

Instrument for Noble Purposes 27th August, 2006, Rev. Kevin Kim

A new minister, Rev. Kevin Kim, has recently come to the Canberra Korean Uniting Church and he was our guest preacher on 27th August. Kevin likes to "bring a song" to congregations he visits and so he sang "*He Touched Me*" for us. The Korean choir also attended and their music made a wonderful contribution to our service as well.



Kevin began his sermon with a story of 3 trees that dreamed of the great things their wood would be used for: valuable, finely made pieces of furniture; strong and reliable timbers for great ships; and strong materials used in important structures. One tree was used for furniture, but only as a humble manger animals ate from; one was fashioned into a simple fishermen's boat; and one became roughly hewn logs for use as needed. The trees would have been disappointed, yet they were used in ways that gave each of them an important role: the baby Jesus was placed in the manger; Jesus and His disciples used the boat as they fished and as they travelled across Lake Gallilee; and the logs became the cross on which Jesus was crucified.

What do you want to be in God's plan? People want to be used by God dramatically, but it is not our decision. It is totally God's decision how He will use us. We are His instruments.

God uses those who are near to Him. We should seek to come as close to God as we can. As we become closer to God, we will become more useful to Him and be used more by Him.

God prefers clean vessels. Just as we like to use clean plates for our food, God wants us to be clean for His use. We should cleanse ourselves, asking God for His forgiveness for those things that dirty our lives.

God requires empty vessels. If we are filled with our earthly baggage, there will be no room for the Spirit to fill us with the things of God. We need to be available.

We need to 'Let God be God' and recognise our place as His people.

Rocket Balloon

Children's Talk 20-8-2006 - Rev. Ray Hughes

<u>Goal</u>

To hit a target with a balloon

Experiment 1

What you need:

Balloon

- Blow up the balloon
- Aim the balloon at the target
- Let go of the balloon
- See where it goes

Observation

Most of the time the balloon misses the target.

Conclusion

The balloon is a good engine but it needs a guidance system to make it go to the target.

Experiment 2

What you need:

Balloon

Long string

Straw

Sticky tape

- Put the string through the straw
- Take the string from the launch site to the target and hold tightly
- Blow up the balloon
- Sticky tape the balloon securely to the straw so it is aimed at the target
- Let go of the balloon
- See where it goes

Observation

The balloon follows the string to the target.

Conclusion

The straw and string guide the balloon along.

Rev. Hughes did the experiment with just the balloon and was surprised because it hit the pulpit (the target) and he didn't expect it to. He told us that it usually misses. The balloon did actually do a couple of loop the loops before it hit.

Next he got the string and we took it across the front of the church. When he let go of the balloon that was stuck to the straw on the string, the balloon went across the church following the string.

Rev. Hughes explained that to make things go the way they should, they need something to help them go the right way. The balloon had a string that guided it.

We have something that helps us live the right way. The Bible helps us know the way God wants us to live.
