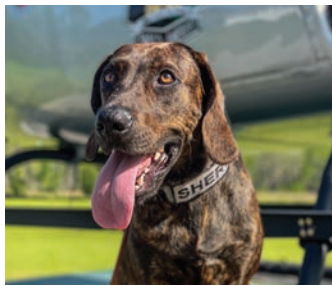

City council annexes territory, acknowledges teacher, student grit

Council moved forward several items from the last meeting

The first order of business during last Monday's regular city council meeting was the acknowledgement of Zephyrhills residents Chris LaRussa and his teacher Leanne John. Zephyrhills Mayor Gene Whitfield gave an account of the trial that LaRussa endured in an effort to capture enough credits to graduate. Whitfield then went into the lengths that John went to in order to help LaRussa accomplish that mission.

"This is to acknowledge all the good work teachers do for the community," Whitfield said. "She (John) chose not to let Chris (LaRussa) fall through the cracks."

In the Consent Agenda, four items were bundled together and passed 5-0. Item 2.1 notified council about the recent purchase by the utilities department of backflow preventers. It is the standard for the city that all connections to the municipal water system have a backflow device installed. The city purchases roughly 1,250 backflow preventers, annually included in the FY22 budget in the water division. The current quote for the items is \$99,602.75 and the utility department requested for the city council to acknowledge and accept this proposed purchase.

Item 2.2 was another notification to council in order to purchase manhole rehabilitation services from RCM Utilities in a continuation of the annual manhole rehabilitation. Deterioration is due to hydrogen sulfide production in the natural process of breaking down product in the collection system. The current estimate is to replace 25 manholes at a cost of \$86,701, budgeted in the 2022 FY Budget.

Item 2.3 was for a public services access easement. Palmetto Zephyrhills-C Ave, LLC agreed to provide a public safety and public services access easement when the city council approved the vacation of alley right-of-way which ran north to south through the Dollar General development at 4766 Gall Blvd. The applicants have provided the easement accordingly which ensures access to the site for public safety, emergency vehicles and public service vehicles will not be impacted

Summer recreation program is back

"The gym, the weight room, everything was utilized by athletic program," said recreation director Norman Scheuerman, noting that Zephyrhills High's football, basketball, volleyball and cheerleading squads occupied the middle school's athletic facilities last summer.

"It's good to have the kids back in the gym," Scheuerman continued. "I'm glad that it's back. We made a few changes."

Instead of just basketball, bowling, kickball and swimming, two additional activities have been a part of the popular program this summer. The camp added arts and crafts, with a lot of work in clay; and tennis, which featured staff members and volunteers

