Sarah Vande Berg Tennis & Wellness Center hosts first beach tennis tournament, but surely not the last one

Beach tennis came to Zephyrhills last weekend when the Sarah Vande Berg Tennis & Wellness Center hosted a two-day event. It won't be the last for that relatively new sport either.

Organizers said they would love to return to the new center that opened last year with Pascal Collard, the facility's chief executive officer, echoing that sentiment and saying plans were being made for additional beach tennis competitions.

"We're going to do it four-to-six times a year," he said. "There's a vision to bring other racquet sports to

While that would include badminton and ping

pong once an indoor building is constructed on the grounds located off Simons Road, the primary focus after last weekend is bringing back even more beach tennis players than the 24, two-member teams that showed

up last weekend. "This is perfect, because four courts are the minimum we can use," said Michelle Bos, who along with Armando Ghinaglia help organize beach tennis tourneys, including recent stops in Tavares (near Orlando) and Clearwater. "I've been to different places and I think this will be the VIP site. They have lights and

that's very important to our tournaments."

"Top of the line," is how Ghinaglia described the SVB center and its four sandy courts. "Their main focus should be tournaments."

The International Federation of Beach Tennis Tournament, held Saturday and Sunday, consisted of various divisions for professionals and amateurs. Most of the players on the two dozen teams came from the Tampa Bay area, along with the Orlando metropolitan area as well as parts of south Florida.

Quarantine leads to Zephyrhills opting out of preseason game

Virus hits Bulldogs hard, forcing a withdrawal from a three-way scrimmage at Zephyrhills Christian Academy

In the first week of school, the state reported more than 400 students having to quarantine due to Covid-19, which is once more surging. Locally, a player on the Zephyrhills High football team tested positive.

Late last week athletic director Bruce Cimorelli, who also is a former assistant football and weightlifting coach for the Bulldogs, said about 20 players were affected and that number could increase this week.

That forced the Bulldogs to withdraw from a three-way preseason scrimmage scheduled for Aug. 20 at Zephyrhills Christian Academy. Gainesville Buchholz also is set to come down to Pasco County to play and Zephyrhills Christian coach Mike Smith said he sought to bring in another team to take the place of Zephyr-

"It stinks. We really wanted to play Zephyrhills Christian," said Zephyrhills coach Nick Carroll, who conferred with principal Christina Stanley and Cimorelli before pulling out of the game. "I know a lot of people wanted to see us and ZCA play."

With the varsity team adversely impacted, notably several players on both sides of the ball, Carroll did not consider fielding junior varsity players against other teams' var-

sity squads. "Ŷou don't want to put the JV players out there," he said. "For safety reasons, we didn't do that."

Not everyone in quarantine was infected with Covid-19. Florida Department of Health guidelines state that K-12 students who are symptomatic or test positive should be excluded from school facilities and may not return for at least 10 days. Those exposed can return after a 14-day quarantine from the date of last exposure, or after seven days if they test negative.

"We're going to see when we can get those kids back," Carroll said. "We hope that this is the only time it happens, but it's something we can't control."

As for the rest of the Bulldogs, the varsity and JV players will continue to practice while being somewhat shorthanded.

'We've practiced, but obviously we didn't have the offensive line and defensive line,"

Four entities seek solutions for transmission pole

The city, county, Metro and Duke hope to find some solution that would remove the pole and open up Kossik Road

If frustration could melt metal, the transmission pole on the west side of Wire Road, opposite Otis Allen Road, would just be a pile of molten steel. The transmission pole stands defiantly obstructing any sort of connection from Kossik Road to Wire Road, a significant

thoroughfare that would help open up the north side of Zephyrhills. Frustration boiled over at the Aug. 9 Zephyrhills City Council meeting. Senior planner Rodney Corriveau approached council with a final plat for the Abbott Park Development that straddles Kossik Road.

Councilman Ken Burgess began politely but his frustration grew as the subdivision nears completion and yet the massive metal road block continues to be, "kicked down the road." Burgess later softened his tone and even walked back some of his angst at the end of the meeting but his sentiment was shared by every council member.

The sentiment was so pervasive that city council did not approve the plat, rather, they tabled it until the Aug. 23 meeting.

It was not a line in the sand drawn with the tip of a sword but more with an olive branch. While council and Zephyrhills City Manager William Poe Jr. are frustrated, they are also eager to come to the table and work with the interested parties toward a solution. Let's look at the parties involved.

Wire Road Pavement Project in Zephyrhills

Single lane closures started this week

An alert for Pasco County drivers. The Wire Road Pavement Rehabilitation Project began this week. The crews will focus on road base rehabilitation, milling, resurfacing and new pavement markings.

The project includes work along the entire three-mile stretch of Wire Road from County Road 54 to Gall Boulevard (U.S. Highway 301). North and southbound lanes will be under construction with single lane closures.

Work hours are Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 4

Message boards will direct traffic.

Project is expected to take 32 days to complete, depending on weather conditions. Target completion date is Sept. 17

Asphalt Paving Systems is the contractor for this Pasco County Department of Public Works project.





Carroll said. "We ran the (passing) routes and we worked on the secondary."

On Sunday afternoon, Carroll led a Zoom call with the missing players. Aside from being an effort to keep them involved with the program, he informed them of some new additions for the game plan against Kathleen in Lakeland. That season opener is sched-

uled for Aug. 27 with a 7:30 p.m. kickoff.

"We installed three more running plays," the coach said. "That way we have everything in when we play Kathleen."

