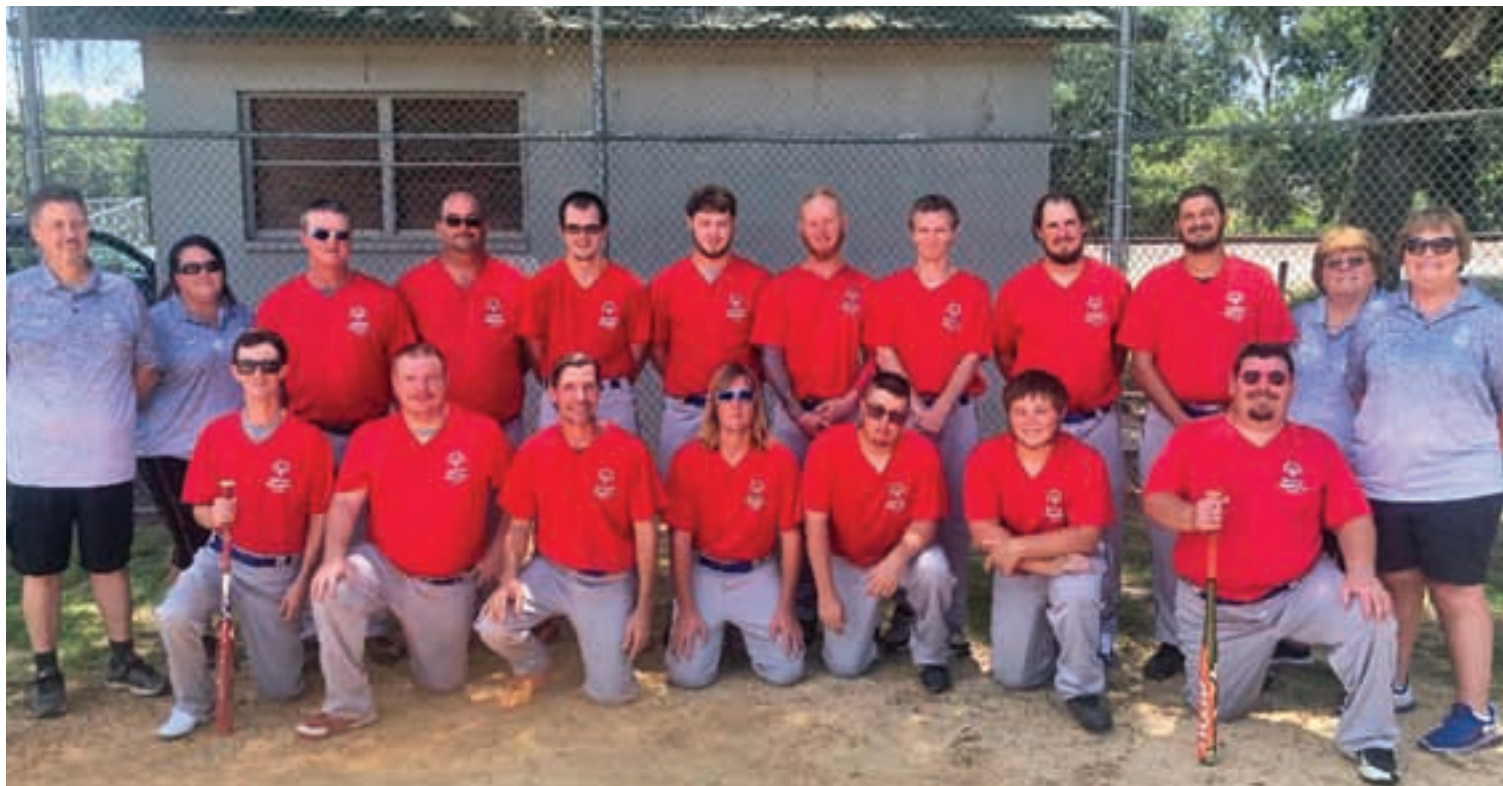

Pasco Stars aim to defend softball title in Special Olympics

Zephyrhills-based team gearing up for upcoming national competition in Nashville

The two most recent additions to the Pasco All-Stars roster can hardly wait to compete in the upcoming Special Olympics Nationals. While some ballplayers on the Zephyrhills-based softball team will be making their fourth appearances at nationals, Robert St. Louis and Josh Asua are eager to make their debuts at that level.

