Zephyrhills football team sets goal of extending its school-record five-year playoff run

The Zephyrhills High football team has made the playoffs an annual rite of passage for the past five seasons. The first two appearances came under former coach Reggie Roberts and the last three with former Bulldog standout Nick Carroll at the helm of his alma mater.

Throughout that impressive span, which has included two straight district titles and back-to-back region semifinal berths, there always have been plenty of players to fill the roster. With the graduation of 23 players, however, Carroll is facing what longtime Zephyrhills coach Tom Fisher had to deal with for many seasons.

A low turnout, which becomes even more daunting by the fact that there are just nine returning seniors.

The varsity roster consists of just 29 players heading into this Friday's preseason game against Sunshine Athletic Conference rival Land O' Lakes at Bulldog Stadium. Kickoff is at 7 p.m.

Carroll, who is entering his fourth season as the Zephyrhills coach, is not as concerned about the number of players. For him and his coaches,

Fresh start for struggling Zephyrhills volleyball team

Longtime local official Joe Galyan welcomes challenge to turn around struggling program

Bring it on, says Joe Galyan, the new volleyball coach for Zephyrhills. Knowing the history of a downtrodden program that has a paltry four victories over the past four seasons, including a 1-15 mark last year, he welcomes the challenge.

"I've officiated the game for about 15 years and played competitively," said Galyan, a former special needs teacher at Woodland Elementary who is now at Zephyrhills High.

Galyan, who also has officiated football, basketball and softball over the past two decades, primarily in Pasco and Polk counties, also stopped officiating to watch his son Jarrin play football for Zephyrhills this season.

"I retired from 29 years of refereeing to be a dad; to be (Jarrin's) No. 1 fan," Galyan said.

Galyan was contacted by athletic director Bruce Cimorelli and applied for a vacancy that came after the departure of Tawnya Booker, a former Bulldog dual-sport athlete who coached volleyball for one season.

Asked what he brings to the table, Galyan responded, "Most certainly book knowledge and interpretation of the game. I know the fundamentals of the game and I know how to run an offense."

Galyan will have plenty of help from assistant

ZHS golf getting on track for 2019

The 2019 ZHS boys and girls golf teams both have a mix of 2018 returners and newcomers

It's going to be a long road back to where the Bulldog girls squad was last year. They were district champs in 2018 and won both the district and region in 2017, including a trip to states at Howie in the Hills. The string of three consecutive district titles stretches back to 2016. The core of those championship teams, however, is gone.

Number one golfer for four years, Emille Alderman, is attending Snead State Community College in Alabama on a golf scholarship. The number two golfer the last four years, Hannah Sullivan, graduated. Number three and four golfers Sydney Baldus and Ashley Regan are gone and that leaves a cavernous void, a void that the team has some prospects to fill.

They'll have some help from the vestiges of the past. First, Hannah Sullivan's father, Carl, has stepped up as a volunteer coach for the Bulldogs. Sydney Baldus' father, Gary, is now the head coach and even Hannah comes back to help out coaching. Gary Baldus felt the call or rather, got the call that he was going to be the next girls golf coach at Zephyrhills.

"It was actually a call from coach (Jeff) Hupp," Baldus said. "One thing that stoked me about the job was that I knew it was going to be a rebuilding year, that they needed someone willing to teach the girls

just how to play the game."

It lined up with Baldus' lack of coaching experience. Baldus is the founding senior pastor at New Walk Church on State Road 54 and he has zero formal coaching experience. He knows and can teach the basics, which is just what the team needs this season. Beyond that, Baldus will lean on his own acquisition

of knowledge and that of Sullivan, as well as the pros at Silverado.

"Silverado has been phenomenal to the kids," Baldus said. "It's so rare that golf pros would help with schools, we get great support from Silverado."

The Bulldogs always have. Sean Klotz is one of

Simple ways to help kids lose weight

Childhood obesity is a global health issue. In fact, childhood obesity is so prevalent that the World Health Organization identifies it as one of the most serious public health challenges of the 21st century. As daunting a task as tackling childhood obesity may seem, it's a problem that can be solved.

