

Zephyrhills rallies for 31-10 win over Wiregrass Ranch

Comeback victory by the resurgent Bulldogs avenges back-to-back losses to the rival Bulls

There was rain, but nothing like the previous Friday night in which lightning and thunderstorms delayed a win over the Villages Charter by two hours. For the second consecutive week Zephyrhills won in inclement weather, this time it was a 31-10 comeback at Wiregrass Ranch.

Zephyrhills, which has made the playoffs in seven of the past eight seasons, overcame deficits of 7-0 and 10-7 before reeling off 24 straight points to pull away.
The Bulldogs improved to 2-1 while the Bulls dropped to 1-2. That allowed Zephyrhills to avenge two straight years of regular-season losses to Wiregrass Ranch, which has a streak of seven consecutive playoff appearances.
"Eventually the field and momentum flipped over," Zephyrhills coach Nick Carroll said. "It's fun to win, but this one means a lot."
"It is what it is," lamented Wiregrass Ranch coach Mark Kantor, who the previous week had reached a

Members of the Zephyrhills Police Department, led by Chief Derek Brewer, showed up last Thursday morning at the Starbucks off U.S. 301. There were no public speeches, agendas or arrests for that matter at the public outreach event.
Simply put, Brew with the Blue was all about coffee and conversation.
Best of all, the chief worked the drive-through window with a long line of vehicles around the building for most of the morning. He handed out orders and took payments alongside an employee.
"It was a great opportunity just to have normal conversations about everyday life," Brewer said, adding that working the drive-through "was a little hectic at first but I really enjoyed it. The goal there was to interact with the public. The time flew by."
That it did as he and other department staff members took part of the inaugural event. Brewer, a frequent customer at Starbucks, planned Brew with the Blue with store manager Ana Reyes.
"He's a regular customer and one day we were talking about community events," Reyes recollected. "He asked how we can do something together and I said my store is your store."
While the local police are not always appreciated throughout their various endeavors,

Pasco Tax Collector's Offices accepting donations of new shoes and socks for Pasco School students

The Pasco County Tax Collector's Office is once again participating in the new shoes and socks collection drive to assist local students and families in need. A collaborative effort between Pasco County government and the school district, the Two Good Soles campaign, which is in its seventh year, is seeking to collect as many new pairs of shoes and socks as possible. The tax collector's offices in Pasco County will be collection sites for these donations between now and Oct. 21, the final day of the drive.

"It is heartbreaking to know that children come to school without socks or shoes in good repair," said Pasco Tax Collector Mike Fasano. "I am pleased that our office is once again part of this county-wide effort to collect as many pairs of footwear as possible. I encourage everyone who is able to please stop by one of our offices and leave a donation. Every item will go to a Pasco student in need."

The need for shoes is primarily at the middle and high school level, although shoes for elementary school students will also be welcomed. While the tax collector's office will accept donations of shoes and socks that are new and unused, the school district reports that the sizes most in need are children's shoes 9 and up, adult shoes of all sizes and socks of any size. It is recommended that sneakers, shoes and socks be of a neutral color, but all donations of new items will be

accepted. No flip-flops or open-toes shoes, please. 



such was not the case at Starbucks. For Reyes, it was “a way to tell them thank you because they do so much for the community. They got to be my baristas.”

One of the drive-through customers stopped her car after getting her order and said she has experienced law enforcement at a coffee house before.

“I worked at a Starbucks drive-through and a horse (with a Pinellas Park officer) came through,” recalled Katie Montes, who has since relocated to Zephyrhills. “I got to feed the horse.”

Inside and outside were several police officers and department staff. Some helped out as volunteer workers while others greeted and chatted with customers.

City councilman Lance Smith stopped by, as did mayor Gene Whitfield.

“I think it helps to build relationships,” said Whitfield, an avid supporter of the local police department as well as the Pasco Sheriff’s Office. “They’re talking about every couple of months doing this, so it’s got to catch on. They do a lot of things in this community that people don’t recognize.”

Also inside was Yvette Klausch, managing funeral director for the Zephyrhills Chapter of Coastal Cremations.

“I love it,” she said of the Brew with the Blue concept. “I think it’s great to see everybody because I never see some of these people.”

