<u>Sunday 7th February - Mr. Revin Blanchard - Upside down ministry</u>

To someone observing our Fellowship, we may appear as an aging congregation and it is certainly true we have plenty of people who have racked up many years of experience during their lives, however on this Sunday we had a much more youthful aspect. Kelly, Sharon, Joanne and Nikki ran the service with Revin (from Crossroads Church) preaching. Joanne's children's talk (which only lacked children) focussed on the fruits of the spirit.



Using the reading Mark 9: 30-50, Revin began by mentioning a pastors' conference. What you might imagine to be a very good and harmonious environment can be a source of sin as pastors perhaps unconsciously compare their church with those of other pastors - 'My congregation is much larger', 'we are more active in the community', 'we attract more young people', 'I'm not getting as good results as them'. Pride, smugness or a feeling of inadequacy can result. As people we want to be great and receive recognition.

Jesus redefines greatness. He told His disciples "Anyone who wants to be first must be the very last, and the servant of all." [Mark 9: 35] Recognition for what you do is not His badge of greatness but servanthood.

Revin posed three questions.

Who should we minister to? - Everyone, especially the lowly.

Who should we minister with? - Jesus told his disciples "whoever is not against us is for us." [Mark 9: 40]. Ministry can take different forms and may be as simple as providing a glass of water. Ministry is not done to bring glory but to serve.

What makes quality ministry? - Our ministry should not lead others to sin, rather lead them to life and we ourselves should repent of our sin. Our ministry is not about us. We should all work together for the sake of the gospel.

We can choose between Cross-shaped ministry (serving others) and worldly, human ministry (recognition).

It was fascinating to hear of how God is using COMPASSION and local churches in the work of His Kingdom.





Alec






Many people have asked after Warren.
