Club Guidelines

COMMON SENSE

PHONE CALLS

Although phone numbers are listed on the crew roster, please refrain from making calls until you have obtained to permission to do so. Some people work odd hours and need to sleep. In general, calls after 9:00 pm should not be made. Please be aware of time differences in other time zones.

Also, please do not call people at work, unless you are given specific permission to do so.

E-MAIL

E-mail has become the way to communicate, and is useful for some of us. Please be kind when using personal e-mail. If someone asks you not send them mail, do not. If you are discussing a private matter, it is bad manners to post in a public forum. Finally, if a person asks you to stop a flaming war, than stop.

LISTSERVS

The Reprisal has several listservs in use, and you will have access to at least one of them. There are some rules for their use: NO profanity, no discussions about religion, politics, or the policies of other fan clubs, no flame wars allowed on the listserv. History of the Reprisal

American Navy:

28 March 1776 -Marine Committee of the Continental Congress purchases the merchantman 'Molly', which is renamed the 'Reprisal', and placed under command Captain Lambert Wickes

10 June 1776- The committee of Secret Correspondence of Congress by arrangement of the Marine Committee issue orders to Capt. Wickes to proceed to Martinique and bring munitions for Washington's Armies and deliver as a passenger Mr. William Bingham to Martinique as a American Representative.

The Reprisal dropped down the Delaware from Philadelphia some time during the latter part of June. Before slipping out to the Atlantic, the Continental armed brig "Nancy" of six guns had been sighted and chased by six British men-o-war as she returned from St. Croix and St. Thomas with 386 barrels of gunpowder for the Army. In order to save her, her captain ran her ashore.

Captain Wickes with the crew of the 'Lexington', was able to save about 200 barrels. Before quitting the 'Nancy', they laid a train of gunpowder which blew up with a large number of British soldiers. In the engagement, Wickes third lieutenant, his brother, Richard Wickes lost his life.

The Reprisal cleared the Delaware Capes on 3 July. During that month, Captain Wickes captured a number of vessels in the West Indies; and on 27 July, had a sharp encounter with H.B.M.S Shark off Martinique, beating her off and escaping into port. She returned to Philadelphia on 13 September.

24 October 1776- Congress orders Wickes to set sail to Nantes, France. This mission was to deliver Benjamin Franklin as the Commissioner to France. The Reprisal was afterward to cruise the English Channel. En route to France, the Reprisal captured two brigs. Reaching Nantes, November 29th, the Reprisal was the first vessel in the Continental Navy to arrive in European waters. She set sail again about mid January 1777, cruising along the coast of Spain, in the bay of Biscay and in the mouth of the English Channel.

5 February 1777- The Reprisal captures the Lisbon packet, 2 days out of Falmouth, after a 40 minutes fight, and the cost of one man and two injured officers. Before ending this cruise on the 14th of February the Reprisal had claimed five other prizes.

In April 1777 the Reprisal was joined by the Continental

vessels 'Lexington' and the 'Dolphin'. these three vessels made up a squadron commanded by Wickes. The American Commissioners in Paris (Franklin was one of them) ordered the squadron to cruise along the British Isles. Leaving France in the latter part of May 1777, they cruised around Ireland during June, July, and August. On the 19th of June, they took their first prizes, two brigs and two sloops. During the following week, they cruised in the Irish Sea and made 14 additional captures, comprising two ships, seven brigs and five other vessels. Of these 18 prizes, eight were sent into port, three released and seven sunk, three of which within sight of the enemy ports. After being driven into port at the end of their cruise around Ireland, several weeks were spent in France while refits to all three vessels were being carried out.

On 14 September 1777, the Reprisal left France, accompanied by the 'Dolphin' for the United States. About 1 October, the Reprisal was lost off The Grand Banks of Newfoundland and all on board, except the cook, went down.

Modern United States Navy

Reprisal (CV_30), originally "Newark" (CL_100), was renamed "San Jacinto" (CV_30) on 6 January 1943.

Reprisal (CV_35) was laid down 1 July 1944 as an Essex class aircraft carrier by the New York Navy Yard. Her construction was canceled 12 August 1945 when 52.3 percent complete. Launched in 1945 without ceremony to clear the slipway, her hull was utilized in experimental work in the Chesapeake Bay from 1946_48. Although inspected during January 1949 with a view to complete her as an attack carrier, the plan was dropped and Reprisal was sold 2 August 1949 to Boston Metals Co., Baltimore Maryland. She was scrapped during November 1949.

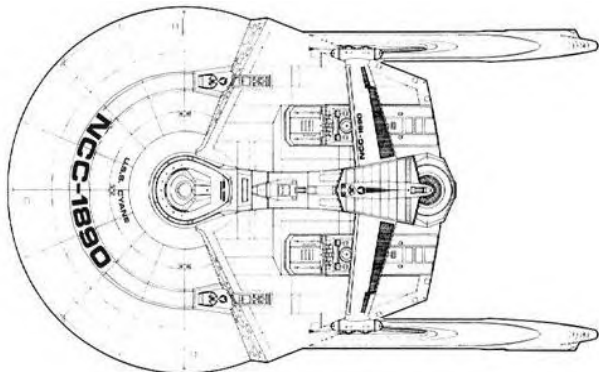
STARFLEET

The name Reprisal was first used in Starfleet 2284 when tensions with the Klingon Empire continued to grow. In order to maintain it's state of readiness, Starfleet Command decided to proceed with the construction of 17 new Cyan Class Heavy Frigates. The Cyan Class is based on the extremely successful Avenger Class platform. Of those ships, the USS Reprisal, 1896 was one. Also, the USS Saratoga NCC-1892, was commissioned at the same time. The USS Reprisal was under the Command of Captain Sotak, a Vulcan, during it's first two five-year missions.

In October 2288, the USS Reprisal and USS Cyan (NCC-1890) were on patrol along the Klingon Neutral Zone as a part

of Operation Distant Hammer, when they were attacked by three Klingon Domis'avyi (Guardians of the Border). All three Klingon ships were quickly dispatched. The K'chjne and another unidentified ship were destroyed in the battle, while the third, Mje'ask was escorted across the border and was tracked into Klingon territory for several hours.

After two successful missions of patrolling along the Klingon/Federation Border, and after the threat of hostilities began to recede, Captain Sotak lobbied for and was successful in receiving a deep space assignment. The Reprisal under his command spent nearly 6 years patrolling the galaxy on scientific and diplomatic missions.

Eventually the Reprisal was retired after serving for nearly 60 years of faithful service to the Federation. The ship was kept in storage at the Federation ship yards near Mars until it was refit used as a training vessel at Starfleet Academy starting in 2362.

