Featured Fire: "The Great Chicago Fire"

Buildings destroyed: 17,500 buildings

Dates: Oct 8, 1871 – Oct 10, 1871

Location: Chicago, IL

Fatalities: 300 killed (estimated)

Burned area: 2,112 acres

Financial Damage: Over 200 million dollars

Many theories have been discussed throughout history about what started the Great Chicago Fire, however the most famous is Mrs. O Leary's cow. The story states that Mrs. O Leary lit a lantern in the barn the night of the fire, and the cow kicked over the lantern beginning the most destructive fire in Chicago.
