Pirates ground Falcons 27-0

The rain parted just in time for a delayed start to the Pirates-Falcons game on Friday night. Still, the sloshy field and wet football made for some momentum-swinging miscues. On the Pirates very first offensive play, they fumbled the snap and the Falcons recovered. It looked as though the visiting Pirates were going to be playing from behind as the Falcon offense

setup shop at the 21-yard line. The Pirate defense answered the bell. JJ Johnson got a pass deflection and the Falcons went backward their next two plays, finally punting on a 4th-and-long. Coming soon, a distillery near you

Dunamis Premium Spirits has selected Zephyrhills to open up shop and they will be serving the area as early as Nov. 1

Zephyrhills has the reputation of being the City of Pure Water. It also has a climate of growth and development. It also has a craft beer house called Zephyrhills Brewing Company. It also has great vehicular access from U.S. Highway 301, State Road 54 and 56. Access to fine adult beverages in Zephyrhills has never looked so good.

"Every great spirit starts with a great water source," Founder and CEO of Dunamis Premium Spirits Victor Young said. "Zephyrhills is a city on the move. It has substantial growth, the political climate is that of growth, it's easy to get into. The elected officials here seem to welcome business and understand growth."

Young has always been a connoisseur of spirits, particularly bourbon and whiskey. He invested in a distillery years ago but found his access to quality control limited.

"I knew that if we were going to attain the highest level of excellence, we would have to do it ourselves," Young said.
Young branded the business Dunamis Pre-

mium Spirits. Dunamis is a Greek word for "the highest level of excellence." Dunamis launched in 2020. The Covid-19 pandemic delayed the move into operational status but by February of 2022, Young and Dunamis were back at it. In fact, they already have a production facility established at 3885 Correia Dr., near the airport.

It is not open to the public yet but on Nov. 1, the production facility will open as a tasting

Nature Coast Chapter of the Florida Native Plant Society

The plant society meeting is Sept. 13, 7 p.m. at the Land O' Lakes Heritage Park Community Center, 5401 Land O' Lakes

The subject will be Native Ferns of West Central Florida, presented by James Stevenson, an extension specialist with the University of Florida IFAS Extension Services in Pinellas County.

Ferns, which reproduce by spores, are the second-most diverse group of vascular plants on earth and one of the oldest groups of plants, with a fossil record dating to nearly 400 million years ago. Their size range from over 60 feet tall to tiny plants, millimeters in size. During this presentation Stevenson will explore the fascinating world of these ancient plants, study the natural history of ferns and get identification tips plus interesting

Stevenson works out of the Brooker Creek Preserve Environmental Education Center in Tarpon Springs. There he teaches classes on a variety of natural resource conservation topics, including: plant identification, botany, entomology, ecology and particular groups of native plants such as ferns, wetland wildflowers and epiphytes.



havoc. After gaining the Falcon 34-yard line, a bad handoff gave it right back to the Falcon of-

Into the second quarter, a string of penalties killed the ensuing Falcon drive. Finally, the Pirates would break through. Balmir, suffering from stomach cramps and intermittently coming off to the sideline to try and purge his stomach, ripped off a 21-yard run using a spin move and trucking one defender. Miles, lining up at wildcat quarterback, ran it in from nine yards out for the first score of the game. The point after made it 7-0 Pirates with 4:53 left in the half.

Another big defensive stop, this time from Johnson, shut down yet another Falcon drive before the half. The Falcon offense gained just one first down in the entire first half and only one of their five possessions resulted in positive yardage.

The Pirates pounced in the second half. After another Johnson pass deflection and a quarterback sack, the Falcons gave it back to the Pirates, turning it over on downs. Balmir began to take over the game. Runs of 20, 2, 9 and 3 setup the Pirates at the Falcon five-yard line where Jalandis Smith punched it in. The point after made it 14-0 Pirates with 7:46 left in the third quarter.