When the Borg attacked at Wolf 359 in the year 2367, then Admiral Sotak, who was an instructor at Starfleet Academy, took a crew of cadets and joined in the battle of Wolf 359 on the USS Reprisal. The ship took heavy damage and all hands were lost, including Sotak.

In 2373, the newest and most advanced of Starfleet's vessels were launched, the Sovereign Class. Among them was the USS Enterprise-E.

Originally, plans were to launch a new Sovereign Class ship to be called Saratoga, but delays in the project cause the name to be moved to a new Appalachian Class vessel. The keel that was laid down for the Saratoga was soon re-named Reprisal in honor of the ship and crew that gave it's all at Wolf 359. Every piece and part of the old Cyan Class Reprisal that could be salvaged was and was incorporated into the

design of it's Sovereign Class namesake. Finally, in an unusual move, it was decided that since such a large amount of parts were able to be used in the new ship, it would considered an "upgrade/refit" and the same NCC number could still be used so to better honor Sotak and his crew that unselfishly gave their lives for the Federation.

When the ship was near completion in late 2374, Starfleet chose Korath K'rus, a Klingon as it's Captain. K'rus was had began his career on the USS Intrepid under Captain Wade Larkin and honed his skills as the Executive Officer of the USS Aries.

K'rus chose Larkin (who was unassigned at the time) as his Executive officer. Many of his old crew mates from the USS Intrepid made up the Senior Staff of the Reprisal. The crew quickly jelled under his leadership and quickly gained a reputation for excellence.

In 2377, K'rus took an extended leave of absence from the Reprisal to return to Qo'nos to settle a blood feud with another house. He was killed during that time.

Larkin was made commander of the Reprisal following K'Rus' death. He earned the loyalty and respect of the crew through the leadership he displayed in several battles, not all of which were in space. He had a running disagreement over policies with Starfleet command for years.

After 4 years as CO of the Reprisal, Larkin stood down to accept a position within Starfleet command. Replacing Larkin as Commander of the Reprisal was Vice Admiral Greg Franklin, another veteran of the USS Intrepid. He was considered by many in Fleet to be one of the most talented officers to come along in many years. After serving for a couple of years as a member of Starfleet Command, Larkin re-assumed command of the Reprisal when Franklin was temporarily re-assigned to a top-secret mission. Today, Franklin serves as Commanding Officer and Larkin as Executive Officer.

REAL LIFE HISTORY

The USS Reprisal was the dream of Greg Franklin and was launched in early 1997 with the help of Eric and Melissa Larkin. Franklin served the first two years as CO and returned as CO at the beginning of 2003 and again in 2007 and continues to serve in that roll today. Eric Larkin finished his third two-year term as Commanding Officer at the end of 2006 and continues to serve on board the Reprisal as XO. Melissa Larkin serves as Ship's Counselor.

SOVERIEGN CLASS

The Replacement for the *Galaxy* Class?

When the U.S.S. *Enterprise* was lost in the Veridian system, Starfleet knew a new vessel would soon bear the famous name. Original plans were to give the name to a new-build *Galaxy (II)* class, in honor of her immediate predecessor. But a surprise move by the Office of Starship Registry gave the name to the second of the new *Sovereign* class cruisers.

The *Sovereign* class represents the next generation of multi-mission vessels. Though the *Galaxy* class is classified as a large exploratory cruiser, in fact the vessel fills almost every role a starship can, her sheer size offering excellent mission flexibility. However, the ships cost an incredible amount of money and their sheer size makes them unwieldy in combat. In addition, there have been numerous advancements in computer and tactical systems since the *Galaxy* class entered service. With the *Excelsior* class quickly approaching the upper end of her design life, especially on the frontlines, the *Sovereign* class is expected to perform the same duties, in a more modern platform and at a far lower acquisition and maintenance costs.

GENERAL APPEARANCE

The *Sovereign* bears a resemblance to the *Excelsior* class battleship and is second only to the *Griffon* as the longest vessel in Fleet service, though the ship is dwarfed in mass and volume by the *Galaxy* class. The ship is extremely sleek in shape, resulting in excellent warp geometry that allows a high warp speed with excellent fuel economy. The primary hull is elongated, and the ship's draft is not as great as the *Galaxy* or *Nebula* classes.

PROPULSION AND POWER SYSTEMS

When Cochrane Warp Dynamics developed the new LF-44 series of warp drive, initial testing was performed on the U.S.S. *Bright Star* and *Werner von Braun*. Results were highly favorable, and the drive was approved for use on the *Sovereign*. A high-speed / high-efficiency design, they allow a top sustained speed of Warp 9.7 and a cruising speed of Warp 6. The LF-44 also does not exert a detrimental effect on local space.

TACTICAL SYSTEMS

Like the *Galaxy*, the *Sovereign* class is designed to operate on the frontier of Federation space. Learning from the defects in the *Galaxy* class, and corrections made to the *Galaxy (II)*, the *Sovereign* was equipped with nine Type XII phaser strips, three Mk 90 photon torpedo launchers (with quantum torpedo

capability), and the FSS shield system.

COMPUTER SYSTEM

The *Sovereign* class uses the M-16 Bio-Neural Gel Pack-Isolinear III computer system found in the *Galaxy (II)* and *Intrepid* classes. The vessel was originally designed to use the M-15, so extensive systems rework was necessary to implement the system in *Sovereign* and *Enterprise*. However, all future ships will incorporate the design changes in the yard.

SHIPS FACILITIES

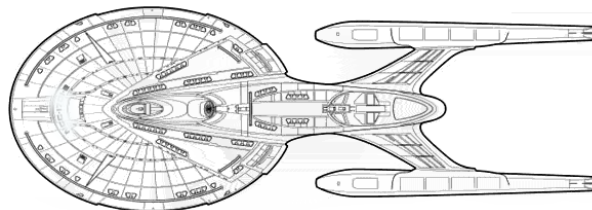
Standard compliment of a *Sovereign* class starship is actually 150 more than that of a *Galaxy*, with fifty less officers and two hundred more enlisted grades. An extreme surprise, at first glance, is that a *Sovereign* class can carry almost two and a half times the number of passengers as a *Galaxy* — 12,500 vs. 5,000. This is because the ship's quarters are almost half the size of those on the *Galaxy*, more closely resembling those on the *Excelsior* class she will replace. Also, a far greater percentage of the ship is dedicated to storage space for long-duration missions. In times of crisis, these spaces can be converted to temporary bulk personnel transport.

DEVELOPMENT AND CONSTRUCTION HISTORY

The *Sovereign* class Starship Development Project was launched in 2358. Designs were finalized in 2363 and construction began the following year on two keels. *Sovereign* entered service in 2371, followed shortly thereafter by the newly christened *Enterprise*. Two additional ships are under construction, and more are expected to be procured over the coming decades as *Excelsior* and *Ambassador* class vessels are retired.

