Subject: SCBA inspection schedule		

Purpose: This directive sets the inspection procedure for self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) inspections for volunteer, on-call and full-time fire departments pursuant to 26 M.R.S. § 2105.

Statutory Background: 26 M.R.S. §2105. Inspection procedure

The Bureau of Labor Standards shall adopt an inspection procedure for self-contained breathing apparatus. The procedure must include at least the following, as specified in the manufacturer's operation manual:

- 1. All components, air supply devices, personal alert safety system devices and warning devices. A complete inspection of all components, air supply devices, personal alert safety system devices and warning devices to be performed after each use and:
- A. For volunteer associations and on-call fire departments, every month; and
- B. For full-time fire departments, every week;
- 2. Facepiece. Cleansing and sanitizing the facepiece after each use; and
- 3. Record. A record of the date of each inspection and findings for each self-contained breathing apparatus.

Inspection Procedure:

Consistent with § 2105, volunteer and on-call fire departments must perform inspections at least monthly. Full-time fire departments must perform inspections at least weekly.

The Bureau interprets a full-time fire department as any fire department that is staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, regardless of the number of employees per shift.

All fire departments, regardless of designation, must inspect each SCBA after each use.
