None of us is any good at our prayer, our ministries, our lives, unless we take the time to find the quiet and go back to replenish our own wells.

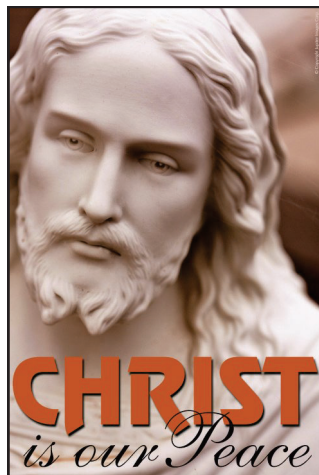
There is no way we can give to others unless we do. That is why we return to church each week, to rest and be nourished and renewed.

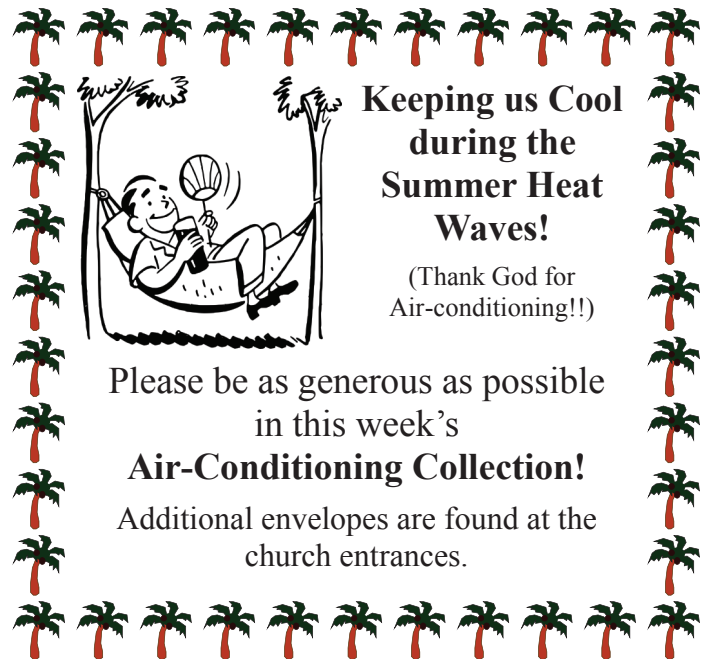