CONCLUSION

At this time, the two vessels have been in service for far too short a time to make any sort of definitive statement as to their effectiveness. Both vessels were originally placed on deep-space mapping tours, but with the start of the Dominion War, both vessels are currently assigned to TacFleet.

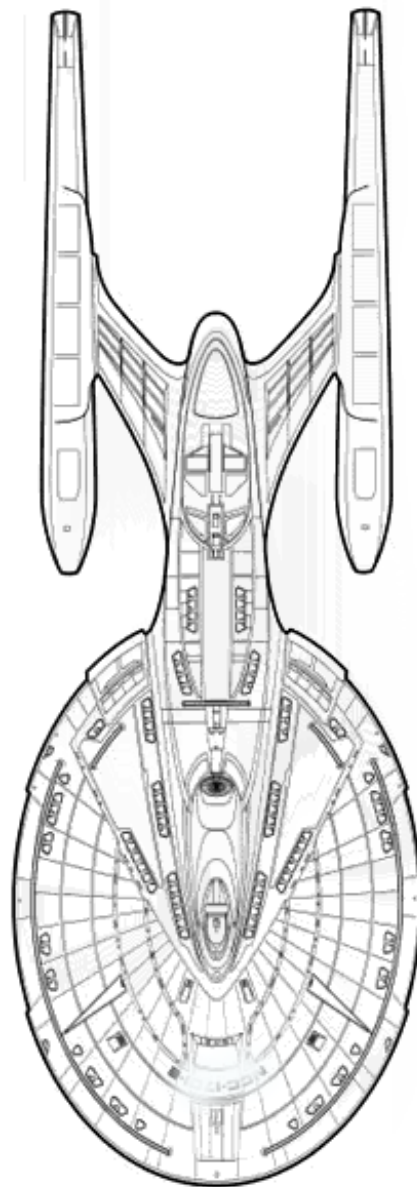
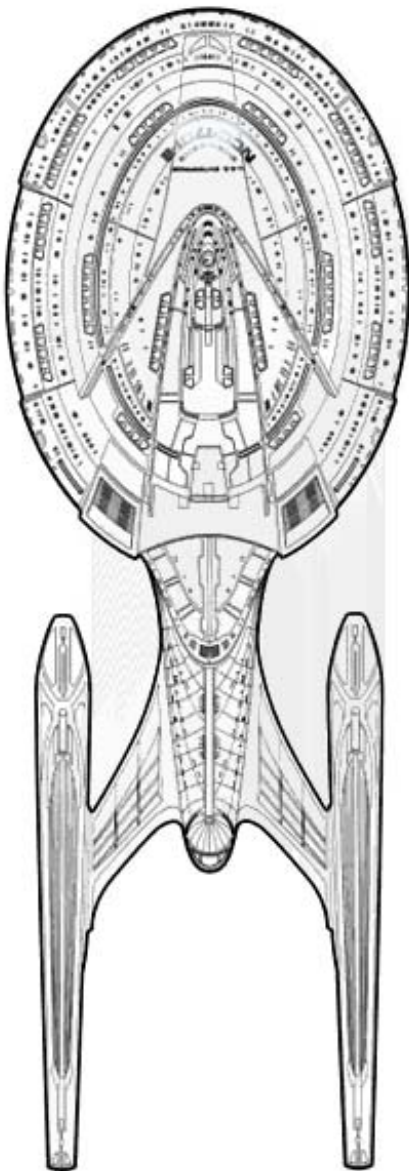
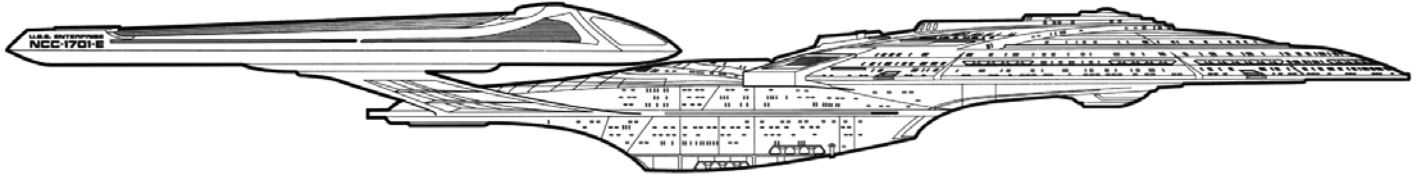
One half of passenger quarters were converted to a barracks for Marine enlisted personnel and extra hangar space for the Marine fighter craft.

Sovereign Class Cruiser

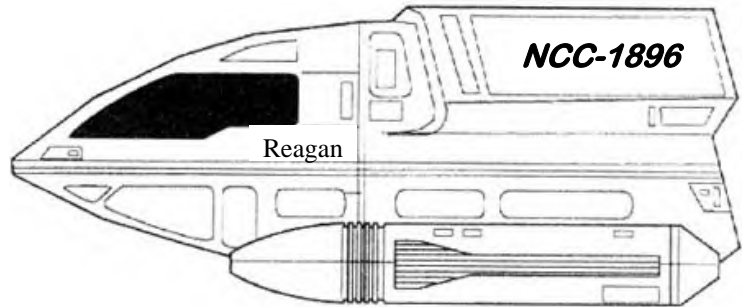

DEFINITIONS AND SYMBOLS

STARFLEET INTERNATIONAL

Starfleet International, or SFI, is one of the world's oldest and largest Star Trek fan clubs. The Reprisal is a sanctioned chapter of SFI and while we don't require it, we very strongly encourage our members to join SFI. Starfleet has over 200 chapters and 3000 members throughout the world.



REGION ONE

Starfleet is divided into Regions, which are overseen by Regional Coordinators. The Reprisal is in Region One, which consists of Kentucky, Tennessee, Virginia, West Virginia, Indiana, Ohio, North and South Carolina. There are over 40 chapters in Region One, making it the largest of all of Starfleet's Regions.



SECTION 2

The Reprisal is in the area known as Section 2 of Region One, Tennessee and Kentucky. Section 2 is overseen by our Senior Captain and also has a Section Representative who assists in the "fun stuff". In recent years the Reprisal has been very active in our section. Section 2 is the first section to have it's own web site and list serve. We were also the first to employ the position of Sectional Chief of Staff to assist the Senior Captain, to have our own list serve and to develop our own logo and newsletter.



THE RAMPANT LION

The Rampant Lion is the chosen symbol of the USS Reprisal. The Rampant Lion had been used throughout history as the herald of the Royal House of Scotland. We chose this as our

symbol for two reasons: the rich history of the Scottish throughout our highland region and to give a call to the man responsible for Star Trek in our area, Sydney Maxwell. We carry the Royal Scottish flag in parades (as seen below).



