SOAR Class or Event Closing

Safety Plan

1. There will be a Welcome Desk attendant at the table near the doors throughout the school day.
2. The board and administrators will work with the instructors at the beginning of the year to ensure that they understand their roles in keeping students safe.
3. Planned safety precautions will be taken and procedures followed by instructors, the SOAR board, and administrators to ensure children are safe in the event of an emergency.

Lost and Found

SOAR is not responsible for any items left by students at any time.

Please remind your students not to leave items lying around in common areas, classrooms, or restrooms. Students are asked to keep track of their own stuff and put it in a safe place if they are not carrying it to class.

Please label all backpacks, books, coats, etc. with your family's name. Any items left at the end of each SOAR day will be placed in the SOAR lost and found box.

Any lost and found items at the end of the semester will be donated to One More Time in Isle.

Code of Conduct

This Code of conduct is based on seven premises:

1. Treatment of other people (fellow students/families, tutors, and staff) must always be respectful.
2. This facility and all property will not be abused.
3. Each student is responsible for attending class as SOAR is an open campus.
4. Each student is responsible for his/her own personal possessions.
5. Each student is accountable for his/her own actions.
6. Each student must use the restroom associated with their biological sex.
7. Each student's dress and actions should encourage others to Godliness.

Our expectation is that all actions, lifestyle, conversations, classroom references/discussion within the context of SOAR meetings and activities, be in accordance with the values supported by SOAR's Statement of Faith. While our hope is that these values are present in each home, we recognize that this may not always be the case. Thank you for being respectful of all SOAR families by adhering to these expectations.

Parent Expectations

1. All families must affirm the Statement of Faith and sign the Waiver & Release of Liability upon Membership Registration.
2. SOAR is an open campus and therefore, students and parents hold responsibility for the students' attendance on class days.
3. Parents are responsible for the safety of their children. SOAR is not responsible if students leave the SOAR premises without their parent or legal guardian.
4. Families are expected to arrive promptly so classes may start on time.
5. Prompt pick-up of your children after their classes have ended for the day is essential. SOAR is not a day care center.
6. Parents need to take full responsibility and have complete control of their children's behavior and safety.
7. All outside playtime must be supervised by the child's parent(s) if there is not a volunteer supervisor scheduled for the outside play area.
8. Your child must be scheduled in classes if they are at SOAR. Children cannot be at SOAR for more than 90 total minutes without a class (not counting lunch which is from 12:00 – 1:00). If your child has more than 90 minutes of unscheduled time during the SOAR day, you must be present and supervising them while in the building as we do not have someone to specifically watch children when they are not in class.
9. Parents must pay tuition on time as designated on the website and in the handbook.
10. Parents are required to be present with children in the Co-op group. Highschool classes do not require a parent to be present.
11. It is the parent's responsibility to ensure students complete and turn in the required homework assignments.
12. It is the responsibility of each family to ensure that they are in compliance with all Minnesota homeschooling laws. SOAR is just a supplementary resource to your at-home education.

13. Parents are to be respectful of teachers in the way teachers respect you and your children. We all love Jesus but need to retain a level of discipline and security for you and your children.

General Expectations

As a Christ-centered organization, SOAR is committed to respect the Bible and its teachings as the inerrant Word of God.

SOAR is committed to respect Isle Evangelical Free Church, whose facility we are renting. Staff, students, and families agree not to engage in any activities or promote any teachings that would bring scandal to God and His Word, SOAR and/or the Isle Evangelical Free Church.

Verbal Expectations

1. Bathroom humor and crude language (swearing/cussing) is not permitted.
2. Sexually or ethnically orientated jokes and comments or name-calling is prohibited.
3. Inappropriate gestures will not be tolerated.
4. Calling other people names other than their legal name is prohibited.

Classroom Expectations

Each instructor has the responsibility and authority to set behavioral expectations in order to maintain an educational setting that provides for effective learning without inappropriate disruption. In these individual settings, each student is to comply with each tutor's requirements with the understanding that there will be variances between classes. Students are expected to attend class. If absent, students/parents are asked to communicate with instructor/SOAR.

Lunchroom Expectations

1. Good Stewardship: Parents/Students/Families will clean up messes, throw away trash/recyclables in appropriate receptacles, and accept responsibility for their own personal possessions.
2. Tables should be wiped clean of any crumbs or liquid.
3. Food allergies may be present at SOAR. Parents will take responsibility for managing their child's allergies.
4. SOAR is an open campus. Students are free to eat lunch in the SOAR building or off campus at another establishment.
5. Gambling, with or without the use of money, is not allowed on the premises.

Dress Code

1. No spaghetti strap tank tops or strapless shirts. Shoulder straps should be at least 1 ½ inches wide.
2. Tops and bottoms must overlap so midriff skin is not exposed, even when sitting or raising arms.
3. Girls must wear bras; no straps showing.
4. Necklines should not be revealing.
5. Dress must be appropriate to the biological sex of student.

6. Clothing advertising tobacco, alcohol, or containing inappropriate sayings or graphics will not be allowed.
7. All lower body apparel must be no higher than mid-thigh.
8. No underwear showing. This includes, but is not limited to, boxers and bras.
9. No rips or tears in clothing that exposes underwear.
10. Make sure to bring weather appropriate clothing.
11. No yoga pants or leggings can be worn without a long top, dress or skirt that covers the backside. This does not apply to ages 8 years or under.

Bodily Contact

SOAR's goal is to keep all the students free from physical harassment of any kind.

