Warriors conquer Pirates in 9-Mile War

In a new installment of a fledgling rivalry, Zephyrhills Christian Academy routs Pasco 55-0

Often when a Class 6A school takes on a team in Class 2A, the one with the smaller population comes up short — sometimes in a big way. Last Friday night's game was a rout alright, only for the smaller school.

Zephyrhills Christian Academy, a kindergarten through high school senior school, wiped out Pasco, a traditional high school that not long ago ranked among the top teams in the county as well as the Tampa Bay area. While Zephyrhills and Pasco have a longstanding rivalry labeled the 9-Mile War, last Friday's installment could be the first in a new series.

Either way, ZCA coach Mike Smith viewed the outcome as a major statement for his team, which is off to a 3-1 start with three consecutive victories and back-to-back shutouts. The Warriors, coming off a 58-0 blowout of Palm Beach Christian Prep, have outscored the opposition by a whopping 179-41 margin so far.

"That's how a 2A team does it," said Smith, a Zephyrhills High graduate who formed the ZCA program as a six-man team in 1998. "There ain't a team in this county that beats this team right here."

Added assistant Lane McLaughlin, a former head coach at Carrollwood Day Prep, "When you look at the film, that's what you call a complete game."

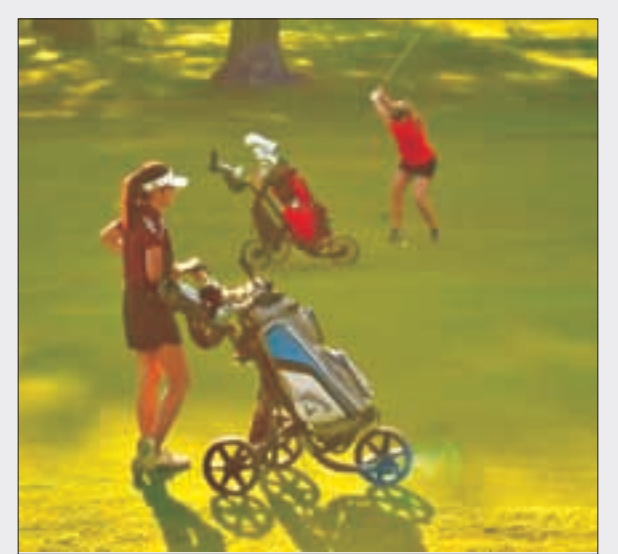
On the other side, Pasco, which once made a county-record eight straight playoff appearances, has yet to score in four losses. The Pirates have been outscored 156-0.

ZCA, which won two state championships in six-man team has competed as an 11-man squad since 2016, has its sights set on a fifth consecutive playoff berth and beyond. Judging by a hot start, the Warriors appear to be on the right track.

Quarterback Jayce Nixon, an eighth-grader who would be playing at the middle school level in a public school, showed he is plenty capable of handling himself as a varsity football player. The left-handed passer completed 6-of-7 attempts for 164 yards and two touchdowns against Pasco.

"He's so relaxed," Smith said. "He's a great leader." The Warriors have other leaders on both sides of the ball. Seniors Dontrevius Jackson and Andrew Felder are breakout players and scoring threats every time they touch the ball. Jackson, who had a game-high 156 yards on the ground, scored on runs of 63 and 28 yards.

Girls golf team keeping focus on shaving strokes

With a young and very new-to-the-game team, the 2021 Zephyrhills girls golf team is just focused on getting better every week

The Zephyrhills girls golf team took a heavy hit coming into the 2021 season. Three players that head coach Gary Baldus thought he had returning ended up not returning. There were a myriad of reasons but Baldus got to work with what he had and has tried to bring along a fledgling team, led by his daughter Brooke, a four-year senior.

"It's definitely a rebuilding year for us and we play teams with girls who have played a lot of golf," Baldus said. "We are teaching a lot of our players from scratch, some have never even held a club before."

It's not so much doom-and-gloom as it is tempered expectations. The team isn't going to states. That's not on the radar. Shaving strokes off their totals every week? That's realistic and so far has been attainable.

