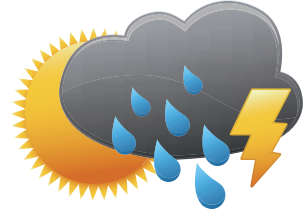

Minimal flooding and lower winds at less than hurricane levels leaves the area virtually unscathed

Last Friday, the National Weather Service reported a tropical storm in the Atlantic Ocean that officially became Hurricane Elsa and it headed for Florida. Locally, as in most places within the cone of uncertainty, people went into disaster preparedness mode.

In essence, city, county and state officials made

sure they were ready for potential disastrous conditions with the storm alternating from tropical storm to a category 1 hurricane and back as it swirled through the Caribbean and up along the west coast of Florida.

"We're prepared for the worst and hoping for the best. Thankfully it's not projected to intensify tonight," city manager Billy Poe said on Tuesday evening. "As soon as you take one too lightly that's the one that's going to intensify and blast you."

For Zephyrhills and nearby east Pasco residents, along with most of west central Florida, there was no such intensifying — this time. The local area was spared for the most part with the exception of a few flooded areas from overnight storms lasting into early Wednesday morning.

A Look Back ...

JULY 8, 2010

New series harkens back to days gone by. Let's look at the above date

For our ninth installment of Look Back, we decided to bring readers a sampling of 2010. That year was marked by numerous newsworthy events. A drilling rig exploded in the Gulf of Mexico, causing an environmental disaster. An earthquake devastated Haiti, killing 160,000 and destroying the capital city.

Plus, George Steinbrenner, whose New York Yankees won seven World Series in his 37-year tenure as owner, died at the age of 80. The New Orleans Saints beat the Indianapolis Colts for their first Super Bowl championship.

On the local front, there was not quite as much of a flair for the dramatic. As summer in east Pasco progressed, there was news about schoolchildren, prominent Zephyrhills High alumni, an expansion of Skydive City and the continuation of a summer series entitled, Getaway for a Day.

On the cover was a feature about the movie *Twilight Eclipse* drawing young and old alike to Zephyrhills Cinema 10. As always, summer movies, notably matinees, continued to be a hit.

In school news, Chester W. Taylor and West Zephyrhills offered high tech camps to elementary students and the Pasco County School District reported that FCAT test scores for area school came in above the state average.

Also out front was a story on how the Zephyrhills Police Department utilizes its computers to communicate with local residents via email and text alerts. It was called the Nixle messaging system.

A look inside revealed an advertisement for events sponsored or listed by the Greater Dade City Chamber of Commerce, a traditional community calendar, weather page and a coloring contest for children that has been

ZAL Bulldawgs are back at practice

Local youth football and cheerleading program begins preparing for the upcoming season that begins in August

Although the season does not begin until late August, youth football players and cheerleaders have returned to the practice fields. Players and coaches began showing up for conditioning and drills last week in preparation for another Zephyrhills Athletic League season.

The Bulldawgs, who play home games and practice at Charles B. Krusen Memorial Field, compete in the Mid-Florida Football and Cheerleading Conference. Most of their opponents are in northern Hillsborough and Polk counties.

Despite a late start last season due to restrictions stemming from the coronavirus pandemic, the Bulldawgs made two championship runs but came up short. The pee wees (ages 9-10) made it within one round of a Super Bowl and settled for being the Western Conference runners-up while the mighty mites (7-8) played in a division Super Bowl but lost.

Football and cheerleading coaches alike have two primary focuses during the initial practice sessions. One is to indoctrinate the newcomers and teach them the basics and another is ensuring that returners and more experienced players learn more and continue to improve.

"It's just working with the kids and trying to make them better," said Mike Johnson, who has coached the pee wee team in recent years but is moving down a level to head up the flag program (4-6) for the upcoming season.

Working with the younger boys means that Johnson must take a simpler approach than he did with the pee wees. He welcomes that challenge.

"I get them ready for the next level and teach them the fundamentals," he said.