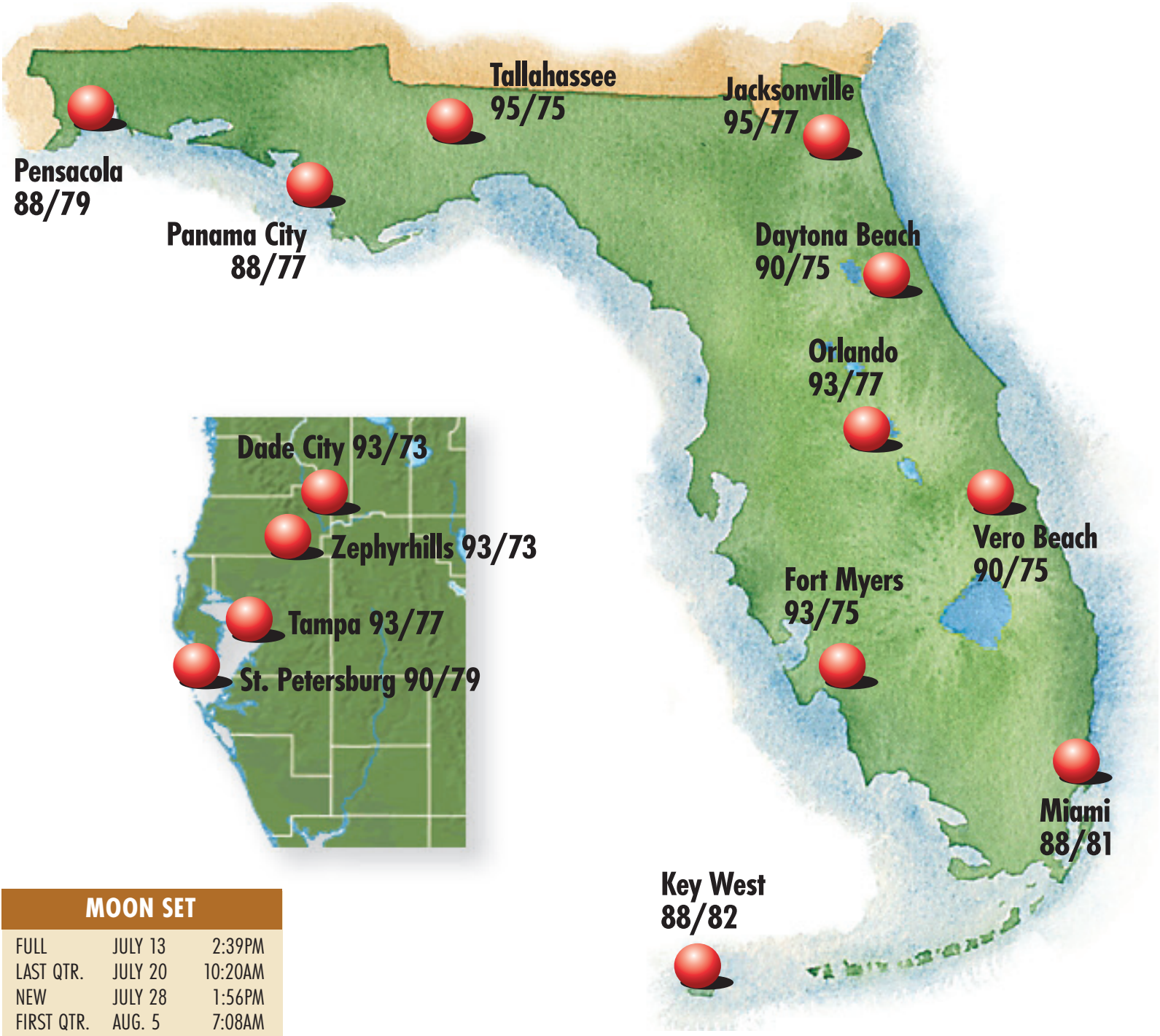

by any possible future construction or installation.

Item 2.4 was connected to the easement near Dollar General, this one in order to provide utility service to the applicant. All four items were bundled and passed together 5-0.

In Business Items, Items 3.1 and 3.2 both were second readings and dealt with a more-or-less five-acre parcel of land, located off Kittyhawk Drive, near the municipal airport. The site is aimed for future use as Heyl Truck Lines storage and was discussed at the last council meeting. The items first annexed the property and second, amended the city's Comprehensive Plan as well as re-zoned the parcel from a county designation to city LI or Light Industrial.

Item 3.3 was another second reading of an ordinance put forth at the last council meeting. This item asked to change the zoning designation of about 0.73 acres of property that was originally part of the Abbott Park (then Zephyr Lakes) Planned Unit Development Master Plan for residential use. When Zephyr Lakes sold the property to Zephyr Commons, LLC, the parcel was not re-zoned to be consistent with the commercial shopping center. Item 3.3 asked council to approve changing the zoning from PUD to C2 (Commercial). With no public comment

or discussion from the dais, all three items were passed 5-0.

Item 3.4 dealt with indoor storage facilities. The city's planning department asked council's approval to update the city's Land Development Code. Discussion revolved around the overall look for indoor storage facilities, which has changed dramatically in terms of: height, scale and design/architecturally. The planning department has received a couple of inquiries about indoor storage facilities that would exceed the current code standards and therefore asked for some changes to site plans, buffer zones, landscaping, signage and screening. It also stipulated that the height may not exceed one story. Larger storage units would be prohibited from establishing in the city's CRA district. The item passed 5-0.

Item 4.1 asked to transfer funds from Administration Contingency to the police department to fund one position. The amount was \$68,059. It was simply transferred. The item did ask for \$5,000 to match a grant of the same amount in order to purchase a firearm simulator for ZPD. The item passed 5-0.

Item 5.1 was a report from Pasco Economic Growth Director David Engel. It detailed some of the dynamics of Pasco County businesses. Some of the highlights were that: 86 percent of the county's businesses have less than 25 employees, 64 percent of the county's businesses are over 10 years old, 36 percent will be hiring new employees and 43 percent of businesses are owned by Pasco residents. Concerns from the study were: flow of traffic, efforts to revitalize low-income areas, and quality, availability, stability and skills of workers. One of the more troubling statistics was that 70 percent of Pasco County residents traveled outside of the county for work. Engel contrasted this against 47 percent of county residents traveling outside the county for work 10 years ago. This was not an action item.

