

































































Elsie

Margaret Buckley

Margaret Buckley was one of the group of people who made up our Fellowship when it first began and met in the Gospel Chapel. Eventually distance and transport difficulties meant she was no longer able to join with us.

Margaret grew up in Manly, Sydney. An early memory for her was of the Japanese mini submarines entering Sydney Harbour and the commotion they caused during the war.

Margaret started attending church during her teens and accepted Christ at a Billy Graham rally. She met and married Frank and they lived in rural towns in NSW as he worked as a Home Missionary.

They moved to Canberra in 1957 where their 3 children were born. Their family made Reid Methodist Church (later Reid Uniting Church) their

home church for approximately 40 years. Margaret opened their home up to the young people in the church, and especially enjoyed providing a great supper for

youth group evenings and Bible study events. Later Wattle Park Uniting Church became their home church after they moved from inner Canberra to Gungahlin.

Margaret loved her family life and that included their many pets – dogs, birds, guinea pigs, fish. She played tennis regularly at the church tennis courts in Reid, and loved music as long as it had a good beat.

She was generous hearted and supported a number of charitable organisations; the Leprosy Mission and indigenous programs being of particular importance to her.

Despite ongoing health concerns for herself and husband Frank, Margaret would say "God has it under control". A prayerful life brought Margaret much strength and solace throughout her life
