Faculty and students rave about new C building

Zephyrhills High opens two-story building on campus as part of \$33 million expansion project

Now that the new C building has opened on the Zephyrhills High campus and school is back in session, the reviews are in. Administrators, teachers and students alike rave about the most recent expansion that is part of an overall \$33 million enhancement project.

"The air conditioning runs great, the bathrooms

are clean and I like the way it is structured," said Austin Williamson, a senior planning to join the U.S. Air Force before attending college. "It's very good architecture, how it goes into the other rooms."

The C building, referred to by some administrators as building 26, incorporates floors for seniors and juniors, and was ready when students returned to school in mid-August. The two-story structure with 17 classrooms also includes offices for guidance, administration and graduate enhancement, new bathrooms and additional storage space. There also are conference rooms on each floor.

"We tried to make it a junior-senior wing," said Matt Hayes, an assistant principal as well as a former teacher and student at Zephyrhills.

Students in the higher grades were well aware

Checkers coming soon to Zephyrhills

Fast food restaurant's structure is now in place at Gall Boulevard and 9th Avenue

A Checkers Restaurant sign at the corner of Gall Boulevard and 9th Avenue has been in place for a while. Now there is a 980-square-foot structure that a large crane dropped in place on the half-acre site and hiring should begin soon.

William Bingham, who was raised in Dade City, graduated from Pasco High in 1999 and runs a real estate company in Zephyrhills, is the more prominent figure among five investment partners. He and the others are eager to open with a target of early to mid-November.

"It's happening fast," he said. "We're extremely excited. We're eager to get it open and to serve customers."

As is the case with many businesses, most notably restaurants, location is often pertinent to a successful venture. That said, Bingham is thrilled with the site.

"It's a corner, which is obviously ideal, so the visibility is great," he said. "It's also down there in the mecca with other fast food restaurants."

In close proximity to the new Checkers are Burger King, Wendy's, KFC and Hungry Howie's Pizza. A bit further north on U.S. 301 are McDonald's, Culver's, which opened last year, and Pizza Hut. There are a few other sit-down restaurants, which also do take-out orders, in the area as well.

Zephyrhills City Council looking for ways to retain veterans in police department

Recent defections to Pasco County have council members looking for ways to retain their more experienced employees in the police department

At the last Zephyrhills City Council meeting, K9 Officer Lorenzo Limoges took the podium during the citizens comments period and issued a warning. He stated that six recent transfers from Zephyrhills Police Department recently took jobs with the Pasco County Sheriff's Office. It was certainly implied that more defections might occur unless the city could do something to create better incentives for their police department.

The appeal was timely as the city is in the process of finalizing their 2019/20 Fiscal Year Budget. That budget included a 3.5 percent increase in base salary for all city employees. The appeal also came the very



Already Bingham, president of Bingham Realty, and his investment partners are reviewing some applications with a general manager in training. More hiring will take place in early October with plans to bring in 50 people, although that number of employees might not remain that high over time.

The Checkers at the new location is the first but not the last for Bingham's group. Plans call for 10-15 in total with franchises expected to open in Pasco, Hernando, Citrus and other areas northward.

"This is kind of our tester," Bingham said of the Zephyrhills location. "If it does well we'll do more."

For now, the project's infrastructure is being put in place.

"We're just waiting on the site work, trying to get all the underground in," Bingham said. "Just typical site work at this point. This is the part I know. It's the other side (namely, running a restaurant) that's new. I am learning as we go."

Being a local businessman and lifelong resident of east Pasco endeared Bingham to the community. The Greater Zephyrhills Chamber of Commerce welcomes his new business venture with open arms.

"I think it's great that one of our local residents is expanding his horizon and going into a new venture," said Melonie Monson, the chamber's executive director who often has worked with Bingham on economic development matters. "He really is based in this community and wants the community to expand and grow in positive ways, so I'm excited for him."

The feeling is mutual with Bingham adding, "We appreciated the city of Zephyrhills in helping make this happen."

As for the food, plenty of folks have eaten at Checkers and some have their favorites. When it opens, however, Monson, for one, will be a first-timer.

"I'll give it a try, for sure," she said, adding, "I do think the location is great for the surrounding businesses. It will give another option for people on their lunch break and to get quickly back to work."

night of a salary study presentation by Clifton, Larson, Allen, LLP (CLA).