There are just six total players on the team. Behind Brooke Baldus is freshman Garcia Sullivan, then Mackenzie Porter, Jada Everett and then sisters Chloe and Shaelynn Scriven. Only five golfers count in the score when it comes to the state series but six can go out there and hit during the regular season.

On Monday, the Bulldogs squared off against Land O' Lakes and Wiregrass Ranch. It was not really a contest, team against team, yet the girls continue to whittle down their scores.

"All of our new girls were over 70 strokes when we started this season," Baldus said. "Today, we had three under 60 strokes and our fourth was at 64."

Progress. Brooke Baldus shot a 46 and placed second overall at the match. She hit three pars on the day and teammate Chloe Scriven hit one on the ninth hole. Everett has shaved 17 strokes off her total from when she started the season.

Stewart remains undefeated at 3-0

Cypress Creek is first middle school football team to score against the defending conference champion Bulldogs, who still win 28-6

Entering Tuesday night's middle school football game at Cypress Creek's Coyote Stadium, Stewart had not lost or been scored on. At least the Bulldogs haven't lost yet.

Coming off back-to-back shutouts — 38-0 over Weightman and 46-0 against perennial contender John Long — to open the season, the defending conference champion Bulldogs defeated handily. Although they allowed a touchdown in the first half they won 28-6.

"It was a better team and we just got off to a lousy start," Stewart coach Greg Mathis said.

On the other side, Cypress Creek coach Vincent Itri was well aware that Stewart had not been scored on before facing his team. He also felt his squad was in dire need of a score, having played a scoreless tie with Pinewick to open the season.

"I'm proud of our players," he said. "We were the first team to put up points on Stewart."

Both teams scored on their initial possessions. Stewart took the opening kickoff and capped off a seven-play, 54-yard drive with Saniyn Black's 12-yard quarterback keeper for a touchdown. A pivotal play on that drive came on fourth-and-8 with Black completing a 41-yard pass to Roosevelt Miller. Stewart took an 8-0 lead after Amerh Norris' 2-point conversion run.

Not to be outdone, the Coyotes put together a long drive that resulted in a touchdown early in the second quarter. A key on that eight-play, 60-yard drive came when quarterback Daniel Terry hooked up with running back Starlin Montero for a 22-yard completion. Montero then scored

on a 13-yard run, lunging just inside the left pylon before being knocked out of bounds by a Stewart defender.

The second half, however, proved to be a bit more decisive as the Bulldogs outscored the Coyotes by a 20-0 margin to pull away and remain unbeaten.

"We wound them down and the kids got some concentration," Mathis said, adding that at halftime "I told them that (first) half is over. We've got to put points on the board."

In the second half, Miller, who lines up at running back on offense and at cornerback on defense, returned an interception 54 yards for one touchdown and ran the football into the end zone from 2 yards out for another. That gave the Bulldogs an insurmountable 22-6 lead through three quarters.

In the fourth quarter, Black completed a scoring pass to Azuri Jackson to account for the final margin.

Earlier in the game, Stewart might have won by a greater margin. Black and Norris just missed interceptions with Norris' potential turnover that could have resulted in a pick-6 with Cypress Creek wide receiver Gustavo Herrera getting his fingers on the ball for a tip.

Additionally, the Coyotes fumbled three times, but recovered the ball each time.

Cypress Creek was not without its share of big plays on offense. Herrera hauled in a pass from Terry for a 38-yard gain in the second quarter, which turned out to be one of the longest plays of the game.

Later, Montero broke free down the right sideline on a 29-yard reverse for an apparent touchdown, but that play was nullified by a holding penalty.

In the fifth quarter, designed to allow the backups to get some playing time, the only touchdown came in the final minute. Stewart quarterback Tyson McCullough connected with Anthony Smith on a crossing pattern from the right side to the left corner of the end zone for a 33-yard touchdown.

"He runs hard as heck," Smith said of Jackson, who is beginning to get college scholarship offers and is expected to get more throughout the season.

