Pastor's Notes

What would you do if there is a severe famine, and you are at your last loaf of bread, and someone begged you for food? You know that what you have is not even enough for you and your child. Will you still give?

The first reading and the Gospel both about widows reminded me of a story by Mother Teresa of Calcutta.

There was a mother with a few children who went to their convent, begging for bread. Unfortunately, the convent ran out of food and only had a single loaf of bread left. Even the nuns themselves have nothing to eat.

Out of compassion, Mother Teresa gave the last loaf of bread to the starving mother. To her amazement, instead of giving the bread directly to her children, she divided it into two. She gave the first half to her children and the other to another woman with hungry children. How that small bread fed both families is really a miracle.

What inspired me in these stories is the ability of the mothers to give their full trust on the Lord's providence. They already know that what they have is inadequate or insufficient for their own families, yet they were still able to give. They did not hold back in sharing the blessings they received.

They believed that everything they had was because of the generosity of God. Rightly so, they wholeheartedly imitated that generosity by sharing to others.

This Sunday readings invite us to find a way to share generously the gifts we have received. It reminds us not to judge the generosity of an individual by the amount they gave. Only God knows what is in each one's heart.

Let us not only focus on what we can give away, but also on what we can gain by giving away.
