Pasco Stars three-peat as gold medalists in Special Olympics softball

The Pasco Stars are held in high esteem when it comes to Special Olympics softball — so much so that teams at the state level don't even want to play them anymore. Not surprisingly, they were invited to this year's national championships in Lynchburg, Va.

The local team lived up to the hype by winning the Special Olympics North American Softball Championships in mid-September. The Stars captured their third straight title by winning five of seven games in that three-day series.

That gives Pasco, which at the national level is referred to as Team Florida, five medals in five Special Olympic appearances. The ballplayers, primarily from east and central Pasco who have always practiced at Charles B. Krusen Memorial Field in Zephyrhills, also have a bronze and a silver.

"We've always taken a medal," coach Belinda Brown said. "For fourth place you only get a ribbon. We kind of have a reputation of being a good team."

City council sets budget, millage, observes Mental Health Week

Monday's City Council meeting saw second reading of both the 2022/23 FY City budget and millage rate

Monday's meeting was set amid the backdrop of Hurricane Ian bearing down on the Gulf Coast of Florida. It was fitting that ahead of the nervous waiting for the storm's impact, the first item on the agenda was a proclamation recognizing Mental Health Week. Noted statistics were that suicide is the 10th leading cause of death in the United States. Ninety percent of those suicides the person had an underlying mental illness. Pasco County Parks & Recreation representative Kimberly McCullough received the proclamation and detailed a number of events at the Withlacoochee River Park aimed at providing an outlet for residents to battle mental health issues.

There were five Consent Agenda items, they were bundled and passed together 5-0. Item 2.1 made some changes to the collective bargaining agreement between the City of Zephyrhills and the Fraternal Order of Police, on behalf of the Zephyrhills Police Department, as they pertain to sergeants.

Item 2.2 made some of those changes to PTO or paid time off and other contractual changes for ZPD as they pertained to police officers, detectives and SROs or school resource officers.

Item 2.3 approved Amendment 1 to the Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO)

Sample ballots available for the General Election

Brian E. Corley, Supervisor of Elections, Pasco County, announces that sample ballots for the upcoming Nov. 8, General Election are now available online at PascoVotes.gov, and will be mailed to Pasco County voters on Oct. 10.

Voters are encouraged to look over their sample ballot and familiarize themselves with the candidates and issues before going to the polls. In order to expedite the voting process, voters should take their completed sample ballots with them when early voting or on Election Day.

An accessible sample ballot is available on PascoVotes.gov. It is a web-based, interactive sample ballot for all voters. It is audio-enabled, multilingual and fully accessible for voters with disabilities and compatible with all major

screen readers, tactile switches, closed captioning, and sip and puff systems. It allows voters to view and mark an accessible sample ballot and print a reference sheet with their selections.



grant pertaining to the Sarah Vande Berg Tennis & Wellness Center. Amendment 1 made changes to the effective date and expiration date of the grant agreement period. It also added a project description that two hard court surfaces would be built, as well as SVB providing access to low-income residents and children.

Item 2.4 awarded a bid for outdoor tennis court construction at SVB to CPWG Contractors. CPWG was the only contractor to bid the \$500,000 project so they were an easy choice.

Item 2.5 reassigned a lease for a portion of the Zephyrhills Municipal Airport.

In Business Items, Item 3.1 was the second reading of the new fiscal year's millage rate. The millage rate of 6.25 was lower than last year and reflects a 5.876 roll back rate. Approved 5-0, the millage rate for the 2022/23 FY is now set.

Item 3.2 was the second reading of the city budget. Finance director Ted Beason gave some brief remarks but the highlight was the \$100,621,184 proposed budget for 2023, an increase of \$25,324,504.

In the Planning Director's Report, Historic Preservation Specialist Audrey McGuire spoke on a conditional use application for a boat and RV storage site located at 3971 and 4000 Trump Place, near the municipal airport and Skydive City. The two parcels combined for roughly seven acres and are located in an already established industrial park. It was determined through discussion that the business would have little impact on the area with limited water usage and minimal traffic impact. It was determined that six buildings would eventually be at the properties but the item passed 5-0.

"It's a good spot for something like that," councilman Lance Smith said.

