It is a moveable observance recalling the Passion, Crucifixion, Death, burial, and Resurrection of Jesus, as portrayed in the canonical Gospels.

On Palm Sunday, the palm branches signify the victory and triumph Jesus has over death.

Holy Week, also known as Passion Week, is the most sacred week in the Christian liturgical year. It is a time for reflection, repentance, and remembrance of the final week of Jesus Christ's earthly life, leading up to his crucifixion, death, and resurrection.

Why do we veil images during Lent?

- as a liturgical symbol to emphasize the solemnity and penitential nature of the season. The act of covering them draws our attention toward the passion, suffering, and death of Jesus Christ.
- a reminder of how God often remains 'hidden' in our lives, especially when we are going through trials. Scripture often refers to the "hiddenness" of God, as in Isaiah 45:15
- the veiled images remind us that there's a 'big reveal' coming. We cover these images not to forget them but in anticipation of unveiling them in the joy of Easter. The Catechism reminds us that Easter is not simply one feast among others but the "Feast of feasts," the "Solemnity of solemnities" (CCC 1169).