Other challenges will be guiding the pee wees and mighty mites

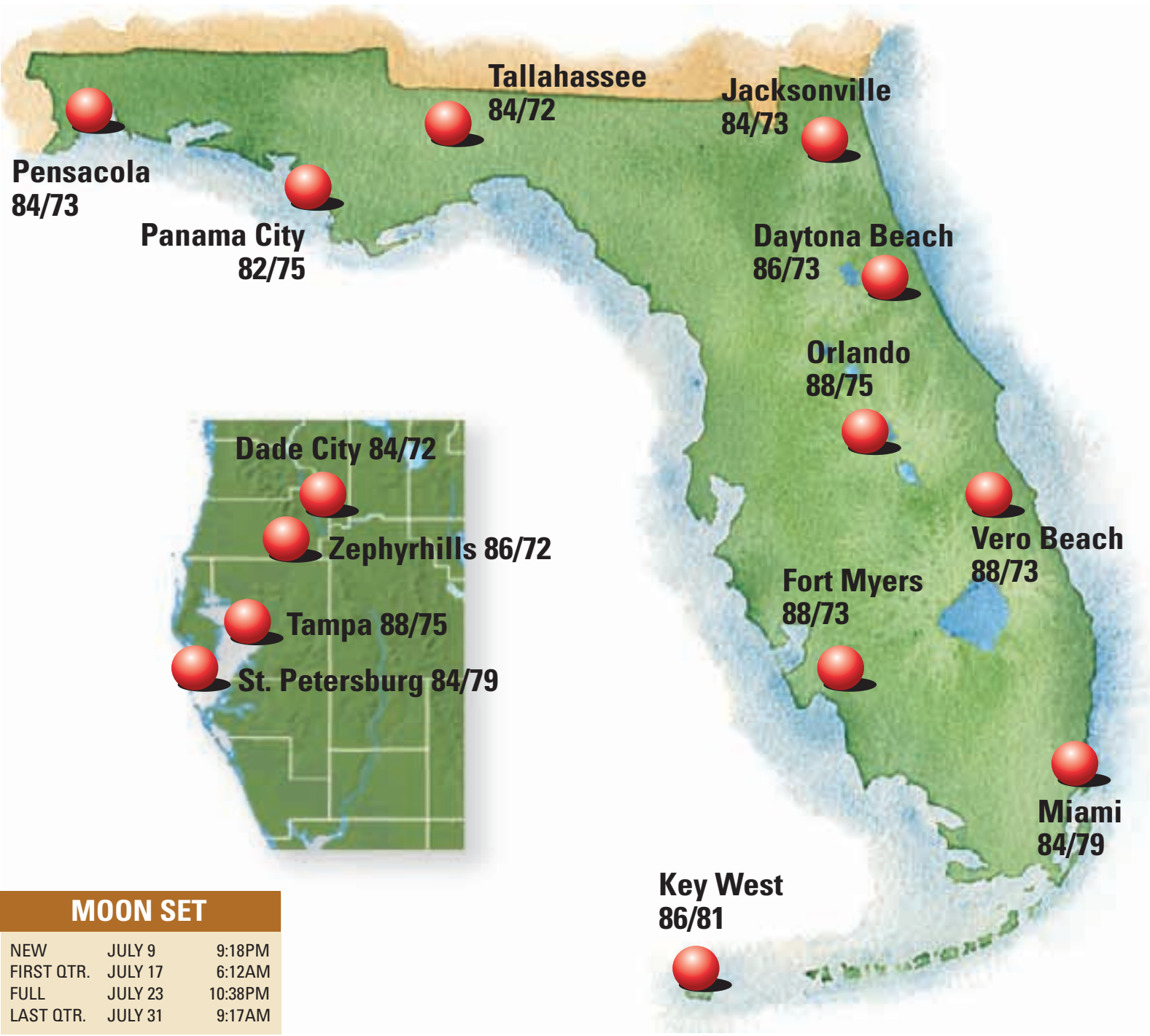

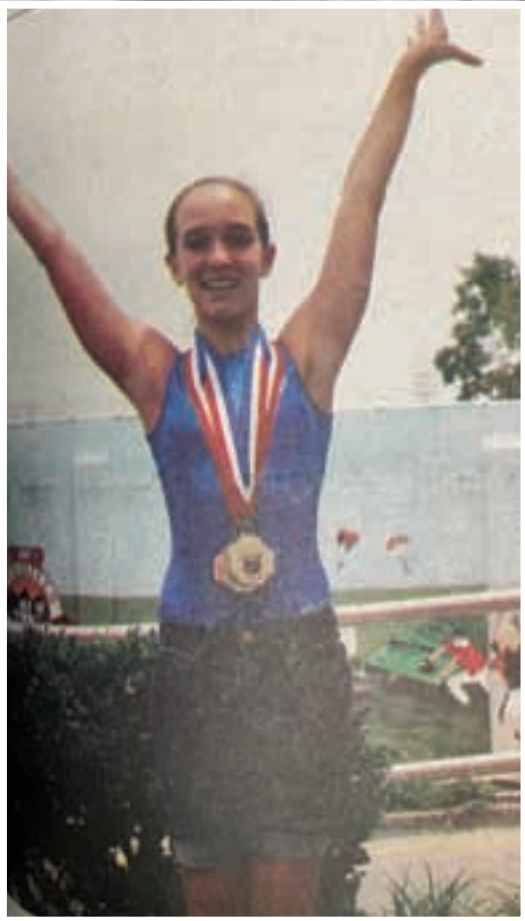

around for years.

There were photo spreads on alumni from Zephyrhills High and Sparklebration, a traditional Fourth of July celebration held annually at the Pasco County Fairgrounds.

In the second section of the paper, there was a variety of stories on school sports as well as a tennis clinic for men and women at Zephyr Courts. Karl Hinkle, the city's former tennis director and longtime coach at Zephyrhills High, organized the clinics for men and women that dated back to 2007.

New high school coaches were profiled with Jimmy McAuley taking over boys track and field while Greg Mathis stepping in as the boys weightlifting coach. McAuley now is in charge of the JROTC program while Mathis is the athletic director and football coach at Stewart Middle School.

Ashley Morris, competing for East Pasco Gymnastics, won a silver medal at the Amateur Athletic Union National Gymnastic Meet in Orlando. She was 13 at the time and earned five medals at that meet.

The Sunshine Athletic Conference All-Academic Team came out and there were plenty of student-athletes from Zephyrhills on it. In all, the list included 43 Bulldogs, which was fourth highest among county schools.

Looking further inside the second section was a fun story on Vonnie Mikkelsen, the chamber's former executive director, making a tandem jump at Skydive City. Plus, in that week's installment for the Getaway for a Day Series the feature was on Manatee County's Anna Maria Island with plenty of beaches, shops and restaurants and small-town charm.

Sports View displayed plenty of photos of all-star teams and individual players from the Zephyrhills Little League. Additionally, there were park news, club news and health briefs, along with a crime report. Aside from the crime report was a tribute for two slain Tampa Police Officers with local ties.

Crosswords, classifieds and, as usual, a seven-day listing of the TV guide, were among the back pages. There also were plenty of automobile ads including Jenkins' Christmas in July sale.