SYDNEY MAXWELL

Commodore Sydney Maxwell who died at the age of 83 was the former CO of the USS Aries. He helped to start the USS Intrepid, where many of our members came from and fostered the idea of cooperation between the area chapters. Sydney was a proud Scotsman and Star Trek fan. It is his honor that we have adopted the Scottish symbolism we use.



OUR ORIGINAL LOGO

The logo of the USS Reprisal was created by Mike McGowan from Region 12. It shows the Sovereign Class ship USS Reprisal in the foreground and the Rampant Lion in the background. Our name and NCC number are across the top and our logo "Loyalty, Honor, Freedom" is across the bottom.



OUR NEW LOGO

The newest version of our logo was designed by our own John "Kiwi" Kane. It too uses the Rampant Lion as the main logo, but has a more printable design. The two logos are used interchangeably.



Starfleet Rank Insignia (Next Gen.)

Below are the rank insignia as used on “Star Trek: The Next Generation”, “Star Trek: Deep Space Nine”, and “Star Trek: Voyager”. These insignia are to be worn on the appropriate uniform. It is considered poor form for a Starfleet member to wear the insignia of a rank he or she has not yet earned.

Flag ranks are surrounded by a gold box, other than the rank of Fleet Captain. These ranks are bestowed by the Starfleet Executive Committee. Officer ranks of Warrant Officer through Commander are granted by the CO of a chapter. The rank of Captain can be granted by the Regional Coordinator. These ranks are gold in color. Enlisted ranks are silver in color.

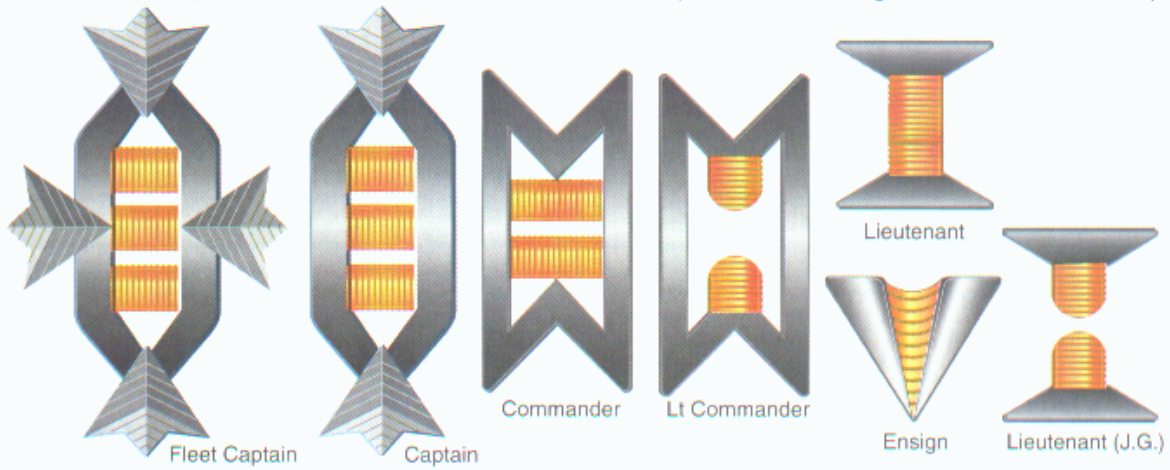

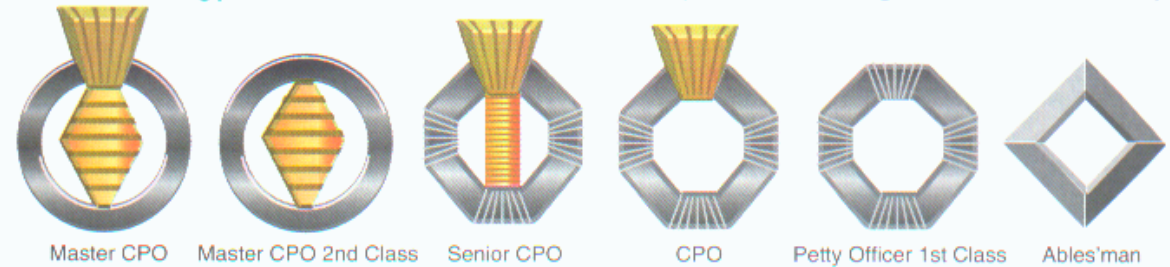

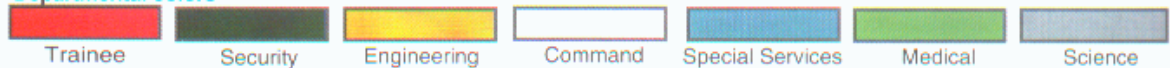

EVENTS

Listed below with descriptions are some of the events that we have annually and participate in on a regular basis.

MONTHLY MEETINGS

Monthly business meetings are held at various locations usually on Saturday afternoons. Most of the time they are coupled with an additional event such as watching a movie, putt-putt or eating out.

FUN FEST PARADE

The Fun Fest parade is the opening event for Kingsport's annual community celebration, Fun Fest. The Reprisal has been in it every year since 1998 and many of our members have participated with different chapters since as early as 1993. It is a uniformed event and is televised locally.

REPRISAL MOUNTAIN RALLY

This annual event is held in the spring of each year. The day begins at Bays Mountain Park and nature preserve. We attend the Planetarium show, hike, and observe the animal and nature programs in the park. Then we move down the mountain to the picnic shelters and have a big cook out. This event was first held in 1999 and has been a big success for us. We usually have members from as many as 7 or 8 chapters in attendance.

END OF SUMMER BASH

This event was first held in 2000 and was a smashing success with over 60 people in attendance and 8 chapters represented, so we decided to make it an annual thing. In 2002, we held it as a region-wide event in place of the R1 Fall Conference since there was none for that year. We had a great turn out and

held the first ever R1 Football Game! We usually hold the EOSB in late September just as the evenings start to cool down, so bring a jacket! It is held at the Eastman Recreation area at the foot of Bays Mountain.

ANNUAL AWARDS BANQUET

This event is usually held the weekend before Thanksgiving in November. We have dinner catered and dress up in our uniforms for a formal awards ceremony. We give out awards such as "Officer of the Year", "Enlisted Person of the Year" and "Cadet of the Year" and many others, as well as our funny awards. Every other year we hold an election so the new CO is sworn in at the banquet as well.

REGION ONE SUMMIT

The Region One Summit is an annual "business meeting" for Region One held each spring. It was held in nearby Gatlinburg, TN for the first 6 years and returned there in 2002 and again in 2008 and 2009. In the past the Reprisal has helped with security, medical, decorating and the model contest. We have had the most members there several times with 12 or 13 in attendance.

