"He was amazed at their lack of faith."

As an avid food adventurer or "foodie" (someone who likes to try different cuisines), I always ask locals for their recommendations of restaurants and dishes to try. For me, their opinions matter because they are familiar with the establishments and food in their area. Most of the time, their suggestions are often a hit.

In today's Gospel, Jesus went "home" to finally share his good news and help those who are close to him. Instead of celebrating his return, (I'm sure the people already heard of his "celebrity" status), he and his ministry was not welcomed.

Even if they heard him speak, seen the wisdom in his teaching and witnessed how he healed people without expecting anything in return, they rejected what he was offering.

Why did they behave that way? Why are they not happy that a "homeboy" is actually doing something great? Why were they so skeptical? Were they jealous of his achievements?

I can't figure out what their real reasons. 