In the City Manager's Report, an emergency item, Item 5.4 granted emergency powers to

Zephyrhills City Manager William Poe Jr. declared a state of emergency in the city and gives Poe more flexibility with procuring items or services, as well as opens up claims for FEMA reimbursement. The resolution passed 5-0.

Item 5.1 was a non-action item that discussed the present and future of water use in Zephyrhills. In a nutshell, the city has the capacity to draw more water than is currently permitted under the Southwest Florida Management District (SWFMD). Expected growth and development could add 6,000 residents in the next 10 years. Council members discussed options such as requesting a higher threshold for pumping from SWFMD, asking developers to pay 50 percent of their impact fees up front. Identifying additional water sources is perhaps the key to securing Zephyrhills' future water use needs. Taking over ownership of existing wells, using water from other municipalities, acquiring other pumping plants, tapping the Floridan Aquifer and improving water conservation measures were all items discussed on Monday. Poe estimated that the city could save 145,000 gallons a day by implementing conservation measures. This was a non-action item.

Item 5.2 established rates for SVB. It set rates for both single sports and multiple sports in three tiers - Public, Seasonal and Zephyrhills residents. For instance, a Zephyrhills resident for a one-month membership, for tennis only, would pay \$60. The \$99 initiation fee is waived for Zephyrhills residents. The fee for bringing a guest is \$15 and an all-access day pass would be \$50 per day. This item passed 5-0.

Item 5.3 approved an agreement between ZPD and Axon, the provider of ZPD's body cameras, to purchase a new Records Management System (RMS). The program length is 60 (five years) months at the cost of \$1,004,999.90.

Poe stated that ZPD has used the same system for the last two decades and that it was badly in need of updating, also that the current system is incompatible with federal and state agencies. Poe also stated that the contract also includes data migration, implementation, renewal of the body cameras and taser.

ZPD Chief Derek Brewer spoke very highly of the Axon services already contracted and the benefits of the RMS. Brewer also stated that Pasco Sheriff's Office is using the same RMS, improving efficiency and information sharing. It passed 5-0.



MOMENTS IN TIME

The History Channel

- On Sept. 29, 1954, Willie Mays, center fielder for the New York Giants, makes an amazing over-the-shoulder catch of a fly ball hit by Cleveland Indians first baseman Vic Wertz to rob Wertz of extra bases in game 1 of the 1954 World Series. The catch has gone down as one of the greatest in the history of baseball.
- On Sept. 30, 1868, the first volume of Louisa May Alcott's beloved coming-of-age book "Little Women" is published. Alcott dedicated most of her life and writing to supporting her family after her father's failure at running a school.
- On Oct. 1, 1920, Scientific American magazine reports that the rapidly developing medium of radio would soon be used to broadcast music. Experimental concerts were being conducted from the Radio Laboratory of the Bureau of Standards with local radio operators being used to see if the transmissions could be heard hundreds of miles away.
- On Oct. 2, 1965, a team of scientists invent Gatorade, a sports drink to quench thirst, in a University of Florida lab. The name Gatorade was derived from the nickname of the university's sports teams. A coach had asked for something to help his players who were negatively affected by the heat during play, and the salt and sugar drink was developed.
- On Oct. 3, 1995, Heisman Trophy winner O.J. Simpson is acquitted of the double murder of his estranged wife, Nicole Brown Simpson, and her friend, Ronald Goldman, despite a DNA match, a wound on Simpson's hand, the recent purchase of a Stiletto knife and matching shoeprints at the scene.
- On Oct. 4, 1927, sculpting begins on the granite images of presidents Washington, Jefferson, Lincoln and Roosevelt at Mount Rushmore. Jefferson's image was originally fashioned to the right of Washington. Within two years, the face was badly cracked, and workers blasted the sculpture off the mountain. Sculpting began again with Jefferson on the left side of Washington.
- On Oct. 5, 1947, President Harry Truman makes the first televised presidential address, asking Americans to cut back on food to help starving Europeans. He requested that the public voluntarily forgo meat on Tuesdays, eggs and poultry on Thursdays and to save a slice of bread each day.