CHARITIES



Toys for Tots is the Marine Corps' premier community action program, one of the nation's

flagship charitable endeavors, an American tradition and a national treasure. For 51 years, Marines have been the unchallenged leaders in looking after needy children at Christmas. The Toys for Tots message of hope for the future has motivated youngsters to grow into responsible, productive, patriotic citizens and community leaders. Toys for Tots has earned the distinction as a program which plays an important role in helping youngsters emerge from a background of poverty to adulthood as assets to society. Toys for Tots not only benefits children, but also has a positive impact on communities, on businesses - large and small, on the Marine Corps and on the nation. Toys for Tots is one vehicle for addressing the issue of poverty among children.

The USS Reprisal has proudly supported Toys for Tots since the club was formed in 1997. The crew has donated hundreds of dollars in toys and many hours as volunteers decorating and wrapping presents.

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD Some 6 million suffering children in more than 100 countries on six continents will receive personal, gift-filled shoe boxes through this kids-helping-kids project each year. For many of these children, the gift will be the first present they have ever received. Since 1993, Operation Christmas Child has collected more than 18.5 million shoe boxes valued at more than \$360 million, and hand-delivered them to needy children in 120 countries.



Operation Christmas Child is a project of international Christian relief organization Samaritan's Purse. Headed by Franklin Graham, Samaritan's Purse is currently working in 100 countries, including many countries in Sub-Saharan Africa devastated by

HIV/AIDS. To help strengthen and unify the Christian response to the HIV/AIDS pandemic, Samaritan's Purse hosted an international conference on the HIV/AIDS in Washington, D.C., in February 2002, drawing more than 900 frontline AIDS workers, church and government leaders, and medical providers from 87 countries.

OTHER CHARITIES Members of the Reprisal support many local charities as individuals and as groups. Some of those that are supported as a group are local food banks and coat drives for the needy. Some of the individual efforts have included blood drives, work for PBS, volunteering for the MDA telethon and supporting Ronald McDonald house. We also volunteer our time and resources at a number of local volunteer agencies.

SECURITY RULES

The USS Reprisal is known throughout the Fleet for it's work as a security team. We have developed a set of rules or guidelines for our members to follow when on duty.

The Reprisal Security Rules

1. Don't forget anything.
2. Have your uniform clean as a whistle, and make sure you have all of your equipment.
3. When you're on duty, act with honor and integrity.
4. Tell the truth about what you see and what you do. Never lie to another member of the security team or to officers.
5. Never take a chance you don't have to.
6. When we're on duty be alert at all times.
7. Remain at your post until properly relieved.
8. Always watch your back and your partners back.
9. When you go on break, take no more then five minutes and only if you have been relieved.
10. If someone is caught doing a wrong be courteous and do not make physical contact.
11. Never allow yourself to be provoked.
12. Always remain calm and in control of yourself and your teammates.
13. Your orders will be given to your by your superiors before going on duty.
14. Don't sit while on duty.
15. Don't sleep on duty.
16. Don't allow yourself to become distracted.
17. Make sure you are prepared for anything.
18. Don't become a victim, let it go.
19. If a thief refuses to stop, don't pursue. Make every attempt to get an accurate description for the police.

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

GENERAL POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

The general policies of the Reprisal are covered in more detail in the Constitution Articles 3-11. Yet, we thought it important to discuss them here. We have also included some things that were not initially covered in that document.

THE COMMAND STAFF

The command staff (CS) consists of the Commanding Officer, the Executive Officer, and the Second Officer with the CO serving as the chairman. The CS adopts and enforces the policies set forth by the crew, the Reprisal Constitution, and this publication. However, the Commanding Officer is the final authority in these matters. Finally, the CS also holds a review board and grants promotions as needed.

THE SENIOR STAFF

The Senior Staff is the administrative body of the chapter and consists of senior officers. This staff is appointed by the Commanding Officer and consists of the following in order of succession: Executive Officer, Second Officer, Chief of Operations, Chief of Security, Chief of Staff, Counselor, Inspector General, Judge Advocate General, and the Marine Commandant.

If any member of the senior staff holds more than one of the listed positions, the Commander may appoint additional crew to ensure that there is a total of nine senior staff members at all times.

DEPARTMENT CHIEFS

Department chiefs are appointed by the Commander, and represent his/her department to the chapter. Department chiefs are required to make a monthly report to the Executive Officer, and the appropriate RDC on a monthly basis. Failure to do so may result in removal from the position.

FINANCIAL AFFAIRS

As of this printing the Reprisal does not charge dues, however, this may be amended in the future. All funds are either by donation, or fund raiser. The fiscal year commences January 1st and terminates on December 31st of each calendar year. All transactions are to be conducted in US currency.

DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE

The disciplinary committee consists of at least 5 members of the Senior Staff as chosen by the Inspector General. The IG oversees all actions taken, and makes recommendations to the Commanding Officer on all judgments. Any member before the disciplinary committee is entitled to counsel from the JAG officer.

DEPARTMENTS

This is a comprehensive overview of the Departmental make up of the USS Reprisal. Each department is listed with the positions for that department and the number of openings for that particular slot.



COMMAND DEPARTMENT

COMMANDING OFFICER

Qualifications:

- 1) Must be at least 21 years old
- 2) Must have passed OTS, and OCC
- 3) Must have completed at least one other SFA course
- 4) Should have successfully held a senior staff position for a full year
- 5) Must be an Active member of the USS Reprisal and have a valid Starfleet membership

The Commanding Officer (CO) is responsible for the well being of the entire chapter. Major decisions for the membership fall onto his/her shoulders. The CO must also make monthly reports to Commander, STARFLEET, Chief of Operations, STARFLEET, to the Region 1 RC, Senior Captain and Section Reps. Furthermore, the CO is the Reprisal's representative to STARFLEET International.

Finally, the Commanding Officer is the chairperson of the command staff.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER

Qualifications:

- 1) Must be at least 21 years old
- 2) Must have passed OTS, and OCC
- 3) Must have completed at least one other SFA course
- 4) Should have successfully held a senior staff position for a full year
- 5) Must be an Active member of the USS Reprisal and have a valid Starfleet membership

The Executive officer is the CO's representative to the crew. He/She is responsible for collecting monthly reports from the Department Chiefs and preparing a summarized report to the Captain. The XO is also responsible for maintaining an open line of communication between the CO and the crew, and is to assist the crew in any way.

Finally, the XO must be prepared to assume the duties of the Commanding Officer when needed, for whatever reason.

He/She is a member of the command staff, and is the chairperson of the senior staff.

SECOND OFFICER

Qualifications:

- 1) Must be at least 21 years old
- 2) Must have passed OTS, and OCC
- 3) Must have completed at least one other SFA course
- 4) Should have successfully held a senior staff position for a full year
- 5) Must be an Active member of the USS Reprisal and have a valid Starfleet membership

The second officer assists the executive officer in the performance of his/her duties. The second officer may be a department head, and may also have other duties. He/She is responsible for overseeing the Chapter's projects, and ensuring that they are being completed.