Opportunity knocked again as a tackle-forloss by Tyreese Grose and a sack by Pratt, together with a shanked Fivay punt, setup the Pirates at the 15-yard line. It would take until fourth down but Balmir would punch it in from five yards out. The missed extra point made it 20-0 with 9:28 left to play.

The Falcons shot themselves in the foot on their ensuing offensive drive. They managed to setup a 4th-and-1 at the Pirate 31-yard line but committed a false start penalty. They threw incomplete on fourth down and gave it back to the Pirates. The Pirates put together a decent drive but a 45-yard field goal attempt fell far short of the crossbar. The Pirate defense would deliver the coup-de-grace on Fivay's next offen-

sive play.

"We've been studying film and I knew the wheel route was coming," Miles said. "They finally ran it and I was ready for it."

Miles cut in front of the Fivay running back

and picked the ball off at the 25-yard line to effectively end the game. The Pirate offense and Balmir were not finished. After ripping off a 16-yarder, the Pirates went into hurry up offense and a handoff to Balmir saw him crash into the end zone from two yards out. That point after made it 27-0.

The Pirate defense wanted the shutout. They could smell it in the air. They forced a punt on three plays, thus preserved the goose egg on the scoreboard.

"We put kids in positions to make plays tonight," Pirate head coach Alphonso Freeney

The Pirates were dominant in the win and improved to 2-0. The Falcons were without starting running back Ty Wilson - out with a knee injury but otherwise could get nothing established on offense. Pratt would tally a tackle--loss, a fumble recovery and a sack. Johnsor had two passes defended and a tackle-for-loss. Balmir finished with 180 yards and two touchdowns on 18 carries.

"We were feeling it tonight," Balmir said. "All the hard work in practice started to pay off."

Matos completed just four passes for 56 yards and rushed for 41 but his poise in the pocket and in spite of the slippery football, kept the Pirates in possession of the football.

'We have great coaches, weapons, good running back - everything we need is right here," Matos said. "It's all coming together."

Freeney was particularly proud of the way Balmir and his offensive line took over the game in the second half.

There was a point in the second half when we had all sophomores on the offensive line


and they got it rolling," Freeney said.

MOMENTS IN TIME

The History Channel

- On Sept. 8, 1965, the five-year Delano Grape Strike begins as over 2,000 Filipino American farmworkers refuse to go to work picking grapes near Bakersfield, California. Over the next five years, even American households stopped buying grapes in support of the farmworkers.
- On Sept. 9, 1942, in the first and only air attack on the U.S. mainland during World War II, a Japanese floatplane drops incendiary bombs on Oregon's Mount Emily, setting fire to a state forest. The president immediately called for a news blackout for the sake of morale.
- On Sept. 10, 1897, a 25-year-old London taxi driver named George Smith becomes the first person ever arrested for drunk driving. A true breath test didn't come along until 1931 with a device called the Drunkometer. It involved a blow-up balloon and a tube filled with a purple fluid (potassium permanganate and sulfuric acid). Alcohol on a person's breath changed the color of the fluid from purple to yellow; the quicker the change, the drunker the person.
- On Sept. 11, 1857, Mormon guerrillas, stoked by a deep resentment of decades of public abuse and federal interference, murder 120 emigrants at Mountain Meadows, Utah. The conflict apparently began when the Mormons refused to sell the emigrants any supplies.
- On Sept. 12, 1846, Elizabeth Barrett elopes with Robert Browning. Despite her father's dislike of Browning, calling him an unreliable fortune hunter, Elizabeth and Robert conducted a secret courtship. After a secret wedding at St. Marylebone Parish Church, the two moved to Italy, where Elizabeth's former weak health improved dramatically.
- On Sept. 13, 1963, Texas-born entrepreneur Mary Kay Ash launches a cosmetic company in Dallas. Mary Kay Inc. would become a cosmetic empire with revenue of more than \$3.5 billion and salespeople in dozens of countries. Mary Kay became renowned for an award system designed for women, including mink coats, diamond rings and pink Cadillacs.
- On Sept. 14, 1901, U.S. President William McKinley dies after being shot in Buffalo, New York. When McKinley was operated on, doctors had failed to find the bullet, and gangrene soon spread throughout his body.



