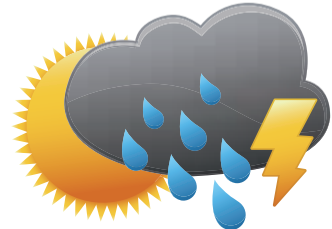

More than 1,100 freshmen and transfers settle into residence halls on the sprawling campus near Lake Jovita

Joining a host of volunteers and staff members to help students during Saint Leo's move-in day on Saturday were three coaches. Rick O'Dette, the baseball coach, basketball coach Lance Randall and Brad Jorgensen, the only lacrosse coach in that sport's 17-year history at the university, helped freshmen and transfer students get acclimated to the sprawling campus off Lake Jovita in Dade City.

For that coaching trio it was all about welcoming young men and women to the scenic campus in the hills of east Pasco County and making the transition as smooth as possible. Students were moved into five residence halls — Benoit, Henderson, Alumni, Roderick and Marmion & Snyder.

"You've got kids coming from all over the country," said O'Dette, who has coached baseball for five seasons at Saint Leo and noted that 15 ballplayers moved in last weekend. "We're able to make them comfortable, make their parents comfortable."

Jorgensen added that it was important to get one particular message across to the new students: "Having them understand they've got a community that's waiting and ready for them."

Jorgensen and his wife Caroline, director of the university's brand marketing and communications, know first-hand of the importance of making an incoming student feel comfortable at a new school. They recently moved their son Thomas, a freshman, onto the St. Joseph campus in Philadelphia.

Among those volunteers helping new students move into their respective residence halls were four fraternity brothers.

"We just want to help them; make their lives easier," said senior Domenic Frederico of (SAE) Sigma Alpha Epsilon.

Fraternity brother Logan Burke, a junior, recalled

Eagles finally get their downtown grand opening

5th Avenue site has been home to the Fraternal Order of Eagles Aeries 3752 since relocation from Wesley Chapel in spring of 2020

The Fraternal Order of Eagles Aeries 3752 have been downtown since taking over the former Wells Fargo Bank building in the spring of 2020. After a few stops and starts, primarily due to the on-and-off again presence of the coronavirus pandemic and a recent resurgence, the non-profit charitable organization finally got its grand opening.

Last Thursday, it became official as members were joined by city leaders and local dignitaries to celebrate with a traditional ribbon-cutting as well as words of appreciation from a handful of notable speakers. They came together at the renovated 10,000-square-foot building.

"On behalf of the city we just want to say we're very happy to have you downtown," said Todd Vande Berg, the city's planner who showed up with city manager Billy Poe and city clerk Lori Hillman.

"This is everything; people helping people. I love it," said John Hierons, a trustee and past president who has been part of the local chapter for 20 years.

The local chapter, along with the accompanying Ladies Auxiliary, has been in the east Pasco area for five decades. It incorporated in 1977.

The renovation of an abandoned downtown building was completed in three stages. The FOP Aeries 3752 had been in a building off State Road 54 and across from the New River Branch Library in Wesley Chapel, just beyond city limits. That site has since been bulldozed.

"This here is bringing us into Zephyrhills," trustee Reed Sutton said.

Eddie Shaw, a longtime member who helped pressure wash the outside area during the early stages of renovating the property, pulled up front on his 2014 Harley Davidson Softail to join in the celebration. He often parks his motorcycle out front.

Tim Hoyt, the Eagles Grand Aerie Membership Coordinator based in Ohio, came down for the ceremony and following party. He congratulated John Daff, chapter president as well as being president of the local Eagle

SVB hosts Padel and Paella

The Sarah Vande Berg Tennis & Wellness Center brought the flavor of Spain to Zephyrhills this past weekend

If you've spent any time around SVB CEO Pascal Collard, you already know that Padel is the fastest-growing sport in the world. It has some catching up to do but it's a unique sport that combines elements of racquetball and tennis, encased in plate glass that athletes use to play the ball off of and crash into when necessary.

It makes a loud crash but Collard assures that there is no danger as he runs into one to demonstrate. It's fast but it can be for the elite athlete to the novice. It uses a tennis-height net and racquetball-sized rackets. The surface is a traditionally blue artificial turf carpet glued to the concrete floor. SVBs turf is imported

from Spain, of course. SVB even has lights for playing at night.

Padel is also a cultural sport. Originated in South America, Argentina and Spain are the world's leaders and pioneers of the sport. It also has a strong fellowship aspect to it.

