A History of Remembrance

National Poppy Day: Why We Wear Red

Each year, as May draws to a close and Memorial Day approaches, a small but powerful symbol begins to appear across America — the red poppy. On National Poppy Day, observed this year on Friday, May 23, members of the Sons of the American Legion Squadron 97 join millions of Americans in honoring the sacrifices of our nation's heroes by wearing this humble flower.

But why the red poppy?



The tradition dates back to World War I, when the bright red blooms grew over the devastated battlefields of Europe. Inspired by the sight, Canadian Lt. Col. John McCrae penned the famous poem "In Flanders"

Fields," forever linking the poppy to the memory of fallen soldiers. After the war, the American Legion adopted the poppy as a national symbol of remembrance and hope.

Today, wearing a poppy is a simple but meaningful gesture. It shows that we remember those who paid the ultimate price for our freedoms. It also supports living veterans and their families — funds raised through poppy distributions often go directly toward veteran care, rehabilitation programs, and scholarships.

This year, Squadron 97 encourages all members, families, and supporters to wear a red poppy proudly. We will be distributing poppies throughout the month of May at local events and gatherings. Donations are welcome but not required — the most important thing is to help keep the spirit of remembrance alive.

When you pin a red poppy to your shirt, jacket, or cap, you send a silent but powerful message: We remember. We honor. We are grateful.

Family, rolled up their sleeves and got to work, lending a hand where it matters most — to our veterans and our community.


