With staff and school personnel on campus this week, the arrival of local students comes a week behind

Students at Pasco County public schools do not begin the 2021-22 academic year until next Tuesday. For administrators, teachers and other school personnel, however, it's back to school this week.

Those adults returned to their respective campuses at the elementary, middle and high school levels on Tuesday and spent this week gearing up for students'

arrival next Tuesday. In the interim there is meet the teacher day at all county public schools this Thursday.

For former Zephyrhills High assistant principal Matt McDermott, who also spent time as an administrator at Sunlake and now is the principal at Wesley Chapel, the message at this time of year is always the same.

"The first week is to get teachers excited about the new school year," said McDermott, who also has been a teacher and coach (wrestling and football) at those high schools. "It's just to make sure they're on the same page and to be focused and ready for the students who come back next week."

Being ready is something that will come down to the wire at Zephyrhills High. Due to renovations that

A Look Back ...

AUG. 5, 1993

New series harkens back to days gone by. Let's look at the above date

For our 13th Look Back, part of a summer-long series, we turn to 1993. That year brings back many memories since I was the sports editor of *The Zephyrhills News* and *The Laker Republic Newspapers* published both weeklies back then.

In prominent news stories, Bill Clinton was sworn in as the 42nd President of the United States and Kim Campbell became the first female Prime Minister of Canada. Before Clinton's arrival, President George H.W. Bush and Russian President Boris Yeltsin signed the second Strategic Arms Reduction Treaty.

Elsewhere, a bomb exploded at the north tower of the World Trade Center in New York City, the first version of Microsoft's line of Windows NT operating systems was manufactured and the Waco siege of a religious sect compound took place in Texas. It lasted 51 days and resulted in 86 deaths.

In sports, the Dallas Cowboys defeated the Buffalo Bills in the Super Bowl. The former National Football League powerhouse would beat the Bills in a Super Bowl rematch the next season. The Toronto Blue Jays won a second straight World Series and the Chicago Bulls, led by Michael Jordan, completed their first of two three-peats in the National Basketball Association Finals.

In a sign of the times on the local front, there was a wide array of stories. The centerpiece feature was a welcome back for Jim Davis, who returned to Zephyrhills High as a principal. He had been an assistant principal, teacher and coach at that school. He replaced Larry Robison, Zephyrhills High's principal for 13 years who moved on to head the Saddlebrook Prep Academy.

Worldwide 9/11 Memorial to take place at Skydive City

A 9/11 memorial event crossing three continents will be focused in on Skydive City in Zephyrhills

It remains one of the most devastating tragedies in American history. The terrorist attacks against the United States on Sept. 11, 2001 remain burned in the American psyche. There isn't an American born after 2001 that doesn't remember where they were that fateful day. Aside from taking the lives of more than 3,000 Americans, it forever changed the New York City skyline and has a lasting effect on diplomatic relations, even today.

The year 2021 will mark the 20th anniversary of the 9/11 attacks. Commemorative events will be held all across the country. If 20-year Air Force veteran and professional skydiver Partick Fortune and Skydive City of Zephyrhills have anything to say about it, they'll put on one of the more colorful and unifying events of them all.

Fortune was jogging along U.S. Highway 301 at 2:30 in the morning, this past January when it dawned on him that 2021 was going to be the 20th anniversary of the incident.


Services that will continue to be provided at the Dade City office include automobile/boat registrations and renewals, all title work (Florida title and out-of-state titles transferring to Florida), hunting & fishing licenses, property tax, business tax and dealer drop-off and pick-up work.

Back to school safety reminders

It's time to start preparing for back to school. Pasco County schools will be back in session on Aug. 10. As summer comes to an end, the Pasco Sheriff's Office wants to share essential safety reminders for the new school year. Below is a list of important tips to follow and ensure the safety of Pasco's students.



Road safety

We want to remind all motorists to be alert and slow down when driving through school zones and residential areas. Follow all traffic laws, speed limits and do not text while driving. Use hands-free options to talk on your phone while driving. Look out for kids walking and biking when backing out of your driveway. Be alert for children playing and gathering near bus stops. Always come to a complete stop when approaching any school bus that displays red flashing lights and an extended stop arm. This indicates kids are loading or unloading from the bus. Do not resume driving until the signal has been withdrawn. Never try to "beat" a stopping bus.

