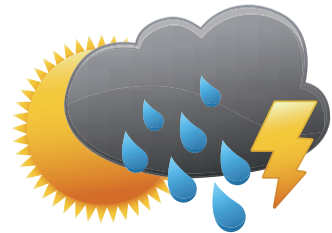

A Look Back ...

JULY 28, 2016

New series harkens back to days gone by. Let's look at the above date

For our 12th Look Back, part of a summer-long series, we don't go far back at all in checking out 2016. As is the case in any given year, that spin around the calendar provided an abundance of memorable moments.

In prominent news stories, Barack Obama became the first U.S. President to visit Cuba since Calvin Coolidge in 1928. Later that year, businessman and television personality Donald Trump became the 45th President.

Elsewhere, a lone gunman killed 49 people and injured 53 at a gay night club in Orlando, the United Kingdom voted to leave the European Union, NASA's Juno spacecraft began orbiting Jupiter and more than half of the world population (four billion) was now connected to the Internet.

In sports, the Chicago Cubs defeated the Cleveland Indians to win their first World Series since 1908, snapping the longest championship drought ever in American sports history. American swimmer Michael Phelps, the most decorated Olympic athlete of all time, won his 20th gold medal and Alabama beat Clemson to win its fourth college football title in seven seasons.

In a sign of the times on the local front, an iconic landmark served as the primary story with a prominent photo. The Suntrust Bank at 5435 Gall Blvd., the most prominent branch in the city, was the subject of a closure announcement. That local bank had been regarded as a community institution since 1949.

In the other front-page stories, a race widened for the Pasco County Property Appraiser with Democrat Jon Sidney Larkin set to face the Ted Schrader vs. Gary Joiner winner in a Republican primary; and city

Skydiving, Padel and city budget headline council meeting

City budget unveiling as well as a pair of big-time events were highlights at Monday's city council meeting

As has become almost par for the course, any time Sarah Vande Berg Tennis & Wellness Center (SVB) President Pascal Collard attends a city council meeting, sparks fly. It would actually be 20-year Air Force veteran and skydiving world record holder Patrick Fortune making the sparks fly on Monday.

Fortune announced a one-of-a-kind event on Monday, an international skydiving event in memory of the 20th anniversary of the 9/11 attacks. Fortune presented a slideshow depicting *Flags in the Air* - a memorial event to remember, respect and honor those who died and those who gave their lives so that others might live. The event aims at bringing drop zones all across the state, country and planet together to commemorate the American tragedy of 9/11. Different types of events are planned to commence at significant times during that fateful day in 2001. Skydive City in Zephyrhills is one of the primary drop zones for the event that commences at 8 a.m. Eastern Standard Time.

Collard, even though the event is being put on in

On July 9, as it typically is on any given early evening Tuesday, the Zephyrhills Lions Club Bingo hall was buzzing with activity. Dozens of local residents, along with many out-of-town bingo-playing fans, were all prepping their papers for another fun-filled evening of their favorite recreational activity of playing bingo. This particular Tuesday evening, however, featured a special item on the agenda. That being, the presentation of a generous donation check awarded to a very important and valuable learning institution here in Zephyrhills: The Academy of Spectrum Diversity.

The Academy of Spectrum Diversity was established in 2017 by husband and wife co-founders, Chris and Tammi Dester. With two fully-staffed campuses here in Zephyrhills, Chris Dester states that both facilities have been fully enrolled to maximum capacity. The Academy specializes in the education and developmental skills of young students that have been diagnosed with an intellectual or developmental disability, such as autism, ADHD, dyslexia, etc. Such children simply cannot receive a proper normal education, nor can they develop natural social skills, within the ranks of the traditional community school system.

Academy executive director Chris Dester expressed to the crowd of bingo players that the

teachers and faculty staff at the Academy work closely with each student: academically, socially, behaviorally and spiritually, enabling these young people into becoming upstanding and respectable adults of tomorrow.

Zephyrhills Lions Club Bingo players have always been great at supporting various local causes that desperately need help. The Academy of Spectrum Diversity is certainly high on that list of worthwhile organizations that need a helping hand. By participating in a 50/50 ticket drawing held during every Tuesday and Friday evening's Bingo program, the players are making a direct monetary donation to the Academy. The net proceeds collected thus far from the 50/50 ticket sales were presented to executive director Chris Dester on July 9.