The WHO notes that, in 2016, an estimated 41 million children across the globe were overweight. That's a troubling statistic, as overweight and obese children are likely to remain so into adulthood, increasing their risk for various diseases, including diabetes and cardiovascular disease.

Parents of children who are overweight or obese may find it difficult to get youngsters to change their lifestyles and adopt healthy behaviors that can help them lose weight and keep the weight off. Like adults, many children are creatures of habit, particularly when it comes to diet. And getting kids to change those habits is not always so easy. However,

a few simple strategies might be all it takes to help kids lose weight and get on the path to a healthier lifestyle.

- **Limit sugar intake.** The WHO recommends reducing kids' sugar intake. Sodas and juices, even fruit juices, are often loaded with sugar. Many children drink these beverages every day, with some even consuming multiple servings per day. Water is a healthy alternative to soda and juice, and parents can slowly transition their youngsters away from sugary beverages by diluting the beverages with water and only allowing kids to have them on special occasions.

- **Switch things up at snack time.** Many children eat daily snacks, and that's perfectly normal. Youngsters are growing and, as a result, tend to get hungry between meals. What parents serve at snack time can have positive or negative effects on youngsters' weights. The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends parents use snack time as a way to

increase kids' intake of fruits and vegetables. Fruits and vegetables are nutrient-dense, and the WHO says increasing fruit and vegetable intake is a great way to fight childhood obesity.

- **Focus on more than the dinner table.** Getting overweight and obese kids to eat healthy diets is just one aspect of helping them lose weight. Routine physical activity is another essential part of a successful weight loss plan. The WHO recommends that

children get at least 60 minutes of moderate-to vigorous-intensity physical activity every day. Parents can promote a physically active lifestyle and limit the time kids spend on devices or playing video games by only allowing access to such distractions after kids have been physically active.

Overweight and obese children may need help and some extra encouragement as they try to lose weight.

the current pros at Silverado and he even coached the boys golf team in the past. Former Silverado pro Shaun Van Patten actually coached the boys team through much of the 2018 season before he took a job in Saint Petersburg and had to relinquish the position. Current boys coach Hupp, finished out the 2018 season as head coach and it was Hupp that initially reached out to Baldus about the girls job.

Coaching aside, it will be the efforts of the 2019 girls that determine just how close they get back to those district title aspirations.

Only three girls return, sophomore Brooke Baldus, senior Ricci Guico and junior Makayla Shipley. The other four, sophomores Caitlyn Regan and Alyssa Perez, as well as freshmen Maya Gray and Bri Cunningham have never touched a club before. This puts a lot of pressure on the returners.

"I'm a little nervous about it but I'm also excited for the new challenge," Shipley said. "One of the big things is not getting too into my own head, not letting a bad shot affect the rest of my game."

It's a burden and a lesson Shipley will share.

"I try to channel the nervous energy into my game and not let it mess with my head," Brooke Baldus said.

Taking private lessons is something that could kickstart the girls squad this season.

"When that switch flips, they tend to go and get lessons," Baldus said. "They can get lessons at Silverado, even."

That switch has already flipped for Guico. She started taking lessons at Plantation Palms in Land O' Lakes over the summer.

"Chipping and putting are big factors in my game and if I can get the short game good, I can make more pars and birdies," Guico said.

Guico also spoke about a summer trip she took with her father, Keith, playing 18-hole courses all around the state.

The boys are much better situated to match or even improve on their 2018 status. The 2018 boys team qualified for states, won conference and were the runners-up at regionals. Of the seven boys that make up the 2019 team, only one of the top three golfers is gone to graduation. Much of their top tier returns and lessons learned from states carry over into 2019.

"The state tournament was a big learning experience," Hupp said. "The course is just so big, the holes are a lot more difficult - it's one of the top three most difficult courses in the state."