Felder returned the open-

ing kickoff for an 88-yard touchdown and caught a pass in the left flat before weaving his way through numerous defenders for a 67-yard touchdown.

Also contributing to the scoring were E.J. Allen, who caught a 15-yard touchdown pass from Nixon, and Demetri Whitehead, who finished off a drive with a 3-yard touchdown run.

Defensively, Zyon Vaughn-Nobles and Antonio Hunt chipped in with a handful of combined sacks while tackling running backs near the line of scrimmage throughout the lopsided contest. Hunt also wound up with the final score of the game, recovering

a fumble in the end zone after Reggie Pry blocked a punt.

Despite being 11-2 with losses only against Bishop McLaughlin and Land O' Lakes since becoming an 11-man team, Smith pointed out that on social media and other platforms his team does not get much respect.

"It's the same everywhere," he said. "We're ready to play anybody. Any time we play in this county I'm going to be ruthless."

The Warriors are on the road this Friday against St. Petersburg Catholic (2-2) while the Pirates travel to Ocala Vanguard (4-0).

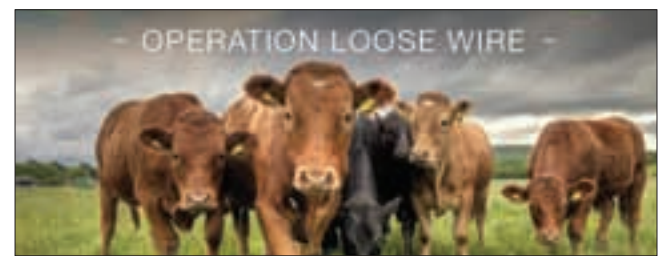

Florida Sheriffs Task Force announce successful completion of Operation Loose Wire

The Florida Sheriffs Association (FSA) Task Force released the results of Operation Loose Wire, an initiative focused on reducing the number of livestock that are at large, as well as cases of neglect. This operation also located and prosecuted individuals who are illegally dumping waste material. During this month-long operation, 225 external messages were developed and distributed to citizens and 88 citizen education events were hosted across Florida. "With ample rural areas and the current growth of local communities, Florida is a hot spot for criminal activity, ranging from illegal dumping to loose livestock, which contributes to the defacing of our state's pristine agricultural land," said Levy County Sheriff Bobby McCallum, President of the Florida Sheriffs Association. "We are proud of the success Operation Loose Wire has had in reducing livestock at large and apprehending those committing criminal activities."

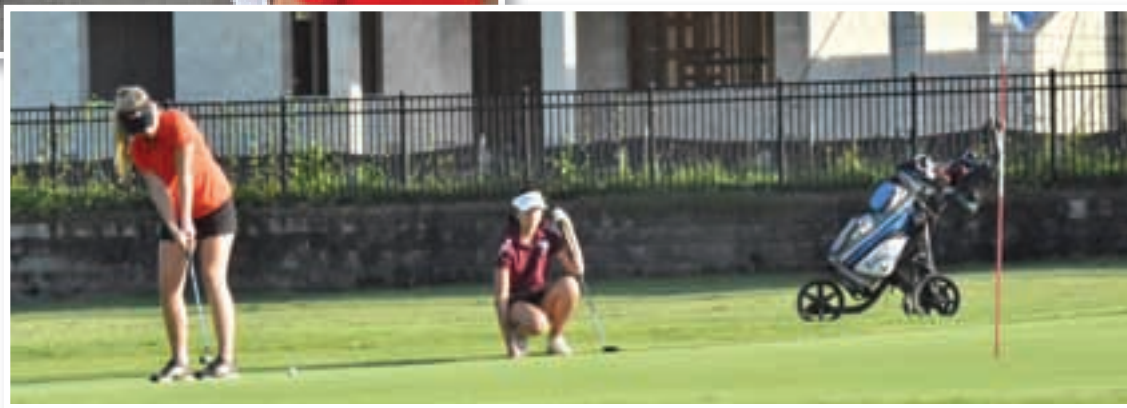
