson, who made a motion for approval to have city staff workup an ordinance for the project, councilman Lance Smith and council president Ken Burgess, voted in favor of it.

"Initially I was not inclined to zone that property, but we had to do something," Smith said in closing remarks.

"I'm glad it's not 130-unit apartment buildings," Wilkerson said. "At this point I don't have any major objections to it."

Dissenting votes came from council vice president Charlie Proctor and councilman Alan Knight.

"The property, sooner or later, is going to be developed," Knight said. "We can't hold back progress, but 91 homes, whew ... that's a lot of homes."

Added Proctor, "For me, it's too much density."

Vande Berg pointed out that developers are not likely to build homes on one-acre sites these days

Explore Your World - Fort King National Historic Landmark

In this summer series, The Zephyrhills News takes you on a tour through the natural and historical treasures in Central Florida

As one might imagine, the Fort King Trail finishes at, you guessed it - Fort King. In our summer series, we've covered some of the state parks make the string of 19th Century forts built in Florida. In this installment, we cover the final destination. Major Francis Dade's doomed column during the Dade Massacre in 1835 was headed to Fort King. The reason Osceola was not present at the Dade Massacre was that he was hunting former army general, congressman and Indian Agent Wiley Thompson, who had put him in chains just months prior.

Osceola and a small band of Seminole warriors ambushed and assassinated Thompson at the very gate of Fort King while the Dade Massacre was occurring nearly simultaneously. Less than six months later, the fort was abandoned and the Seminoles burned it down. This was not uncommon with military forts in Florida.

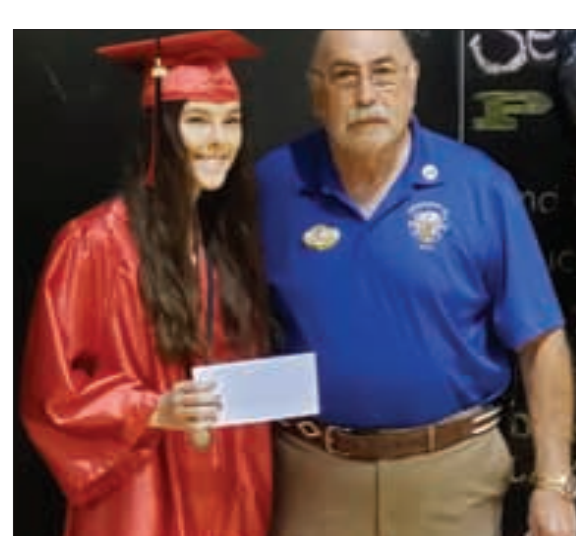

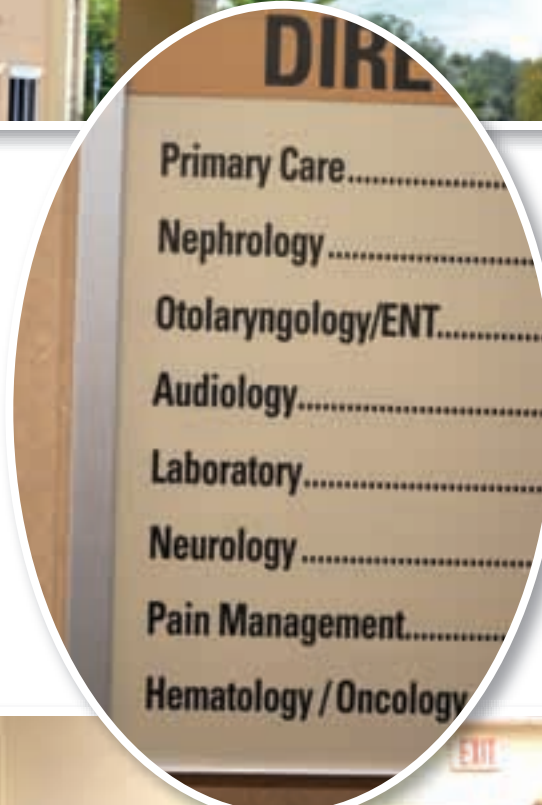

locations, another three in Wesley Chapel and one in Dade City.