With so many potential threats lurking, cooks must be especially vigilant when preparing meals at home. These strategies can make cooking in the kitchen more safe.

· Keep a watch on foods, as walking away from something cooking on the stove or going outside while the oven is on is risky. Do not leave cooking food unattended for an extended period of time. It only takes a minute for something to catch on fire.

• Keep flammable items away from open

flames. Wear short or close-fitting sleeves when cooking, as loose clothing can catch fire. Make sure curtains, pot holders and towels are away from hot surfaces. • Remember that hot items remain hot

for some time. Use oven mitts or pot holders when handling hot cookware.

• Sharpen knives, as sharp knives cut more easily, thus reducing risk for injuries.

• Clean cooking surfaces to prevent the buildup of grease, which can catch fire.

• Turn pan and pot handles inward on stoves or counters to prevent food spills.

 Always defrost foods in the microwave or overnight in the refrigerator to reduce the chances that pathogens may develop

 Prepare raw meats, poultry and seafood away from fresh produce to avoid cross-contamination. Utilize separate cutting boards and knives, and use warm, soapy water to wash away bacteria from surfaces.

• Wash hands before and after handling

• Keep pets and children out of the kitchen or away from any in-use appliances, including outdoor grills.

• Invest in a food thermometer to ensure that food is properly cooked to the right tem-

perature to reduce risk of foodborne illnesses. Kitchens are popular gathering spaces, and various measures can make home cook-





Bulldogs even their record with decisive win and now hit the road to take on rival Wiregrass Ranch

Despite a delay of more than two hours due to lightning and thunderstorms, returning to friendly confines appears to be just what the Zephyrhills High football team needed. The host Bulldogs defeated the Villages Charter 32-15 last Friday night at Tom Fisher Field to even their record at 1-1.

"It's a great start," coach Nick Carroll said. "We're back on the winning train."

Zephyrhills, which lost the opener at Lake Wales, hits the road again with Friday night's game at Sunshine Athletic Conference rival Wiregrass Ranch. The Bulldogs have made the playoffs in seven of the past eight seasons while

the Bulls are on a current run of seven consecutive postseason berths.

"We are back and we have to play like a champion against Wiregrass," Carroll said.

The Bulldogs had two good things going for them against the Villages — a strong running game emerged and they won the turnover

Having lost a combination of six fumbles and interceptions against Lakes Wales, Zephyrhills reversed course by taking away the football three times against the Buffalo. Tristan Lennon recovered an onside kick to start the game and safety Maddox Rivera had two interceptions.

"He was just kind of staring down his receivers and I was able to read it," Rivera said of his picks of two Danny Bitting pass attempts.

Rivera also contributed on offense by rushing for 45 yards and a touchdown. Backfield mate Rodney Smith gained a game-high 137 yards with two scoring runs. Quarterback Brendyn Colella led the balanced attack by scrambling for 52 yards and passing for 151 yards

with touchdown passes to D.J. Pickett (49 yards) and Ben Raines (24 yards).

"You've got to be aggressive enough to still be able to throw the ball to keep teams honest, but you've got to be able to run the ball to get (to the end zone) too," Carroll said.

It didn't take long for Zephyrhills to get on

the scoreboard. Lennon recovered an onside kick to start the game and five plays later Smith ran the ball into the end zone from six yards

After Alvon Isaac's 5-yard touchdown run for the Villages, the Bulldogs went ahead 20-7 at halftime on Smith's second scoring run, this one a 19-yarder, and Pickett caught a 49-yard touchdown pass from Colella. The lanky wide receiver jumped higher than two defenders then cur from near the right sideline across the field and beat them to the end zone.

In the second half, Rivera plunged into the

end zone from a yard out and Colella connected with Raines for his second touchdown pass of the game.

