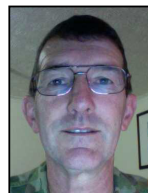

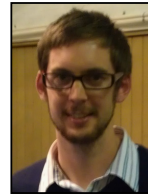

## Extracts from "The Purdey Pages", April 2014

(Ian is an MAF pilot we have supported. He, with wife Adele and their 2 boys, is stationed at Elcho Island, Arnhem Land)

### **Six Months in Arnhem Land!**

Yes six months already! With the move up here in September, the move to Elcho in December and all of this over the six hottest, stickiest months of the tropical year we decided to take a short break, or rather whirlwind tour, of Adelaide via Cairns in early March. We caught up with family and a few friends, went to our home church and were excited to meet our two newest nephews, born exactly the same day and conveniently the day before we arrived! Six months also means check flights and checks with the Chief Pilot to assess Ian's progress, both of which he has recently completed with encouraging results. ...

### **Homeland Outreaches and Easter MicroSD Cards**

In early January Ian and a fellow Elcho pilot were privileged to fly some Yolngu Christians from the homeland of Gawa on Elcho Island to that of Baniyala, 150km southeast. The two pilots attended the evening rally which went late into the night with worship, dances and a message of the Glory of God. In total, outreaches were run to 9 different homelands over the Christmas period, with invitations from all of them for more visits.

... a special Easter MicroSD Card has been produced by MAF Information Technology Services for distribution in the remote communities of east Arnhem Land. These cards for mobile phones include the Easter story, other Bible stories, testimonies by Yolngu Christians, Easter videos and pictures, both in local language and in English. ...



### **Life at Galiwin'ku, Elcho Island**

Life at Galiwin'ku, the main community on Elcho Island, is settling into somewhat of a routine. We are going along to the local church on Sunday mornings and it's encouraging to see this run and led by the Yolngu. ...

We've also started going to a Bible Study group for non-Indigenous workers in the community. .... The focus has been on learning to remember and retell Bible passages as stories, especially relevant to life here as the Yolngu culture is traditionally an oral one. ...

## Sunday, 4th May – Rev. Ron Reeson – Doubt and the Emmaus road

A minister who emerged from a rocky period in his ministry caused by doubt observed "No one was seeing that doubt can be a path to Christian faith."

Doubt can arise from intellectual struggles, tiredness, emotional stimulus and numerous other things. Many biblical and more modern day people have had periods of doubt including Jeremiah, Job, Thomas the Apostle, Francis of Assisi and C.S.Lewis.

- Often when doubts grow, the doubter hasn't waited long enough to discover the truth. The men travelling to Emmaus had left Jerusalem having heard reports of Jesus having risen, but had not stayed long enough to satisfy themselves if those reports were true.
- Listening to others can ease doubts. If the Emmaus men had paid more attention to what the women had said, they would most likely have been less uncertain on their trip home. For us, listening to the faith story of others can boost our faith and lessen doubts.
- Doubts can persist when people fail to investigate the truth of a matter for themselves. Truth bears investigation.
- Turning to Scripture when battling doubts relating to faith helps resolve those doubts. We should approach Scripture with an open, humble and ready spirit, letting it bring its message to us.



God can come to us through and in our doubts.

## Lea Nelson's book

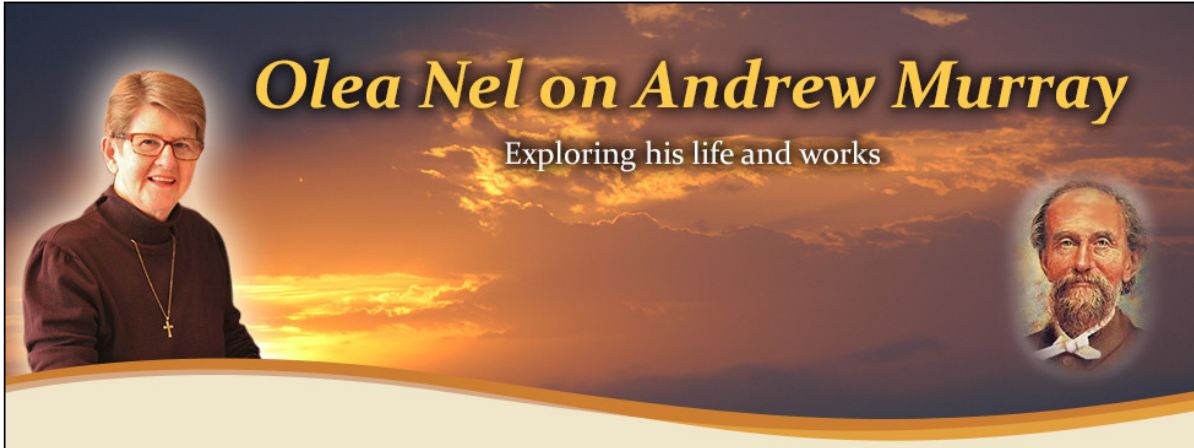

We closed with prayer.



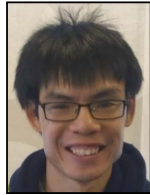