Both are Zephyrhills High students with St. Louis heading into his junior year while Asua will be a senior. St. Louis, an infielder who primarily plays second base, does have experience at the national level, having served as a batboy when the Stars played in Roanoke, Virginia.

"I wasn't old enough to play. You have to be 16," said St. Louis,

adding that taking the field for the Stars this time around is "going to mean a lot, because I actually get to play."

Added Asua, an outfielder who was not involved with the softball program at that time, "It's going to be an honor to be there."

"They're young and they're vibrant. They just have that good attitude," coach Judy Brunner said.

The Pasco Stars, coached by retired Zephyrhills teachers and longtime Special Olympics coaches Belinda Brown and Brunner, will compete in Nashville Aug. 16-18. They are defending a national championship won in 2016 at Roanoke. The gold medal-winning team followed two other national appearances with Pasco placing second at Chicago in 2011 and third in Oklahoma City in 2012.

To get there the team must raise about \$8,500. Having begun that fundraising effort in May, Brunner reported the current amount near \$6,000 with Walmart in Dade City contributing \$1,000. A spaghetti dinner and raffle are planned for July 20 at the Dade City Christian Church.

"We're doing very well," said Brunner, who in 2017 stepped

Zephyrhills All-Stars fall short in comeback bid

Junior Baseball team finishes as District 25 runner-up

Fielding just nine players with no substitutes for the District 25 Junior Baseball championship game, the Zephyrhills All-Stars were somewhat shorthanded. They hung close for a while before eventually succumbing in a 21-8 loss to Land O' Lakes.

That game ended in the fifth inning due to the 10-run mercy rule. The outcome, however, did not reflect the valiant effort put forth by the team of east Pasco ballplayers.

The opposing coach called the shorthanded Zephyrhills team "a nine-man wrecking crew."

Adam Wilkes, president of the Zephyrhills Little League whose son Edward played right field for the team, lauded the effort of the local players: "We made it work."

Zephyrhills manager Jesse Thorne, whose son Aiden plays on the team, credited his players for not

Children enthralled by birds in wildlife show at City Hall

Zephyrhills Public Library hosts Matt Edmonds' Wonders of Nature in council chambers

More than 100 children gathered in the tight quarters of council chambers at City Hall last week for the most recent installment of the Zephyrhills Public Library's summer reading program. The room was filled with plenty of laughter during a nature show presentation featuring five distinct birds.

The educational traveling wildlife show, entitled Wonders of Nature and presented by Matt Edmonds, occurred on June 26 for boys and girls primarily ranging from kindergarteners through fifth-graders. There were plenty of parents and adults in the room as well, many of whom came with the All About Me Learning Center in Zephyrhills and a child development center in Dade City.

At the sound of Edmonds imitating a smoke detection alarm, Moby the parrot repeatedly exclaimed, "Fire! Fire!" The amusing parrot also mimicked the children's laughter, which made the boys and girls chuckle even louder.

Edmonds' next bird was aptly named "Turbo, because he does everything fast," the handler said of his toucan with a long colorful nose.

Other birds shown by Edmonds were Jedi, a hawk that swooped low into the crowd of seated children on the floor to land atop a perch across the room; and Bambam, a seriama related to falcons and parrots, who continuously smacked a rubber snake on a rock to demonstrate how he kills prey.