Avocados are packed with nutrients and vitamins



Over 116,500 Vote-By-Mail Ballot requests fulfilled for the General Election

Brian E. Corley, Supervisor of Elections, announced that on Sept. 29, over 116,500 vote-by-mail ballots for the Nov. 8, General Election will be mailed to voters with requests already on file. Ballots to uniformed and overseas citizens were mailed Sept. 23.

Voted mail ballots must be returned to the elections’ office by 7 p.m. Election Day, Nov. 8. Please allow sufficient time for first-class delivery by the U.S. Postal Service, or hand deliver ballots to any of the three Pasco County Supervisor of Elections’ Offices. Voted mail ballots

are also accepted at early voting sites, however voted mail ballots may not be turned in at the polls on Election Day. Early voting sites and office locations are available online at PascoVotes.gov.

For eligible voters who did not previously request a ballot, they are still available by calling the elections’ office, by submitting the request in writing, or by using the online request form on PascoVotes.gov. Requests must include the voter’s Florida Driver License number, Florida ID Card number, or the last four digits of

voter’s SSN, date of birth, and Pasco County residence address. Written requests must also include the voter’s signature.

Vote-by-mail ballots cannot be forwarded but can be mailed to a temporary mailing address if outside of Pasco County. Voters are encouraged to confirm their mailing address when ordering a vote-by-mail ballot. The deadline to request a ballot to be mailed is 5 p.m. on Oct. 29.

Written or telephonic requests for vote-by-mail ballots must come from the voter, an

immediate family member, or legal guardian on behalf of a voter. Voters may pick up ballots for themselves at any of the three elections’ offices beginning, Sept. 26, but not for someone else until nine days before the election, or Oct. 30.

Those picking up ballots on behalf of someone will need a written request from the voter, designating them as the person authorized to carry out the ballot. The designee will be asked to provide a photo ID and to complete an affidavit before the ballot will be released to them.



"I think this is the sweetest one ever," fellow coach Judy Brunner said of the most recent title. "Three years ago we didn't lose a game. We were riding high. This was a national invitational and this time we were playing really strong teams."

Brunner and Brown, both of whom also have been Pasco County Special Olympics coordinators and longtime referees for various high school and middle school sports in east Pasco, were joined on the coaching staff by Stacy Morris. The latter was a longtime supporter who recently became an assistant coach.

The road to the gold medal was not exactly smooth riding. The Stars lost two out of their first three games before rallying with four straight wins. They clinched the title with an 11-1 rout of the Ontario Aces. Including all seven games, the Stars outscored the opposition by a whopping 70-33 margin.

The Stars opened the competition by splitting their first two games. First came a hard-hitting 15-11 loss to Kansas, then a 10-8 win over the Virginia Rangers. Following a 12-1 loss to the Georgia Big Dawgs, their second of the series, they defeated the Texas Mustangs 11-7, Virginia Sox 10-9 and Virginia Rangers 16-1 to set up the finals matchup against Ontario.

"We were the top seed and got a bye in the

medal round," Brown said. "We believe that we started bad because we didn't play any meaningful games (before the national tourney). We couldn't find anyone to scrimmage with."

Added Brunner, "We're the best and strongest team in the state of Florida."

In all, the championship field in Virginia consisted of 20 teams, including two from Canada. It marked the first Special Olympics softball event on the national stage since 2019. The Stars won the title in Nashville that year, but due to shutdowns and restrictions stemming from the coronavirus pandemic the series took a two-year hiatus.

Brunner and Brown spoke proudly about the team chemistry, pointing out that some of the ballplayers have been part of the team for about 20 years. Bonding on road trips and swimming in hotel pools or going out to eat together are fun-filled activities shared by the team.

"They love their softball," said Brunner, adding, "They really have such a wonderful time."

The Stars roster included: Phillip Olson, Roger Olson, George Morris, George "Bubby" Morris, Richard Proctor, Ernie Shultz, Joshua Asua, Kenny Cariveau, John Algoood, Justin Buchanon, Curt Walters, Blake Bird, Andres Torres, Scott Walter and Michael Dunn.