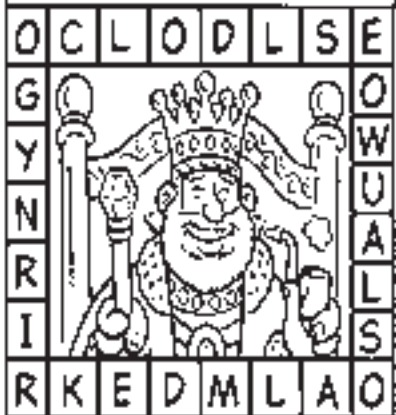

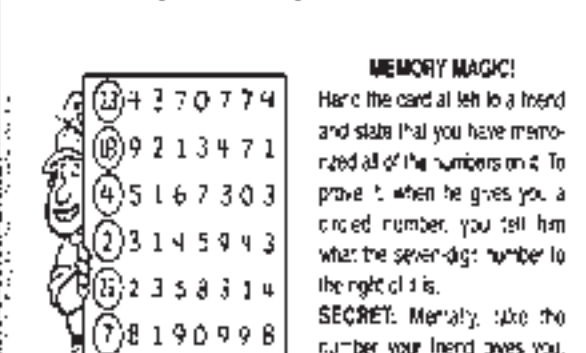

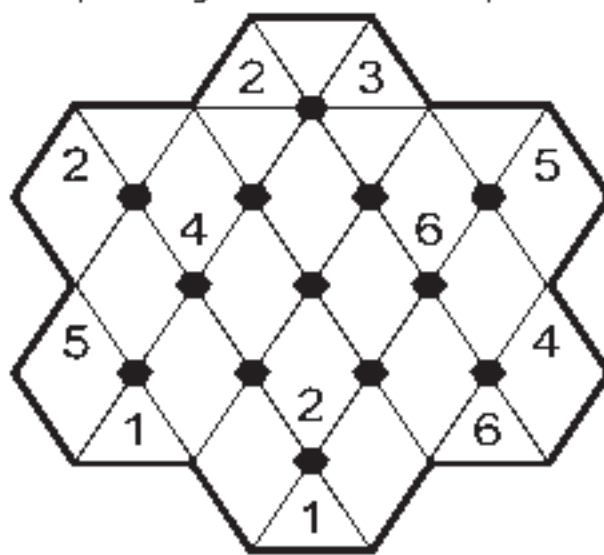

Effective exercises for seniors

Losing interest in an exercise regimen is a situation many fitness enthusiasts have confronted at one point or another. Overcoming a stale workout routine can be simple for young athletes, whose bodies can typically handle a wide range of physical activities. That flexibility allows younger athletes the chance to pursue any number of physical activities when their existing fitness regimens grow stale. But what about seniors who have grown tired of their workouts?

Even seniors who have lived active lifestyles since they were youngsters are likely to encounter certain physical limitations associated with aging. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the likelihood of dealing with one or more physical limitations increases with age. CDC data indicates that 8 percent of adults between the ages of 50 and 59 have three or more physical limitations. That figure rises to 27 percent among adults age 80 and over.

SilverSneakers® even notes that seniors can experience improvements in strength and stability by committing to as little as 10 to 15 minutes of daily Pilates exercises.

- **Strength training:** Seniors on the lookout for something more challenging than a daily walk around the neighborhood should not overlook the benefits of strength training. The CDC notes that seniors who participate in strength training can stimulate the growth of muscle and bone, thereby reducing their risk for osteoporosis and frailty. In fact, the CDC notes that people with health concerns like arthritis or heart disease often benefit the most from exercise regimens that include lifting weights a few times each week.

Physical limitations are a part of aging. But seniors need not let such limitations relegate them to repetitive, boring workouts.

back into Super Bowl contention.