Items 6.1 and 6.2 in the City Manager's Report, dealt with funds from Penny for Pasco and asked council to

approve an interlocal agreement with Pasco County, Pasco County School Board, Dade City, New Port Richey, Port Richey, San Antonio and St. Leo. It is proposed to create a referendum to extend the Penny for Pasco for an additional 15 years. With this interlocal agreement, the county will receive 45 percent, the school board 45 percent, and the cities will receive a combined share of 10 percent of proceeds collected from the Government Infrastructure Sales Surtax (Penny for Pasco).

Each city's share of the 10 percent is based on the 2020 population. If passed by the voters, Zephyrhills will receive 3.59 percent of the 10 percent, Estimates show this could equal \$68,301,628 over the 15-year period.

Item 6.2 basically asked permission to spend those funds on municipal projects. Those include: transportation infrastructure projects, public drainage and water quality projects, acquisition of public safety communications equipment, public building and facility infrastructure and others. The city is mandated to detail which projects they will divert Penny for Pasco funds toward. Those details are public record in the agenda packet downloadable from the city website.

Councilman Lance Smith noted the \$30 million that went toward the renovation at Zephyrhills High School, the very council chambers they were having the discussion in, as well as the library just next door. These items passed 5-0.

In the City Attorney's Report, Item 7.1 dealt with water and sewer capacity fees. Capacity fees are a one-time fee applied to new growth or redevelopment requiring additional water and sewer capacity. Their purpose is to assign practical, growth-related capital costs to new development responsible for such additional costs. These increases will only be for new construction and not increase the fees for current rate payers and it passed 5-0.

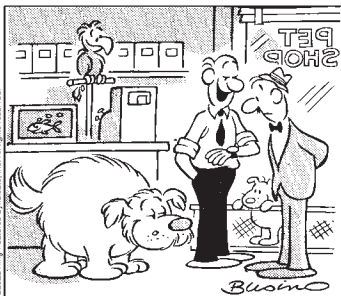

A salt-free rub made with chili powder, garlic powder, paprika, and/or other spices is an effective and salt-free way to add flavor to meat, chicken and fish.



Grill more vegetables. Grilled vegetables, whether they're part of kebabs or simply grilled alongside the main course, add significant flavor and provide all the health benefits of veggies cooked in more traditional ways. The AHA notes that coating vegetables in a healthy oil like olive oil makes it easy to grill them directly over an open flame without sticking. Cooking in this way

imparts that signature smoky, grilled flavor to vegetables.

This summer, grilling can be as healthy as it is flavorful. All it takes is a few simple strategies to make the menu at your next backyard barbecue one any doctor would love.

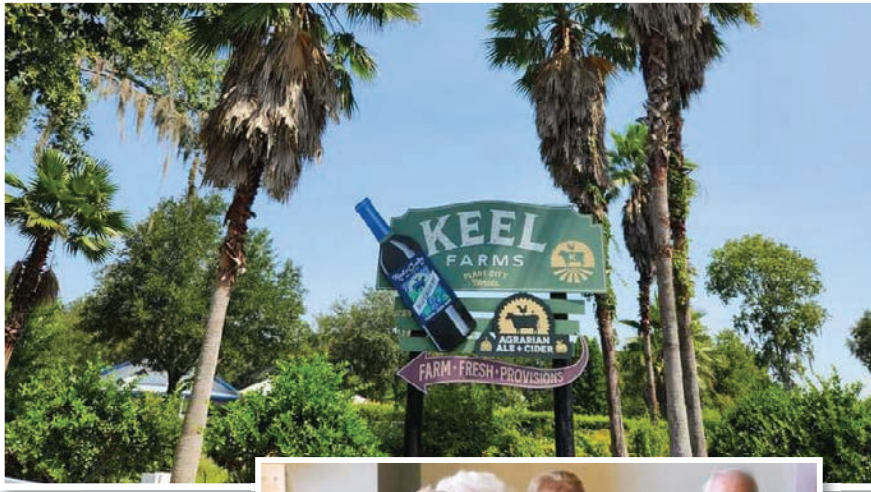

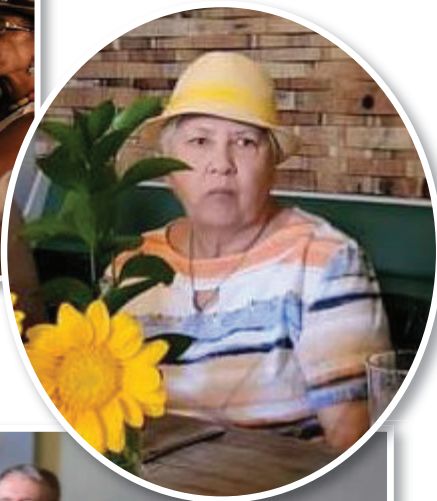

Seventh Annual Zephyrhills Summerfest draws hundreds for a Fourth of July celebration
