It is now sometime since I made a contribution to Gathered Together. It is hard to believe that 5 months of 2007 has almost gone.

The WesleyVale Community Church recently celebrated its 98th Knife and Fork Tea – approximately 200 folk sharing in the meal. As usual, there was a wonderful group of helpers on the day and we thank God for the energy required and his blessing on this special occasion each year – God willing, we will reach 100!

Members continue to enjoy each others company, meeting for worship and fellowship. Visitors are always made most welcome and usually able to share in a cuppa after the service.

On April 15th the church hosted the Ecumenical Service for the churches of Port Sorell and WesleyVale and enjoyed a meal together after the service. Three such services are held each year at different locations within the community – each denomination has a part to play in the service. This is a wonderful opportunity to meet together to encourage each other and share our joys and concerns.

Many of our ladies continue to knit bandages for Leprosy Mission – also baby clothes, warm hats, etc. and very soon will be busy packing shoe boxes again.

We are very blessed to have the support of Rev'd Graham Clarke, a retired Wesleyan Minister, who takes 2 services per month for us, including Holy Communion. Lay preachers fill the remaining Sundays — representatives from Gideons, Compassion, Bible Society, City Mission School and Hospital Chaplaincy and Parakelio (suicide prevention), just to name a few, visit on a regular basis. As a church we have been able to assist these groups as part of our local Mission Work.

The local C.W.A. recently held its yearly church service at WesleyVale Community Church. During the service Mrs. Leslie Young – the National President of C.W.A. spoke about some of the work undertaken by C.W.A. – particularly drought relief. Mrs. Young is the wife of a local farmer and through her the church has been able to give some financial assistance to those in need.

Just recently we invited Fusion Ministries to be involved in a church service which led to our church, together with other denominations within the community, becoming involved in a festival (a family fun time) at Latrobe – a small town about a 10 minute drive from WesleyVale. The idea of the festival was to show God's unconditional love to the community and focus on families doing things together. Some of the activities included face painting, tug of war, water volleyball and a wind tunnel. It was really great to see 2nd and 3rd generations joining together and having fun.

The Master of Ceremonies for the day gave a short message, at intervals, about Simpson and his donkey, the sunflower seed and the story of Granny Smith. Pamphlets including these stories were handed out to those attending. A young married couple, Greg and Kathy, continue to work in the area as a part of Fusion's 5 year plan for the North West Coast of Tasmania.

Where Do We Go From Here?

Two years ago when we produced the first *Gathered Together*, we believed there was a significant role for such a newsletter as fledgling congregations and groups were finding their feet after making a break from the spiritual homes they had known.

The response to *Gathered Together* reinforced this opinion and we felt God had shown us one small way we could serve Him.

The stories and ideas shared by different groups were varied, interesting, encouraging and showed God at work through His people in ways appropriate for the people involved.

Initially it seemed that many of the groups that had acted in faith to start something new were at something of a loose end, unsure of what the future held. This was not a source of concern as God was leading the way, but rather just left them feeling a little isolated.

Since that time it has become evident that most groups have established links in their communities and with other churches or denominations. The sense of isolation that once existed has diminished.

While we are confident *Gathered Together* met a need and came about as a response to God's leading, we are no longer convinced that it is as useful as it was. God wants us to work for Him, but once that work is done, we don't believe he requires us to continue with it just to keep it going. He has other work for us to do.

Contributions to *Gathered Together* have become less frequent and so, unless it becomes clear that our perception and conclusions are wrong, we don't intend to continue to produce *Gathered Together*.

If your group believes there is still a place for *Gathered Together* (perhaps less frequent or with a modified role), please let us know and send us something we can print and share with others. If you believe *Gathered Together* has run its course, again we would be pleased to know your opinion.

Depending on responses, this may be the last or second last issue.

God has taken us all on a special journey of discovery and faith with Himself. It will be interesting to see where He takes us from here.