Three of the golfers from that state meet return. Roddy Kight, now a senior, was the number one golfer from 2018 and according to Hupp, "has a great drive, about 380 yards." Junior Christian Hupp is a likely slot into the number two spot. It's his third year on varsity and the team will have to rely on his consistency. Junior Trevor Myers was the number four golfer in 2018. Myers took a leap forward in 2018 and Hupp hopes that trajectory continues. Behind those three, sophomores John Helms, Evan Drinkwater, Chris Larussa and Tyler Beson will vie for that number four spot in the lineup.

Hupp is thankful he's not doing it alone. He will rely both on Klotz and volunteer coach Carl Gennaro.

"Sean (Klotz) will help us with our swing and with technical issues, and just have his knowledge to draw on," Hupp said. "Without them (Klotz and Gennaro) this would be extremely tough."

It's still very early, the Bulldogs haven't even had many team practices as they gear up for the Aug. 20 season opener against Mitchell and Fivay. Much is left to be determined for both squads. Hupp mentioned that his boys will be playing some internal matches to help sort out positions this week.

The girls will most likely be working out the same situations. Both teams are in search of sponsors for the season.

and junior varsity coach Madison Marker, who recently moved down here from Pennsylvania. She played volleyball at the high school and club levels in the Philadelphia area.

Unaware that the Bulldogs have not had a winning season since they posted a 12-8 record in 2011 or that there were consecutive winless seasons in 2015 and 2016, Marker is not overly concerned about the past.

“This is a totally different team,” she said. “We’re not only here to teach them to win, but to have a strong foundation.”

Two players with solid foundations are returning senior Kayla Zinc, a four-year varsity

player, and junior transfer Mercedes Krueger from Michigan.

“I think we just have to talk more and be more aware of what’s going on,” said Zinc, a right hitter who will play as a defensive specialist this season. “I think this year’s going to be very good. We have a really good team this year.”

Judging by what she has seen so far in the early practices, Krueger, a club-level player, shared that sentiment.

“There’s a lot of potential on this team and I think this year’s going to be a good year,” said Krueger, an outside hitter and middle blocker.

Galyan noted that this year’s team is on the verge of a turnaround. That will happen, he said, with “consistency, dedication, hard work and commitment.”

To help with conditioning, as well as informing the players the best way to maintain a healthy diet, physical trainer Kristen Dumont was brought in.

“The more endurance, the more you can go,” said Dumont, a 2007 Zephyrhills graduate who trains at RetroFlex Fitness.

Galyan backed Dumont in her efforts to emphasize the importance of conditioning with both, along with Marker, understanding that often the most conditioned players win in the long, drawn-out games.

“Game 5’s coming,” Galyan said.

Aside from Zinc and Krueger, the rest of the varsity team includes: Madison Aguilera, Taryn Henry, Laila Huffman, Aleah Killebrew, Mayka Llanes, Aamahri Lewis, Alysha Mathis, Izabella Mathis, Sierrah Peacock and Madison Poe.