"With Padel, you play, stay, eat and drink," Collard said. "It's a super social sport. The social aspect is very important."

Awaiting players as they finished the day's rounds was a wok-style cooking skillet manned by Javier Mendez from Spain. The tapas-style food has a social element built in but on Saturday it was all about the paella. Paella is a Spanish rice dish, most commonly spiced up by seafood and cooked one-pot gumbos-style. Mendez is a long-time Padel player but his favorite part of the sport is the, "Third Game."

Third Game refers to the eating and drinking part. SVB and Mendez served up heaping helpings of paella and washed it down with Spanish-made lagers, Estrella Damm. Each of the teams competing over the weekend got to partake.

Pasco Clerk & Comptroller claims international budget award

Distinguished presentation prize is office's 10th straight

Under the direction of Clerk & Comptroller Nikki Alvarez-Sowles, Esq., the Office of Pasco County Clerk & Comptroller has earned its 10th consecutive Distinguished Budget Presentation Award from the Government Finance Professionals Association.

Judges congratulated the budget team for outstanding presentation, clarity, thoroughness, descriptions, and understandability. Judges cited, in particular, effective use of charts and graphs throughout the document to convey valuable information. From GFOA: The award represents a significant achievement by the entity. It reflects the commitment of the governing body and staff to meeting the highest principles of governmental budgeting. In order to receive the budget award, the entity had to satisfy nationally recognized guidelines for effective budget presentation. These guidelines are designed to assess how well an entity's budget serves as: a policy document, a financial plan, an operations guide, and a communications device.

Budget documents must be rated "proficient" in all four categories, and in the 14 mandatory criteria within those categories, to receive the award.

When a Distinguished Budget Presentation Award is granted to an entity, a Certificate of Recognition for Budget Presentation is also presented to the individual(s) or department designated as being primarily responsible for having achieved the award. This has been presented to Office of Nikki Alvarez-Sowles, Pasco County Clerk & Comptroller.

More than 1,700 agencies participate in the annual Budget Awards Program, the best of these "pioneer(ing) efforts to improve the quality of budgeting and provid(ing) an excellent example for other governments throughout North America."

Included in the judges' remarks:

"Commend the staff for an excellent document."

"Budget looks good and is easy to follow. A nice job!"

"Staff is to be commended for their efforts."

Pasco Clerk & Comptrollers office agrees completely, and are delighted to heap praise on then-Budget & Purchasing Director Chris Mettler (who shepherded one last budget through the exacting process before passing the torch to Dan Klein) and Purchasing Specialist Charles de Haan. The plant society meeting is Sept. 14, 7 p.m. at The Land O' Lakes Heritage Park Community Center, 5401 Land O' Lakes Blvd. in Land O' Lakes.

The subject of the meeting is "The Truth About Pollinators" presented by Craig Huegel. There is a great deal of attention focused on pollinator gardens in developed landscapes at the moment. Groups devoted to promoting pollinators are growing exponentially on social media, and resources available for homeowners wishing to provide for pollinators in their landscapes seem to be appearing daily. There is a very real decline worldwide in the populations of bees, butterflies and other pollinating insects, and it is laudable that there is a rising interest in helping to rectify that. However, many of these so-called pollinator gardens fall far short of actually improving our efforts at creating true pollinator gardens.

Huegel is a wildlife biologist with a special



interest in plants and their role in creating ecological landscapes in developed areas. He helped found the Urban Wildlife Co-operative Extension Program at the University of Florida and served as the Environmental Lands Division Director for Pinellas County before working as an environmental consultant and educator. He currently teaches in the Biology Departments

at St. Petersburg College and the University of Tampa. He has written six books on native plants and landscaping all published by the University of Florida Press.

