Statement from the Archdiocese of Newark concerning the reopening of Churches

A general dispensation from the Sunday obligation will remain until further notice.

The dispensation for the obligation to attend Mass will remain in effect. No one will be required to attend Mass when public celebrations resume. Hence, live stream Masses for parishioners at home will continue.

Attendance will be limited. We know restrictions will remain on holding large gatherings, so we are working with parishes to determine the best way to ensure safety. Communications will come from the parish so parishioners will know how many people can attend any given Mass.

It is likely that all parishioners may not be able to attend Mass regularly at first.

Social Distancing will be practiced. Expect that your parish will have pews/rows that are taped off, and that households, even of one individual, will be asked to keep six feet of separation from each other.

No one will be admitted without a mask. Parishioners should take their temperature before coming to Mass.

Anyone with any symptoms of sickness must stay home.

Liturgical changes will be in place. Similar to protocols established when churches were closing, extra precautions will be taken. Temporary adjustments will be made to how we celebrate Mass and receive Communion.

There still will be a risk for anyone who attends a public Mass. Even with best health practices and strict social distancing, anyone who enters a public space should recognize there is a risk of contracting the coronavirus. Improved cleaning will occur at our churches, but no one should expect that they will be any safer from germs than in other public spaces.

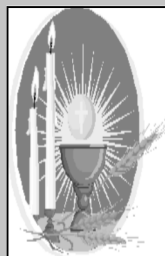

Weekend Masses have started!

There are several *realities* that must be understood .

We will be only able to accommodate 50 people (maximum) at each Mass.

At all times, you must wear a face mask while in church.

You must sit only in designated areas.

These are the pews that are not taped off.

Also, each pew can have only 3 individuals.

There are blue tape marks at the places you are to sit.

(A couple may sit together and families of 5 or less, may sit together.)

In pews where couples or families are seated, there might be a space for only one individual at the other end of the pew.

When coming to sit in a pew, please take the middle space FIRST.

(This way, there will be no need for someone to climb over you!)

There will be six Masses each weekend.

3 on Saturday evening: 3:00 PM, 4:30 PM & 6:00 PM

(If you are doing the “math,” that will accommodate only 150 people. Obviously, not everyone who might want to attend a specific Mass will be able to do so.)

3 Masses on Sundays: 8:00 AM, 10:00 AM & 12 Noon.

(Again, that will only be able to *welcome* 150 people.)

I have looked at all kinds of scenarios (e.g. having people pre-register; having a “lottery” for seats; assigning people to Masses. Some of these might be used in other parishes.)

I have settled for the old fashioned: **“First Come, First Served.”**

Attendees will have to line up outside.

The Church will be available only 15 minutes before a Mass.

When we have reached our maximum, the others will not be given admittance.

(If you can think of another reasonable and fair way of handling this problem, please contact me!)

After the Mass, volunteers will sanitize the church before the next Mass.

Therefore, we cannot allow people to linger in church.

Communion must be done in an orderly way starting from the rear of the Church. (There will be special “Ushers” to facilitate this.)

As you come up the aisle, you must wait at each blue line until the person before you has moved forward. You return by the side aisles.

Communion will only be distributed in the hand.

The Church bathrooms are closed.

Like many other public facilities, we cannot provide a continual cleaning service for the bathrooms.
Please plan accordingly.

Now, I am sure this might seem strange to us all in the beginning, but we must follow the norms of “Social Distancing” and “Safe Environments” to protect our self and others.

You are also reminded that if you have any medical condition, are not feeling well or have a fever; you should **NOT** be coming to Mass.

The Archbishop has waved all obligations to attend Mass during this time.

(We ask that all use common sense and practice patience & generosity!)