After receiving a check from the collection of player donations, Chris Dester expressed his heartfelt gratitude for the outstanding generosity of each bingo player that has participated in the Lions Bingo Program's 50/50 nightly drawings over the past couple of months. Dester continued on by stating, "The monies collected thus far, and the donations from the continued 50/50 ticket sales through September here at the Zephyrhills Lions Club Bingo, will provide tremendous assistance to those parents whose children desperately need the specialized schooling offered by the Academy of Spectrum Diversity, but cannot afford the full tuition cost on their own."

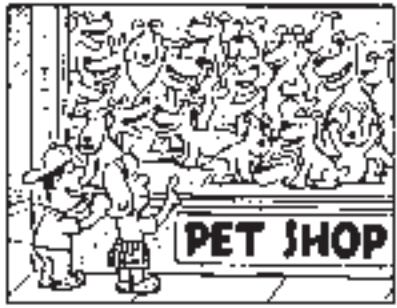

partnership with SVB, still had a big announcement for the tennis center. SVB will host the first ever international Padel tournament. Collard stated that Padel is the fastest growing sport in the world right now and that the event will come on the heels of a national tournament, also to be held at SVB.

The national tournament will feature 64 teams from the United States and will be held this Aug. 20. The top eight teams will be determined in the tournament and those eight will face off against the team from Spain, the top team in the world, at a date to be determined. Collard and SVB are trying to figure out a date for the international tournament but have been hampered by international travel restrictions in light of the COVID-19 Pandemic and recent uptick in cases attributed to the Delta Variant.

"We are hoping this event has a big impact," Collard said.

The next big item was a preliminary reveal and discussion of the city budget. The big numbers were the \$946,676,382 aggregate assessed property value, the current millage rate of 6.35, unchanged from last fiscal year and \$5,710,825 in ad valorem tax revenue. The budget is not approved yet. Meetings with individual and collective council members are ongoing but the final budget is expected to be approved on Sept. 27. The final budget is expected to be available on the city website by Oct. 1.

Some key items in the budget that drew discussion from the dais were the lofty price tag on the \$2.3 million Simons Road Phase 2 Project, the 7th Street Milling and Restoration, the construction of reclaimed water lines and city employee salary raises.

City council members bemoaned the price tag on what they called 800 feet of roadway improvements on Simons Road. City manager William Poe Jr. stipulated that there were wetlands and low-lying areas, as well as box culverts to contend with; also that the price of materials and labor is skyrocketing.

Zephyrhills Public Works Director Shane LeBlanc spoke, saying that there was indeed some sticker shock but that he had a contractor look at the engineer's proposal and said that it looked accurate. LeBlanc detailed that the project had a lot more to it than just road repaving and that he anticipated the price going

down once the project goes out to bid.

Poe stated that he hopes to package other municipal road projects together in order to, "get a better deal" and that the engineer's estimate is usually higher than the contractors.

The 7th Street milling was another that council members hoped to tamp down but one that they agreed was badly needed.

Reclaimed water is expanding in Zephyrhills and councilwoman Jodi Wilkeson wondered if even more funding should be allocated to improving reclaimed water lines in the city.

City employee salaries had proposed increase rates of 2, 3 and 4 percent and ZPD Chief Derek Brewer recommended the city add six more officers, while Poe and his staff came in with a recommendation of two additional officers.

Wilkeson suggested that some of the savings from the city out-sourcing their fire rescue services to Pasco County could be used for that purpose.

The city is still on the hook for the difference in what Pasco County spends to operate the two fire stations in city limits and the revenue generated by the Municipal Service Taxing Unit (MSTU), that all Pasco County property owners pay into. The 2021 expense for the City Fire Department was \$2,290,391 and the anticipated 2022 expense is \$1,146,703. That expense is expected to taper off in subsequent years, down to just \$226,457 by 2027.

Consent Agenda items all passed 4-0 with councilman Ken Burgess absent from the dais. They included approval of the July 12 meeting minutes, an interlocal agreement with Pasco County for reclaimed water systems, a FDOT beautification maintenance memorandum agreement for 5th Avenue and a professional services agreement with American Infrastructure Development, Inc.

Business Item 3.1 passed 4-0 on its second reading. It was an amendment to the City's Comprehensive plan, changing the future land use map designation from City RS (Residential Suburban) to City RU (Residential Urban) and amending the zoning from R3 (Medium Density Residential) to R4 (Multi-Family Residential) for the Autumn Palm Villas, a nearly 10-acre parcel on the west side of Autumn Palm Drive, between Vinson Avenue and Covered Bridge Boulevard.