Additionally, the second officer is a member of the command staff, and must be prepared to fill in for the CO and/or the XO. He/She is also a member of the senior staff.

CHIEF OF STAFF

Qualifications:

- 1) OTS
- 2) Must have experience in a senior staff position for a full year
- 3) Must be able to handle money, and have accounting experience
- 4) Must have access to a computer

The chief of staff is primarily an administrative assistant for the command staff. He/She is also responsible for maintaining accurate records of the chapter's funds, and providing to the crew a quarterly, and annual financial report.

JUDGE ADVOCATE GENERAL

Qualifications:

- 1) OTS
- 2) Must be at least 21 years old

The Judge Advocate General or JAG officer is a representative for the Reprisal's crew during disciplinary matters, or other conflicts within the Reprisal. The JAG officer must have extensive knowledge of the SFI's member's handbook.

The JAG also assists the Inspector General with the election process (unless a candidate) by verifying ALL ballots by

his/her signature. The JAG officer may also be required to conduct elections, votes of confidence, and ship board ballots. The JAG is a member of the senior staff.

INSPECTOR GENERAL

Qualifications:

- 1) OTS
- 2) OCC
- 3) Must be at least 21 years old
- 4) Must have command experience

The inspector general (IG) is appointed by the Commander, USS Reprisal, and is the chief investigator of matters where his/her expertise is required. The IG has broad investigative powers in accordance with the guidelines established in the Reprisal's constitution as well as those within this publication. He/She may draw upon any chapter personnel to assist with these duties.

Finally, the IG is responsible for overseeing the electoral process within the chapter in order to safeguard against tampering, unless he/she is a candidate. The IG is a member of the senior staff.

STRATEGIC OPERATIONS OFFICER

Qualifications:

- 2) Must have passed SFA's School of Strategy and Tactics
- 3) Must have been an active member for a full year

The strategic ops officer is responsible for assisting the security chief in his/her duties. And is responsible for planning the strategy in competitions involving the Reprisal's Security, Weapons and Tactical department and Marine unit. .

USS REPRISAL CONSTITUTION

USS REPRISAL NCC-1896 CONSTITUTION 3rd EDITION (March 20, 2007)

PREAMBLE

We, the members of the USS Reprisal (NCC-1896), a chapter of STARFLEET International, in order to provide a social organization in which persons of various backgrounds with similar interest can promote the visions of Gene Roddenberry as set forth in the Star Trek Universe, and to support this endeavor through service to community, social functions and creative input, do hereby establish this constitution for the chapter USS Reprisal.

ARTICLE 1: MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1:

Any individual seeking membership in the Reprisal shall be awarded said membership so long as they agree to all mandates set forth in this document, and all subsequent addendums. Membership shall be open to all persons without regard to age, race, sex, religion, disability, or national origin. All members shall be classified as either "Active Duty" or "Associate Member". All crewmembers of either classification are considered voting members within the chapter. Active Duty memberships are for those members that have joined STARFLEET International. Associate membership designates those members that choose not to join STARFLEET. Any member of the crew may leave upon his/her discretion, preferably after written notification. Any Donations, dues, or monies are non-refundable.

SECTION 2:

Individuals who wish to become members of the USS Reprisal must be sponsored for membership by a current member in good standing and must attend at least one business meeting of the Reprisal. All member candidates must be voted on by the crew. Any candidate who receives a simple majority of crew votes cast will be considered a member in good standing.

SECTION 3:

Former Reprisal members who wish to re-join the crew will be allowed to do so and are subject to a vote by the crew. A simple majority vote is required for reinstatement.

SECTION 4:

Members of other Starfleet chapters who wish to transfer to the Reprisal shall be voted on as any new member and will be asked to sign a statement agreeing that the Reprisal did not recruit them and a copy shall be sent to the commanding officer of the applicant's former chapter.

SECTION 5:

Only Active duty members may serve on the command staff or as a senior officer. This requirement may be waived at the discretion of the Commanding Officer.

ARTICLE 2: DEFINITIONS

SECTION 1:

The USS Reprisal NCC-1896, a chapter of STARFLEET, the International Fan Association, is based upon 'STARFLEET' as depicted in the television series, motion pictures and literature. This Chapter shall operate within

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the Star Trek Universe to enhance the experience and fun of membership. Listed below is terminology that is interchangeable within the organization:

Chapter -Commissioned Starship or vessel (referred to as ship)

Chapter-in-training – Shakedown cruise

Chapter/Chapter-in-training President- Commanding Officer (CO)

Chapter/Chapter-in-training Vice President- First (or Executive) Officer (XO)

The President of the organization- Commander, STARFLEET (CS) or the fleet Admiral

The Vice President of the organization- Vice Commander STARFLEET or the Vice Fleet Admiral (VCS)

IG- Inspector General

JAG- Judge Advocate General

SECTION 2:

Ranks awarded to Reprisal members as described in the current membership handbook of STARFLEET International are fictitious and serve only to reflect a member's length of time in, and contribution to the chapter. These ranks do not give any member authority over another member. Positions assigned to a member may give that member responsibility to administer the assigned duties of that post. However, NO ONE has the right to misuse said responsibilities granted by the command staff to violate another members legal rights.

SECTION 3:

All new members will start with the rank of Crewman for adults and Cadet for persons under sixteen (16) years of age. This section is subject to the discretion of the Commanding Officer and the Command Staff. Persons transferring from another chapter may keep their present rank upon verification of that rank. Promotion boards will be conducted every quarter and all eligible crew will receive their promotions.

SECTION 4:

No new crewmember will be promoted to Officer's rank (Ensign) without taking OTS. No crewmember may serve on the Command Staff without having taken OCC. Special ranks i.e. Sergeant Major, Master Chief Petty Officer, Warrant Officer, and Midshipman are approved by the Commanding Officer.

SECTION 5:

Cadets that are exceptional in their duty may be given a brevet rank. This shall be noted as an "Acting" rank. Example: "Acting Ensign". These officers shall be accorded the same privileges as normal officers.

ARTICLE 3: GOVERNING BODY

SECTION 1

The governing body of the Reprisal shall be the command staff consisting of the CO, XO, and the Second Officer. The command staff will adopt and enforce the policies set forth by the crew and this publication. The Commanding Officer shall be the final authority in the interpretation of this Constitution and of the policies and procedures of the chapter. The command staff also reviews and grants promotions to the crew.

