We, the public, are continually misled. As an aviation professional, I have subsequently deduced that as poorly and as inaccurately as the press reports aircraft incidents, they are probably as inept at EVERY newsworthy event... no matter what its subject. Their job is not to accurately inform and report as we expect, but to capture an audience's attention and hold it captive for as long as possible. Reality is not a consideration, as the truth is not nearly flashy enough to keep the public preoccupied.

In this rant I have not speculated on the fate of Malaysia Airlines Flight 370. That's because I don't KNOW the FACTS. In the coming months, or maybe years, they will come out. Or, at least the information our various governments want to release will come out. And if you are still interested, and not caught up in the latest media circus, you might actually find some closure with the fate of 239 lost souls.

At least, I hope so.

Oh, and in case you haven't been paying attention... while the media has ensnared us with this airline imbroglio, the roots of World War Three might just be taking hold in the Crimea and Ukraine...