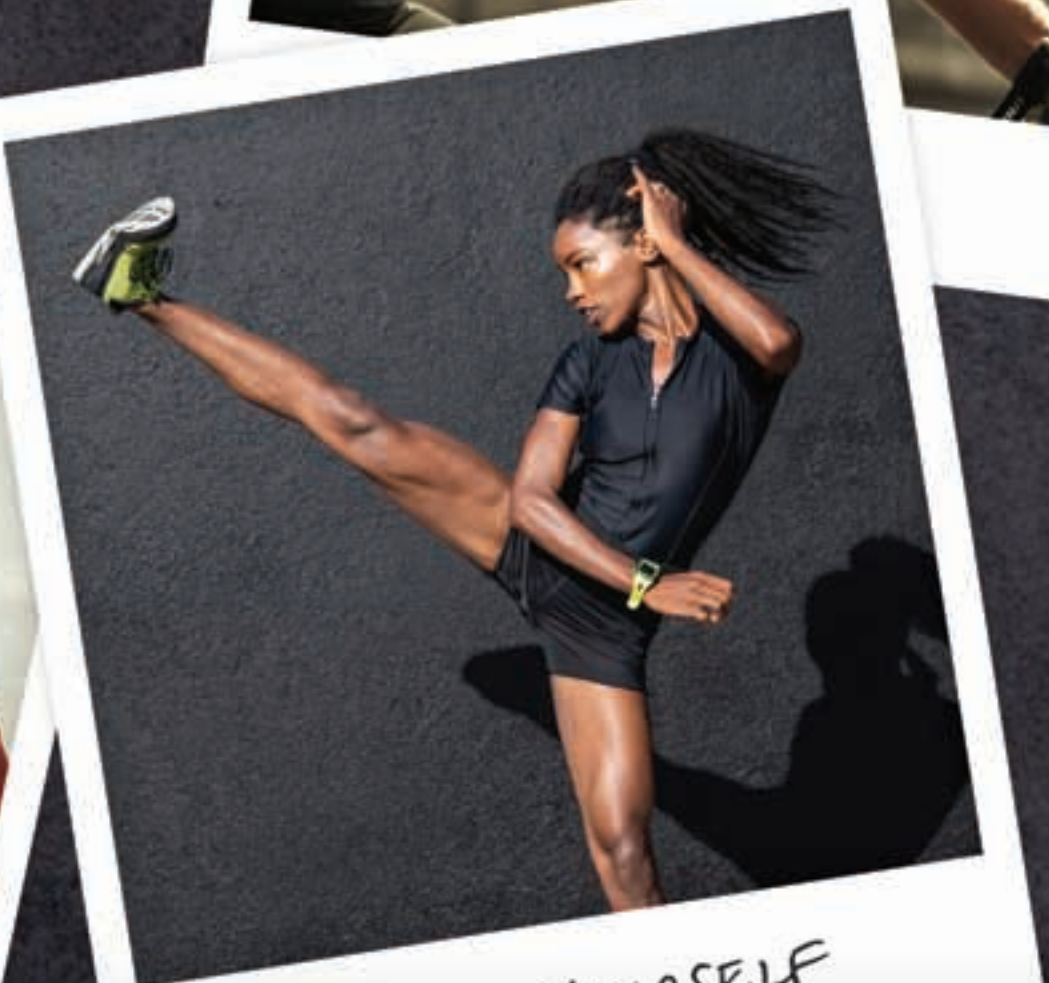
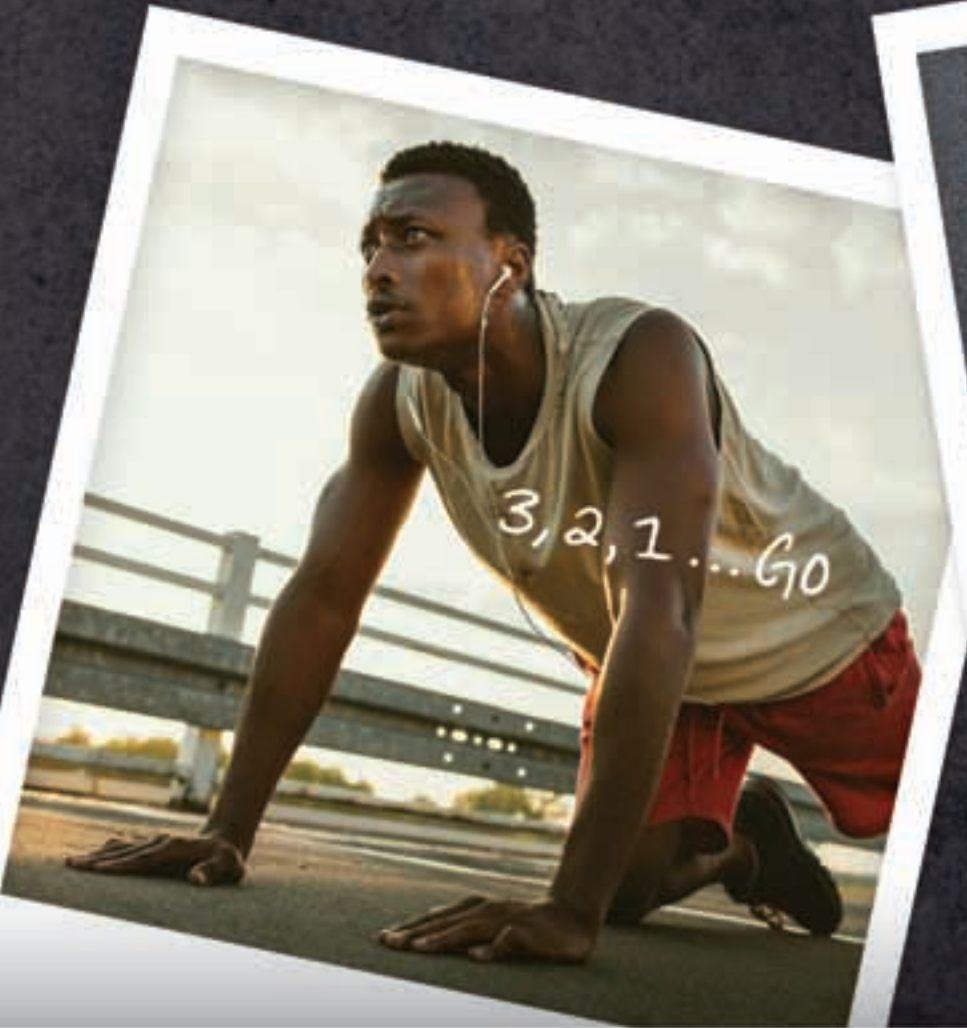

