
This is a brief history of Israel from Adam to David, culminating with David commissioning the temple of God in Jerusalem.

TEACHER: 1 CHRONICLES 29 CHAPTERS, 2 CHRONICLES 36 CHAPTERS

On the surface 1 & 2 Chronicles seems like a re-hash of Samuel and Kings. They cover almost the same time period with 1st Samuel starting earlier than 1 Chronicles (just over 50 years) not including the genealogy, and 2nd Chronicles ending with 2nd Kings, with the Book of Ezra taking over historically from there. Chronicles is 1 book until the Septuagint translators divided it into 2 books several hundred years before Christ. Many suppose 1st & 2nd Chronicles originally was a Judaic version of Samuel and Kings for the southern tribes of Judah, because they focus on the Kings of Judah, and the Davidic line, only mentioning Israel when it has to for historical necessity. When running down the list of Kings, Chronicles is much kinder to the legacies of the Kings. Usually omitting the sins that plagued them. Also I should mention the books of Samuel and Kings were written before the Exile, and Chronicles 2 books were written after the exile was over. The 1st 9 chapters of 1st Chronicles covers the genealogy of Adam to the Israelites beyond King David's generation, of all 12 tribes.


STUDENT:

Adam was the father of Seth. Seth was the father of Enosh. Enosh was the father of Kenan. ² Kenan was the father of Mahalalel. Mahalalel was the father of Jared. Jared was the father of Enoch. ³ Enoch was the father of Methuselah. Methuselah was the father of Lamech, and Lamech was the father of Noah.

⁴The sons of Noah were Shem, Ham, and Japheth. (NCV)

TEACHER: In case you are curious where you come from, the following is called "The Table of Nations." It has been diagramed here from the books of Genesis and Chronicles. Next time you are on the internet, search out the names in the diagram below. The amount of information on them is staggering.

Japheth. Also *Diphath*. Literal meanings are *opened*, *enlarged*, *fair or light*(Father of the Caucasoid/Indo-Europoid, Indo-European, Indo-Germanic, or Indo-Aryan people groups

- *Japhethites*).

Ham. Also *Cham or Kham.* Literal meanings are *passionate, hot, burnt or dark* (father of the Australoid, Mongoloid and Negroid people groups - *Hamites*).

Shem. Also Sem. Literal meanings are named or renown (father of the Semitic people groups - Shemites).

STUDENT

The people of Judah were captured and forced to go to Babylon, because they were not faithful to God. ² The first people to come back and live in their own lands and towns were some Israelites, priests, Levites, and Temple servants.

³ People from the tribes of Judah, Benjamin, Ephraim, and Manasseh lived in Jerusalem. (NCV)

TEACHER:

After clarifying and updating the genealogy of the remaining people to return, chapter 10 starts the re-cap of the earlier history books. History has been kind. As the years have passed, the memories, coupled with hindsight, reveal how the Kings now are thought of with less judgement. God had a plan, and everyone was complicit in the need for God's judgement. Below is the chart paralleling 1 Chronicles with the coinciding history books.

2 Chronicles

David's son Solomon builds the temple, but after centuries of rejecting God, the Babylonians take the southern Israelites captive and destroy the temple. **Author:** Most likely Ezra

In 2 Chronicles – Jesus is the King who reigns eternally

2 Chronicles 15:2 "The LORD is with you when you are with Him."

2 Chronicles 14:7 For he said to Judah, "Let us build these cities and surround them with walls and towers, gates and bars. The land is still ours because we have sought the Lord our God; we have sought Him, and He has given us rest on every side." So they built and prospered.

TEACHER:

CH. 1

CH. 4

2 Chronicles starts with the reign of King Solomon, and the building of the Temple in Jerusalem, and ends with the Decree of King Cyrus of Persia in 538 B.C. which allowed the people of Judah to return and rebuild Jerusalem.

STUDENT: Solomon's position with God

Solomon, David's son, became a powerful king, because the LORD his God was with him and made him very great. (NCV)

STUDENT: Solomon's wealth

¹⁴ Solomon had fourteen hundred chariots and twelve thousand horses. He kept some in special cities for the chariots, and others he kept with him in Jerusalem. ¹⁵ In Jerusalem Solomon made silver and gold as plentiful as stones and cedar trees as plentiful as the fig trees on the western hills. ¹⁶ He imported horses from Egypt and Kue; his traders bought them in Kue. ¹⁷ They imported chariots from Egypt for about fifteen pounds of silver apiece, and horses cost nearly four pounds of silver apiece. (NCV)

STUDENT: Solomon's commitment

⁵ "The temple I build will be great, because our God is greater than all gods. ⁶ But no one can really build a house for our God. Not even the highest of heavens can hold him. How then can I build a temple for him except as a place to burn sacrifices to him? (NCV)

CH. 5 STUDENT: Solomon finishes the Temple

Finally all the work Solomon did for the Temple of the LORD was finished. He brought in everything his father David had set apart for the Temple—all the silver and gold and other articles. And he put everything in the treasuries of God's Temple. (NCV)


STUDENT: God accepts the Temple and rests on the Ark

Then the Temple of the LORD was filled with a cloud. ¹⁴ The priests could not continue their work because of the cloud, because the LORD's glory filled the Temple of God. (NCV)

Nearing the end of the Old Testament timeline, Cyrus issues an important, historic decree.

CH. 36

STUDENT:

²²In the first year Cyrus was king of Persia, the LORD had Cyrus send an announcement to his whole kingdom. This happened so the LORD's message spoken by Jeremiah would come true. He wrote:

²³This is what Cyrus king of Persia says:

The LORD, the God of heaven, has given me all the kingdoms of the earth, and he has appointed me to build a Temple for him at Jerusalem in Judah. Now may the LORD your God be with all of you who are his people. You are free to go to Jerusalem. (NCV)