PSO also encourages all parents to review the following road safety tips with their children before they return to school. Kids who bike to school should always wear a helmet and follow all safety rules when riding their bicycle. Familiarize them with essential rules of the road, such as hand signals, traffic lights and stop signs. Students who ride the bus to school should wait for the bus to stop before approaching the curb. They must remain in clear view of the bus driver when on the bus

and not move around. Kids should always wear a seatbelt when riding in a car and remove their backpacks before buckling up.

Remember, good driving starts with you. Be a good role model by driving safely, following pedestrian safety rules and wearing a helmet when biking. Talk to your teen driver about traffic laws and discourage them from using their phone while driving. Ensure your child has a safe route to take if they walk to school. Walk with them the first week if they are young or they are walking a new route.

School threats and possession of substances

Pasco County Schools have a zero tolerance policy for bringing weapons to school, making threats, or making false reports. PSO urges parents to speak with their children about the serious consequences of breaking any of these rules. Threats of violence, even jokes about threats, are illegal. Students who make threats of any kind can face felony charges. Possession of a weapon, imitation weapons, or dangerous objects, such as razors and ammunition are also a violation.

Use, possession, selling, purchasing or distributing of drugs, tobacco, or alcohol are also a not allowed on any Pasco school campus. We urge parents to talk with their children about these threats to school safety and to speak up if they ever encounter this behavior.

Reviewing these reminders will ensure your school year is a safe one. Welcome back, students.



Also on the cover, local firefighters responded to a strange smell emanating from the Sun Professional Center on Gall Boulevard and a gas spill at a local gas station off U.S. 301. One of two men was arrested for the alleged robbery and murder of a 62-year-old Zephyrhills man and Zephyrhills hosted the Dixie Softball League Ponytail World Series, bringing thousands of visitors from 12 states to town before the annual influx of tourists.

Inside, pilot Herman Reinhold had his license suspended following an engine failure in a World War II vintage DC-3 carrying skydivers from the Zephyrhills Municipal Airport and subsequent safe crash-landing. FSN Cable in Zephyrhills announced a promotion to benefit the Muscular Dystrophy Association. Edwinola residents Adelaide and Frank Higgins celebrated their 71-year wedding anniversary.

In sports, there was a preview of the DSL Ponytail World Series, a feature on the East Pasco Tennis Association's summer camp for boys and girls and a warm goodbye to Zephyrhills High coach John Stephenson, who in seven years oversaw that school's cross country and boys soccer teams. He also helped out with the junior varsity softball team.

Part of the sports coverage at the time included the Tampa Bay Buccaneers beat with a story on the preseason opener against the Denver Broncos. Locally, Wayne Reutimann remained in the hunt for a United Stock Car Association title and the Bad Girls, an indoor soccer team from Zephyrhills, capped the regular season with a 2-1 win over the Brandon Hawks.

In addition to columns and letters to the editor on the opinion page there were small sections for business, religion, people, births and deaths, anniversaries and wedding announcements, and, of course, clubs.

On a separate page for park living there was news from the Tourist Club, Valleydale Estates, Tropical Acre Estates, Sundance, Palm View Gardens and Sixth Avenue Mobile Home Park.

The back of the paper included legals, classifieds, a real estate directory, TV listings and the New York Times Magazine crossword puzzle.

"I started to think about what we could do to remember it," Fortune said. "I thought about what day of the week Sept. 11 would fall on. I got home and looked it up and thought, 'wow, it's on a Saturday!'"

Fortune became the event's project manager that very day. From there, it was a matter of garnering interest.

"Nine months out, I knew that was a long time but I began reaching out to different people and entities," Fortune said.

United States Parachuting Association (USPA) National Director Melissa Lowe got a Facebook message, as did iconic skydiver Dan Brodsky-Chenfield.

"Dan (Brodsky-Chenfield) has the contacts and the ability to make things happen," Fortune said.

With a little bit of help and a lot of gumption, Fortune began to grow the event. This past March, he sent out 205 personalized emails to USPA drop zones in the United States. He followed that up with 206 emails to city officials where the drop zones were located. He teamed up with Option Studios in New Mexico and the vision for the event started to come together.

Fortune now had a flyer to disseminate and the studio designed a long-sleeved moisture-wicking shirt. The idea started gaining traction. By June, many drop zones, not just in the United States but worldwide, began to take notice. Skydive Arizona was one of the first to offer participation. They asked what Fortune wanted and Fortune gave them agency to perform what they wanted.

"They asked me what I wanted to do and I asked them, 'What can you do?'" Fortune said.

