## **Pastor's Notes**

A friend of mine who happened to be a priest too recalled his experience during the earthquake that happened last Friday. Awoken from his nap by the strong movement, he thought that he was just sitting on his massage chair. Still half asleep, he desperately tried to look for the remote to make the shaking stop.

Later that day, he found out that it was actually an earthquake after another friend told him the news.

A few days later, the solar eclipse took placed during my sister's break from work. She told me she enjoyed observing while having lunch. She then recounted many more amazing phenomena (if we actually believed those were).

In the Gospel, the disciples of Emmaus recounted that their hearts were burning while an unknown man was walking and talking to them. It was only after the stranger broke bread with them that they realized that the person was actually Jesus. Then, they believed.

How many times did God walk with us but we did not even notice Him? How many times did He speak to us but we ignored him?

Once again, Jesus is inviting us to walk with him. Not to Emmaus but closer to home. Jesus is inviting us to the mission of helping our brothers and sisters in the Archdiocese through the Annual Appeal.

Jesus appears to us in the seminarians diligently studying to one day serve as a priest. He appears to us through the people being helped by food pantries, job placement offices, and safe haven for women who experienced domestic violence or unplanned pregnancies around the Archdiocese and so much more.

Unless we share and show that we care, we cannot say that we encountered Jesus.

This week, let us recount how God has walked with us and blessed us. Let us recount that in this Holy Mass, Jesus is breaking the spiritual bread of his body and is being shared among us.

Do we believe? If so, let's put it into action.