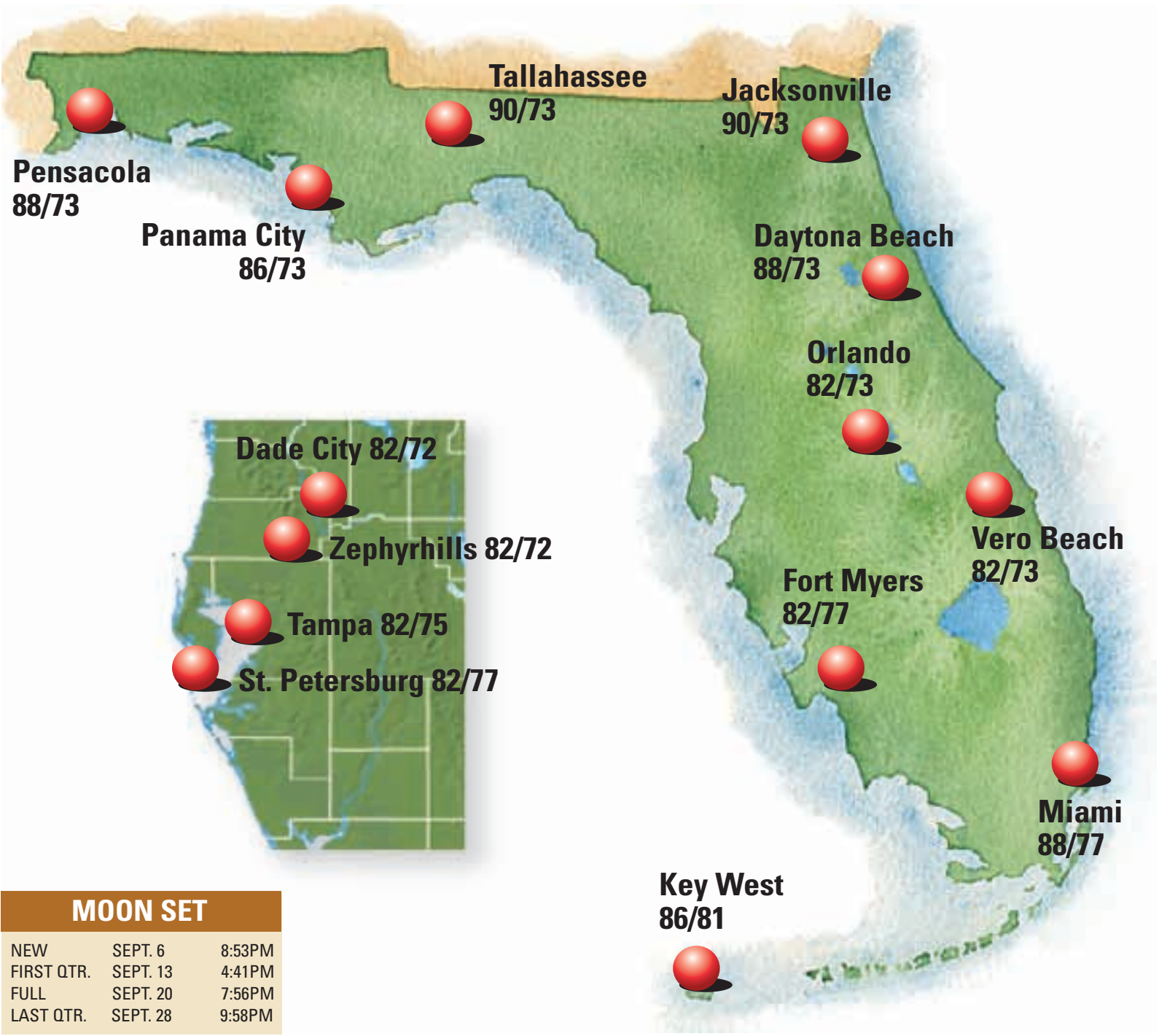

being in the new students’ shoes not so long ago when he moved down to Florida after graduating high school in New Jersey. He said he remembers “all the excitement of moving down to the area.”

Fraternity brothers Jack Prieto and Ziyad Amro, both juniors, also helped students carry items from vehicles to their rooms.

Among the students lugging personal belongings, favorite personal items and school supplies into their new residences on campus was Zizeir Miller, an engineer major from Jacksonville.

Miller said he brought “a little bit of everything.”

The busy day, which preceded Sunday’s move-in for returning students and the first day of classes on Tuesday, proved to be a school record-setter for a third straight year. The administrative staff reported more than 1,100 new students moved in last weekend, numbers that surpass the fall registration figures for 2019 and

2020.

“For anyone in admissions, this is the best day,” said Maribeth Stevens, assistant vice president of university campus and center enrollment. “It’s a great day, especially because of the challenges we’ve had (with cancellations and postponements stemming from the coronavirus pandemic) over the past 18 months. It’s really a celebration of where the students are.”

Saint Leo is a 132-year-old higher learning institution. Although current enrollment figures include 59 percent from Florida, there are 25 percent of students from 50 countries as well as 16 percent of students from other states.

Angelica Molina, a sophomore majoring in global studies, said she is looking forward to the influx of students from so many countries.

“I love seeing people from everywhere,” she said. “I love learning about their cultures.”


The weekend moves follow Super Saturday, which took place in July and offered informative sessions on what new students and transfers could expect when they arrived on campus.

But to him that worketh not, but believeth on Him that justifieth the ungodly, his faith is counted for righteousness."* Let's go back to that phrase: *"the law worketh wrath."* Many people just don't want to see this. Even some clergymen tell us that the law was given to help us to be good, but God Himself says, *"the law worketh wrath."