




Canberra Christian Fellowship (in the Methodist Tradition)




This year the carols attracted a crowd we estimated at 320 - 330. It was a joy to have so many come to remember and celebrate Jesus' birth.


Unfortunately our Tongan friends were unable to come at the last minute and their attempts to let us know failed. We will catch up with them early next year.