“This just solidifies the strong presence we have in east Pasco,” company spokesman Heather Eramo said of the newly opened two-story building off Eiland Boulevard. “We hope to continue to grow and provide excellent care to people while serving the local communities.”

The two Florida Medical Clinic buildings off Eiland Boulevard are not the only changes to the area of late. The Sarah Vande Berg Memorial Tennis Center groundbreaking, which will be located off Simons Road northeast of the clinics, took place earlier this month and there have been recent traffic signal changes along that two-lane roadway.

As for the new two-story facility, it is a

32,000-square foot building sitting on four acres that include a parking lot and overhead drive-through area. The \$8 million project began in April 2018 and was completed this June. On June 10, physicians, staff and other employees began moving into the facility.

Dr. Michael Branch, a specialist in otolaryngology/ENT, remarked fondly on the newness of the building and equipment to work with.

“This is one of the nicest facilities in the area,” he noted. “It’s state-of-the-art.”

Heather Hancock, associate director of physician’s offices, oversees numerous details at the new facility. She and her husband recently moved to the area from Oklahoma and, like others said, is enamored with the state-of-the-art facility.

“We want to provide the best health care in our community,” she said.

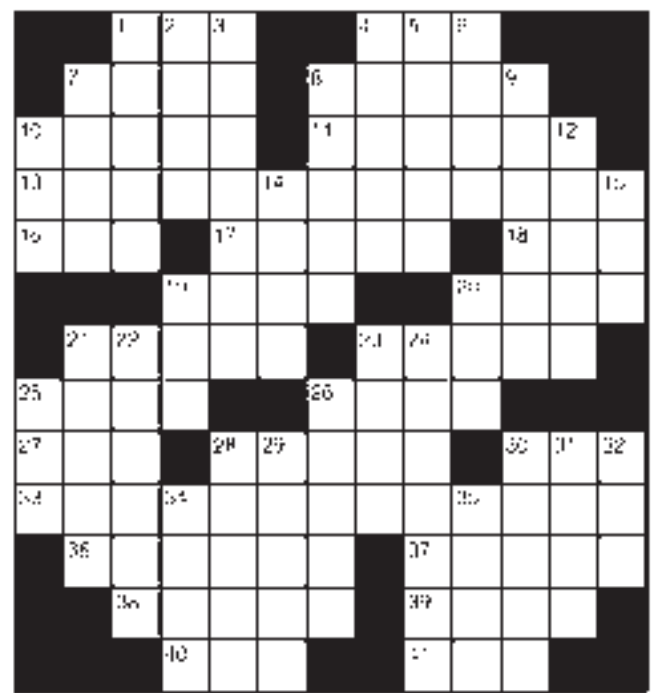

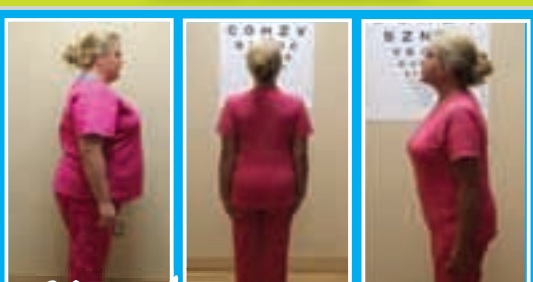

In the 1830s there was simply no way known to soldiers to stave off the withering effects of a Florida summer. Diseases spread by unsanitary conditions and swarms of insects made fort life unbearable and unsustainable. The Seminoles, having lived in Florida for decades and drawn on the knowledge of some of the earlier tribes that inhabited the territory for centuries prior, like the Apalachee, the Timucua and the Tocobaga, could manage the summer challenges. They would also use the summer time to burn down army forts that were abandoned.

Fort King is located in present-day Ocala in Marion County, just shy of 80 miles almost due north of Zephyrhills. It was originally built in 1827 and named after Colonel William King, commander of the Fourth Infantry. The fort was re-built in 1837 as US soldiers returned and it became the army's military headquarters during the Second Seminole War.

The property is owned jointly by both the City of Ocala and Marion County and operated by the City of Ocala. The Fort King Heritage Association is a non-profit that helps preserve and cultivate the fort's history. In 2004, the site was designated as a National Historic Landmark, the fort itself having long since been consumed by the elements. Ten years later, the Fort King National Historic Landmark opened to the public with a visitor's center and interpretive walking trail. In May of 2017, construction of a replica of the fort began.