* Every criminal knows this, and every sinner should know it. God certainly places strong emphasis on it. *"Wherefore then serveth the law? It was added because of transgressions (Galatians 3:19) "that every mouth may be stopped, and all the world may become guilty before God" "Therefore by the deeds of the law there shall no flesh be justified in His sight: for by the law is the knowledge of sin (Romans 3:19-20).*

If we come to God expecting eternal life because of our good works... Are we not offering Him our terms, which He will never accept? He will never sell salvation at any price, and certainly not for a few paltry "good" works, when our lives have been filled with failure and sin. Sin and death came into the world by one man, Adam, and God says that all have sinned and come short of His glory (Romans 3:23 and 5:12).

What is our only hope? God has promised to give eternal life to those who trust in His Son. *"For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord"* (Romans 6:23). *"Christ died on the cross to pay for our sins, He was buried, and He rose from the dead on the third day according to the scriptures* (1 Corinthians 15:1-4). Simply believe God's Word. Ephesians 1:7 says, *"In whom we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins according to the riches of His grace."* It is impossible for God to lie (Titus 1:1-2).

How to avoid potential nutrient deficiencies on a vegetarian diet

Individuals choose to adhere to vegetarian diets for a multitude of reasons. Some do so for ethical reasons, while others feel a vegetarian diet is a healthier option than eating meat. Regardless of why people choose to follow vegetarian diets, it's important that they take steps to ensure they avoid nutrient deficiencies.

What qualifies as a vegetarian diet differs for certain people. Some people who consider themselves vegetarians avoid animal flesh but it still eat poultry and seafood, while others avoid animal products altogether. The latter group must be especially careful to avoid nutrient deficiency, as the U.S. National Library of Medicine notes that malnutrition can sometimes cause permanent damage to the body.

Planning is a vegetarian's best friend in regard to avoid nutrient deficiency. The following are some potential nutrient shortfalls vegetarians may encounter and how to overcome them.

