What started on a whim less than 10 years ago, has grown into a movement. It's no secret that OCRs or Obstacle Course Races are sweeping the country. They are fun-filled, family-friendly fitness festivals, each with their own dynamics. Mud Endeavor Owners Randy and Teresa Yoho are no longer the new kids on the block. Their string of five annual events has become culture among many of the sport's top athletes and has become tradition for families and recreational runners.

It's part of the beauty of Mud Endeavor and OCRs in general. There are elite athletes that pound out the course in record time and there are weekend warriors who walk it and talk and laugh and play the whole time.

Typically, a course is a 5k or just longer than three miles and has

anywhere from 20 to 30 different obstacles. Randy Yoho specializes in making adjustments to his courses every year, even though they occupy the same spaces. Yoho will do clever things like switch up the entire direction of the course or place traditional obstacles at different points. The Yoho's are a local outfit and thus have the luxury of not having to haul their obstacles over long distances.

What that breaks down to is Mud Endeavor obstacles are often sturdy wooden structures as opposed to inflatable ones. It's not to knock the national operations, those outfits have their own dynamic and clever post-race games but Mud Endeavor is capturing a local audience and converting them into cult-like followers. It's getting hard to find runners that are participating for their first time anymore. Now you find groups that are growing to include more friends, family members or co-workers.

Take the Swamp Crew team from the Wesley Chapel area, for instance. Neighbors Corey Spurr and Jason Ballata have not just competed in several Mud Endeavor events, they were both running in their third Under the Lights event. They both brought their sons, Gavin Spurr and Tyler Ballata on Saturday night.

"The event is a good one for friends and family," Corey Spurr said. "It's not necessarily a competition, the runners all help each other out."

San Antonio Majors advance to Dixie Baseball League World Series

San Antonio Minors made state final but local all-stars came up short in quest for nationals

The numbers keep dwindling for the San Antonio All-Stars who captured three District 6 titles early in the postseason. While the Juniors (ages 7-8) went 1-2 and were eliminated in the early stages of their state series at Sebring, the Majors and Minors fared a bit better at state tournaments in Bristol, located in the Florida panhandle.

Both teams from a league that draws from east and central Pasco made state finals, giving San Antonio two chances at the Dixie Baseball League World Series. Only the Majors (11-12) remain in the hunt for a national championship with San Antonio beginning that tourney on July 25 in Lambert, N.C.

Last season the Majors won a district title but were knocked out in a state final. The Minors fared somewhat better, though, having won a state championship before finishing as a DSL World Series runner-up.

San Antonio went 3-1 in the Majors Division, although it took nearly a full week to play that series due to rain and thunderstorms.

"The rain was so bad they had to clear the fields with airboats," said San Antonio coach Tim Maple. "Every night it would dump rain."

In the Majors final against Altha, San Antonio took a 6-2 lead. Altha clawed back to tie the score at

Travel softball team showcases high school players

Zephyrhills High coach Jarrett Myers founded the competitive team three years ago

As is the case with all travel softball programs, the Crush aims to make ballplayers better by improving their skills as they face stiffer competition than at the high school level. That's why Zephyrhills High coach Jarrett Myers founded the team of local travel players three years ago.

"I had some people reach out to me," said Myers, who formerly coached softball in the Zephyrhills Little League as well. "They like my style. I'm a laid-back type of coach. I just expect things out of my players and they give it to me. Those expectations are set up way before they tryout."

The Crush, a 16-and-under team comprised of incoming sophomores and juniors, has a roster of players from Zephyrhills, Pasco, Hernando, Freedom and Lakeland.

Myers, 11-30 in two seasons coaching the Bulldogs, seeks to lead them to their first winning season since 2015. Zephyrhills High went 14-13 that season under former coach and school resource officer Jeff Hupp. Having three Bulldogs spending time on the Crush could help immensely in that quest.

A former high school football player, Myers never coached softball until his daughter Haley began playing in the Zephyrhills Little League when she was 8. He watched her for a while before coaching for five seasons in the local league, which calls the ball fields at Samuel W. Recreation Complex home. Now, he relishes devoting

Do a digital detox

Phones and other digital devices also force people to multitask. Evidence suggests that multitasking isn't all it's cracked up to be, leading to preventable errors and actually delaying the completion of tasks.

A 2010 study from researchers in France found that the human brain can handle two complicated tasks relatively easily because it has two lobes that can divide responsibility equally between the two.

Add a third task, however, and it can overwhelm the frontal cortex and increase mistakes. Trying to multitask on vacation can lead to stressful feelings and not being fully immersed in the experience.