Skydive Arizona will perform a 20-way group formation spelling out, "9/11." Skydive Chicago will put together a jump. The Hillman Farm Skydiving Club in Australia got on board. A drop zone in Germany got on board and now there are 40 drop zones on three continents all participating.

What exactly it will all look like is still being settled. Fortune wants to push off different maneuvers at appointed times, corresponding to the events unfolding on 9/11. The first tower was hit at 8:45 a.m. Eastern Standard Time (EST), the second tower was hit at 9:03 a.m. EST. The timeline stretches from 8:45 to 10:28 a.m. EST and Fortune would like to have events/maneuvers for each of the significant moments, with a finale at 10:28. The 9/11 events happened in the eastern time zone, so it's virtually impossible to coordinate with events all over the globe. Australia is 12 hours different in time. Germany is going to try and coordinate, as they are just eight hours different. That drop zone will present a 32,000-square-foot German flag in solidarity at 4:28 p.m. in their time zone, so as to synchronize with the 10:28 a.m. on the American east coast.

The goal is not just to commemorate but also to support three charities. Tuesday's Children, a 501(c)(3) non-profit, was established just after 9/11 to support children and families affected by the tragedy. Families of Freedom is a scholarship fund, assisting 9/11 victims and their families, that has provided \$176 million to 3,800 recipients. The Tunnel to Towers Foundation commemorates Firefighter Steven Gerard Siller, who lost his life trying to save people that day. The foundation's namesake comes from Siller having parked his truck at the entrance of the Brooklyn Battery Tunnel. The foundation holds fundraising events to help veterans and first responders, injured in the line of duty, get into mortgage-free homes.

"The foundations will receive all the proceeds," Fortune said. "This is about the people that died, that went inside that tower, knowing they might not make it out. That, to me, is what a hero is."

Four San Antonio all-star teams earn state berths

Having missed last season due to the coronavirus pandemic, all-star baseball teams from San Antonio came back strong. Four squads qualified for state tournaments with three advancing to that level in the Dixie Baseball League.

San Antonio hosted the District 6 tournaments with the T-ballers (ages 5-6) and Juniors (7-8) winning titles to earn state berths. The Minors (9-10) and Ozone (ages 11-12) all-stars were district runners-up, but only the Minors advanced to states. The Ozone did not have enough players to compete in that next level at the time.

After winning their district championships at home, the T-ballers and Juniors went to state tourneys in Frostproof and Marianna, respectively. The district runner-up Minors were one of the top two all-star teams in that division to qualify for the state series in Sebring.

"It's really exciting to see the growth occurring throughout the league," said Christopher Kent, San Antonio's league president. "San Antonio may be a small community in the Tampa Bay area, but there's no shortage of baseball talent here, as evidenced by the number of teams we continue to have qualify for state tournaments."

The Minors had the best postseason result by placing third in the state series. San Antonio got off to a slow start in the district tourney, but bounced back to finish as the runner-up with a dominant 18-3 win over Webster.

San Antonio's primary pitchers for the first two district games were Gunner Bingham and Eric Frye. In the decisive win against Webster, Deegan Piet, Christian Adams and Cody Carroll combined on a one-hitter.

The top hitters in that game were Michael Hynes (three hits, three runs), Noah Hill (three RBIs, two runs), Kamrin Kennedy (three hits, three RBIs, three runs) and Piet (two hits, two runs and an RBI).

San Antonio then went 3-3 in the state tourney. The best part, according to manager Jack Payne was avenging a 15-5 loss to Brooksville with an 11-7 win in the rematch.

"They were excited," Payne said of his team defeating Brooksville the second time around.

Highlighting the rematch was a grand slam by Bingham.

"That was really the turning point," Payne said of that clutch hit. "That ignited the kids and they never looked back from there."

Bingham and Kennedy pitched in that game, combining for 11 strikeouts.

San Antonio barely lost the game for the runner-up spot, coming up short in a 14-12 loss to Lake Placid. In that game Bingham scored twice, Blaine Kohan drove in a pair of runs and scored two, Wyatt Comer scored three times and drove in two, and Piet had a pair of RBIs.

Sharing pitching duties in that game were Comer, Kace Carter and Adams.

San Antonio, which also got help from coaches Wes Frye and Will Hill, had to settle for third while runner-up Lake Placid advanced to the DSL World Series in Mississippi.



began three years ago and are in the third of four phases, the school is expected to be open on time for incoming students.