If you visit now, you'll be able to enjoy not only a full-scale replica of the fort, it's palisades and blockhouses but also participate in the site's many interactive programs.

Park Programs

The architecture of the fort has its own allure but the real meat-and-potatoes of the Fort King National Historic Landmark are its programs. If you're a history buff, you're in luck. Much like the other parks that have historic forts in Central Florida, Fort King hosts historical reenactments. Their 4th annual "A Fight for Freedom: Attack on Fort King" is set for the first weekend in December.

That event mimics the assassination of Indian Agent Wiley Thompson. Recurring historical events like Sutler Saturdays, bring out historical reenactors to give lectures and demonstrations in the mid-19th Century as well as period skill and trade demonstrations.

The events are free and the next two are on Aug. 10 and Sept. 14. The site also hosts workshops where attendees can learn skills from the era like making brooms, rugs or even sauerkraut.

If nature is more your speed, the 40 acres the site rests on may offer some more desirable forms of recreation. Coming up on Aug. 31, the fort will host a Wild Mushroom Hike, a free event for all ages hosted by members from the Florida Academic Lichen and Fungi Enthusiasts.

The fort's Summer Shorts: Fort King Environmental Days event series is almost finished. Their second-to-last event is today, Thursday the 25th but they'll follow it up with another one on July 31. At this camp, children ages 5 to 15 will learn about nature through one-on-one instruction and hands-on projects. Themes for the next two events are, Discover Hiking with Journey Sticks (July 25) and Life Cycles (July 31). There is a cost for these camps but just \$10 each.

If you stick around until October, the Fort King Haunted Trail is frightening fun for the whole family. Parking and the event are free and the scares wind up as the darkness sets in. Candy is provided for children who are encouraged to come

early. The event is Saturday, Oct. 26 from 6 p.m. to 10 p.m.

Other Attractions

The park's current visitor's center is modest but contains hundreds of artifacts from the time period. It is the hub where many of the park's programs originate from. Plans are already in place for both a new visitor's center as well as a Seminole Indian-style chickee, where events can be held.

The park's most recent innovation is the Fort King Heritage Teaching Garden. The garden will focus on plants and food traditions in Florida, during the 1800s. The site plans to add an outdoor kitchen area to complement the garden.

Audio tours are another great experience to be had at the Fort King National Historic Landmark. Much like the museums in Washington DC, Fort King offers visitors a series of different audio tours, some shedding light into the history of Florida as a

and noted that apartment buildings also are going up nearby off of U.S. 301.

"We're city and generally cities are built in a more dense style," Vande Berg said.

"I wish there was a market for one-acre lots," Smith be-moaned.

The homes, which would be built on various elevations due to the topography of the land, would be closer together than some citizens said they would like. Especially since there are lots ranging from one to five acres nearby. The close proximity of the homes is due, in part, to establishing buffer zones on the edges of the property as well as a conservation area and retention pond.

"We want to find a builder that will work with these natural grades," Vande Berg said.

Objections came from area residents Warren Earl and Leon Wilson.

"Zephyrhills has a lot of little lots and everyone knows it," Wilson said. "I would like to see less density."

Earl expressed similar concerns about how close the homes were, but eventually said, "It's okay, but it's too many buildings."

In other action during Monday's session, police chief Derek Brewer swore in new officer Morris Sparkman. He has worked in law enforcement for eight years, including time spent in the U.S. Army, in the states of Washington and Colorado. Sparkman brings to 32 as the number of police officers in the city and the chief said there are two more openings.

Additionally, a new seating arrangement at the behest of public works director Shane Leblanc was made that placed city department heads at a long table along the east wall of council chambers.

"You're all where we can find you now," said Burgess, mentioning that in the past city department heads sat in various seats in the audience for council meetings, public hearings and various workshops.

Lastly, saying he "saved the best for last," Earl presented a donation to Vande Berg for the Sarah Vande Berg Foundation. Sarah, Todd's late daughter was a tennis star at Zephyrhills High and perished in a 2015 automobile crash while she was a student at University of South Carolina Upstate. The Sarah Vande Berg Tennis Center is being built next to the Silverado Golf Course.