The Villages added one more score in the second half, a touchdown pass from Bitting to

As for Zephyrhills' next opponent, Wiregrass Ranch, which had lost to Manatee on the road, came home and evened its record at 1-1 with a 19-0 shutout of nearby rival Wesley Chapel. The Bulls built a 12-0 halftime lead and cruised to an easy victory.

Just like the Zephyrhills offense, Wiregrass

Ranch displayed a balanced attack.

Quarterback Elijah Brown completed 9 of 19 passes for 156 yards with a touchdown and an interception. Davion Brown gained a teamhigh 77 yards and ran for two scores while Bryson Rodgers, a highly touted recruit who has committed to Ohio State, had six catches for 93 yards and a touchdown.

Defensively, linebacker Matt Hensley Jr. had a team-leading eight tackles with two sacks. Jeremy Caruso exceled on special teams by combing for 249 yards on kickoff and punt

The 9/11 Memorial

Among the more indelible images to emerge on September 11, 2001 was the sight of two planes crashing into the North and South Towers of the World Trade Center. Still photos and video footage of those planes flying into the Twin Towers were the first images of the attacks many Americans saw, and no one who watched events unfold that morning will ever forget those images.

Though both the North and South Tow-

Though both the North and South Towers fell on that day, today the site where each tower once stood is a serene retreat in the bustling lower Manhattan neighborhood that was

shaken to its core on the day of the attacks. The 9/11 Memorial was designed by architect Michael Arad and landscape architect Peter Walker. The 9/11 Memorial and Museum notes that Arad and Walker's proposal was chosen in a design competition that featured 5,201 submissions from 63 countries.

The 9/11 Memorial is located on the western side of the formal World Trade Center where the Twin Towers once stood. Two enormous reflecting pools are part of the Memorial Plaza, which is where the North and South Towers once stood. The pools feature the two largest man-made waterfalls in North America. Around the edges of the pools, the names of people who were killed in the 9/11 attacks in New York, the Pentagon, on Flight 93, and in the 1993 bombing at the World Trade Center are etched in bronze.





room from Thursday to Sunday, 12-7 p.m. If the airport is too far of a hike, Dunamis is already getting into the former Suntrust Bank building at 5435 Gall Blvd. That facility won't be ready until November of 2023 but when it is, it's going to be one of the swanki-

est places in town.

The new facility will boast full tours. Patrons sitting at the bar will have full view of the lab, the production space, bottling and canning of spirits. The large bar will seat 30 people. There will also be a 32-seat area for people to relax after tours and sample flights of distilled liquor. An event space will be built upstairs that can accommodate 150 people and be rented out for used lines postions conserved and the liles.

weddings, parties, corporate events and the like. A small VIP space that accommodates 25 people can also be rented out for smaller, private events. Bourbon and whiskey are Dunamis's specialties. They also make what are called, "white" spirits - vodkas, rums, gins but the carmel color in bourbon and honey color of whiskey take time; at least three years, to be precise. To quali-fy as a bourbon, a spirit must have a 51 percent

corn mash and it must be aged in virgin white oak, charred barrels for no less than three years. While the white spirits are readily available the bourbons and whiskeys take time and there's no way to shortcut the process.

"We want to have something everyone can buy off the shelf and then we want to have some

things that you only bring down off the shelf for special occasions," Young said.

It doesn't stop at spirits, either. Dunamis will have a handsome cigar room with renowned cigar manufacturers JC Newman and Arturo Fuente. They have actually helped Young design the humidor that will be in the new facility. There will also be a retail store where customers can purchase spirits, torches, cigar cutters and the like. Additionally, Dunamis is interested in partnering with other groups and individuals that, like Dunamis, strive for excellence. Young stated that Dunamis would be interested in sponsorships, event hosting and other types of partnerships with excellence in the commu-

Can't wait to go? You'll have to wait at least until Nov. 1. The tasting room by the airport will be ready by then. It's okay. You can't rush a good

thing.

"When aging a spirit, you can't do anything to change time," Young said.