Daniel Rubel, a 7-year-old who won a goodie bag in a drawing, said he

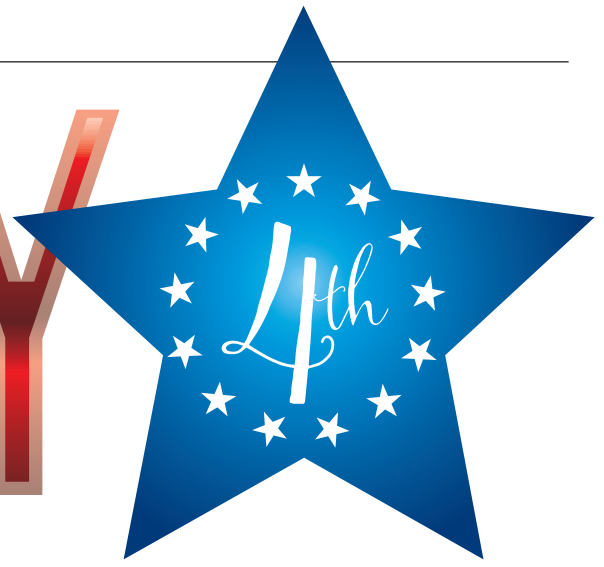

Enjoy a safe and happy Independence Day

Independence Day is a celebration of the United States of America. The holiday is marked by fanfare and large parties, complete with barbecues, fireworks and parades.

As fun as July 4th festivities typically are, injuries, particularly those involving fireworks, are a concern that celebrants should not take lightly. An estimated 11,000 people visited the emergency room for fireworks-related injuries in 2016, according to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission. However, fireworks aren't the only danger this time of year. In order to remain safe, individuals can heed these tips.

- Do not drink and drive. Alcohol consumption may accompany Independence Day festivities. For those planning on using a car to get to and from parties, it is essential to designate a driver who will not imbibe. Otherwise, utilize any number of ridesharing services or available taxis.
- Swim smartly. Always swim with a buddy, and consider hiring a lifeguard if you'll be hosting a pool party and cannot keep a watchful eye on guests in the pool. Adults also should not swim intoxicated, as it can impede the ability to stay afloat and may lead to risky behaviors.
- Leave fireworks to the professionals. Watch a public fireworks display instead of lighting fireworks on the street or in the backyard.
- Exercise caution with sparklers. Kids running around with sparklers in hand could be a recipe for disaster, as sparklers burn extremely hot. Make sure children do not wave them around or others can get burned. Keep a bucket

of water handy to properly extinguish the sparklers.

- Review safe boating practices. If July 4th festivities find you out on the water, be sure that life jackets are worn and set boating and water safety rules for the family.
- Check in with a vet. The Fourth of July can be traumatic for pets not accustomed to fireworks and other loud noises or crowds. Behavior therapy, medication and ensuring that pets do not run away from home and get lost may be necessary.
- Watch food temperatures. Do not leave food out in the hot sun for too long; otherwise, harmful bacteria can grow and potentially cause foodborne illnesses. The USDA Food Safety and Inspection Service says to never leave food out of refrigeration for more than two hours. If the temperature is above 90 F, food should not be left out for more than one hour.

These are some of the safety strategies that can keep Independence Day celebrations both safe and enjoyable.

Happy Independence Day!

Festive facts for July 4th

Each year on July 4, Americans celebrate the birth of their nation and independence from Great Britain. This day marks the anniversary of the presentation and acceptance of the Declaration of Independence, signed 242 years ago on July 4, 1776.

The Declaration of Independence began as a letter to Britain's King George to explain why the Continental Congress was interested in declaring independence from Great Britain. The writing of the declaration began on July 2 and the final wording was established on July 4.

Independence Day is full of opportunities to celebrate and enjoy oneself. Parades, fireworks, parties, barbecues, and much more are part of the festivities.

Another way to commemorate Independence Day is to educate oneself about the many historical and entertaining facts that surround the day. The following are some interesting details about the origins of Independence Day and the celebrations that surround it.