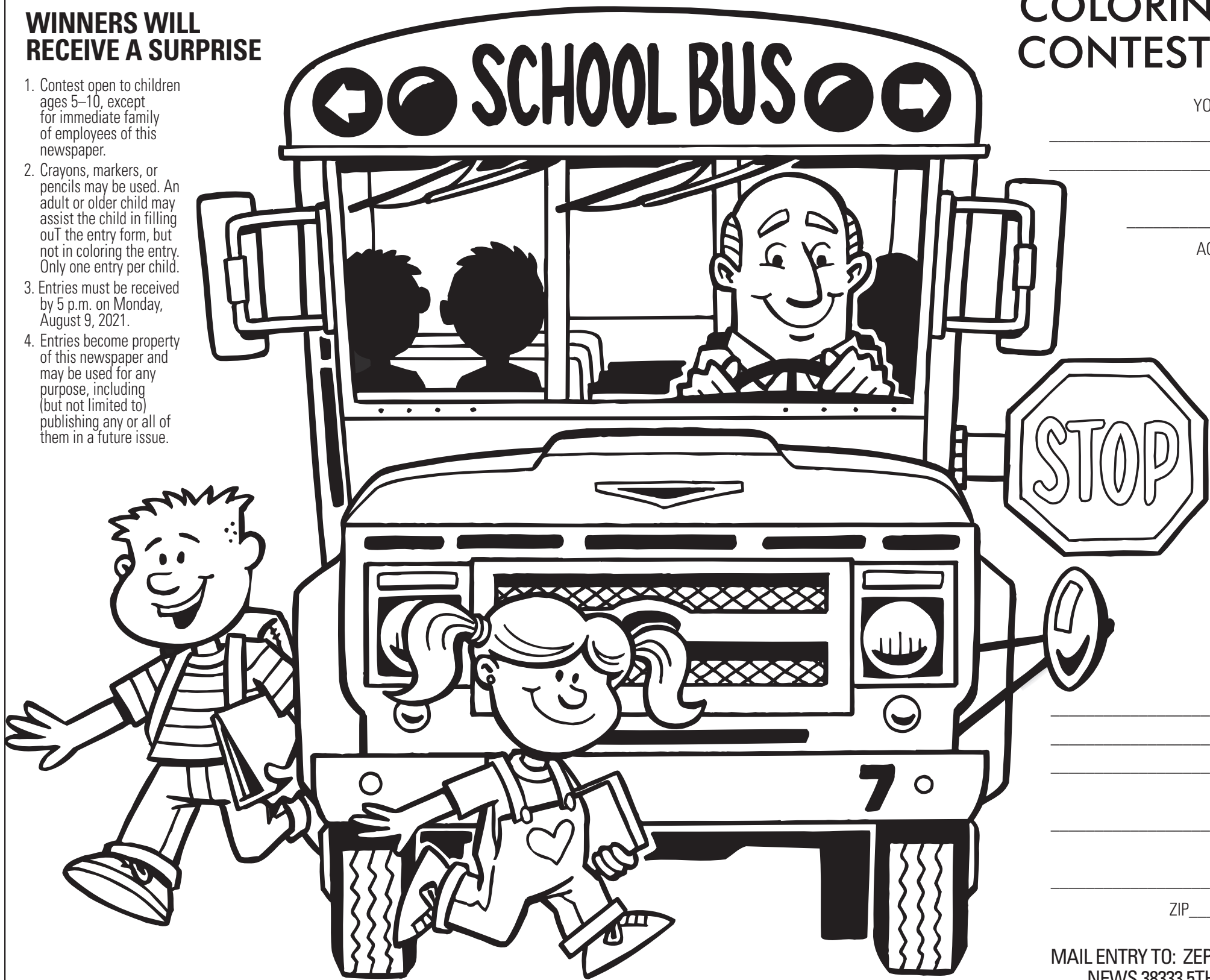

Summerfest replaced Sparklebration, which was formerly held at the Pasco County Fairgrounds but cancelled for a second straight year

Drawing on a familiar refrain for many Americans was Alan Knight, when at last week's city council meeting he said, "Remember that freedom's not free."

Six days later, Summerfest in Zephyr Park — ironically, a free event to the public — symbolized our freedoms with a day-long celebration. It was capped off by a fireworks display with Old Glory waving on surrounding flag poles and on little sticks held by some people as bands played patriotic and popular songs at the Bernie Wickstrom Bandstand.

Zephyrhills' Jenny Lester recalled how disappointing it was that the Fourth of July festivities at the Pasco County Fairgrounds were cancelled for a second straight year in the wake of the coronavirus pandemic. She and her 10-year-old daughter Kelsey were thrilled they had somewhere to go this year.