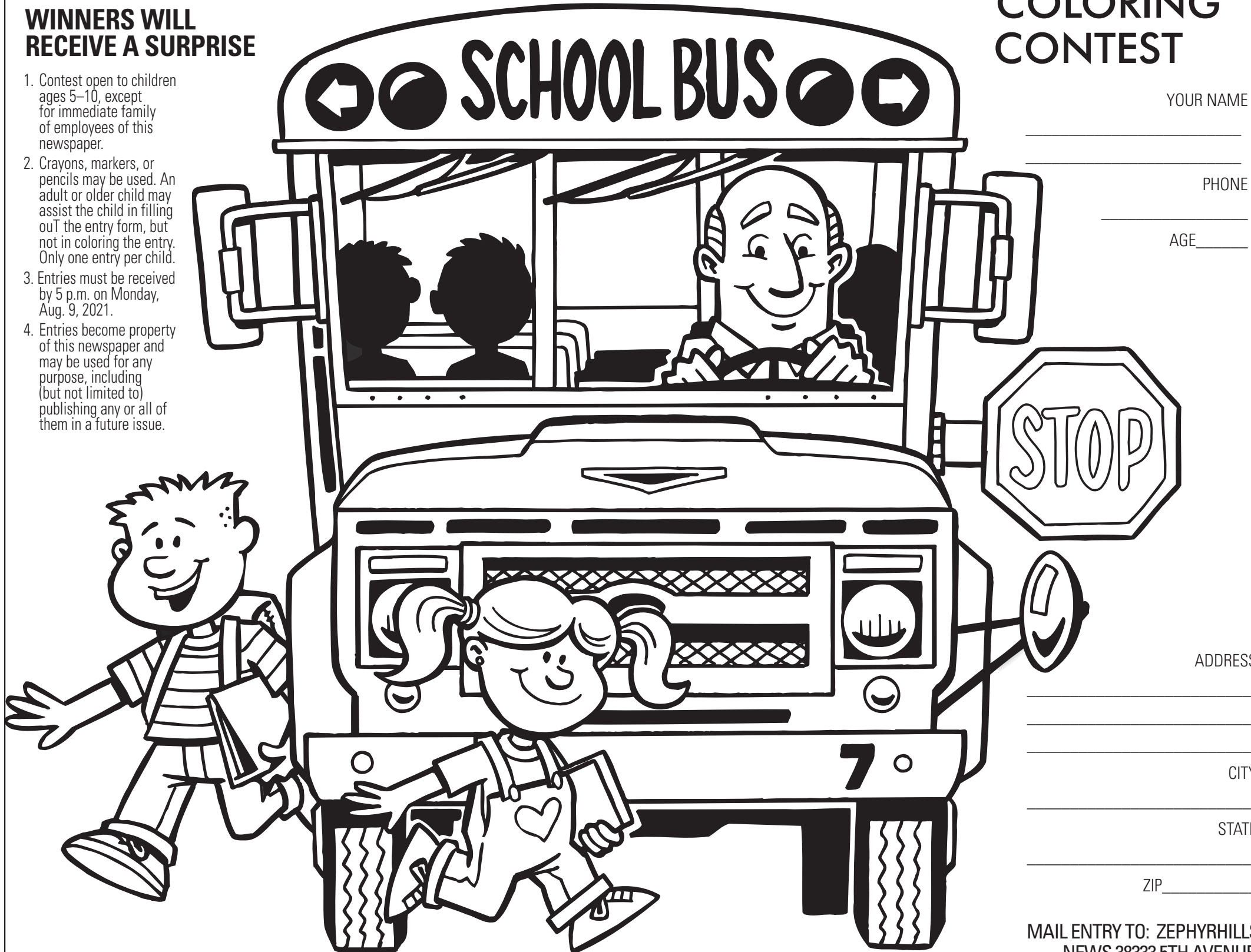

The newly-renovated historic properties sent out a beacon to prospective suitors at an open house

Billed as an open house, city officials, builders and community members hosted an event at the Jeffries and Carriage House this past Thursday with hopes of attracting potential users for the historic properties. The Jeffries House, originally built in 1912, is a two-story structure with 2,365 square feet and a 600-square-foot wrap-around porch. The hardwood floors, light fixtures, fireplace and stained glass windows are original.

The building was restored in 2016 and added modern plumbing, electrical and an HVAC system.

The Carriage House was originally built in 1940. It is a two-story structure with 1,320 square feet that includes the upstairs balcony. The Carriage House was restored in 2020 with new plumbing, electrical and an HVAC system.

Both restorations endeavored to keep the historic character of the buildings. Some options were serendipitous. As Kerns was renovating the Carriage House, last year, they found the original carriage room doors.