Base pay for a Patrol Officer as defined by the City of Zephyrhills starts at \$43,261.76 annually, while the Deputy Patrol position at the Pasco Sheriff's Office starts at an annual salary of \$42,409.90. The current salary cap for a City Patrol Officer is \$66,623.11. At the Pasco Sheriff's Department, the max is \$68,952.

Pretty comparable. Almost identical. As is usually the case, the devil is in the details. Both departments offer annual salary increases determined by their budgets. As stated earlier, Zephyrhills is implementing a 3.5 percent increase across all departments. This includes an immediate bump up to what the new proposed minimums are for each pay grade, based on the CLA study.

"We recently went through a salary study of our own and, with the support of our county commission, we were able to get raises for our members the last three years," PSO Assistant Executive Director Chase Daniels stated. "The raises varied based on certified vs civilian members but were at least 2 percent. This year, as well, the sheriff has requested for raises and it is pending approval of the BOCC."

So the salary ranges are similar, why is ZPD losing veteran officers to Pasco County? One of Limoges' points makes the case. Limoges stated that while the salary range might look great, he questioned how long it might take an officer to advance through that pay grade. The answer? Zephyrhills really doesn't have a step or incentive program in place. At 3.5 percent, it could take a Zephyrhills patrol officer 15 years to reach the maximum salary at that pay grade. Naturally, a patrol officer would have likely advanced in rank and pay grade for that matter, in 15 years but the fact remains.

"I think a step plan of five years is pretty

fair," councilman Lance Smith said. "If you stay in a position for five years, you must be doing a good job or you wouldn't be around for those five years."

PSO has a step plan and theirs is every two years.

"We do have a step plan, in which the deputy moves a step after they complete two years in their current step," Daniels said.

Pasco County's step plan might be something the city could look at in future budgets but again, details need to be sorted out. There was much discussion regarding the subject at that same city council meeting. Both step plans and performance pay bonuses were floated as ideas. Performance pay might get sticky for police officers. Would it be based on number of arrests? Number of citations? It's not a great scenario. While the CLA even recommended a merit pay or pay-for-performance option in their report, is it something that just applies to certain departments in the city and not police? Then what does the city do to create incentives for their police?

"I think in some instances, we might try performance pay but would we rather do that than just give so-and-so a raise?" Smith said. "The step plan guarantees that if you stay so long you get so much raise in salary but is it fair to give the police department steps and not other departments?"

Truly, those are valid questions and ones both the council and perhaps a new entity could help determine in the future. Part of the CLA report was a recommendation to form a compensation committee. There was universal support at the last council meeting in forming such a committee. It would be an added set of perspectives to help figure out how to be fair, frugal and generous at the same time. While it's too late to implement it into the 2019/20 Fiscal Year Budget, the council and perhaps this new committee will be examining these options going forward.

they would be walking into a new building upon returning to school for this semester. Like Hayes, some said they could not wait to see how it turned out since many saw it being constructed during the last academic year.

"I was pretty intrigued," Williamson said. "I really wanted to see what it was going to be."

Several students spoke of how a new addition marked by cleanliness and with plenty of room enhances their learning experience.

"The newness of it makes it a lot more enjoyable to learn and a pleasure to be in class," said Kade Schaefer, a sophomore taking three advanced classes in the new wing. "It enhances the learning experience 100 percent."

"I feel like it does help a little bit," Williamson added. "It feels like it helps the (learning) environment."

The additional classrooms help alleviate overcrowding in the 10 portables on campus. Hayes said eventually the school could get down to just two portables

with the remaining ones being sent to other county schools in the area.

"We're a pretty big campus and on the south wing we have those portables," Hayes said. "We're happy that when all the construction is done we'll have only two teachers in portables. The district will just come and take those and put them at other schools. The freshmen, by the time they're seniors they'll have a whole new campus."

Abigail Boyko, a senior headed to Pasco-Hernando State College next year, is among many students glad to get out of the portables. She felt the expansion was long overdue.

"It gets pretty crowded at school and the younger classes are getting bigger and bigger," Boyko said.

Added Schaefer, "I was really excited to be out of those portables."

Math teacher Elizabeth Winslett, who is in the new building, concurred: "We could get rid of the portables. We were in need of some new classrooms."

"It's fresh, it's new," she said. "I have a window so it's open. I'm there and (the seniors are) there. For me it's all about effectiveness and being there for the kids."

Theodora Eggleston, who teaches history and government is in the C building having shifted from the B building, which was an
