#### Season openers loom for ZAL football players and cheerleaders

Practices continue at Krusen Field as the season openers for four divisions are pushed back to Sept. 19

Like many other sports and extracurricular activities affected by the coronavirus outbreaks this year, the Zephyrhills Athletic League's fall season has been delayed. - Age three to five: Children in this age group should receive at least one eye exam between their third and fifth birthdays.
- Age six to 17 years: Children in this age group should receive one eye exam prior to beginning first grade and then an annual exam
- Age 18 to 64: Adults between the ages of 18 and 64 should receive an eye exam at least once every two years.



• Age 65 and older: Annual eye exams are recommended for men and women age 65 and older.

Eye examinations help people preserve and improve their vision while also promoting long-term overall health. These vital components of healthy lifestyles should not be over-


## Did you know?





off," he said, adding, "Size doesn't matter."

Heart and drive are what matters most,

Jackson and Pickett agreed on.

Jackson played several positions while coming up in the ZAL program. That has helped in his development as the Zephyrhills High quarterback, not only with his passing but with his elusive scrambling ability.

Perhaps no one is more eager to get things started for the upcoming season than league director Damien Pickett, who has coached several of his kids and has been the junior varsity coach for a handful of seasons.

"I've probably got the three best receivers in the league, he said, listing that trio as Kingston McCullough, Roosevelt Miller Jr. and A.J. Jack-

Cunningham was equally thrilled to march and perform cheer routines in that parade. Perhaps even more important, however, is how much it means to her to be a co-captain.

"It means, literally, the world to me because I love cheer-leading more than I can explain," she said. "When I leave (high school) I want this program to be better than when I came in."

The Bulldogs have done fairly well in recent years. Last season the team finished as a regional runner-up and advanced to the state semifinals. The year before that they competed in the




HOLLYWOOD -- Is nothing sacred anymore? The University of Southern California has removed an exhibit honoring John Wayne, and there are threats of removing John Wavne's name from what was once The Orange County Airport. It's because of an interview he gave in 1971 to Playboy Magazine. The quote in question is: "With a lot of blacks there's quite a bit of resentment along with their dissent and possibly, rightfully so, but we can't all of a sudden get down on our knees and turn everything over to the leadership of the blacks." No one objected at the time, but the world was a different place then.

Wayne was a formidable figure who became a star in 1939 because of "Stagecoach." He made 142 films, many of which he produced himself, through his company Batjac Productions. His films, such as "The Green Berets" (1968), which were pro-American when many were against the Vietnam War. He was a staunch Republican who campaigned for Richard Nixon, but when Nixon lost, Wayne proclaimed, "I didn't vote for John F. Kennedy but he's my president." His first wife was from Panama and he was extremely vocal opposing communism. He employed a diversity of actors, among them Hispanic, Black, Asian, etc., especially for "The Alamo" (1960) and "The Green Berets." He showed his "True Grit" in 1969 and was rewarded with a best-actor Oscar.

Today's climate is very different from when the Playboy article appeared. Comics can't tell ethnic jokes without offending someone and possibly losing their career, as Michael Richards did. Back then there was no social media, which gives anyone and everyone a voice than can be magnified, right or wrong. Where do we draw the line? A person is declared dead after missing for seven years, yet a statement from 50 years ago, by a man recognized as "an American Natural Resource," can threaten his legacy. Where does it end?

A sequel to "Knives Out" is already in the works. The screenplay received an Oscar nomination, and Daniel Craig will be back as Benoit Blanc. Craig's latest 007 film, "No Time to Die," will be released Nov. 20. Craig allegedly signed a two-picture deal, yet he's telling people he's done playing James Bond. Waiting in the wings as the top contender to replace him is "Outlander" hunk Sam Heughan.

The streaming hit movie "The Outpost," about a squad of outnumbered U.S. soldiers in Afghanistan, stars a number of celebrity offspring: Scott Eastwood (son of Clint), Milo Gibson (son of Mel), James Jagger (son of Mick), Will Attenborough (grandson of Richard) and Scott Alda (grandson of Alan). As a famous sign at The William Morris Agency reads, "If there has to be such a thing as nepotism ... keep it in the family!"