Being connected while on vacation may

leave a person dealing with stresses they normally would avoid until returning home. A study published in the journal Applied Research in Quality of Life indicates that stress accrued on vacation can cause people to feel like they had lower energy at work after returning from a relaxing vacation.

Taking a step back from their phones, tablets and laptops while vacationing can help people make the most of their getaways. Such a break can promote mindfulness, encourage people to try new things and lead to more meaningful conversations with travel companions.

time to the players on the travel and high school teams.

Most recently, the Crush went 3-2 in the Premier Girls Fastpitch Tournament at Winter Haven. The team was led by three standout pitchers. Riley Collins allowed just four hits in 10 innings of that series with Olivia Thowsend and Haley Myers contributing on the mound as well. The latter also played first base and in the outfield during that tourney.

Townsend, who also hit a home run in that series, received an invite to Polk State College.

"They want to see more of her," Myers said, adding that the showcase tourneys often draw college scouts and coaches. "The whole purpose of the showcases is to get our girls seen by the colleges."

As for Collins, Myers said she, "is dominating on the mound right now. She is our lowest ERA (earned run average) pitcher at 2.45 in 25 innings pitcher thus far and only allowing one hit per inning."

Aside from solid pitching of his top trio, Myers noted that "our strength is hitting."

De'Onna Brown, of Pasco, led the Crush with a .605 batting average. She has strong athletic bloodlines as the granddaughter of the late Jerrold Brown, a former Hernando and University of Miami standout who played

defensive tackle for the Philadelphia Eagles (1987-91) before perishing in a 1992 automobile accident.

"De'Onna Brown is a true utility player that will play anywhere needed to help the Crush win ball games," the coach said. "De'Onna is our leading hitter, bats both right and left, and is a presence all around the field not matter if she is batting or fielding. De'onna also leads the team in stolen bases this year with 11."

The travel season began in May and Myers envisions the team practicing and playing in tournaments through December. That busy schedule, Myers noted, "keeps the girls engaged and it helps them maintain game speed."

Myers and his fellow coaches spoke highly of the talent on the team and how they should keep improving as high school players.

"Hands down we have some of the most talented young ladies ages 15-16 on this team that have the drive to want to succeed," said assistant coach Rick Wilton.

Added Myers, "The future is bright for all these young women. Their desire to want to perform to help each other succeed is what is most noticeable."



6 before San Antonio scored three in the seventh and allowed a run in the bottom of that inning for a 9-7 title-clinching victory.

Reliever Lenny Mercado got the final out on the mound, one of five key pitchers for San Antonio in the series. The others were Ashton Liddington, Talon Maple, Owen Wilson and Gianni Mercado.

"Our five pitchers really help up," Maple said. "When one of them was down the others picked him up."

San Antonio opened the tourney with a 7-4 loss to Frostproof. The team followed that game with a 21-0 romp

over Sneads and a 3-1 win against Avon Park to advance to the state final for the second year in a row. This time, however, a victory allowed the all-stars to continue playing for one last and final round.

In all, San Antonio outscored the opposition by a substantial 37-15 margin.

"Our bats were good throughout the order," Maple said.

The dominance at the state level was just a continuance of what San Antonio was able to do against some stellar competition at the district level. In the District 6 tourney at Ridge Manor San Antonio racked up

wins of 15-11, 13-1 and 10-7 to go 3-0. The first two of those games came against longtime rival Brooksville while the other was against host Ridge Manor.

As for the Minors (9-10), San Antonio went 3-2, dropping the final by an 8-4 score against Paxton. San Antonio opened that series with a 19-4 win over West Volusia, lost 12-0 against Avon Park before defeating Liberty County 8-6 and Avon Park 8-4 in a rematch to reach the state final.

"It was a great run," said Jeremy DesHotels, the team's coach who also is the league president. "The experience was good."

Another good thing for San Antonio was winning the sportsmanship trophy with DesHotels saying, "We are super proud."

San Antonio came pretty close to joining the Majors team, but the Minors could not come through in the clutch when they left the bases loaded late in the game.

A turnaround for San Antonio was the shutout loss against Avon Park.

"Our bats did not show up whatsoever. It was a rough game," DeHotels said. "At the end of it the kids were determined not to go home. Once the bats wake up and they start hitting the rest will follow."

That is exactly what happened in the 19-4 decisive win over West Volusia.

"It was an incredible boost," DesHotels said. "As the game progressed they were able to hit full stride."

Grow Financial grants thousands to feed kids
