Education Drop-Off (or Stay!) Program

Imagine Achievement is a homeschool enrichment program located on 20 acres in Summerfield, Florida, designed to nurture creativity, confidence, and whole-child growth. We serve children of all abilities—including preschool, elementary, middle, and high school learners—through project-based, STEAM-focused classes that integrate science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics with nature exploration and entrepreneurship. Our program offers flexible full-time and part-time schedules (1–5 days per week), as well as half-day options, afterschool “Night Owls,” and early morning “Early Birdies” sessions. Parents can stay or drop off. Our staff is trained to support special needs students. We accept community partnerships for ABA, Speech & OT therapies to push in. In addition to blended core & enrichment, we provide tutoring, social-emotional learning, and enrichment in art, music, gardening, cooking, and nature study. Families also have access to counseling and neurotherapy support onsite. We emphasize inclusion, supporting gifted students, neurodivergent learners (including ADHD and autism), and children with learning challenges. Short-term Camps, Workshops & Community Events are also provided. Our mission is to provide a safe & inspiring environment where all children can thrive academically, socially, and emotionally while developing real-world skills and a lifelong love of learning!

EXAMPLE THEME: Cultures of the World [Greek Culture]: Read Greek literature & learn about Mythology at developmental level (English), Draw the scene or character and provide a reaction sentence or paragraph (Art/English), learn about Greek Clothing and make and wear toga and Caesar crown of olive leaves (History/Art), Act out a play of the literature or invent a new ending/story with the characters (Theater), learn about health properties of olive oil and how it's made & make our own (Health/Science/Cooking), Learn about Mediterranean area geography, draw maps, and research foods that grow near Greece & field trip to a grocery store where we get ingredients & estimate costs (Math/Life Skills/Health/Science/Geography/Art). Cook and eat a Greek Style pizza, ideally with herbs/spinach/garlic we grew and olive oil we pressed (Cooking/History/Farming/Life skill/Collaboration/Health/Math), Write your name/paragraph/short story in Greek Letters (English/Art), Watch a video/research in a book about Greek Architecture & build structures out of 3 different materials (History/Math/Art/Engineering), Study Greek philosophers/philosophy/Ethics at developmental level, older kids write a persuasive or comparative essay (English/History/Philosophy), learn about Greek inventors & inventions, i.e., Pythagoras & Galen, and make Greek coins from clay (Science/Math/Art/History), Practice Greek Olympic games (PE), Musical instruments of the time (Music), Learn about & practice Government (Gov't/Team Building/History), Learn through videos, books, discussion and presentations (individual projects/research shared with the group) about Holidays, Cultural Norms, Foods, Timeline, Historical events, etc.

Many Cultures will be taught throughout the year in this manner. This would be only one topic in the day. A child attending our 10-3pm portion of the day would expect to have exposure to 4-5 topics daily, which are about 45 minutes each.