While Pasco Superintendent Kurt Browning spoke in a press conference last week about reluctantly abiding by Governor Ron DeSantis' ban on mask mandates in schools, he nonetheless encouraged staff and students to don masks.

Carroll, who is vaccinated, concurred: "We really want them to wear a mask so we can keep the virus away from our team."

This marks a second straight season in which the coronavirus has made an impact on the early part of the schedule for the Bulldogs. At the beginning of the school year last August, they were dealt a major blow when a player tested positive and several players were quarantined. Zephyrhills missed two early games, but salvaged the season

by rallying to make the playoffs.

Unlike Zephyrhills, Wiregrass Ranch dealt with adverse implications from the virus at the end of last season. Following a positive test by a player, several Bulls were quarantined, which led the team from opting out of its playoff game.



GOD'S PROMISE vs MAN'S EFFORTS

"For if they which are of the law be heirs, faith is made void, and the promise of none effect: Because the law worketh wrath" (Romans



The apostle Paul, God's great apostle of grace, declares in Romans 4:4-5: "Now to him that worketh is the reward not reckoned of grace, but of debt. But to him that worketh not, but believeth on Him that justifieth the ungodly, his faith is counted for righteousness." Let's go back to that phrase: "the law worketh wrath." Many people just don't want to see this. Even some clergymen tell us that the law was given to help us to be good, but God Himself says, "the law worketh wrath." Every criminal knows this, and every sinner should know it. God certainly places strong emphasis on it. "Wherefore then serveth the law? It was added because of transgressions (Galatians 3:19) "that every mouth may be stopped, and all the world may become guilty before God" "Therefore by the deeds of the law there shall no flesh be justified in His sight: for by the law is the knowledge of sin (Romans 3:19-20).

If we come to God expecting eternal life because of our good works... Are we not offering Him our terms, which He will never accept? He will never sell salvation at any price, and certainly not for a few paltry "good" works, when our lives have been filled with failure and sin. Sin and death came into the world by one man, Adam, and God says that all have sinned and come short of His glory (Romans 3:23 and 5:12).



The City of Zephyrhills.

The city is just about finished with the signal and intersection improvements on the Pretty Pond/U.S. 301 Project. The already famous Chick-Fil-A is drawing business into the area and traffic is steadily increasing. Having a good access road on the north side of town that connects U.S. 301 and Wire Road is a priority. Kossik currently stretches east from U.S. 301 but only just enough to access Abbott Park. A plastic fence with red caution markers wall off the road just a few hundred yards from the transmission pole and Wire Road.

Pasco County

Despite most of the residential and commercial parcels in the area, including Abbott Park being within city limits, Kossik Road, as well as Otis Allen and Wire roads, are county roads. Poe speculates as to why the county is holding onto them.

"I assume the ultimate goal is to connect Overpass Road to Epperson, then connect to Kossick and Otis Allen and then to U.S. 98," Poe said. "It will be another east-west cross-county connector like state roads 52, 54 and 56."

While the county might have their eyes set on the bigger picture, the city just wants to complete the Kossick connection. They are working with Metro Development to do just that.

Metro Development

Metro is the builder for Abbott Park. The development is often confused with Zephyr Park. They are, in fact, the same development. In the Fall of 2019, Zephyr Park started to be referred to as Abbott Park. This is not uncommon. It was Metro and the Zephyr Commons builder, the commercial development with the Publix, that constructed the part of Kossik Road that exists today from U.S. 301 to the wall. The city and Metro have a business agreement that Metro will construct the first two lanes of Kossik but that if they expand to three or four lanes, the city will provide impact fee credits.

"We are hopeful that the parties involved can work out a solution to connect the roads for our community," John Afflebach, marketing director of Metro Development Group, developer of the nearby Abbott Park community, said.

The power company holds the cards because they own the land that the transmission pole sits on. On Feb. 24, 2014, Duke acquired the plot from Dune FL Land I Sub, LLC for the sum of \$390,000. It was part of a civil action in the Sixth Judicial Circuit Court ceding the eminent domain of just the easement where the pole is located.

Now it's about coming together to figure out a solution. "The goal is, let's get it figured out, if it's cost prohibitive to move it, otherwise, let's get that road in and move traffic," Poe

said. Poe met with representatives from each of the groups prior to the Aug. 9 meeting. What transpires when Poe meets again with the interested parties ahead of the Aug. 23 meeting, could dictate whether or not final plats are approved for Abbott Park or not. Everyone is seemingly willing to come to the table at this point but city council also seems poised to halt progress on the development until a solution for connecting Kossik Road to Wire Road is devised.



Matches played in the sand at SVB on what has been

traditionally used as beach volleyball courts. The nets were best described as in between volleyball and tennis nets, both in height and density. The game was played with low compression tennis balls and a wooden paddle that is similar to one used for pickleball.

Beach tennis, which originated in Italy in the mid-1970s and has been played in the United States for about 10 years, combines elements of tennis and volleyball. The ball cannot touch the ground and scoring is the same as it is in tennis. In some places it's called beach paddleball. It is played in 50 countries, mostly in Italy, Spain and Brazil.

The health benefits include the sport being excellent for a cardio workout with low impact to knees and joints due primarily to the game being played in the sand.

Boutros said she believed that beach tennis might

eventually become an Olympic sport. For now, though, it is likely to continue expanding. Marco Notarianni and Alessandro Antezza paired up over the weekend with both having originally played the game while growing up

HOLLYWOOD -gie Smith wasn't sure she wanted to play the dowager countess, yet again, in "Downton Abbey 2," but by the time she read the script, which has been called "a lot of fun," she agreed to visit Downton at least one more time.