"I was hoping they would do Sparklebration this year, but this is wonderful," Lester said. "I didn't think it was going to be so crowded, but we've got our little space (on a blanket near the lake) here to watch the fireworks."

Alice Quinones, who enjoyed watching Crossfire Creek, a band out of Clearwater playing at Summerfest for the first time. She took a selfie with lead singer Beamont Battie in front of the bandstand as he walked out into the crowd to sing.

"This is like Main Street America, a little bit of everything," she said while dancing in front of the bandstand. "I love it."

The sentiments of Lester and Quinones surely were shared by many as the nation celebrated its 245th anniversary on Sunday.

Later in Zephyr Park, the fireworks display lit up the night sky over the lake. The festival also featured numerous vendors and craft booths, pony rides, a petting zoo and face painting, along with bounce houses.

Organized by Florida Penguin Productions, Summerfest actually was that Clearwater-based company's sixth event in Zephyr Park. Traditionally, it has not taken place on the Fourth of July so as not to interfere with the annual Sparklebration event in Dade City.

"We always did it the week before because we didn't want to compete with Sparklebration," said Drew Cecere, the company's president.

Upon learning that Sparklebration would not be held once again, Cecere said, "Let's bring everything back to Zephyrhills. I've got family that lives in Zephyrhills, so that's why we started doing (Summerfest) here."

Among the various businesses and organizations that have been part of Summerfest in recent years is the Stano Foundation, whose volunteers enhance the lives of our U.S. Armed Forces, veterans and their families. The foundation sends care packages, personalized letters and cards to service men and women.

On hand overseeing bounce houses during Sunday's festival was Paula Stano, the nonprofit organization's founder in 2015 and mother of Jordan Viches, a U.S. Marine and Wiregrass Ranch High graduate (Class of 2013).

"It totally fits into our mission," she said of celebrating a patriotic event with proceeds from donations to play on the bounce houses earmarked for care packages for U.S. troops overseas.

"My children enjoyed playing in the bounce houses. Now we're going to go watch the fireworks," said Felicia Torres, who walked toward the lake shore with sons Andres and Miguel.

A few miles west of Zephyrhills, another fireworks display went off at Avalon Park. That Wesley Chapel community, just beyond city limits, has had a Fourth of July celebration since 2013. Last year, during the height of the coronavirus pandemic, that was the only fireworks show in the east Pasco area.

"Fortunately, Tropical Storm Elsa didn't batter the city of Zephyrhills too bad," said Shane LeBlanc, the city's public works director. "Luckily, we dodged a bullet this go-round."

There could, however, be more in the chamber. As the first hurricane of the 2021 season, Elsa was initially designated by the National Hurricane Center as the fifth tropical storm in the Atlantic. That came on June 1, five days ahead of last year's first tropical storm, Eduardo. The first storm in the Atlantic does not typically form until sometime in August.

Over the weekend as the storm increased to hurricane status, officials in Cuba evacuated 180,000 residents amid concerns about flooding. By Sunday, Governor Ron DeSantis put together an emergency order as tropical warnings were issued for the Florida Keys.

As was the case throughout the state, local officials prepared as best as they could. LeBlanc and Poe put plans in place to deal with dangerous weather conditions. That entailed pumping down retention ponds, cleaning storm grades and fueling emergency equipment.

LeBlanc said a six-member strike team, led by street superintendent Rob Funnell, was on call overnight to be ready for a quick response if needed.

"Storm preparations involve every city department to ensure the safety of all residents and employees," LeBlanc said. "We had to prepare, with all hands on deck. We can use Tropical Storm Elsa as a training exercise."

City workers worked on Wednesday with the U.S. Post Office and Zephyrhills Municipal Airport among the places operating as usual. Poe noted that if it got too windy that pilots likely would take typical precautions and seek an alternative airport.

Ironically, Poe said city officials are working to update a storm master plan that is not quite ready. A so-called dry run like this week's storm will give local officials more information on handling such an event in the future.

