Information will be coming out soon as to registration.

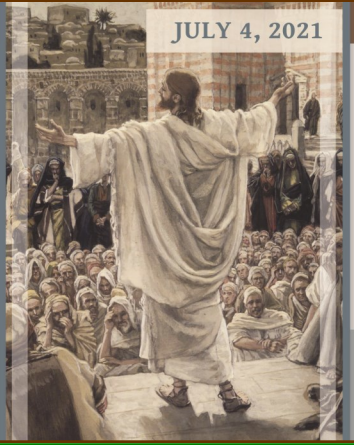

Receiving Communion

Most people over the age of 50, were instructed to receive Communion on our tongue. Many of us remember kneeling at the Altar Rail as the Priest went up and down the line.

Younger generations learned to process up the aisle to receive Communion either on their hand or on their tongue.

Over the history of the Church, how people received the Eucharist changed many times.

A first century Christian, (who celebrated the Eucharist at an actual meal), would have thought Communion on the tongue “strange” and would not understand a “*procession*” to receive Communion.

Since Vatican II, we have had the option to receive either way.

During this time of Covid, the more “sanitary” way of reception on the hand, was mandated.

But, we have the “Freedom of the Sons and Daughters of God!”

The Bishops in the State of New Jersey, have permitted Communion to be received again on the tongue for those who want.

Those wishing to receive this way are asked to come to Communion last.

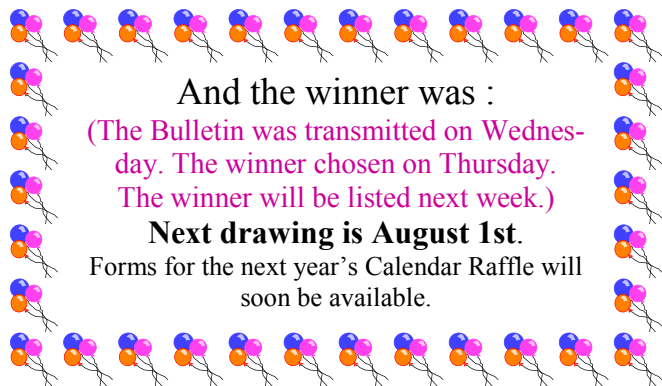

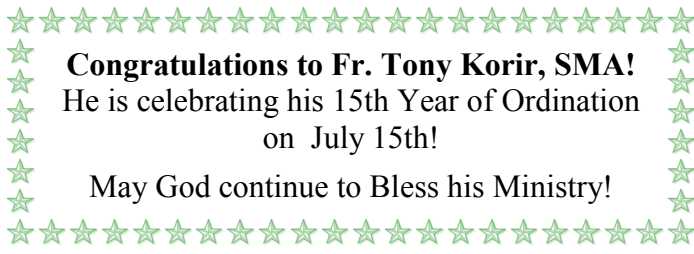