SECTION 2

The administrative body of the chapter shall be the senior officers. The senior staff is appointed by the Commanding Officer, Reprisal, and Consists of the following in order of succession:

Executive Officer USS Reprisal

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Second Officer, USS Reprisal
Chief of Operations, USS Reprisal
Chief of Security, USS Reprisal
Marine Commander, USS Reprisal

The function of the senior staff shall be to oversee all operational activities of the chapter as well as the process of formulating and developing policies, which are subsequently subject for approval from the crew. Should a member of the senior staff become incapacitated or otherwise be unable to perform his/her duties, the CO shall appoint a replacement for the staff member.

If any member of the senior staff holds more than one position that is part of the senior staff, the CO may appoint an additional department chief to the senior staff so that the total number of Senior Staff members does not total less than six (6) individuals.

ARTICLE 4: TERMS OF OFFICE, OFFICE DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

SECTION 1:

All Reprisal Officers described within Article 4 Sections. 3-8 inclusive shall be at least 21 years of age unless otherwise specified. This is due to legal and financial considerations.

SECTION 2:

Department Chiefs are appointed by the CO. This appointment is a reflection of that individual's length of service, as well as their service merit to the Reprisal, and STARFLEET. The primary duty of the Chief is to represent his/her Department to the Chapter, and the Command Staff specifically. The department head is responsible for administering and implementing chapter policies as set forth by the senior staff. Department Chiefs are required to make a monthly report to the Executive Officer, whether it is verbal or written, and to account for their departments activities during the monthly chapter meetings.

SECTION 3:

The Marine Commandant reports directly to the CO and is responsible for maintaining the Marines' records and their functions. The Marine CO is also to act in conjunction with the Security department on an as needed basis.

SECTION 4:

The Chief of Security reports to the CO and is responsible for security and assembling competent security teams at all functions. The CoS's authority extends only so far as what is allowed by the law of the United States.

SECTION 5:

The Chief of Operations reports directly to the CO, and is responsible for the daily activities of the chapter, to include organizing fundraisers, activities and charitable causes. Furthermore, the Chief of Ops shall be available to the crew to assist them with any questions concerning the Reprisal's crew manual. He/she is also charged with providing an updated list of ship's personnel to the command staff. The Operations Officer shall be available to assist with any election, vote of confidence or organized ballot so long as he or she is not a candidate.

SECTION 6:

The Second Officer reports directly to the CO and the crew, and is responsible for making administrative policies in conjunction with the command staff. The second officer also has a say in the promotion of any member within the chapter. The Second Officer of the chapter must be at least 21 years of age, and must meet all other qualifications for

CONSTITUTION

the office as set forth in the crew handbook.

SECTION 7:

The Executive Officer reports directly to the crew and the CO, and is responsible for making sure the daily operations of the chapter are accomplished in a timely manner. He/she is also responsible for the well being of the crew and to ensure that their needs are met. The first officer acts for the CO as Commanding Officer, Reprisal, in his/her absence or disability from office. The XO of the chapter must be at least 21 years of age, and must meet all other qualifications for the office as set forth in the crew handbook.

SECTION 8:

The Commanding Officer shall be elected by the members of the Reprisal, and shall serve as Chairman of the Command Staff. He/she answers directly to the crew and is responsible for coordinating the activities of the entire chapter as provided in the crew handbook. The CO must be at least 21 years of age, and must meet all other requirements for office as set forth by the STARFLEET Membership handbook.

ARTICLE 5: REMOVAL OF OFFICER FROM POSITION

SECTION 1 COMMANDER USS REPRISAL

If at any time the Commanding Officer, USS Reprisal neglects his/her duties as set forth within this constitution and the crew handbook, or if the CO causes harm to come to the reputation and stature of the chapter by any of his/her personal actions, the crew may initiate the procedure of impeachment as set forth in this document. During this procedure the CO shall be allowed to defend his/her actions to the general membership. The CO shall be allowed to choose his/her own defense counsel during the procedure, except the XO or the Second Officer.

The Judge Advocate General shall act as the advocate for the crew during this proceeding. Any or all of the proceedings may be taped to prevent potential defaming material from being released.

The Inspector General shall act as judge in this matter and shall conduct any investigations required.

After a full and fair review of the charges brought against the CO, if two-thirds (2/3) of the crew vote in favor of removal of the CO, then the CO shall be ordered to resign within 30 days or any lesser time period set forth by the senior staff. If the CO fails to comply, he/she will be removed from office and the Executive Officer shall become the new CO.

The former CO is expected to release all documents, funds, files or chapter materials within 30 days upon vacation of office. If this is not accomplished the chapter has the ability and right to pursue legal action in accord to the laws of the United States of America.

SECTION 2: MEMBERS OF THE COMMAND STAFF

Any member of the Reprisal shall have the right to petition the CO or the IG for removal of a member of the command staff if based upon the CS member's lack of performance of official duties. No member may petition for removal of another member if that petition is based upon a personal dispute the petitioning member has. If this is proven to be the case, then the original petitioning member shall be held liable and will face disciplinary action.

Upon investigation by the IG, if the CS member is found to be remiss in his/her duties, then the CS member will be removed from that position effective at a date determined by the CO. The CS member shall have the opportunity to be represented by the Judge Advocate General, if he/she so desires.

Should the command staff member file an appeal to the CO, the reasons for removal shall be reviewed by the CO, whose judgment in this manner is final.

SECTION 3: MEMBER OF THE SENIOR STAFF,

CONSTITUTION

A member of the senior staff may be replaced by the CO if there is significant evidence of dereliction of duty. The CO may appoint another crew member to assume the duties of the senior staff position.

SECTION 4: REMOVAL OF A MEMBER

The entire crew must be present and vote on the removal of a member from the chapter. Involuntary revocation of membership in the chapter may be made only upon the recommendation of the disciplinary Committee and will require a two-thirds (2/3) majority to remove any member from the chapter. All said members are to be given a fair trial, and are considered innocent until proven guilty. All rules and official channels as set forth by the STARFLEET Membership Handbook will be followed.

ARTICLE 6: FINANCIAL AFFAIRS/STANDARDS

SECTION 1:

The fiscal year for the Reprisal shall commence on January 1 and terminate on December 31 of each calendar year. All transactions shall be conducted in United States currency.

SECTION 2:

The command staff shall install and maintain accountancy for funds or donations collected by the membership. Financial statements are to be published in the monthly newsletter.

SECTION 3:

The USS Reprisal is a non-profit organization. No members of whatever classification have any right to the property and assets of the chapter. Funds belonging to the Reprisal, except to pay current expenses shall be placed in an interest bearing account if applicable. Furthermore, no one individual may disperse funds from the account.

SECTION 4:

All money for this chapter shall be held and used solely for the chapter's benefit or for the charity for which it was intended. No funds shall be dispersed to members unless they can show receipt of a purchase made for the chapter.

SECTION 5:

All disbursements shall be made by check, which shall show the date, payee, type of service needed and amount of payment.