• Although 56 people eventually signed the Declaration of Independence, only John Hancock signed the document on July 4, 1776. The rest added their names later on. John Hancock's signature is ornate and widely recognized. Putting your "John Hancock" on a document has become synonymous with the process of signing something.

• The Declaration of Independence was adopted while the Continental Congress met in Philadelphia at the Pennsylvania Statehouse. That building is now known as Independence Hall.

• The average age of the signers of the Declaration of Independence was 45. The youngest person to sign was Thomas Lynch, Jr., who was 27 when he signed the document. Benjamin Franklin, at age 70, was the oldest signer.

• John Adams and Thomas Jefferson were the only signees who went on to serve as presidents. Coincidentally, Jefferson and Adams both died on July 4, 1826, within hours of each other.

• Philadelphia is the birth place of much American history and is home to the Liberty Bell. Each Independence Day, the Liberty Bell is tapped (not rung, as the vibration would further damage the cracked bell) 13 times in honor of the original 13 American colonies.

• The original 13 American colonies were located all along the eastern seaboard. They include Virginia, New York, New Hampshire, Massachusetts Bay, Maryland, Connecticut, Rhode Island, Delaware, North Carolina, South Carolina, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Georgia.

• The stars on the original American flag were placed in a circle. This was so all of the colonies would be equally represented.

• Independence was gained in 1776, and the first celebration took place in Philadelphia four days later. The White House held its first Independence Day festivities in 1801.

• Benjamin Franklin proposed that the turkey be the national bird of the United States. However, John Adams and Thomas Jefferson overruled him, and the bald eagle became the national bird.

• The only copy of the engrossed and signed Declaration of Independence is in the National Archives in Washington, D.C.

Independence Day is a time for hot dogs, ice cream and, of course, revisiting America's history.

down as the Pasco County Special Olympics Coordinator but still enjoys coaching the local team.

Brown and Brunner said they have been honored to coach the Pasco Stars since the 1990s. Among the longest-tenured players on the roster are Ernie Schultz, who Brunner coached when he was a teen in Zephyrhills, and Kenny Carriveau, who Brown coached on a 1993 team that made it to states.

"For the most part the core has been together for a lot of years. They've just been going strong all those years," Brunner said. "I just think it's the camaraderie and the feeling of family that we have. They care about Belinda and I and their teammates. There's a real special bond there."

"I have known most of these guys since they were in high school and earlier," Brown added. "Now they are husbands, fathers, and hard-working men who still choose to devote their time to this team."

"We are like a family that sticks together through good times and bad," she continued. "This year we have some newcomers to our team and, fortunately, they are fitting right into the family dynamics."

The current roster, which also includes coaches Keith Smith and Stacy Morris, features ballplayers from Zephyrhills, Dade City Lacochee and two newcomers from New Port Richey.

Aside from the aforementioned players the rest of the team consists of: Richard Proctor, Blake Bird, Brian Starnes, Scott Walter, Justen Buchanan, George Morris, George "Bubby" Morris, Curt Walters, Chris Allen, Phillip Olson and John Algood.



Additionally, there are two alternates practicing with the team. Currently, Ross Cleveland and Mike Dunn, both of whom played on the national championship squad in 2016, are not scheduled to go to Nashville but an injury or two could change that.

Smith, the coach, is eager to visit Nashville for more than just softball.

"I'm going to bring my guitar," he said. "You never know."

