Pastor's Notes

How many times have we passed an opportunity to serve just because we feel that we are not qualified to do so?

In today's Gospel, Jesus called Simon (Peter), James and John to gather people and bring them to God. Three ordinary fishermen without formal education to become "fishers of men".

Common sense tells us that those men were the least qualified for the "job" that Jesus wanted them to do. However, they still said Yes to the call. The same is true in our first reading about Isaiah, the youngest prophet in the Old Testament. Though he was inexperienced, he willingly accepted God's calling.

You see, God does not only call the qualified. He qualifies those who are called and wholeheartedly accepts his invitation. As long as we have a willing heart, he will provide us with the skills and tools we need to complete the mission he entrusted to us.

Every day, all of us are being called by God. Some tasks are life changing while others are menial. Whatever that is, God only needs our "Yes" and he will provide the means.

The question now is "Are we ready to accept or are we going to refuse?"

Did you know?

The Grotto of Our Lady of Lourdes between the Church and Rectory was donated by one of the parish families, the Fontanelli who obtained the stone for it from the mountain streams of Pennsylvania, where the waters rushing over the stones year after year smoothed their edges to a fine artistic finish. A close inspection reveals veins of coal, a reminder of their origin in the coal region of the area that once known as Penn's Woods.

A further tribute to Our Lady of Lourdes and her miraculous powers is evidenced in a relic of a stone visible in one of the rocks directly below the statue of the Blessed Mother. This was given to Fr. McHale at the Shrine in Lourdes, France by a convert who had been cured there of cancer of the throat.

This Grotto has become a landmark here in Garwood where some residents bring their visitors from out of town. People attest that they find peace when they visit the Grotto.
