Over the last couple of months I have worshipped with a good number of different congregations from several different denominational backgrounds. Instead of just knowing that the Church embraces people all around the world, I feel God has given that intellectual knowledge of mine a reality by showing me a little of what He is doing in Canberra through some of the many congregations of His people.


While I have been blessed by visiting a number of congregations, I believe God wants me to be part of one Church family and that He will lead me to where He wants me.
