

<u>Hell</u>

Sunday, 7th June – Mrs. Joyce Hall – The Choice

Hell tends to be an unfashionable subject for sermons, yet Joyce felt she was being led to that topic for tonight, despite her own preference to preach on something else.

Hell exists but what do we know about it? We have a picture of chaff (Matthew 3: 12) or unproductive fruit trees (Matthew 3: 10 & Luke 3: 9) being thrown into a fire. Another picture is of a place of darkness and weeping and gnashing of teeth



(Matthew 8: 12). Revelations 20 talks about an abyss (v3), a place of torment and a lake of burning sulphur (v10,15). Our understanding of hell may be sketchy but it is certainly an exceedingly unpleasant place, a place of eternal torment.

Jesus doesn't want anyone to go there. It is a place for the Devil and his angels. Jesus has done all that is necessary to save us from hell but too many people are still heading there.

Joyce retold the story of a lady who had been going through some very difficult times. Things were so tough that death almost looked appealing - it would release her from all her worries. The Devil is a deceiver and the father of lies. The peace she imagined would accompany death is a deception. Unless Jesus took her through death, she would enter hell where her misery would be multiplied and remain with her for eternity.

God is love and we can either obey Him or obey the Devil. Jesus has power over death and life. Jesus has the power to change us and show us how to live. Jesus gives us faith, hope and love, he can change distress to joy and instead of dispair the Holy Spirit works within us. The lady faced a choice between Jesus and abundant life or the Devil and his lies.

The Bible talks about hell on occasions but it more importantly tells us the way to avoid hell and receive a far better outcome. - "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him." [John 3: 16,17], "Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved." [Acts 4: 12], "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God" [Ephesians 2: 8].

Hell exists but we do not have to go there.

Sunday, 14th June – Pastor Steve Prior – A spiritual battle in a material world



We got two Steve's for the price of one on this Sunday. Steve Prior came to preach and Steve Lindner to talk about his chaplaincy at Campbell High.

Steve Lindner told us a little of what he does and the programmes he runs at the school. There is a lunchtime group that meets weekly that Steve Prior comes and helps lead.

Lil joined us for this service to tell us more about the work of Compassion, an organisation that helps children in need around the world by channelling assistance through local churches. She was able to tell us of her experience visiting aid projects, meeting children being helped and their families and seeing the way lives are being changed.

2 Corinthians 9: 6-15 encourages generosity and points to God's great generosity to us.

Lil also quoted Frederick Buechner who wrote "The life I touch for good or ill will touch another life, and in turn another, until who knows where the trembling stops or in what far place my touch will be felt."

Whatever we do may not seem much but it can produce amazing results. God is able!

Sunday, 5th July - Pastor Peter Nduati - Prayer

Peter previously visited us in 2008 and told us about his work with street boys in Nairobi, Kenya. This visit he updated us on that work.

There are large numbers of street kids in Nairobi (60,000), doing whatever they can to survive. They are often exploited by crime gangs who sell them drugs or use them as a cheap criminal labour force.



Peter and his co-workers try to assist boys living on the streets as best they can by providing detox, shelter, food, clothing, schooling and Christian family.

Immanuel Afrika (or I Afrika) (the organisation Peter directs) is able to assist only a small proportion of the street kids however it's work is obviously effective. Peter has been physically attacked by thugs upset that their activities have been disrupted when potential drug customers or gang members are instead helped by I Afrika.

Christmas is approaching and so it was time our Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes were dispatched so they would be ready for distribution. Norma gave us some facts and figures about the distribution of shoeboxes and shared an example of how God connects

shoeboxes and recipients. A boy in Cambodia was waiting for his box. Unfortunately the only box left was marked as for a younger girl. It was that box or nothing so it was given to him. He opened it and discovered a bottle of perfume among the contents (liquid, including perfume, in bottles is not meant to be included in a box). He began to cry. The onlookers thought it was caused by disappointment but soon discovered that it was joy. The boy explained he had never been able to give a present to his mother but now he could.

David McDonald dedicated the 84 shoeboxes, some of which were on display.



Before commencing

his sermon, David mentioned the Hay family who visited us some months ago to tell us about their proposed move to South Africa to work at Lily of the Valley caring for children abandoned or orphaned due to HIV/AIDS. The Hays have raised 100% of the one off funds they need but cannot make their move until they also have 100% of the continuing support they need. They currently only have 40%.

David preached on True Worship. Worship is not just getting together on Sundays to praise God. Instead we should absorb God's teaching and worship by living the life we learn about. As Christians we need each other. None of us are too insignificant to not be needed, nor are we too important. Each of us have gifts we should use for the common good. As scripture reminds us though, exercising our gifts without love is futile.



Zane has recently returned from a trip overseas. While in Paris he saw some of the works of French sculptor Auguste Rodin (1840-1917) including a large work "The Gates of Hell" that Rodin worked on for much of his life.

Atop The Gates, (the entrance to Hell) stand The Three Shades (the souls of the damned), pointing to an unequivocal inscription, "Abandon hope, all ye who enter here".

This prompted Zane to think more about hope. He shared with us seven thoughts arising from the question 'How can I have hope?'.

Ephesians 4: 1 "As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received."

Seek help from others.

Galatians 5:13 "You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in love."

Find good in all circumstances.

1 Thessalonians 5: 18 "give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."