For now, it's about making sure generators are working, retention ponds are drained in preparation to handle heavy rains and that Federal Emergency Management Agency protocols are in place.

"It's making sure everybody has the proper FEMA forms should we need them, but, hopefully, we don't" Poe said.

We didn't this time, but there likely will be several more occasions during the current hurricane season in which local officials will once again have to prepare for a disaster.

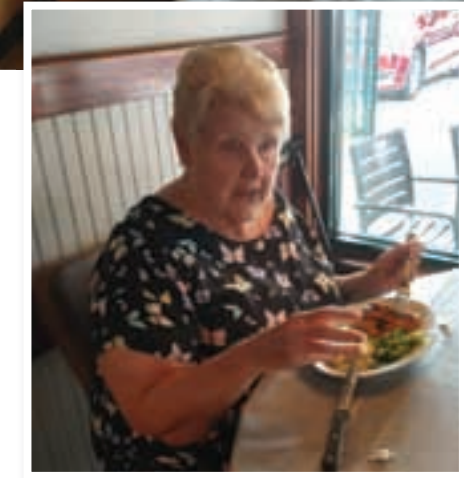

"It just helps you grow," McCullough said of participating in the camp with some of her old teammates as well as new ones.

Added Robles, "It gives you inspiration and motivation."

"It helps you face challenges and strive to be better," Woolfolk said.

Hitchner's response focused more on team chemistry, something the older players and coaches talked about as well.

"It helps build confidence and relationships with each other," she said.

As for what the more experienced players get out of the summer sessions, Llanes said, "It gives you an opportunity to tweak little things you have to master."

Another factor in Llanes' motivation is winning the top SAC award: "It proved to me that all the time and effort I put in was worth it."

Zephyrhills High girls basketball teams had losing seasons for nearly two decades before a turnaround in recent years. It began with a 10-10 record in the 2018-19 season, coach Chris Smith's first with the Bulldogs, and was followed by back-to-back 18-win seasons.

To maintain that momentum, he organized a summer camp on the court at Stewart Middle. The sessions are taking place there due to Alan Reed Court at the high school being unavailable during this summer's renovations.

Showing up three afternoons per week are

most of the returning players from last year, along with a half-dozen girls from Stewart's team that won a conference championship last season. They are not just scrimmaging, however. Smith and assistant coach Kim Miller-McCullough also are incorporating various drills and doing all they can to foster team cohesion.

"It's to improve all the way around in every aspect of the game; ballhandling, defense," Miller-McCullough said.

"It's a good opportunity to evaluate the (former) eighth-graders and get some good competition with the older girls," Smith added, noting that improving the players' shooting accuracy "is extremely important, because probably eight losses (last season) came by a few points. Make a shot here and there, and it's a difference in some games."

Aside from evaluating the incoming freshmen, Smith is eager to see how rising seniors Maya Llanes, Mikayla Cintron and Madison Driggers take on leadership roles. While Llanes and Cintron are more vocal in games and at practices, Smith noted that Driggers prefers to let her actions do the talking.

"She's a quiet leader," the coach said of Driggers, who as a junior had a 7.7 scoring

average. "She does everything she's supposed to."

Llanes, the Sunshine Athletic Conference Player of the Year, and Cintron, an all-conference player, welcome leadership roles. Among their goals is ensuring that the girls coming up from middle school make smooth transitions into the lineup.

"It takes a lot of practice and dedication. You have to be willing to put in the time and effort," said Llanes, who last season averaged a team-leading 18.5 points per game. "This (summer camp) helps improve your game by 100 percent; just by showing up and trying."

For her part, Cintron, who last season averaged a team-high 15 rebounds per game, encourages the incoming members of the team to be aggressive and play hard.

"(At the high school level) it's way more fast-paced. The players are taller, bigger, stronger," she said. "Don't be discouraged, because you're going to make mistakes. If you put in the effort, you'll be fine."

The new high school players should not have any problems acclimating to a winning team since they are coming off a championship season. That group includes Bailee Hitchner,