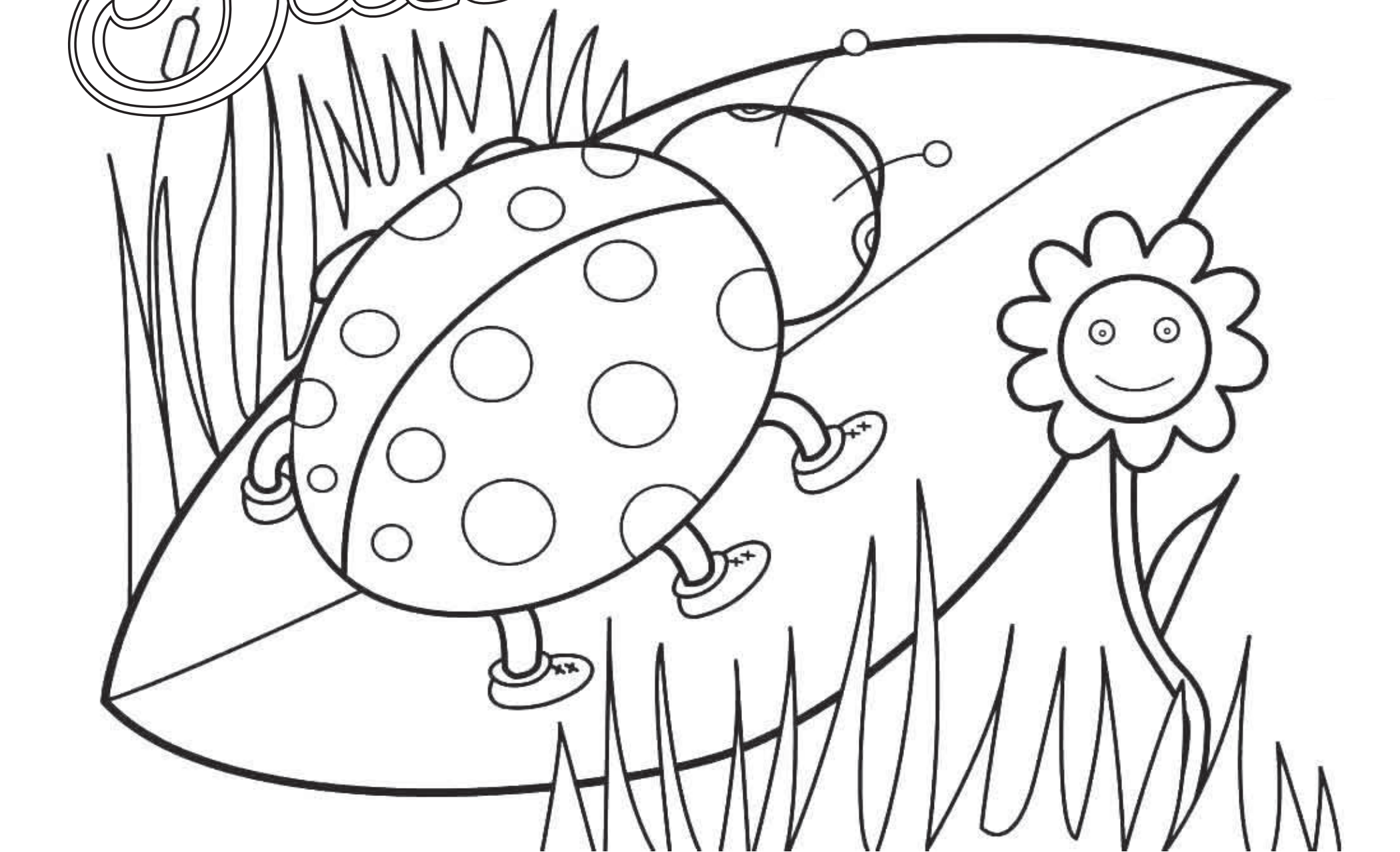

liked "seeing the big hawk." "I liked all of them," said Larkin Milligan, 8, who came to the show with her mother Lauren and 4-year-old sister Isla.

Lori Brightwell, who is in her second year as the city's library director, noted that the summer reading program consists of nine weekly sessions. Last week's, however, ranks high on that list.

"I would say that this is one of the most popular. It's really an educational show, because he teaches them how they live in the wild," Brightwell said, adding that "we have another reptile show in late July and they bring plenty of snakes. The kids like snakes."

Maria Delarosa, a tutor with RCMA, said the children "were just amazed by the birds. It's not something they see every day. We talked about the birds and they had a lot of questions."

