Sunday, 2nd February – Mr. Trevor Monson & Mr. Michael Bevan (Gideons)




We were pleased to have Trevor Monson, Michael Bevan and their wives visit us to tell us more of the work of Gideons International.

Scriptures have been distributed in Nepal and the number of Christians in that country has increased greatly over the last 50 years.

Trevor spoke about Camp visits which are intended to educate and encourage Gideon camps in various parts of the world. A Gideon member will visit a camp, have fellowship with the local Gideons and work with them to ensure that camp members know how to best go about distribution and that Scriptures are distributed effectively.

Just days later he collapsed and was diagnosed with cancer.


His move to Darwin had to be abandoned and he has been receiving treatment for his cancer ever since.

Sunday, 16th February – Mr. Zane Edwards – From Sight to Insight

Sometimes things don't seem to make a lot of sense to us. Why are some people rich and others poor? Why do many things seem unfair and many good people find themselves in poor circumstances? It just doesn't seem right.

We believe in a good God, but live in a bad world. We need to look around with spiritual, not human eyes.

• 1 Corinthians 13: 10-12 explains that our current view of things is limited. We don't see the full picture. We don't see as God sees.

- Matthew 5: 43-45 tells us that God "causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous." There isn't a link between goodness and good fortune.
- When we read Psalm 73: 3,4,12,16,17 we can recognise our human thinking but also see beyond that and understand that everyone's true rewards are not what we have in the present but instead they are waiting for us in eternity.
- Life is not all about possessions as is explained in Luke 12: 15.