SECTION 6:

The Chief of Staff shall provide for the annual audit, and shall publish those findings in the newsletter.

SECTION 7:

In the event that the Reprisal should be dissolved or cease operation, the property and assets of the chapter shall first be used to pay all outstanding debts, with any remaining assets being donated on behalf of the crew to a charity, selected by the command staff.

ARTICLE 7: ELECTIONS

SECTION 1:

The commanding officer of the chapter shall take office on January 1 of each year following the crew general elections, which shall be held every 3 years. The office shall be filled by the candidate that receives the plurality of votes

CONSTITUTION

cast by the chapter membership. There shall no limit to the number of terms possible to be served in the office of Commanding Officer by any one person. The CO serves at the leisure of the crew.

SECTION 2:

Unless the Inspector General is an announced candidate for CO, he/she shall be responsible for coordinating all election activities for chapter President/CO. Should the Inspector General be such a candidate, the JAG assumes the responsibility of coordinating the election process.

SECTION 3:

To be eligible for the chapters President/CO position all candidates must meet the following criteria: be at least 21 years of age, completed OTS, and OCC. Moreover, the candidate must meet all requirements set forth by the STAR-FLEET Membership handbook.

SECTION 4:

If only one candidate pursues the office of chapter President/CO, a vote of confidence for that candidate shall be held by the crew. If said candidate fails to get a majority vote in the vote of confidence, the current CO will remain in office until an emergency election can be held and a suitable candidate can be found. In the event that the single candidate is the current CO and that person does not get a majority vote in a vote of confidence, the current Executive Officer shall assume command until an emergency election can be held, to be completed by no more than 90 days after the election voting deadline has passed.

SECTION 5:

An out-going President must release all material connected with the chapter to the new President on or before January 31 of the election year.

SECTION 6:

Time table

- *Open for nominations May 1- June 15
- *Nomination must be accepted by nominee by no later than midnight July 31
- *Candidates announced August 1
- *Open campaigning August 1 - September 15
- *Ballots Distributed September 15
- *Ballots must be returned by midnight October 31
- *Election results announced at the Awards Banquet in November, not to be announced any later than December 1
- *Change of command ceremony at Awards Banquet
- *New CO assumes Command on January 1

SECTION 7:

Election Rules:

- *All nominees must be nominated by at least two (2) members of the Reprisal
- *Nominees may nominate themselves
- *Nominees may not be nominated by more than one (1) member of their immediate family
- *Nominees must have a valid Starfleet membership or proof must be shown that the membership has been sent for
- *Nominees must have required SFA degrees (OTS, OCC) by July 31 to be eligible to run.
- *Nominations must be written and presented to the Inspector General or JAG Officer by US Mail or e-mail. Nominations will be taken orally at meetings only.

CONSTITUTION

*All nominations will be posted by IG or JAG Officer to the Reprisal list serve and Reprisal Announcements list serve. All nominees must be notified in writing by the IG or JAG Officer via US Mail or e-mail. In the event that either runs for CO, the other will handle the election and so on until someone who is not running is found.

*Acceptance of nominations must be in written form via US Mail or e-mail.

*Any misconduct by nominees or their respective supporters that is aimed at slandering or discrediting their opponents will not be tolerated and will result in immediate suspension of election for disciplinary action. Election process will remain on hold until said matter can be resolved.

*Ballots will be hand-delivered or sent out by US Mail

*Absentee ballots may be accepted as per election coordinator's digression via e-mail.

*In the event that the current CO is re-elected, a re-swearing in ceremony will replace the change of command ceremony at the banquet.

*In the event that there is only one candidate there will be a vote of confidence instead.

* No two members of the same family may serve on the Command Staff (Service on the senior staff is allowed).

ARTICLE 8: ASSESSMENTS

There shall be no assessments to the crew of the USS Reprisal. However, STARFLEET membership is highly recommended.

ARTICLE 9: AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended, repealed or superseded either in whole or in part by a two-third (2/3) majority vote of the crew.

ARTICLE 10: OPERATIONAL AND OTHER MANUALS

The crew of the USS Reprisal shall be empowered to adopt manuals of Operations information and procedure to assist in the governing and administration of the chapter, subject to approval of the entire crew. These manuals may be revised as necessary, subject to the author's approval.

ARTICLE 11: DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE

The Disciplinary committee shall consist of no less than five members of the Senior Staff and crew as chosen by the Commanding Officer. The IG shall oversee all disciplinary actions, and shall make recommendations to the CO on all judgments. Any member brought before the Disciplinary Committee shall have the right to be represented by the Judge Advocate General.

This Constitution supersedes all previous editions of the Constitution. The STARFLEET CONSTITUTION and policies are required for being a chapter in that organization; however, our policies supersede those documents.

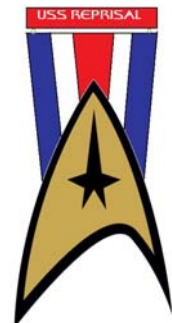

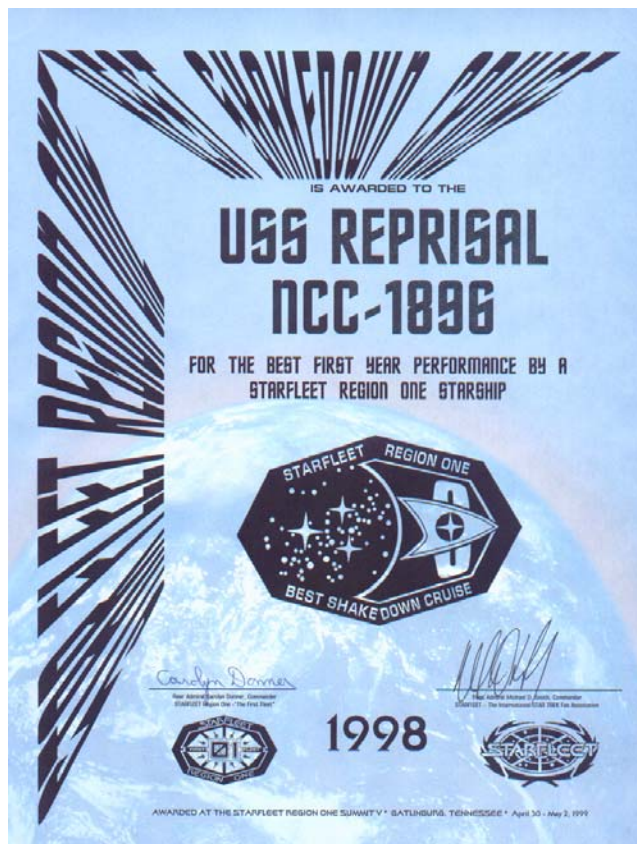