Outside the coffee house in the parking lot facing U.S. 301 was a large police van with an awning and table out front. Officer Steve Walker and detective Bill Carmer met with people passing by. Walker also noted that the department is hiring and welcomed those wanting to pursue a job.

“We’ve got open positions and we’re just doing community relations,” Walker said.

While there were no police dogs on location, one local resident brought her dog to chat with officer at the outside table. Zephyrhills’ Zoja Kubiak had her dog Sadi, a shepherd breed who is in training, on a leash.

“I brought her out here to see the uniform,” Kubiak said. “It’s training for her so she knows cops are the guys to help.”

One man who came and appreciated the event was a former police chief in the United Kingdom who preferred not to be named.

“This type of event is building up the reputation of the community,” he said.



7 common fitness mistakes to avoid

It’s tempting to try everything the gym or the fitness world has to offer. It is better to learn the basics and stick with a program for some time before moving on to another one; otherwise, you may never have enough time to master any routine.

These are just a few of the fitness mistakes to avoid as you begin a journey to improved health and wellness.

milestone with his 100th career win in combined stints with the Bulls, Gaither and Hudson. "I thought we were in a battle. We couldn't stop them when we needed to."

There was no stopping the Zephyrhills ground game with running backs Rodney Smith and Maddox Rivera racking up some impressive runs. Smith, who the previous week gained 137 yards, ran for a career-high 161 yards and scored three times. Rivera gained 74 yards and had a touchdown.

"They're not going to hit 80-yard touchdown runs, but they are going to get positive yards," adding that "it was better for us to run the ball."

Zephyrhills tallied 319 rushing yards with Fred Adams, a transfer from Zephyrhills Christian Academy, adding 53. Those totals were attributed, in part, to a strong offensive line that won most of the battles up front.

"They got off the ball quick and they were moving their feet," said Pat Fortunato, the Zephyrhills offensive line coach.

On offense, running back Kenny Walker had his best game ever with 170 rushing yards and a touchdown.

"He ran like a grown man," Kantor said of the senior running back. "He's got it in him. He's just got to do it on a consistent basis."

The Bulls got solid play from several key

defenders. Matt Hensley Jr. had a team-leading 11 tackles and two sacks while Lawrence Graham, a transfer from Zephyrhills, had 10 tackles. Jaiden Barron added a sack and defensive backs Tre Gibson, Isaiah Riggins and Elijah Westbrooks played well.

Zephyrhills also got solid defensive play with Ben Raines tallying a team-high eight tackles and adding an interception. The Bulldogs got one sack each from Lukas Colella and Marcell Tucker.

After forcing a Zephyrhills punt, Wiregrass Ranch scored on its first possession. Starting on their own 37-yard line, the Bulls needed just three plays to get into the end zone with Walker scoring on a 6-yard run.

Zephyrhills countered to tie the game 7-7 at halftime. The first of Smith's three scoring runs capped a 69-yard drive in the second quarter.

Wiregrass Ranch kicker Jeremy Caruso gave the home team a brief 10-7 lead by converting on a 45-yard field goal. Not long after that, however, Zephyrhills' Christian Clemons kicked a 32-yard field for a 10-10 tie.

That set up the Bulldogs for a 24-0 run that clinched it. They try to make it three wins in a row this Friday night when they host IMG Academy White, which also is 2-1.

Nearby Cypress Creek, which is off to a 2-0 start, had a bye. The Bulldogs host the Coyotes on Oct. 28 in the ninth game of the season for both teams.

punt and recovered in the end zone. It was 24-8 at the halftime break.

A wet football plagued both teams. The Warriors were without their long snapper, who was out sick, further exacerbating the issue. An already wet field got worse as showers rolled in during the second quarter.

"The wet ball has been an issue in all of our games but we practiced with it all week," ZCA head coach Mike Smith said. "We just can't seem to put it all together."

The slippery ball mishaps were predictable, if not ordained. The Warriors muffed the first snap of the second half, handing it back to the Gators. A short field let Clarke find Ayala again, this time for a 15-yard touchdown. Ayala made a terrific reception, out-leaping two ZCA defenders to come down with the football.