Iron deficiency

The Mayo Clinic notes that iron deficiency anemia is a condition in which the blood lacks enough healthy red blood cells, which are responsible for carrying oxygen to the body's tissues. Meat is a great source of iron and consuming meat is how many people get their necessary daily doses of iron. Vegetarians must therefore find ways to get iron from sources other than meat. Leafy green vegetables like spinach are a great source of iron. The Mayo Clinic notes that beans, dried fruits like raisins and apricots and

iron-fortified cereals, breads and pastas also are rich in iron.

Insufficient protein

Avoiding meat also can make vegetarians susceptible to insufficient protein intake. However, there are many ways for vegetarians to consume enough protein without breaking their diets. In fact, a 2019 study published in the journal *Nutrients* found that classic vegetarian diets supply more than adequate protein and amino acids. Protein-rich foods like legumes and nuts and seeds can help vegetarians meet daily protein requirements. A simple mix of brown rice and beans also contains the nine essential amino acids, which are vital to human health and cannot be made by the body. They must come from food.




Zinc deficiency

A 2013 study published in the *Journal of the Science of Food and Agriculture* found that vegetarians have lower zinc intake than people who eat both plants and food. Plant foods are not generally high in zinc and zinc absorption from plant foods may be insufficient. Whole grains, tofu, legumes, nuts and seeds are some examples of foods that are rich in zinc. Eating such foods throughout the day can help vegetarians avoid zinc deficiency.

Vegetarians can speak with their physicians about additional deficiencies they may be vulnerable to. Such deficiencies can often be easily overcome, reassuring vegetarians that their dietary choices won't put their overall health in jeopardy.



Bulldogs defeat Lakeland Kathleen 16-12 in season opener

After both playoff contenders missed preseason games due to quarantines, Zephyrhills hits the road to begin the season on a good note

Neither team had an advantage in last Friday night's season opener with visiting Zephyrhills and Lakeland Kathleen having to miss their preseason games due to quarantines resulting in positive tests for Covid-19. With no warmups to speak of, both perennial playoff contenders aimed to kick off the 2021 high

school football season with a victory.

Chalk one up for the Bulldogs following a 16-12 win over the Red Devils. That bodes well for Zephyrhills to extend an impressive run that includes five playoff appearances in the past six seasons.

"What a great way to open up and have a win against a good team. We made a good first impression," said coach Nick Carroll, who has coached the Bulldogs to four of those five postseason berths. "I think the biggest thing now is we've got film."

Looking over that film on Monday, Carroll noted that the offense had some work to do as far as cleaning up mistakes. Either way, the team is off to a much better start than last season when the first two games were stripped away after some players tested positive for the coronavirus.

"Offensively, we'll get it right," the coach said. "We had a great defense."

Added assistant Tom McHugh, who formerly coached at Pasco and was a defensive coordinator at Wesley Chapel, "If they can't score they can't win."

A stand-out defensive play led to the clinching touchdown for the Bulldogs and helped them withstand a late score by the Red Devils. Leading 10-6 and with all of the game's points coming in the first half at that point, Zephyrhills went expanded its lead to 16-6 when safety Nick Sheldon scooped up a fumble and ran the football into the end zone from 34 yards out.

That marked the second fumble recovery of the day for Sheldon, a senior who celebrated his 18th birthday on Friday. After the game, the team gathered in the north end zone to sing happy birthday to

him.

Downplaying his contributions, Sheldon softly said it was "great" to account for the clinching touchdown and have two turnovers on his birthday.

Nonetheless, he was not the only defensive player who came up big when it counted. After allowing a 65-yard touchdown pass from Anthony Oldham to Jayren Dennis on a deep post pattern, the Bulldogs bent but did not break as the Red Devils mounted one final attempt to score in the waning minutes. Zephyrhills linebacker Theotis Smith forced a fumble by Oldham and Maquire Neal recovered the football on the final play of the game.

In a sign of things to come, Willie Queen returned the opening kickoff 57 yards to set up a Zephyrhills score on its opening drive. Four plays after that long return, Jaxon Rivera kicked a 24-yard field goal to give the Bulldogs an early 3-0 lead.

Later in the first quarter, Kathleen capitalized on a turnover to take a 6-3 lead. The Red Devils recovered a fumble by Queen right after he picked up a first down on the short carry. They went 41 yards in three plays, capping that brief drive with a 5-yard run by Jordan Gant.