Nonetheless, the library and media center are not likely to be ready until December of January as construction continues in those areas. Plus, the newly renovated cafeteria should open sometime early in the fall.

"We're going down to the wire," said assistant principal Matt Hayes, a former Zephyrhills High student. "Phone lines are going in, furniture's going in. It's going to go down to the night before."

Renovations at the high school forced the some members of the Zephyrhills High staff to share space at nearby Stewart Middle during the summer. Hayes, for one, said, "It's good to be back."

Also thrilled to be back at the high school is Zephyrhills principal Dr. Christina Stanley, who on Tuesday provided an impromptu tour of parts of the school that included some ongoing renovations and project completions.

"It is a blessing for the kids to see new equipment, new furniture, new classrooms," she said. "It just makes them feel extra special. We kept a lot of the spirit of the old place, but just gave it a facelift."

While mask mandates and home-schooling stemming from the coronavirus pandemic have been part of the recent past for the Pasco

School District, Covid-19 protocols are somewhat different for the upcoming academic year.

While rules and regulations have been revised due to changing circumstances, current protocols are a bit less restrictive compared to the last school year. Masks are optional, although guidelines from the Center for Disease Control recommends that they be worn. All district employees, students, visitors and volunteers are subject to daily health screenings. Staff and students are encouraged to practice social distancing when possible and teachers are encouraged to provide adequate space in their classrooms.

"We just want to do a complete re-set and make sure we're ready to take on whatever challenges come our way," said Julie Marks, principal at Chester W. Taylor Jr. Elementary. "We'll still be contact tracing. We're just going to continue doing the best we can."

Kim Poe, a former Woodland Elementary principal who now is the district's assistant superintendent of elementary schools, realized the importance of this week as the final days to prepare for the arrival of students.

"If you're an educator, it's all down to business this week," said Poe, noting that as a second-grader at West Zephyrhills Elementary she knew she wanted a career in education. "My role now keeps me connected to the elementary school principals. I never lose sight of the job they do because it's big."

Got Lawn? Reclaimed water expanding in Zephyrhills

It's been around since 2003 but options for residences and businesses to utilize reclaimed water are expanding

on seasonal rainfall. The proximity of the golf course and of nearby Krusen Field made both locations prime users of the reclaimed water. Zephyrhills High School, as well as Stewart Middle School use reclaimed water for their athletic fields.

Developments came in and the city added pink pipelines. The Abbott Park Development on the north side of town is even further expanding the reclaimed water network. The city is furnishing half the expense, while SWFMD is furnishing the other half to run a line where it can be accessed at the development.

"Abbott Park will be the first major development to have full reclaimed water," Bostic said.

Bringing the line that far north will also allow for access by the Scotland Yard Golf Course.

Golf courses and athletic fields have thirsty fields to water but what about the average homeowner? As it turns out, there's an avenue to bring reclaimed water to your house. A prospective resident would come to the building department and provide details about their residence. From there, the building department establishes how far the residence is away from a reclaimed line. A cost-to-connect estimate is derived and if the individual wants the reclaimed water, they can pay the cost estimate. This cost can run high, especially in light of a surge in material costs but residents can also band together to tamp down the cost. For instance, it might be cost prohibitive for one person to pay to run a line to their home. Yet, if several or even dozens of adjacent residents all want the service, it defrays the cost significantly.

"We encourage people to come together to apply," Bostic said. "We want to help people as much as possible but we also aren't going to do work that people can do for themselves."

One added benefit to using reclaimed water is that there is no sewer meterage for using it. While city residents pay for municipal water and sewer, the reclaimed water is spread on the lawn and thus does not incur sewer metering fees.

Reclaimed water usage is expanding nationwide, as well as in Zephyrhills. In 2003, when the program began, the city pumped 75,266,000 into the reclaimed system. In 2020, that number rose to 111,069,000. Most new developments are required to use reclaimed water for irrigation purposes. As the city continues to grow and as more current residences and businesses adopt it, the demand will continue

to grow proportionately. Bostic says that the Alston Plant can handle it.

"(5 or 10 years in the future) I expect every drop of reclaimed water from our Wastewater Treatment Facility to be used in a beneficial manner," Bostic said. "Our current limitations are based on our customers' usage of the wastewater system. Our plant is designed to treat 3.85 million gallons per day and we currently only use about 1.8 million (less than half) of that capacity."