Despite 3-1 loss, Zephyrhills is improving while Cypress Creek eyes a return to the playoffs

For the first two games it appeared that Cypress Creek was on the verge of a three-game sweep of host Zephyrhills in last Tuesday's volleyball game. The Bulldogs, however, mounted a rally by winning the third game and taking a late lead in the fourth.

The home fans on Hawaiian night rooted hard for the Bulldogs, who ultimately came up short in their comeback bid. They could not hold onto the lead after a handful of late ties in the fourth game and the Coyotes eventually escaped with a 3-1 win.

That gave Cypress Creek a 5-3 record while Zephyrhills dropped to 4-8, which includes a 3-0 loss to playoff contender Wiregrass Ranch the following night as well as a split of six home games.

The vastly improved Bulldogs had not won more than three times in a season in nearly 20 years. That bodes well for a continued turnaround under second-year coach Emily Frazer, a former college volleyball player at Temple in Philadelphia.

While the four wins have the Bulldogs on the right track, Frazer noted that the focus is more about building a solid program with classy and respectful young women.

"We are growing," the coach said. "My job as a high school coach is to build solid young women, not the best Olympian."

Against Cypress Creek, Zephyrhills rallied from 25-7 and 25-18 defeats for a narrow 25-23 win. The home team then lost the fourth game,

25-20. Frazer felt her team was better though.

"Cypress Creek's a good team, but I believe we're better," she said. "We're fundamentally sound and we have better athletes. The girls did not come out mentally focused. In volleyball you can't wait till the third game to come out and try to win."

Unlike seasons past, most of the Zephyrhills players are on club teams in the offseason. "That's a big difference," Frazer said.

Among Zephyrhills' key players with club experience who fared well in the matchup with Cypress Creek were Zharia Alleyne, a standout freshman who plays for Club Dynamite, sophomore Alleaona Searight, along with seniors Mikalah Geiger and Jade Pickett.

Frazer called Alleyne "a force to be reckoned with. She's coachable. She soaks it in like a sponge."

At 6-foot-2, Pickett is the tallest on a team that has more height than many of the past Zephyrhills teams. The only sport she previously took part in was track, but Frazer convinced her to come out for volleyball.

"She loves it," Frazer said of Pickett, an outside hitter who plays strong at the net.

Other notable players for the Bulldogs are libero Payton Leidy, Laila Woolfolk, Bailee Hitchner and Tessa Starnes. Leidy and Starnes, both of whom play club volleyball, are the team's co-captains.

Meanwhile, Cypress Creek High is coming off an impressive season. The Coyotes went 17-6 and as a district runner-up advanced to the region quarterfinals. Nearly half of the roster has graduated, though, including most of the team's statistical leaders.

The top returners are kills and blocks leader Sadie Walker, a junior, and setter and libero Laney Brinson.

The Zephyrhills junior varsity team lost to Cypress Creek. The Bulldogs have wins over Academy at the Lakes and Patel.

Frazer lauded JV coach Lyndra Davis, a former Zephyrhills player who also helps out with the varsity team.

"The JV (program) is to build fundamentals and to help get the players in the best spot to make the varsity team. She does that," Frazer said of Davis.



HOLLYWOOD

HOLLYWOOD -- Could it merely be a coincidence that Timothee Chalamet’s “Bones & All” (due Nov. 23), directed by “Call Me by Your Name’s” Luca Guadagnino, is a film about two cannibals in love, the very thing that sent his “Call Me” co-star Armie Hammer’s career off the rails? “Bones & All” contains scenes that involve limb-chewing and gory attacks. In January 2021, a woman posted screenshots of Hammer’s alleged messages stating: “I am 100% a cannibal, and I want to eat you,” and “I need to drink your blood.”

Since the cannibalism never actually happened, the exchanges could have just been naughty banter due to intoxication. Doing damage control, Hammer completed nine months of rehab treatment in December 2021. Still, his wife of 10 years, Elizabeth Chambers, divorced him in December 2020.

Chalamet created a sensation at the Venice Film Festival premiere, wearing a sparkling, backless red jumpsuit. After the showing, he received a standing ovation. He has upcoming lead roles in “Dune: Part Two” (due November 2023) and “Wonka” (due Dec. 15, 2023). Luca Guadagnino also announced plans for a sequel of “Call Me by Your Name” (without Armie Hammer, who has been relegated to selling timeshares in the Cayman Islands).