That lead did not last long and Zephyrhills went into the locker room by mounting a five-play, 59-yard scoring drive. Neal snuck behind the Kathleen defense and Rivera passed to him over the middle to complete a 37-yard touchdown pass. Rivera then kicked the extra point for a 10-6 half-time lead.

The Bulldogs host Hernando, which did not play in the opening week, this Friday. Kickoff is at 7:30 p.m.

"All my life, playing was an excuse to get to 'third game'," Mendez said.

The weekend tournament, which stretched from Friday to Sunday afternoon, featured three brackets: beginner, intermediate and advanced. There exists a ranking system but with the sport still in its infancy in the United States and even at SVB, ranking works off an honor system.

"An advanced player can play down one level based on their partner," Padel Director Edgar Aldahondo said. "I have played with most of these players, so I know their level."

Last weekend's tournament marked the second of its kind at SVB. They played a smaller tournament back in the Fall of last year during their soft opening. Another tournament is set for Oct. 11. The padel facility at SVB was recently ranked number nine in the world by the International Padel Association. SVB is one of the few places in the country with four courts and the only facility in the U.S. ranked in the top 10 in the world.

"It's crazy for a little place like Zephyrhills to have something like this," Collard said.

It was certainly enough to attract a field of competitors. Daniel Siljestrom and his partner (both romantic and padel) Rocio Frej are originally from Spain but both moved to Tampa for work. Siljestrom came up playing padel, while Frej crossed over

to the sport from tennis.

"She (Frej) beats me at tennis, I beat her at padel," Siljestrom said. "It's different than tennis, you play the walls all the time, sometimes two walls at the same time."

Frej, who only started playing padel last October, still bends her tennis game to the new sport.

"In tennis, you're always wanting to move forward," Frej said. "The footwork is totally different (with padel)."

The couple drives an hour up from Tampa to use the sparkling new facility at SVB.

Aldahondo and Collard, however, are adamant that padel is not just for elite athletes. Anyone at any athletic level can pickup the sport. If the aspiring player has any experience with racquet sports like tennis, racquetball, even pickleball, even better. It's worth a try and SVB will even teach you how. In the month of September, SVB is offering free padel clinics on Saturdays from 10:30 to 11:30 a.m. Interested parties should call the SVB front desk at (813) 361-6660 for more information.

Beyond being the top padel destination in the country, SVB is pushing ahead, utilizing all of the magnificent facilities. This coming weekend, SVB will host an SSOVA (Sunshine State Outdoor Volleyball Association) Women's Open Tournament with a \$3,600 purse and \$2,500 first prize. The event is free to the public to attend and will feature some great dining and drinking offerings from Vesh Bistro.

After a slow start, the Wildcat ground game wore down the host Seahawks

Wesley Chapel head coach Tony Egan needed this win. Hampered by cancelled or shortened practices and facing three very tough opponents to start the 2021 season, the Wildcats needed a strong start. While they didn't start their season opener at Sunlake strong, they began to take control and then grind down the Seahawk defense for what would become a dominant victory.

It was the Seahawks that seemed to be off to a fast start. They notched three first downs on their opening drive while deploying a read-option offense. A delay of game flag and an incompletion scuttled the drive. The Wildcats could not get the run game going and gave it back to the Seahawks at midfield with 5:44 left in the opening quarter. The Seahawks used a steady dose of running back Jackson Lipski to reach the red zone but the Wildcat defense stuffed quarterback Kevin Spillane on a 3rd-and-1 and

then Jayden Ramos got a pass deflection on fourth down, forcing a turnover on downs.

"That (turnover on downs) was a huge momentum swing," Egan said. "We were lights out on fourth down all night."

The Seahawks were 0-4 on fourth down attempts on Friday. The momentum shift was in after a Sunlake pass interference penalty floated the ensuing Wesley Chapel drive. Steady doses of Mason Quinn, Jaylan Blake and Nehemiah Morgan opened things up and then a well-executed left sweep saw Morgan lay a great kickoff block and Blake slice through the defense for a 37-yard gain. Morgan would cap the drive with a 14-yard touchdown run, picking his way through the Seahawk defense.

Getting both the quarterback snap and special teams long snaps plagued the Seahawks all night. It killed their fourth drive of the first half and then spoiled an interception by Mitch Hammond on the next offensive drive, fumbling the ball away to Wesley Chapel on their own 17-yard line. The Wildcats would convert the turnover into a touchdown off a tough run by Blake and a one-yard plunge by quarterback Ethan Harper. The Wildcats took a 13-0 lead into halftime.