"They (original doors) were under some drywall and paneling," Linda Starr-Kerns said. "We worked on them to make them functional and they are part of the building now."

The City of Zephyrhills is ready to look at, "ALL" long term leasing possibilities. A Request for Proposals (RFP) went out on May 16 of this year and the city will accept responses up to Aug. 16 - before 11 a.m. Informational packets as well as the RFP forms themselves were made available for Thursday's Open House. Linda Starr-Kerns and Tony Kerns of Kerns Family Construction, the contractors that restored the Carriage House, were on-hand answering questions for prospective lessors and the general public.

"We are looking for a merchant to bring their

business downtown to create more foot traffic and help the other businesses on Main Street," Linda Starr-Kerns said. "Their proposal should demonstrate what they bring to the table and how it will be palatable to both sides equally."

There are a number of possibilities. Even the inclusion of each building is fluid. Proposals can include just the Jeffries House, just the Carriage House or a combination of both. Whatever it is, city officials want it to generate foot traffic. While the potential uses are wide open, the scale might well be tipped in favor of a restaurant.

"There is interest in a restaurant option," Tony Kerns said. "We think that will benefit downtown. It's a type of business that's lacking in this area."

While the Jeffries House has an updated kitchen, the interior rooms are modestly sized. A creative layout of dining tables would have to be concocted for it to make sense as a restaurant. Yet, a restaurateur would likely have the inside track on their RFP.

"A viable idea would be a pizza place in the front (Jeffries House) and an ice cream place in the back (Carriage House)," Linda Starr-Kerns said.

Certainly, there are a number of ideas floating around.

"I think a coffee shop would be great, maybe a fun little bistro," Seth, a Zephyrhills resident who declined to give his last name, said. "(The Carriage House) could be a loft, art gallery, with living space upstairs. It would have a low impact on the building."

The decision to lease the structure or structures will be handled by a five-person evaluation committee, made up of city employees (4) and one (1) outside party. There is a scoring rubric in the RFP packet that was distributed at the open house and it is the task of the evaluation committee to narrow down and rank the top three RFPs. Once the top three are selected and ranked in priority, they go before city council, where the evaluation committee's choices will either be approved or adapted.

Balanced against the desire to create foot traffic is the desire to maintain the buildings' historic integrity.

"We want to attract a commercial investor that has an opportunity for business but that also respects the integrity of the structure,"

councilwoman Jodi Wilkeson, who spent 18 years on the Main Street Board of Directors, said.

Wilkeson cited the GFWC Woman's Club of Zephyrhills for their stewardship of the historic building just across 9th Street.

"We want that for the Jeffries and Carriage House, as well," Wilkeson said.

Zephyrhills Athletic League benefits from presence of high school players, some of whom played in the league, at football clinic

Local high school football players coming back to help out with clinics for the Zephyrhills Athletic League has become somewhat of an annual preseason tradition and why not. That youth football program is where most of the Zephyrhills High and Stewart Middle players got their starts.

Two years ago, former Bulldog standouts Jaylen Pickett and Lorine Parker, both of whom began their time on the gridiron in the ZAL and later earned college scholarships, came back to talk with the youngsters and help lead them through a series of drills. Due to the coronavirus pandemic, that did not happen last summer.

"When I was little I looked at the high school kids as heroes," said Damien Pickett, the league's president and a former standout Zephyrhills High player. "They love the game. Kids like Ben Raines and Jakobe Campbell played here. It's a community thing."

Pickett and Nick Carroll, who enters his sixth season as the Bulldogs' head coach, got together to set up last week's clinic at Charles B. Krusen Memorial Field. Nearly 30 high school players showed up to help out.

"Coach Carroll hit me up and said this was something he wanted to do," Pickett said. "I never had the high school coach come out here and run things for our kids. Me and Nick, we'll get together and make this a lot bigger going forward."

For his part, Carroll would like nothing better than to make the high school-youth connection an annual ritual of spring.

"I hope so," he said of that prospect. "This gives (the ZAL players) perspective to see how we coach high school players."

At Zephyrhills High football games, the coach is well aware of players from the ZAL and local middle schools — Stewart, Centennial and Pasco — showing up at Bulldog Stadium to cheer on the home team.

"In the past, we haven't had a lot of opportunities to do this," said Carroll who also came up through the local league before becoming a football standout at Zephyrhills High and landing a scholarship. "It's important to carry that on."