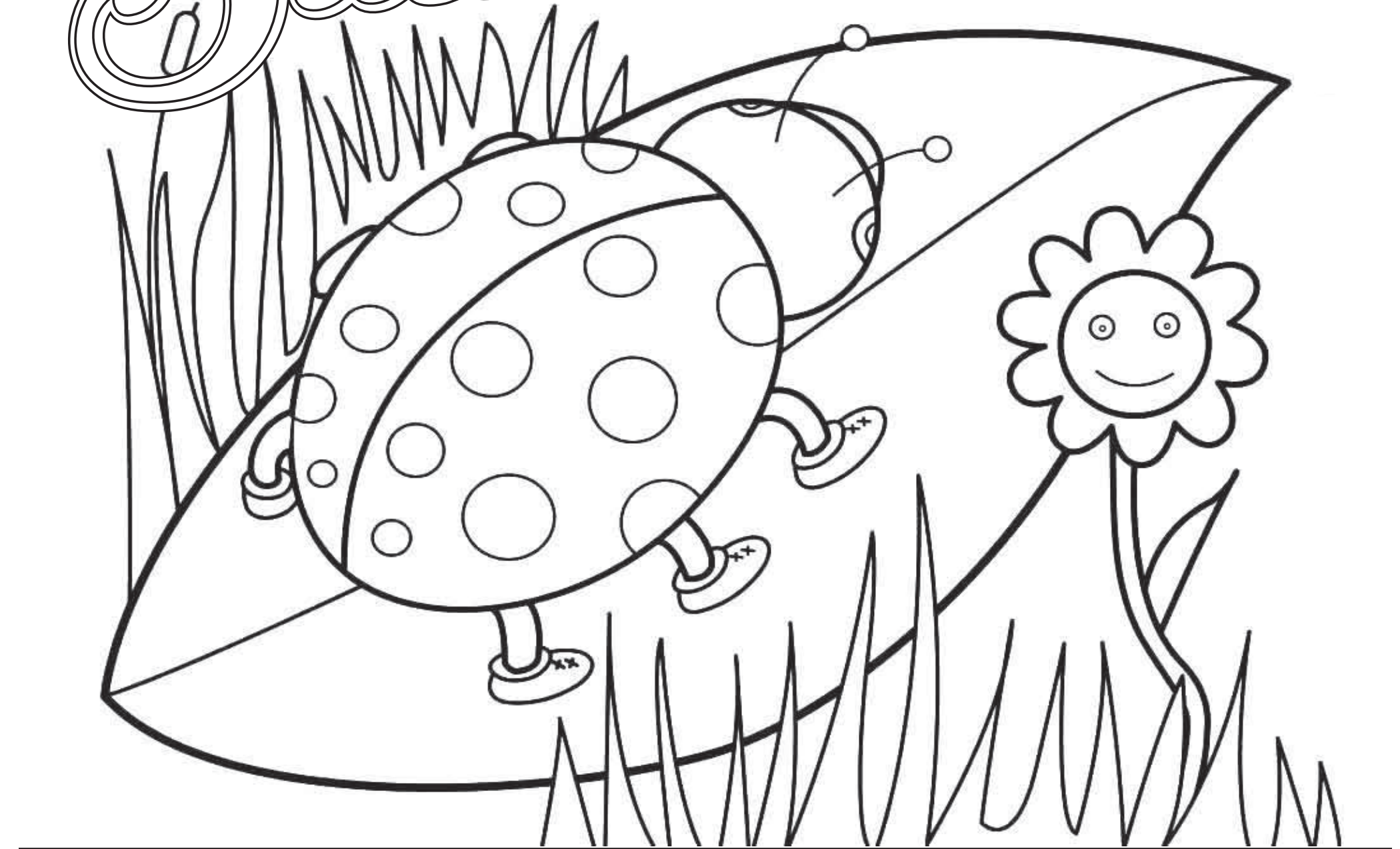

Pasco Sheriff's Office Newsletter

The Pasco Sheriff's Office and the Pasco County School Board began a fund-raising drive last year for a new initiative called Stop the Bleed. Last year's shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, once again starkly showed the need for training and resources to be available in shootings and other mass casualty incidents. Right here in our agency, one of our K9 deputies recently received a life-threatening gunshot wound to his leg where a tourniquet was quickly applied that probably saved his life.



The Stop the Bleed campaign is a national initiative, which aims to train and empower civilians to act swiftly and effectively in trauma situations, like active shooter incidents. Training is provided by medical personnel who are experts in the initial stages of trauma management and is tailored to teach quick, life-saving measures that can be provided to anybody in the event of an emergency.

As part of this campaign, each Pasco County school will be provided with three LIFE Stations containing five trauma kits in each. The Life Stations will be placed in strategic locations to be rapidly accessed in an emergency, such as an active shooter situation. The initial costs for all of the quality, long-lasting kits needed is \$250,000. These stations also include one casualty extraction litter housed in the LIFE

Pack, along with other important items that can assist in saving lives, such as:

- 1 Fold-out Product Instruction
- 2 Pair Nitrile Gloves (Latex Free)
- 1 Emergency Scissors
- 1 Tourniquet
- 1 Blood clotting Hemostatic Dressing
- 1 Compressed Gauze
- 1 Trauma Bandage
- 1 Chest Seal (twin pack)

The LIFE Station container is a surface-mounted storage cabinet meant to be located in publicly-accessible areas, much like AEDs inside schools, offices, and other buildings. The LIFE Station is identical to traditional AED cabinets, but specifically designed to house a LIFE Pack.