Things went from bad to worse when Gator linebacker Kevin Marks stepped in front of a Parker Stirnkorb pass and took it in for a 20-yard pick-six. A running clock initiated at 38-8 with less than 10 minutes left in the third quarter.

The Warriors kept battling. They went for a fake punt with Caleb Gaskin to keep their next drive alive but it stalled at the Gator 45-yard line. The defense held the Gators in check but the offense just could not get up off the mat and it was not until the last five minutes of the game before they'd score again - a 73-yard completion to Quavious Cook. The touchdown and two-point conversion made it look like less of a blowout than it was. Smith and the Warriors were humble in defeat.

"They knew what we were going to do," Smith said. "We were out-coached and out-played tonight. We're a better club than this."

The Warriors had a hard time stopping Gwinn, who mixed in with Ayala and Jaylen Howe to ramp up the rushing attack. The two touchdowns to Ayala were well-executed. Bright spots for the Warriors were the kickoff return by Ramos and long touchdown reception by Cook. The Warriors drop to 2-1 and will face Lakeland Christian on Friday.

The Land O' Lakes Gators play several classifications up and have almost twice the number of varsity players (56), than the Warriors have total players (29). The mismatch was apparent from the beginning. The teams even switched sidelines as the south sideline has more space than the north side.

The Gators opened up with a steady dose of hefty running back Cody Gwinn, running behind a stout offensive line that controlled the game. The Gators got it done through the air, too. Their opening possession ending with a 54-yard touchdown from quarterback Mason Clarke to Kennen Ayala.

The Warriors handed the Gators a short field on their first possession as they went for it on a 4th-and-2 from their own 39 yard line. The ZCA defense managed to hold the Gators to a 33-yard field goal but they were still staring at a 10-0 deficit in the first quarter. The Warriors made the 48-yard line on their next drive but punted the ball away after facing a 4th-and-10.

The Gators kept pouring it on. Gwinn would tally 48 yards on seven carries on the next drive. The riposte was Gator quarterback Clarke running a read option to Gwinn but keeping it and turning it in for a four-yard touchdown run.

At 17-0 the Warriors finally found some life. On the ensuing Land O' Lakes kickoff, Jayden Ramos took it 97 yards for a touchdown. The completed two-point conversion brought the Warriors into striking distance at 17-8 with just better than four minutes left in the half.

In the waning moments of the half, the Warriors were backed up, punting out of their own end zone when the Gators blocked the

HOLLYWOOD -- Move over, Tom Cruise, your aspirations to become a musical movie star at 60 are being challenged by 26-year-old Tom Holland (from the latest “Spider-Man” films). While Cruise hasn’t announced his project yet, Holland has committed to star in an untitled biopic on Fred Astaire. Unlike Cruise, who only toyed with singing in movies until he played a rock star in “Rock of Ages,” Holland portrayed the titular character in “Billy Elliot the Musical,” from 2008-2010 on stage in London. Ironically, Jamie Bell, who played the role of Billy Elliot in the 2000 film, is also set to star in an Astaire biopic for Amazon titled “Fred & Ginger.”

But, first, Holland has to deal with his mental health, admitting, “I find Instagram and Twitter to be overstimulating, to be overwhelming ... I spiral when I read things said about me online, and ultimately, it’s very detrimental to my mental state. So, I decided to take a step back and delete the app.” Social media was instrumental in catapulting his film “Uncharted,” with Mark Wahlberg (a \$120 million cost that lead to \$406.7 million grosses.) All this time, no one made a film about Fred Astaire, and now, there’s three in the works ... tap, tap, tap!

Bill Paxton was an amazing actor and a wonderful human being. Some of his most popular films were “Weird Science” (1985), “Aliens” (1986), “Tombstone” (1993), “True Lies” (1994), “Apollo 13” (1995), “Twister” (1996) and “Edge of Tomorrow” (2014). In early 2017, he entered Cedars-Sinai Medical Center to correct a damaged aortic heart valve caused by rheumatic fever that began at 14 years old. His family alleges the open-heart surgery was botched and caused him to suffer a fatal stroke on Feb. 25, 2017.

