Why do we veil images during Lent?

- as a liturgical symbol to emphasize the solemnity and penitential nature of the season. The act of covering them draws our attention toward the passion, suffering, and death of Jesus Christ.
- a reminder of how God often remains 'hidden' in our lives, especially when we are going through trials. Scripture often refers to the "hiddenness" of God, as in Isaiah 45:15
- the veiled images remind us that there's a 'big reveal' coming. We cover these images not to forget them but in anticipation of unveiling them in the joy of Easter. The Catechism reminds us that Easter is not simply one feast among others but the "Feast of feasts," the "Solemnity of solemnities" (CCC 1169).

The Paschal Triduum or Easter Triduum is the period of three days that begins with the liturgy on the evening of Maundy Thursday, reaches its high point in the Easter Vigil, and closes with evening prayer on Easter Sunday. It is a moveable observance recalling the Passion, Crucifixion, Death, burial, and Resurrection of Jesus, as portrayed in the canonical Gospels.