Brendan Fraser was a handsome leading man, who scored with “Encino Man” (1992); “George of the Jungle” (1997); “Gods and Monsters” (1998); “Dudley Do-Right” (1999), “The Mummy” trilogy (1999-2008); the 3D epic “Journey to the Center of the Earth” (2008); and “G.I. Joe: Rise of Cobra” (2009). After making 51 films, Fraser faded from view because of injuries he sustained from complicated stunts for “The Mummy” franchise (which grossed \$1 billion, \$245 million). Fraser also felt he’d been black-listed because he accused a powerful former president of the Hollywood Foreign Press of “groping” him.

Fraser appeared at the Venice Film Festival for his new film, in which he’s a 600-pound man struggling with health issues and trying to reconnect with his estranged daughter. The film, aptly named “The Whale,” earned him an eight-and-a-half-minute standing ovation at its premiere, which, when posted on social media, received approximately 16 million views. Dwayne Johnson took to Twitter saying, “Man, this makes me so happy to see this beautiful ovation for Brendan. He supported me coming into his ‘Mummy Returns’ franchise for my first ever role, which kicked off my Hollywood career. Rooting for all your success, brother.”

Prosthetics and CGI helped Fraser become “The Whale.” No doubt he’ll have a whale of a time getting back to his normal self!

Initially organized as a golf tournament hosted annually by the Silverado Golf and Country Club, the chamber's fundraiser switched to bowling five years ago. The change to a different sport and a new venue was made, in part, to involve more families.

Organizers, like chamber vice chairman Randy Stovall, reasoned that more people would come out to bowl since more are traditionally able to do that sport rather than golf.

"We used to do golf but I think this is more fun," said Stovall, who bowled with a group on Saturday. "We've got kids of all ages. People have a good time. You look around at the faces and they're smiling."

Added new chairman Ed Goolsby, "This is absolutely a fantastic family event. We've got children of all ages. It's just a wonderful night to come out and have fun."

On Saturday, the chamber's outgoing and incoming presidents were at Pin Chasers. Melonie Monson, who formerly held that position, was there with her family, including grandchildren Addie and Bryson Bristow.

Monson mentioned that while many events were cancelled or postponed during the coronavirus pandemic the bowling tourney was among the few that went on without being interrupted.

"We were lucky," she said.

Meanwhile, new president Vicki Wiggins helped run the bowling event and accompanying raffle with gift baskets. She relished being

part of the activities.

"It's good, clean family fun," said Wiggins, who did not bowl on Saturday but does bowl in a league at Pin Chasers. "It's for kids and co-workers; people who don't normally participate (in chamber activities). They don't necessarily come to our business breakfasts, but they come to this."

Amy Higgins, general manager of Pin Chasers, welcomes the event and is among numerous people who are glad it has relocated and changed to a different sport. The chamber's bowling fundraiser is one of several of its kind, which includes an annual bowling event for the local Rotary Club.

"Events like this are always fun," she said. "It's something different than our normal businesses."

Amy pointed out that there were several lanes filled by bowlers other than those involved in the chamber's fundraiser. They were just people who came in and wanted to bowl. There also was a youth league on Saturday morning, which did not create a conflict with the chamber event that started at 4 p.m.

In all, 60 bowlers took part in the chamber's event. Not to mention dozens of family members, friends and other supporters who turned out for the cause. As has been the case in most of the previous years, the bowling tourney raised about \$4,000.

Funds were earmarked for the chamber's education and workforce initiative. Prime beneficiaries of that included a scholarship fund that allows the chamber to dole out money for college for Zephyrhills High graduates, as well as a citizens of the month club for local students.

Additionally, some of the money raised will go toward skills that pay, an educational program for youth that will begin in January.

Cynthia Cortez, the chamber's marketing and events coordinator, perhaps summed it up best when she said the bowling tournament was beneficial in more ways than one.

"It's great because you get the families and businesses," she said. "They can get together and have fun and raise money. It's a great event."
