Marine Corps History

The following is an excerpt from "The Battle History of the U.S. Marines".

JUNGLE FIGHTERS -

After WW I, Marines were called to action in Nicaragua to help pro-American government of Adolfo Diaz resume power. Pressure from rebel elements led by guerrilla Augusto Cesar Sandino required a major buildup of Marine strength.

After landings at Bluefields, Corinto, and other sites, Marines under Brigadier General Logan Feland had garrisoned fourteen Nicaraguan towns. Eventually, 3,300 men of the 2d Marine Brigade, reinforced by two air squadrons, were in place supporting Diaz's shaky government.

Sandino, who refused to support the "American puppet" Diaz, took his rebels to the northern hills along the Honduran border.

Sandino would prove a formidable foe for the Marines. They pursued him in the Nicaraguan jungles for five frustrating years, engaging in their bitterest guerrilla fighting since the Seminole War in the Everglades.

Thinking of other ways of "skinning the cat" led Captain Merritt "Red Mike" Edson, the thirty-year-old commander of the Marine Detachment on USS Denver, to propose a series of aggressive patrols up the Coco River, along the border of Nicaragua and Honduras.

Red Mike Edson went deep into the bush and stayed there for months, living off the land as necessary, tracking Sandino's confederates. Firefights were vicious and point-blank.

Sandino bitterly began pulling his forces away from the Coco, his main line of communications. Edson then decided to scrap his boats and follow the rebels inland.

Edson's eventual reassignment from Nicaragua, (with a Navy Cross) must have come as a great relief to Augusto Sandino. But other promising Marine combat leaders arose to take his place.

Sandino was vexed by a hard-boiled pair of counter guerrilla fighters whose names had already achieved the status of legend in the American military: Gunnery Sergeant William "Iron Man" Lee and Lieutenant Lewis "Chesty" Puller.

In September 1932, Puller and Lee led their forty-man mounted company north of Jinotega, following a newly discovered guerrilla trail that led into the heart of Sandino's territory.

On September 26, after fighting their way through one ambush while crossing Agua Carta, Puller's force encountered a main enemy force of 150 men flanking them along two looming ridges. Gunnery Sergeant Lee, wounded twice in the initial outburst of firing, wrestled desperately with one good hand to untie his Lewis gun from a pack mule.

Lee was a world-class shot with the whole family of military weapons. His shooting made the difference. Puller's men gained the first ridge, then turned and fired down at the opposite ridge. The guerrillas followed like wolves, hoping for a complete kill. But Puller paused at every defensible fold of ground to surprise and sting his pursuers with well-aimed, long-range rifle fire.

The patrol returned to Jinotega intact, having covered 150 miles, destroyed two dozen enemy camps, and killed at least thirty rebels.

For this savage running battle, both Puller and Lee received the Navy Cross, the second for Puller (who would retire with an unprecedented five Navy Crosses after the Korean War).

River Cities Detachment #1090, Marine of the Year Nominations

GENERAL INFORMATION:

The Marine of the Year award shall be presented to a regular member of the Detachment who has rendered service(s) and performed deed(s) <u>above</u> and <u>beyond</u> the duties and obligations required of a member of the River Cities Detachment. Nominations for the Marine of the Year shall be considered and selected by the current members of the Detachment Marine of the Year Society. The Marine of the Year Society shall be comprised of all recipients of the Detachment Marine of the Year Award in good standing with the Marine Corps League. The Society is charged with receiving and reviewing nominations for the Detachment Marine of the Year. The President of the Society will name their selection at the Marine Corps Ball in November. Each recipient of the Marine of the Year Award shall serve as President of the Society for the following year. The Society shall have no less than five members present to deliberate the selection.

- (1) Nominations for this award will be accepted from <u>any member</u> in good standing of the Detachment.
- (2) Each nomination shall have a brief sketch of the person being nominated as well as a written summery stating why this nominee should be the Marine of the Year. The nominee must also be a member in good standing. The President of the Society shall announce the recipient of the Marine of the Year Award at the Marine Corps Ball in November.
- (3) Nominations will be addressed to River Cities Detachment #1090, ATTN: Marine of the Year Society, P. O. Box 6581, Evansville, IN 47719-0581 and mailed postmarked or hand delivered no later than October 1, 2014. **Nominations received after that date will not be considered.** All letters should be in a sealed envelope and will remain sealed until the Society meets to make the selection. The society will convene on a date determined by the President of the Society in the month of October.

CRITERIA:

There are no minimum criteria to be eligible for this award, but consideration will be given to members who have demonstrated contributions in the following areas:

Commitment: This is defined as a member's participation in Detachment affairs, such as attendance at monthly meetings, working on committees and projects, taking a leadership role in detachment affairs and functions, supporting the various MCL programs sponsored by the Detachment. Also considered is the commitment to perpetuate membership through recruiting and retention efforts.

Service: This is defined as a member's participation in the community, which provides help and relief to underprivileged and reflect positively the Marine Corps League and on the nominee's character. Also, contributing to patriotic programs, which espouse good citizenship and strong moral values. (i.e.—volunteer work in the community, as well as service to church and similar activities.)


