# **Honoring Four Chaplains Day**



Father John P. Washington, Rabbi Alexander D. Goode, Rev. George L. Fox, and Rev. Clark V. Poling

On February 3rd, we observe Four Chaplains Day, a day dedicated to honoring the bravery and sacrifice of four U.S. Army chaplains who gave their lives to save others during World War II. These men—Father John P. Washington, Rabbi Alexander D. Goode, Rev. George L. Fox, and Rev. Clark V. Poling—were aboard the U.S. Army transport ship Dorchester, which was struck by a German torpedo in 1943. As the ship began to sink, the chaplains calmly helped evacuate soldiers, offering comfort and guidance.

They then gave up their own life vests to others, ensuring that as many men as possible could survive.

Their heroic actions, regardless of faith or denomination, are a shining example of selflessness and the true meaning of service to others. On this day, we honor their legacy by reflecting on their sacrifice and commitment to humanity.

Squadron 97 encourages all members to take a moment to remember the Four Chaplains and the countless others who have shown extraordinary courage in the face of danger. Let us carry forward their message of compassion, unity, and dedication to the well-being of others.