The Wildcats went three-and-out their first two drives of the second half. A fumbled punt return by Morgan gave the Seahawks the ball at the Wildcat 33. The defense held and forced a field goal. Then the Wildcat run game got on the rails. Blake went for eight, then again for a 32-yarder. Morgan ran for eight, Quinn ran for eight more. Blake for 11, Blake again for eight, then Blake broke a 30-yarder on a stretch left play that cracked the game open at 20-3 with just 38 seconds left in the third quarter.

"We talked to the O-line at halftime and told them how we were going to come downhill and try to ice games and that they needed to suck it up," Egan said. "They responded well to that."

It wasn't just the Wildcat backs. Offensive linemen stayed on their blocks and pushed into the second level. Egan was complementary of the whole group, particularly the right side. Briac Riles, Tony

Salatino and Max Hembrecht had standout performances. The run game would tally one more touchdown in the fourth quarter when Blake took one in from seven yards out to knot the final score at 27-3.

"Tonight was a testament to our conditioning," Egan said. "We didn't have the practices we wanted but we got some good tests playing at The Villages and then in that coaches scrimmage against Gulf. We were more battle tested."

After a shaky start, Blake came on strong, finishing with 176 yards on 19 carries. Morgan ran six times for 57 yards and Quinn carried four times for 53 yards. Jordan McCaslin had a great night on defense, pressuring the Sunlake backfield. Yael Diaz and Gabe Stewart made splash plays on defense as well on Friday night.

The 1-0 Wildcats now look to settle the score with their crosstown rivals and perennial favorites, the Wiregrass Ranch Bulls.

Bulldogs focused on extending their dominance of the sport on the east side of Pasco County

Way back when any local middle school football fan cares to remember, Stewart had a hard time winning and often battled to stay out of the cellar among Pasco County teams. Times certainly have changed.

The Bulldogs are on a roll unlike any in school history as they continue a record run that includes a mere two losses over the past 10 years. Along the way, Stewart has posted seven unbeaten seasons, including its current run of three in a row.

"I try to remind the kids of that each year," said Stewart coach Greg Mathis, who enters his fourth season after Norm Scheuerman stepped down before the 2018 season. "I tell them each season that it's up to you guys."

Mathis is optimistic that the current trend, which begins Sept. 14 with its season opener at Weightman, will continue with this year's group. Especially considering that many of his players came up through the Zephyrhills Athletic League and have played on championship teams in that youth football organization.

"It helps, because they have that mindset of a winner," Mathis said of players' experiencing winning at a younger level. "I see it in quite a few of them."

There is ample talent and depth in the skill positions with Mathis likely alternating Samiyn Black and Roosevelt Miller at quarterback while spreading playing time out to several running backs and wide receivers.

"Hopefully, we'll be as balanced as we can with the run and pass," Mathis said. "Both quarterbacks are threats to run and throw."

The running backs taking some of those handoffs will include Amerh Norris, Tyson McCullough, Zakary Carroll, John Blanford and Javion Searight. As for the receivers targeted, that group consists of Deori Pope, Azuri Jackson, Daniel Carter, Kobe Tenbrink and Ethan Stone, the latter of whom also will see some time running the football out of the backfield.

Up front, the offensive line is anchored by center Jake Godfrey, tackles Hunter Bowman and Paul Butto, along with Tyler Gillette, Dax Kirkland and Maverick Darrough. Mathis called Godfrey "a phenomenal little center."

On defense, Mathis does not favor one group over the other so far, saying the linemen, linebacking corps and secondary give the team plenty of balance in a collective effort to stop the run and pass of opponents.

The defensive line is led by Blanford, Edward Lee, Adrian Bebedelis and Anthony Carrasquillo with some of the aforementioned offensive linemen filling in at times.

The linebacking unit is deep and features Black, McCullough, Norris, Carroll and Darrough. The edge rusher who will rush the passer at times and drop back into pass coverage on other occasions depending on the circumstances is Blanford.

The secondary is comprised of a combination of the running backs and receivers: Jackson, Miller, Stone, Tenbrink, Pope and Searight.

As for the kicking game, Darrough will handle the punting, kickoffs, extra-point attempts and, when applicable, field goals.

As has been the norm in recent years, the Bulldogs have high hopes for yet another championship season. Not to mention keeping the three-year unbeaten streak going.

"It's looking pretty decent, but we'll see," Mathis said during the second week of team practices. "We have some talent and some size, but not a lot. It's going to come down to discipline and doing the small things; getting them right every single time."