Paxton’s family sued the hospital, and a week before heading into a Los Angeles courtroom to decide the matter, Cedars settled for an undisclosed amount, which must have been more than the \$1 million that the anesthesiologist’s medical group paid them before their court date. The times I was fortunate to be in Bill Paxton’s company, he was cheerful, funny and an all-around regular guy who happened to be a movie star. It was a great loss.



Marine Corps League Detachment 1124 and Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 8154 hosted a solemn commemoration on Sunday morning

The morning sun was in full throat and the temporary seating was cleverly posted in the shade of the oaks, near the 9/11 memorial in Zephyr Park. Past Marine Corps League (MCL) Detachment 1124 commander Rod Rehrig tipped off the ceremony. He walked the gathered crowd through an invocation from MCL chaplain Vanice Holland, the Pledge of Allegiance and national anthem before handing off to guest speaker Manny Funes.

Funes, an Air Force Veteran, recounted where he was when the first plane hit the tower on that fateful morning.

"We were living in Hawaii at the time and it was 3 a.m. and my sister woke everyone up," Funes said. "We saw it all on TV. I thought it was a movie, it couldn't be real. Was it an accident? When that second plane hit, it touched a lot of people."

Funes, being also a former law enforcement officer, noted the 77 law enforcement personnel that perished that day. Funes was in law enforcement since 1969 and had lived through the riots in Miami in 1969 and 1970 but was profoundly impacted that Sept. 11 morning.

"This was the most destructive act of terror on U.S. soil in this country's history," Funes said.

Funes noted that the impact is still being felt with first responders and others suffering from effects of the dust and debris from the towers collapsing. He also noted an estimate of \$250

billion in economic impact in wake of the attack and of the 7,000 service members lost in ensuing wars in Iraq and Afghanistan.

Funes handed off to keynote speaker Dr. Randy Stovall. The president of the board of directors for the Greater Zephyrhills Chamber of Commerce shared his own account of where he was and how he came to the realization that his country was under attack on Sept. 11, 2001.

Stovall handed off to Wreaths Across America - Oakside Lead Coordinator Youth Troop 117 Meagan Sammons. Sammons fought back tears giving her account of that morning and also talking about the efforts from her chapter of Wreaths Across America.

"We are an organization with 3,100 locations," Sammons said. "Last year, we placed 2.4 million wreaths."

Sammons mentioned an upcoming commemoration at Oakside Cemetery on Dec. 19 of this year, where they will hang 320 wreaths on graves from soldiers dating back to the American Civil War.

Following Sammons, the honor guard from VFW Post 8154 performed both a rifle salute and a playing of 'Taps' before Rehrig returned to the podium to wrap up the ceremony. A benediction from Holland and some closing remarks from Rehrig and the modest ceremony concluded.

Even 20 years later, Americans that lived through 9/11 remember it like it was yesterday. They remember the horror of that morning but they also remember the way the country came together in the wake of the tragedy.

"When the first plane hit, I was in shock, it wasn't real," president of the Fraternal Order of the Eagles in Zephyrhills Doug Griswold said. "When the second plane hit, I started to cry. I realized what was happening and what a terrible day it was. But a good thing that came out of it was that it was the last time we, as Americans, really united. It's a shame it had to be that tragedy that brought us together."

MCL member Gary Gibson saw it coming. He'd attended a seminar with the Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms that discussed the 1993 bombing of the World Trade Center and how the Twin Towers were terrorist targets. He remembers being at Edwards Air Force Base in California when the first plane hit.

"I had just gotten out of the shower and I heard my wife in the living room scream," Gibson said. "I ran into the living room and she said that a plane just hit the tower."

The realization that this anticipated attack was finally unfolding impacted Gibson.

"We knew it was going to happen, we just didn't know when," Gibson said.

Gibson lamented the brave firefighters that were doing their jobs running into the towers to save people. Gibson also found triumph in the way the country rallied behind the tragic event.

"September 12 was a proud moment," Gibson said. "I was thrilled the way everyone came together. The FBI and ATF agents fanned out all over the country and were able to solve it so fast. They were able to trace the rental vehicle and catch the suspects. It was great police work."
