Marine Corps History By Gary Burk

The following is an excerpt from "The Battle History of the U.S. Marines".

Korea -

Ironically, the Marines' greatest battle occurred during one of the nation's most bitter defeats, the routing of the American and Allied forces in upper Korea by the People's Liberation Army (PLA) of Red China.

For the United States, top-level arrogance and disregard of strategic intelligence very nearly led to the annihilation of the 1st Marine Division. China's abrupt entry into the war placed the Old Breed Marines in desperate straits – seventy-eight miles away from their sea base, surrounded by seven PLA divisions, and burdened with thousands of wounded and frostbitten casualties at the onset of the coldest winter ever recorded along the Manchurian border. Many officials in Washington considered the Marines a lost cause; trapped, isolated and doomed.

At first it seemed so easy. MacArthur, having succeeded famously with his celebrated "left-hook" landing at Inchon, decided to use Marines again for a "right-hook" landing at Wonsan, on the east coast of North Korea.

Major General Oliver Smith's 1st Marine Division, having prevailed at Inchon and Seoul, cheerfully reembarked on board their amphibious ships and sailed into the Korean Strait, bound for Wonsan. Then came the shock.

Naval intelligence reported that the North Koreans had used their ancient fishing craft to lay thousands of surplus Soviet mines in the harbor. The mines were primitive but effective. Clearing the channels took sixteen tedious days and included the loss of three Allied minesweepers.

When the Marines finally came ashore at Wonsan on October 26, 1950, they were mortified that not only had the South Korean forces preceded them, but the Marine Corsair pilots of MAG-12 had already established an expeditionary airfield and were razzing them unmercifully.

Most ignominious of all: Bob Hope and his USO Show was already in Wonsan before the 1st Marine Division could execute their landing!

General Almond, still commanding X Corps, assigned Smith an enormous operating area, and urged him to press north toward the Chosin Reservoir, not far from the Manchurian border. These were the heady days for the United Nations Command. Suggestive phrases like "the race to the Yalu" and "home by Christmas" captured the fancy of correspondents and raised

Smith suffered none of these delusions.

false optimism among some of the troops.

Chesty Puller's 1st Marines drew the division's initial combat missions in North Korea. One battalion outdueled a first=echelon NKPA regiment at Kojo, just south of Wonsan, in a nasty two day battle. Another of Puller's battalions seized and held the vital crossroads town of Majon-ni against an aroused 15th NKPA Division. The battle for Majon-ni lasted two weeks.

While Chesty Puller kept the last NKPA fighting units at bay, General Smith sent the main body of the division north from the port of Hangnam to the western shoreline of the Chosin Reservoir, site of a valuable hydroelectric facility.

Chosin. That's what the Japanese called the big reservoir, and the Marines used Japanese maps for this campaign. (It'sKorean name is Changjin, but "Chosin" rhymes with "Frozen" so the name remains uncorrected.