1. No inappropriate physical display of affection
2. No inappropriate sexual touch
3. No rough housing wrestling, lifting, punching, kicking, bumping, tickling, etc.

Cell Phones/Technology

Cell phone use is not permitted during class time. If it is necessary for a child to carry a cell phone at SOAR, it needs to be out of sight at all times, except when on a break or during lunch.

Having a phone is a privilege. If rules are not adhered to, further action will be taken.

Physical Surroundings

Students will respect the physical surroundings of the Isle Evangelical Free Church building and landscape (tables, chairs, walls, carpet, grass, trees, parking lot, etc.)

Inside the Building

1. Students/families in the building must stay within the rented space.
2. Only the front door entrance is to be used by SOAR members. Side entrances are not to be used.
3. SOAR staff and instructors do not have the authority to give students permission to leave campus and neither will we keep track of whether or not your child is permitted by you to leave the campus and/or ride with another student. Parents are responsible for this.

Parents who are concerned about their student's whereabouts, safety, and behavior on campus are welcome to wait at SOAR.

Beverages

Water and clear liquids only in the building, except in lunch area.

Pets

No pets allowed.

Open Campus

SOAR is similar to a college experience with students arriving and departing for different classes during the day.

Parking Lot

1. No sitting in cars in the parking lot without adult supervision.
2. Only family groups are allowed in vehicles, no friend groups.
3. Be watchful of pedestrians when in parking lot.
4. There are student drivers arriving and departing from the SOAR open campus, so please be mindful.

Sports Equipment

No skateboards, rollerblades, rip sticks, scooters, or similar recreational toys allowed in the building or on the property.

Prohibited Substances and Weapons

1. Tobacco, drugs, alcohol, weapons, and fireworks are not allowed in the building or parking areas.
 - a. Weapon list includes, but is not limited to, jackknives, box-cutters, blades of any lengths, and any weapon that could or simulates the firing of a projectile including guns of any type and bow and arrows.
 - b. Any firearms/weapons required for extra-curricular activities outside of SOAR must be unloaded, cased, and locked inside of vehicle, preferably the trunk.
2. Anyone discovered with possession of any of these items during SOAR's hours of operation is subjected to immediate expulsion from SOAR for one semester without refund.

Discipline

God knows and SOAR knows that no one is perfect. SOAR students are not characterized by disobedience. The basis for discipline at SOAR is that we are all working towards a behavior that honors God, other people, and their possessions.

- There will be no tolerance for behavior, clothing, or possession that does not contribute to the seven premises on which this Code of Conduct is based.
- SOAR retains the right to discipline a person for involvement in a situation or possession of an item that has not been previously mentioned.
- The discipline procedure will depend on the perceived severity of the offense. While our goal and intention is to use the disciplinary policy for all situations, we recognize that a situation may arise that requires immediate expulsion of a student.
- In that event, SOAR reserves the right to expel a student immediately or on short notice with or without explanation or refund.

Process for Resolving Issues and Conduct Violations

First, an attempt to resolve an issue or code violation should be made between families before consulting the administrator. Email or text is not recommended. SOAR administration will ask if you first attempted to resolve the issue with the family and what steps were taken before intervening. If the administrator decides that there is a code violation, the following steps will ordinarily be taken:

1st Offense- Administrator will talk with families to see if the issue is resolved and mediate if necessary. If the 1st offense is violent in nature (either verbally or physically), it will be treated as a 2nd offense.

2nd Offense- Offending student and student's family will meet with the administrator- may include a suspension from SOAR for a period of time.

3rd Offense- Students will be expelled from SOAR. The offending student may be readmitted after a period of time at the discretion of the SOAR board.

Student Searches

As part of its commitment to fostering a safe and healthy learning environment at SOAR, students are prohibited from possessing weapons or contraband (such as but not limited to alcohol, illegal drugs, and smoking materials) on SOAR premises. All of the facilities, furniture, fixtures, computers, technology or other resources provided by SOAR for use by students while at SOAR, are not private, and may be searched by SOAR officials at any time without advance notice to a student. In addition, when SOAR has reasonable suspicion that a search may uncover a violation of law or of SOAR rules, SOAR reserves the right to search a student's person or personal possessions, including but not limited to a student's clothing, purse, backpack, book bags, electronic devices, packages, and vehicles on SOAR property.

Student Searches contd.

IN THE RARE EVENT that SOAR must do a search, SOAR will strive to ensure that any search is reasonable in scope and intrusiveness. In addition, where it is necessary to search a student's person, SOAR will consider the sex assigned at birth of the student when determining who will conduct the search and will arrange to have an observer present during the search. In some circumstances, SOAR may decide to contact law enforcement to conduct or assist in a search. If a search yields evidence that a student has violated a law or a SOAR rule, the student may be subject to discipline, up to and including dismissal from SOAR, and the evidence may be seized and, if appropriate, turned over to the police.

And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.”

wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. ²⁸ In the same way husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. ²⁹ For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as Christ does the church, ³⁰ because we are members of his body. ³¹ “Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and hold fast to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.” ³² This mystery is profound, and I am saying that it refers to Christ and the church. ³³ However, let each one of you love his wife as himself, and let the wife see that she respects her husband.

Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. ² “Honor your father and mother” (this is the first commandment with a promise), ³ “that it may go well with you and that you may live long in the land.” ⁴ Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord.

Genesis 2:23-24 ²³ Then the man said, “This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called Woman, because she was taken out of Man.” ²⁴ Therefore a man shall leave his father and his mother and hold fast to his wife, and they shall become one flesh.