For Edmonds, his show is about much more than showing off his birds.

"I'm not so much a bird guy or a nature guy, but if you're going to teach kids about nature birds are great at doing that," he said.

Edmonds' love for nature can be traced back to his childhood in Kansas and he relocated to Florida, in part, due to his affinity for the state developed by spending time with his grandparents at Clearwater Beach.

Edmonds previously was a zookeeper at the Lowry Park Zoo in Tampa. In 1994 he began training animals for education shows, which led to his current business venture. Edmonds, who left the zoo in 2000 to start Wonders of Nature, estimates he does 200 shows annually.

For him, being a zookeeper pales in comparison to having his own traveling show. The children, he noted, make the presentations especially rewarding.

"I like when they laugh and enjoy themselves," he said. "I'm hoping that when they leave the show they love nature and they take better care of it."

Edmonds also urged youngsters to pursue the avenue he took, explaining that he is not getting any younger and that there always is a need for young people to work in the fields of nature and science.

Brightwell expressed her appreciation for being allowed to schedule sessions for the summer reading program in council chambers. The extra space compared to smaller rooms at the library has resulted in greater participation this summer.

"We were concerned about having a library program somewhere other than the library," she said. "But with this beautiful building next door we can accommodate everybody."

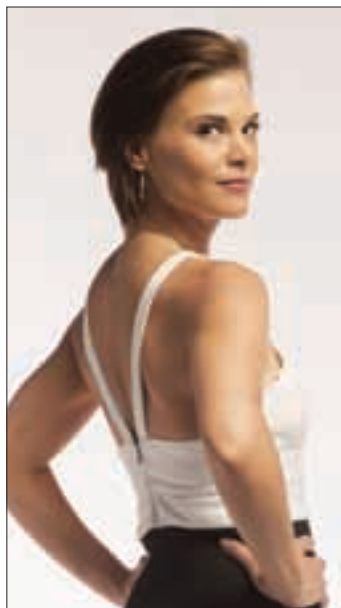

giving up even when they trailed by a substantial 21-5 margin after Land O' Lakes scored nine runs in the bottom of the third.

"It was rough at first, but these guys here, they dug deep and came here to play some baseball," he said following last Wednesday's all-star game at the Land O' Lakes Recreation Complex.

The district final was markedly different from two previous one-run decisions between the longtime Little League rivals.

Zephyrhills won the first game 6-5 when Aiden Thorne singled and raced home on a walkoff single in the seventh by Matthew Cesarez. Land O' Lakes won the second game 2-1 on a passed ball in the third.

"Those were two very good games," manager Thorne said during the title game. "I bet they didn't think they'd see this."

The first inning of the championship game lasted about an hour with Land O' Lakes taking a 10-4 lead. When Land O' Lakes extended the lead to 12-4 after two innings, manager Thorne implored his team: "This game is not over."

When some of the players on the Junior Baseball All-Stars were 9-10 All-Stars they rallied from a 13-1 deficit for a 14-13 comeback win over rival Dade City in the District 25 tournament. That valuable experience, in part, helped fuel a four-run rally over the course of the third and fourth innings by Zephyrhills.

Isaiah Santiago drew a walk and scored on Edward Wilkes' RBI groundout in the third to pull within 21-5. In the fourth, the Zephyrhills

added three runs to cut its deficit to 13 runs and trailed 21-8.

Later in that inning, the Zephyrhills defense came through by turning its second double play of the game.

Zephyrhills had three pitchers on the mound during what turned out to be its final game of the season. Aiden Thorne, a left-hander, started and later was relieved by right-hander Isaiah Santiago and James Dean, another southpaw.

Rounding out the Zephyrhills roster were: Mark Santiago, Michael Carter, Lucas Whipper and Nate Miller; along with assistant coach Jose Santiago.

Zephyrhills had two other district runners-up in all-star play. The Major Softball team lost the championship game to Dade City and the Major Baseball squad was eliminated by tournament host Land O' Lakes.
