## CALL YOUR LOCAL AND STATE REPRESENTATIVES AND LET YOUR VOICES BE HEARD.

Recently, a Texas House Bill was introduced that allows for the creation of a special im-

rovement district, within Waller County, that appears to provide public funding for a 200+ acre area just south of Hempstead.

A notice to this effect was published in the Houston Chronicle on March 20, 2025- the text of this notice is provided below. We note that the notice was NOT published locally in Waller Coun-

The notice was paid for by TexasLand USA, LLC who, according to their website (https://www. texaslandusa.com/the-dream), have the aim ("The Dream") of creating a large Texas-themed amusement park.

It appears that this aim and the area specified in the notice are one in the same. The area specified is right down the road from many of us, and we are very concerned that the amusement park will negatively affect our property values, drive traffic

increases, increase crime and encourage other development that tends to follow these theme parks, all of which would be detrimental to our area.

The House Bill (HB 5685) will provide for public tax dollars to be diverted for the benefit of the theme park. https://legiscan. com/TX/bill/HB5685/2025

We strongly suggest that Waller County citizens who are also concerned reach out to our elected officials, including our State Representative Stan Kitzman, who sponsored the bill, Senator Lois Kolkhorst, the Hempstead EDC, and our Precinct 1 Commissioner John Amsler, to let them know you do not sup port the district creation and do not want tax dollars of any kind going to fund this theme park development.

Aside from the notice posted in the Houston Chronicle there have been no other public notices. While the end of the legislative session is approaching soon, you can give notice to your elect-ed officials to listen to your voice when making decisions.

#### NOTICE OF INTENTION TO INTRODUCE A BILL IN THE LEG-ISLATURE OF TEXAS

Notice is hereby given of the intention to introduce in the Regular Session of the. 89th Leg-islature of Texas a bill creating and establishing a special district in Waller County, under the pro-visions of Article XVI, Section 59. Article III, Section 52; and Article III, Section 52-a of the Constitution of Texas and pursuant to the inherent power of the Legislature to create special governmen-tal agencies and districts, with powers including those given to municipal management districts created pursuant to Chapter 375, Texas Local Government Code. The bill will provide for the district's administration, powers, name, duties, operation, and financing The district is proposed to include

approximately 226 acres +/generally located west of FM 1887, east of Highway 159, north of Jozwiack Lane, and south of FM 3346.