As Pickett and his fellow ZAL coaches looked on, Carroll and his players ran several drills at five stations set up on the football field. Carroll led the youngsters in a Bulldog breakdown huddle to get them pumped up before they broke up into various groups.

Carroll also loudly informed the ZAL players that there would be no walking from station to station and they all obliged by running on ahead.

"We don't walk on the practice field," he exclaimed. "Let's go."

At one station, running back Willie Queen, all-purpose

player T.J. Jackson, who has spent time at quarterback, slot back and in the defensive secondary, and Theotis Smith, a standout linebacker, worked with the young players on warm-up drills.

Arky Hicks, a running back in ZAL's pee wee division, said he enjoyed how the high school players came out to help them through practice drills.

"They're teaching us what to do," he said.

On one section of the practice field, newcomer Davion Brantley, a transfer from Wesley Chapel, was part of the high school players teaching agility techniques to the youngsters. Like his Bulldog teammates, he relished working with the little kids.

"It's knowing that you're changing something and that these kids could one day grow up to be even better than you are."

Malik Dillard, a Zephyrhills linebacker, stressed the importance of young players learning the basics that will go a long way in their development.

"They've got to at least know the fundamentals and why they're doing this," he said.

Zephyrhills wrestlers from Top Brothers travel to Wisconsin to compete in national tournament

Lee Montalvo recently moved to Zephyrhills from Long Island, N.Y. and sought a local wrestling program for her son, 10-year-old Andrew Jordan. He was able to continue in a sport he has participated in since he was 6 by showing up for a clinic run by the American Warriors Wrestling Club and held at Wiregrass Ranch High.

"He loved it. It was so intense," Montalvo said of her son, who received instructions from several prominent coaches including Jamey Ketler, Wiregrass High's wrestling coach who founded the club program in 2017.

Montalvo was impressed with how Ketler, a former state champion from Pennsylvania, worked with the young wrestlers, primarily in the 7-14 age range.

"(Ketler) is great at what he does," Montalvo said. "He encourages the kids and he motivates them."

This summer's club schedule has included three camps and two tournaments. Next up is the No Bull IBT (Individual Bracketed Tournament) scheduled for Aug. 1 at the Wiregrass Ranch gym. Ketler noted that more than 150 wrestlers competed in the 2019 No Bull IBT, but he does not expect as many this time, especially after last year's tourney was cancelled due to the coronavirus pandemic.

"We have the need for kids who want to wrestle," Ketler said. "We only have so much time to get kids into the program this summer."

The Warriors hosted a free wrestling clinic last week, which was primarily designed for newcomers. Helping out were Kip Kiefer, a former Pennsylvania state high school champion and

standout at the Air Force Academy; and James Mangan, who Ketler coached years ago in Pennsylvania.

"Our slogan is mind, body and spirit; Jim is one of those guys that exemplifies all those things," Ketler said of Mangan, a two-time city champion who now is the executive director of Philadelphia's Beat the Streets program.

Another assistant working with the younger kids was Wiregrass Ranch High wrestler Roman Sanchez, who also competes for the Warriors.

"Roman is really one of the big success stories of the program," Ketler said. "He's gone from student to teacher. He's stepping up in that leadership role."

Aside from the sessions at Wiregrass Ranch, another group of local wrestlers who fared well this summer came from Top Brothers, a school in Zephyrhills that also offers boxing, mixed martial arts, judo and ju-jitsu. The Top Brothers team competed at the USA Wrestling Kids Nationals in Wisconsin.

Three wrestlers who went on that long journey earned All-American status and a fourth just missed the cut. Competing in the 49-pound weight class, Markus Figueroa took fifth, Mateo Davila placed seventh in the 54 division and Matheo Cisneros was eighth at 92. Izak Rodriguez finished 12th in the same class, falling short of a top-8 placement required to make All-American.

"The kids did a good job," coach and Top Brothers founder Franklin Cisneros said. "They are very excited about this sport. All the guys said, 'I can train better next time.'"

Wrestlers from Top Brothers also competed in regional and state tournaments before nationals. Throughout those competitions Ingrid Cisneros, Franklin's wife and fellow coach, noted that the wrestlers "spent time together. Everybody took care of each other."

Top Brothers fared much better at regionals in Jacksonville with five wrestlers earning medals. Matheo Cisneros had two firsts and two thirds. Ariana Davila had a first and a third with Gabriela Davila, Mateo Dávila and Jeremías Pizarro each taking fourths in their divisions.

In the state tourney at Osceola, winning individual titles were Pizarro, Figueroa, Ariana Davila and Ianis Pizarro.
