♦ BIBLE CAKE recipe - All you need is a bit of culinary skill and the Authorised version of the Bible.

♦ INGREDIENTS

- * 1. 6oz. Judges chapter 5 v 25
- * 2. 6oz Jeremiah ch. 6 v 20
- * 3. 4 of Jeremiah ch 17 v 11
- * 4. 8oz 1 Samuel ch 30 v 12
- * 5. 8oz Nahum ch 3 v 12 (chopped)
- * 6. 2oz Numbers ch 17 v 8 (blanched & chopped)
- * 7. 10oz 1 Kings ch 4 v 22
- * 8. 1 teaspoon 2 Chronicles ch 9 v 9
- * 9. A pinch of Leviticus ch 2 v 13
- * 10. Half teaspoon of Amos ch 4 v 5. (Interpret as baking powder)
- * 7,8,9 & 10 Sieve together



♦ METHOD 1 & 2 cream together. Add 3 one at a time beating , add 4, 5 & 6 still beating the mixture together. Add 7, 8, 9 and 10 mixing everything together.

* Use a 7" cake tin. Bake in a slow oven for 2 hours. 1 hour 150oC 300oF or gas 2. Then 1 hour 140oC 275oF or gas 2. Cover for the last hour or until cooked.