Thanks to the partnership with Mike Fasano and the Pasco Tax Collectors Office, Regional Medical Center Bayonet Point and our own Pasco Sheriff's Charities, we have raised enough money to put one life station in every high school by the start of this school year. Members from our Pasco Sheriff's Explorer program assisted in recording a brief training video that will be played in every high school informing students and staff about the LIFE kits and how to use them.

Skimmers located at Pasco gas pumps

On Aug. 7, the Pasco Sheriff's Office Economic Crimes Unit received assistance from the Department of Agriculture Petroleum Inspectors to conduct gas pump checks in an effort to locate credit card/debit card skimmers. A total of 147 gas station locations were checked countywide which resulted in nine skimmers

being located on gas pumps at nine different locations.

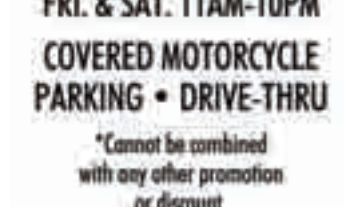
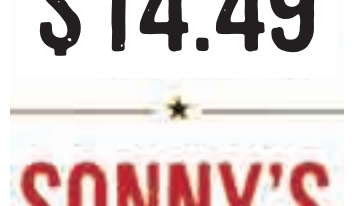
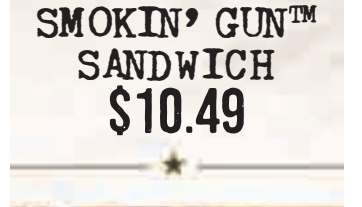

it's all about the quality of players. "Our goals don't change," he said. "It's to be district champs, host playoff games and make a run to states."

For the Bulldogs to pull that off they will have to rely on a combination of key returners and newcomers up from winning programs at the junior varsity level as well as from Stewart Middle, which has dominated the east side of the county for a half-dozen seasons.

Among the players Carroll is looking for leadership roles are a pair of senior two-way linemen Demetrius Wright and A.J. Mathis, senior Zion Williams, a running back-outside linebacker and Bobby Reidenbach, an offensive lineman and linebacker.

"Those are kids who have been part of this program and who are going to help lead," Carroll said, noting that the lines on both sides of the ball will be pivotal to the team's success. "They're big and strong."

Nick Novo, who spelled starting quarterback Doug Crawford, a 2019 graduate, at times last season will battle T.J. Jackson, who also can line up as a slot receiver and at running back, for the vacant signal-caller position. Novo is a tall, lanky pocket passer who also can pull the ball down to scramble while Jackson is a left-handed passer who also can scramble like former quarterback Charles Harrison, a 2018 graduate.

"He's tall, he works really hard and he's strong," Carroll said of Novo, who missed some playing time during this summer's 7-on-7 football action due to a hand injury. "His arm's gotten a lot better."

As for Jackson the coach said, "He makes plays with his legs and he made some great throws this summer in 7-on-7."

Carroll described the quarterback position as "open because they're not battle-tested," adding that he likes the different looks Novo and Jackson can give to a defense. "We can run more things, but we can still throw the ball. They both bring a different type of skill set."

As for running and receiving, the Bulldogs have plenty of choices with a mix that includes Williams, Mike Barber, Tre Gallimore, Marc Dortch, Zyre Roundtree, Clayton Cornelliis and Jaylin Thomas.

"I like to be able to put those athletes out in open spaces so that any time they can catch the ball," Carroll said.

Perhaps more players could be called up to the varsity as the season progresses, but for now Carroll will leave about 25 players on the JV squad.

For the first time this season, assistant Chris Barrack will call the offensive plays while Matt Jackson steps in as the defensive coordinator for Brian Thomas, a former Zephyrhills star who got married last winter with the couple expecting a baby this fall.
